On an afternoon when speed was king at Aqueduct, Ron Winchell's **Tapit** (Pulpit) came from 11th and last early on to take a blanket finish in an exciting renewal of the GI Wood Memorial. The grey colt, trained by



Michael Dickinson, found the line a half length to the good of Master David (Grand Slam), whose nose quite possibly knocked Eddington (Unbridled) out of a spot in the Kentucky Derby. It has been a tumultuous spring for last year's GIII Laurel Futurity hero Tapit, who was to have returned in the GIII Risen Star S. in mid-Febru-

ary, but was forced to skip the event when he missed some training. Sixth in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 13, he emerged from the race with a lung infection and was at one point a longshot to make the Wood. Toyota Blue Grass S. cont. An Underrated Juvenile...

A debut winner at Saratoga Aug. 24, **The Cliff's Edge** was third, placed second, in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile Sept. 13 before finishing sixth to stablemate Eurosilver in Keeneland's GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity Oct. 4. A relatively fresh horse, the bay ran the table at the Churchill fall meet, winning the GIII Iroquois S. by 7 3/4 lengths Nov. 2 and ending the year with a game 3/4-length score in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 29.

Tough Luck at Three...

In an effort to keep his sophomore colts away from one another, trainer Nick Zito opted to ship The Cliff's Edge to Tampa for the Sam F. Davis S. Feb. 21. Drawn in the 11-hole that afternoon, the colt endured a nightmarish wide trip and looped up into contention in the stretch, but yielded late to be second. Wheeled back in the GI Florida Derby three weeks later, the \$200,000 Keeneland September yearling bumped with a rival while trying to make a late run and settled for a solid third-place finish. It was six years ago that Zito saddled Halory Hunter to an upset victory over heavily favored Lil's Lad. Could he play the role of spoiler again?

Edging the Chalk...

Favored Lion Heart was sent for the lead, as expected, but was forced three wide around the first turn as GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner Limehouse (Grand Slam) and GII San Felipe S. hero Preachinatthebar (Silver Charm) were intent on preventing the choice from securing the inside. Lion Heart opened up on the front end with three-eighths to run, but The Cliff's Edge began to advance approaching the stretch, angled out three wide for the drive and caught Lion Heart in the waning strides. "I waited a little longer than I normally would with him," winning jockey Shane Sellers confessed. "The other horse dug in when we came to him, but we were able to draw away at the end." 


When Badge of Silver (Silver Deputy) was scratched on the morning of the Carter with a foot bruise, it seemed as though the Grade I event would turn into a runaway for odds-on favorite Strong Hope. But Pico Central, a Brazilian-bred now based in California, turned



in a game performance on the front end to deny the crowd's choice. The handsome dark bay won a pair of Group 1 events in his native land and took just seven months to acclimate to Northern Hemisphere time. He crossed the line second in his U.S. bow, a \$100,000 optional claimer going 6 1/2 furlongs at Santa Anita Jan. 25, but was

put up to first via disgualification. Dismissed at 43-1 in the GII San Carlos H. Mar. 7, he led at every call, earning a 113 Beyer Speed Figure, and was the distant second choice at 4-1 while shipping to New York. Don Six (Wild Escapade) had a head in front of him through a :21 3/5 opening guarter, but the Brazilian took the advantage back while scorching a half in :43 2/5. As Don Six dropped back turning for home, Strong Hope loomed a serious danger under a motionless John Velazquez, but Pico Central would have none of it. Fighting back along the rail under Alex Solis, he reclaimed the lead in deep stretch and edged clear crossing the wire. The time was just a tick off the stakes and track record set by Artax in 1999. "It sure was fast and this is an amazing horse," said Solis. "It was a good stretch duel between two good horses; luckily, mine had the bigger heart today. I think he might be a star in the rising." The top two may have a rematch in the GI Met Mile May 31 at Belmont. "I thought our horse ran super," said Todd Pletcher, trainer of the runner-up. 
