SPOTLIGHT ON KEENELAND

The runaway juvenile sales express makes a stop today in Kentucky for the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Lexington. Already this year, six youngsters have attracted seven figures at the three

major U.S. breeze-up sales, with a world record for a colt set and then broken at Fasig-Tipton Calder, and a world mark for a filly reached at Barretts March. "The two-year-old market is very buoyant," Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said. "There are a couple of major players that haven't bought at two-year-old sales in the past, and they are now. And some people who weren't able to buy in September are looking to get

back in the market--hopefully they'll be active Tuesday." Keeneland is obliging those looking to get back in action with a strong catalog of 265 horses, which includes three two-year-olds and seven horses of racing age from the dispersal of the estate of Jeanne Vance. "We're very pleased with the catalog," Russell said. Bidding for the one-day sale begins at 1:30 p.m.

Keeneland Cancels Preview...

Keeneland officials canceled vesterday's under tack preview after Hip #161, a filly by Pulpit--Miss Nance (Blushing John) broke down and had to be euthanized after working a furlong over a rain-drenched track. Consigned by Wavertree Stables, she worked a furlong in :10 4/5, but was injured as she galloped out around the first turn. Only nine horses had breezed when the accident happened. "I think there was nothing else they could do," Seguel Bloodstock's Becky Thomas said of the decision to cancel. "Do I think it's a bad track? No. But in a situation like this, I think it's in the interest of the horses, the consignors and the sale's company to cancel. Unfortunately, horses break down at racetracks all across the country. But this was a no-win situation. If anything else happened, people would blame the consignors and the sale's company for sending them out there. So there was no choice but to cancel."

DOMINANT DANEHILL TOPS EASTER SALE

The Inglis Australian Easter catalogue traditionally reads like a Burke's peerage of the Australian Thoroughbred world, and the 2004 edition is no exception. The

late great Danehill and his multitude of sire sons account for 27 percent of 497 horses cataloqued for the three-day Sydney sale, to be held Apr. 13-15. "You can't look into the future, but I would be very surprised to see another stallion in my lifetime as dominant as Danehill," said Inglis Danehill Managing Director Reg Inglis.

"There is another crop, conceived in England, to come, but this is the last crop conceived here, and Australia is where Danehill has really dominated." Added Aushorse Chairman and Arrowfield chief John Messara, "It is a bit of a watershed sale, certainly as far as Danehill is concerned, and, having been involved in his launch, I will have mixed feelings. He has been super-dominant. One should never say 'never,' but it would take a mighty good horse to replace him." In the wake of Darley's A\$22 million outlay for MG1SW Exceed and Excel (Aus), interest in Danehill's sons will be whitehot, particularly as Australian study recognize that buying his colts off the racetrack is beyond their realm.

Easter Sunday...

Danehill is not the only sire whose progeny will be sorely missed at Easter. Arrowfield will offer three

yearlings by the late Sunday Silence, all produced as a result of the stud's project that sent mares to the stallion in Japan, then brought them back to the Hunter Valley to foal on Southern Hemisphere time. "It was an interesting experiment and, in time, it might prove to be something really worthwhile," Messara said. "From his Southern Hemisphere-conceived crops, Sunday Silence has had 10 starters here, nine winners and two stakes winners, and it

Keeneland April Preview cont. No Second Chance...

The cancellation of the Keeneland preview leaves horses who didn't perform last Monday well with no chance to redeem themselves. "Horses that didn't work well last week are going to be at a disadvantage," Becky Thomas said. "There were a couple I was looking forward to bringing back. But that's the luck of the draw. Keeneland tries so hard, but unfortunately, the weather in April is unpredictable. I've been here when it's been snowing, raining. I don't I think I've ever been here when there wasn't some kind of odd weather." Robert Scanlon, who has consigned 30 juveniles to the sale, including the horses who recorded bullet furlong and two-furlong works last week, also agreed with the cancellation. "It definitely should have been cancelled," Scanlon said. "The track is not bad, but there is a lot of water on it. And it's not like breezing older horses on it. These are two-year-olds and they've probably never seen anything like this. And they're not shod for it. It's best not to jeopardize the horses. This is horrible weather, but it's April in Kentucky."

Nothing But the Best...

There will be a slew of top sires represented at Keeneland, including Deputy Minister, Distorted Humor, El Prado (Ire), Gone West, Grand Slam, Pulpit, Saint Ballado, Seattle Slew, Stravinsky, Tale of the Cat, Thunder Gulch, Unbridled and Unbridled's Song. Stallions with their first crop of two-year-olds in the catalog include Cat Thief (Storm Cat), Chief Seattle (Seattle Slew), Commendable (Gone West), Dixie Union (Dixieland Band), Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), High Yield (Storm Cat), Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), Lion Hearted (Storm Cat), Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy), Vicar (Wild Again) and War Chant (Danzig). Young sires Fusaichi Pegasus and Stephen Got Even have already made a splash this auction season. Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus was represented by the \$4.5-million world-record juvenile at Fasig-Tipton, while a colt by Stephen Got Even sold for \$3.1 million at that same sale.

