Horsephotos in the Mar. 6 GII San Rafael S., but got caught on the wire and

finished second by a neck to Imperialism. Will jockey Mike Smith have him on the front end today? "We wait and see," trainer Patrick Biancone said. "Mike Smith knows him well and we will decide what to do." The colt will be asked to carry his speed a mile and an eighth for the first time in the Blue Grass; in three weeks, he will need to have enough gas to go that extra furlong. Can he do it? "I'm going to be honest...I

don't know if he's stay a mile and a quarter," Biancone said. "My target is to stay a mile and an eighth this weekend, and after that we see."

Bred to Run All Day...

The pedigree of Eclipse winner Action This Day (Kris S.) cries out for the Kentucky Derby distance, but the bay will have to overcome the jinx that has kept every GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero from wearing the blanket of roses. He will also need to bounce back from his seventhplace finish in the Mar. 14 GII San Felipe S. "The San Felipe was disappointing for us because of two things," said trainer Richard Mandella. "First of all, he was cut near his tendon. It required three stitches. Then, he got to doing too good. He jumped out of the gate and wanted to go to the lead. We'll take him back a little on Saturday." He added during the Blue Grass gala dinner Thursday night, "I think we have him back where we had him in October."

Better Lucky Than Good...

The Cliff's Edge (Gulch), a late-running third in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 14, gives owner Robert LaPenta his

first shot at Kentucky Derby glory. But the dark bay was not supposed to be racing in LaPenta's burgundy and gold colors. Purchased for \$200,000 as a KEESEP yearling, he was earmarked as a pinhook prospect, but Lady Luck had a different plan. "We had him up for sale at Calder as a two-year-old," LaPenta said during the Blue Grass dinner interview. "I was in New York, and my racing manager was watching the workouts. I remember calling him and saying, 'How did the Gulch horse do?' He said, 'You'll never believe it. A cat

ran across the track.' The horse had a horrible workout and nobody bid on him in the sale. That's how smart we are. You've got to be lucky in this business." The Cliff's Edge, who RNA'ed for \$195,000, won the GIII Iroquois S. and the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two and has earned \$370,258 to date.

"I thought his race in the Florida Derby was very solid," Pletcher said. "We only had one seven-furlong race into him...and the track was like a desert."

A Better Race on Tap?

GIII Laurel Futurity winner **Tapit** (Pulpit) did not fare as well in the Florida Derby. Making his

sophomore bow after a four-month layoff, the \$625,000 KEESEP yearling was caught in traffic for much of the race and ran sixth. But David Fiske, the racing manager for owner Ronald Winchell, did not

use the troubled trip as his excuse. "All those problems...were pretty minor," Fiske said. "They could have prevented him from running his best race, but I think the most important aspect was that it was his first race of the year."

David and Goliath...

Uber-trainer Bobby Frankel, who took the 2003 Wood with Empire Maker, will be back to try for two in a row

with Master David (Grand Slam). The chestnut started his career in England, winning at Thirsk in September, then shipped to the U.S. and was second at 12-1 in the GII Remsen S. Nov. 29 over this track and trip. Favored in two starts this term, he could do no better than

If jockey Edgar Prado has a Stuart Smalley complex, it's understandable. "I think he likes me," the Panamanian dead-panned following Perfect Soul's hard-fought win in the Maker's Mark Mile. Prado is now three for four, with a second, aboard the son of Sadler's Wells. Fifth, but beaten just 3/4 of a length in the 10-furlong GI Arlington Million with Corey Nakatani in the saddle last August, Perfect Soul showed his versatility when rallying for third under Jose Santos in the GI Atto Mile at Woodbine Sept. 14. Reunited with Prado for the GI Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile Oct. 4, he closed to win at 6-1. The Charles Fipke homebred was making his first start since running ninth, with Santos at the reins, in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 25. Reserved in seventh while kept in the clear for the opening six furlongs, the bay kicked it into high gear turning for home, angled out six wide in the stretch and closed willingly to keep his perfect local record intact. Burning Roma outnodded pacesetter Royal Spy for second while favored Stroll (Pulpit) was a no-excuses fifth. Prompted on a possible next start for the winner, victorious trainer Roger Attfield called on his comedic skills. "We might go over to Churchill for the other bourbon race [GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic, 9f, May 1]. I'm a scotch drinker, but I'm beginning to like bourbon now." 

"We obviously expected him to run well," trainer Todd Pletcher said of Strong Hope's last start. "I was a little concerned that three-quarters was a little too short for him, but he was spectacular. Hopefully, he can come back with a similar type of performance. He showed last year he was a quality horse. He was good enough to win everywhere from seven furlongs to a mile and an eighth." Badge of Silver was high on everybody's Derby lists last year after a 10-length victory in the GIII Risen Star S., but was taken off the Triple Crown trail after suffering a fractured right front cannon bone the day before the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. The colt made a successful return to the races 10 months later winning a six-furlong optional claiming event by 2 3/4 lengths at Fair Grounds Jan. 23, but disappointed last time with a fifth-place finish behind Well Fancied in the GII General George H. Feb. 16. A 43-1 upset winner of the GII San Carlos H. last out, Pico Central can make some noise here if able to duplicate that effort.

But Aidan O'Brien has reported that it is "so far so good" for likely favorite One Cool Cat (Storm Cat). Last year's G1 Phoenix S. and G1 National S. scorer may be joined by Grand Reward (Storm Cat) and Antonius Pius (Danzig) at Newmarket.

Upcoming Guineas Preps

Juddmonte's **Three Valleys** (Diesis {GB}) is set to reappear in Thursday's G3 Craven S. at Newmarket, where he is likely to take on his G1 Dewhurst S. conqueror **Milk it Mick (GB)** (Millkom {GB}) and G3 Horris Hill S. scorer **Peak to Creek (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}). "All being well, and as long as the ground is suitable, Three Valleys will run," Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe told the *Racing Post*. "[Trainer Roger Charlton] is pleased with his progress and, when I went to see the colt the other day, he looked in tiptop shape, having grown a little and filled out nicely." Next Sunday's Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial could be the target for His Highness the Aga Khan's **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift).