Action High at Keeneland...

Keeneland's April sale has already attracted plenty of attention from potential buyers. "We had good attendance Monday, the barns have been busy and we've been sending out DVDs and videos ever since. All the right people are here. Hopefully people will see something they like," Geoffrey Russell said. Southern California trainer Jim Chapman, of Chapman Farm, has noticed an increased in the action ahead of the auction. "This is my first year selling two-year-olds at Keeneland," Chapman said. "The catalog is strong and there has been a lot of activity here." Asked what buyers are looking for, Chapman added, "Fast works sell, and then if you have the pedigree and the horse and they all match, that's what they're looking for." Among the six horses in the Chapman Farm consignment is a half sister, by Fusaichi Pegasus, to Chapman's brilliant sprinter Caller One. Also impressed by the crowd at Keeneland is bloodstock agent Reiley McDonald of Eaton Sales. "From my view, just from eye-balling it, it's a very strong catalog," McDonald said. "But more than that, from watching them on the racetrack, they're a lot of really nice horses going around that circle at Keeneland. There are a lot of great sales specimens." Keeneland enjoyed a record April auction last year, with an all-time high gross of \$21,440,000 for 128 horses sold. Last year's average was \$167,500, second only to the 2002 figure of \$174,015.

Keeneland April Preview cont. Vance Dispersal Gets Underway...

A 10-horse contingent at Keeneland April is the first offering from the complete dispersal of the racing stock of the late Jeanne Vance. Vance, who died last December, campaigned champion and GI Belmont S. winner Lemon Drop Kid with her late husband Laddie Dance Jr. Eaton Sales is consignor for the group, which includes three two-year-olds and seven racing prospects. "We've had a lot of interest in the racehorses," said Eaton's Reiley McDonald. "We've been receiving a lot of calls, more than I've ever seen on a group of horses. There is a high demand for racehorses and these horses have been trained for their three-year-old careers and they're ready." The racing prospects, catalogued as lots 259 through 265, include Beaufort Scale (Storm Cat), a \$1million 2002 Keeneland September yearling out of a full sister to champion Banshee Breeze, and recent winners Ecclesiastic (Pulpit) and Inducement (Danzig). "Ecclesiastic had a great win at Keeneland the other day and Inducement looked like a real horse when he won his second start at Gulfstream," McDonald commented. Ecclesiastic pulled away to a four-length maiden victory racing 1 1/16 miles at Keeneland Apr. 2, while Inducement took an Apr. 1 turf maiden at Gulfstream. The dispersal added another winner when Munchkin (A.P. Indy) returned from a 19-month layoff to record a determined neck victory at Keeneland Saturday. The fouryear-old filly sold as a yearling for \$550,000 at the 2001 Keeneland July sale.

The Vance Two-Year-Olds...

The trio of two-year-olds in the Vance dispersal are all well-bred, but buyers have not yet had the chance to see them strut their stuff on the racetrack. "Because of the way it happened, with the passing of Ms. Vance and the timing of everything, we didn't feel we had enough time to work them," McDonald explained. "In the best interest of the horses and the estate, we decided not to work them." The bloodstock agent thinks the lack of workouts could prove a bargain for potential buyers. "This could represent a good buying opportunity," McDonald said. "Everyone is looking for the :10 1/5 work. These horses aren't ready for that and that could make them a better buying opportunity for someone." Foxglove (Fusaichi Pegasus), Hip 208, is one of the standout two-year-olds in the dispersal. The dark bay is out of Rokeby Rosie (Prized), a half sister to champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) and to Garden Secrets, the dam of Grade I winner Forest Secrets (Forest Wildcat). The colt sold for \$900,000 at last summer's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. "The Fusaichi Pegasus is a lovely horse," McDonald said. "He's very attractive as his price would indicate. I remember when he went through the ring [at Fasig-Tipton], Wayne Lukas said to me, 'This is the best physical I've seen.' I looked at him in the ring and I just fell in love with him." McDonald added, "There is also a Lemon Drop Kid that sold at Fasig-Tipton for \$500,000 who is a nice horse and a Pulpit that is really training right." Hip 36, Plunkit (Lemon Drop Kid), is out of April Starlight (Storm Bird), while Hip 18, Evangelism (Pulpit), is out of Willa Joe (Ire) (El Gran Senor). McDonald added that Hip 52, Gingerbread Man (Lemon Drop Kid), had to be scratched from the sale after injuring himself when he lost his rider on the track last week.

Keeneland April Preview cont. Another Classic Contender?

Last spring, Niall Brennan consigned a half brother to Hip 45 to the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale. That colt sold for \$320,000 and became graded stakes winner and top Kentucky Derby contender Read the Footnotes (Smoke Glacken). Brennan sees similiarites between Read the Footnotes and his two-year-old half brother by Stravinsky. "They both have a lot of quality; they are similarly made," Brennan said. "Read the Footnotes is a bit taller and has a little more scope. Being from the Nureyev and Northern Dancer line, [the two-year-old] is a little more compact, more a quarter-horse type, so while there are a lot of similarities, Read the Footnotes is a bit lengthier and scopier. They are both very professional and nice to be around and certainly have a lot of class." The May 6 foal was scratched from Fasig-Tipton's February sale to give him the chance to mature. "It was strictly a decision to give him more time to develop," Brennan explained. "I sold Read the Footnotes at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale in May and he grew quite a lot from March to April. This one is a little typier colt, being by Stravinsky, so I just went with my gut feeling to give him a little more time. Whether that was a good or bad decision, we'll find out Tuesday." The bay colt worked a furlong Apr. 5 in :10 4/5. "We were a bit disappointed with his first breeze and I know it's kind of a weird excuse, but he didn't seem to handle the track," Brennan admitted. "It's been a cuppier track than normal, as you've seen from the races during the first week. He just didn't seem to be at his best and wants a firmer surface. He's got beautiful action and his brother is obviously a very good horse. He's only a May foal, but I have a lot of confidence."

The filly has now won four of six starts with her only defeats coming when fourth behind Island Fashion in the Dec. 27 GI La Brea and fourth behind Victory Encounter in the Jan. 18 GII El Encino S. The two-year-old sold for \$50,000 at Keeneland September.

Hip 44, f, Fusaichi Pegasus-Baltic Sea, by Danzig Consigned by Chapman Farm

A May 23 foal, she is from the first crop of Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) and is a half to multiple graded stakes winner Caller One, who captured the Dubai Golden Shaheen in 2001 when it was a Group 3 race and again in 2002 when it was a Group 1. Chapman Farm purchased the filly for \$125,000 at last year's Keeneland September Yearling Sale. "She was a small filly," Jim Chapman said of the two-year-old. "I think she was overlooked a little because of her size and she's a late foal. And I thought, at that price, it was a good deal." Given the winter to mature, the filly will go through the ring again Tuesday. "She's grown and she still has a lot of growing to do, but she's turned into a real nice filly. She reminds me a lot of Caller One. They both have the same attitude," Chapman said. The bay is also a half sister to graded stakes winner Prospect Bay (Crafty Prospector) and multiple stakes placed Silver Dollar Kids (Meadowlake).

Hip 63, c, Silver Deputy--Classique, by Pleasant Colony Consigned by Robert Scanlon, agent

The dark bay colt is the first foal of the unraced mare Classique, who is a full sister to Fly North, the dam of champion three-year-old filly Farda Amiga (Broad Brush). The juvenile worked an eighth of a mile Apr. 5 in :10 4/5.

He sold for \$160,000 at Keeneland September.



Easter Preview cont. International Appeal...

The Easter catalogue has increasing international appeal, with Danzig stallions like Anabaa, Agnes World and Belong to Me complemented by vibrant sirelines that are relatively new here. More Than Ready, Singspiel (Ire) and High Yield are among first-crop sires who carry the burden of providing genetic diversity. But, with a new emphasis on Mr. Prospector, Fusaichi Pegasus may well head a changing of the guard in Australia, and he has certainly been given every opportunity. The first crop by Fu Peg rocketed away to a A\$197,292 average and a top price of A\$320,000 at Magic Millions and his Easter draft rivals that of Danehill. He has yearlings from Cox Plate winner Dane Ripper (Aus), Golden Slipper winner Burst (Aus) and Group 1 winners Canny Lass (Aus), Credit Account (NZ), Danendri (Aus), Danglissa (Aus) and Dashing Eagle (Aus). Darley's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas winner King's Best is another Mr. Prospector-line representative. His Magic Millions crop averaged a respectable A\$122,273, an average that will look an exceedingly good value if his 31 Easter yearlings are as popular as was his Magic Millions draft. Although the Easter sale clashes with the Keeneland April sale, Australasia's majors have reflected acrossthe-board buyer optimism in 2004 and John Messara said he expected unprecedented international interest in Sydney. "Aushorse is at least partly responsible for the broadening of the buying bench, because we've been out there encouraging buyers, but we are also seeing increased interest because our horses are performing well on an international stage," Messara remarked. "If the sale is up 5 to 10 percent, I would be pretty happy--I hope that would be achievable."

Young gun John O'Shea, formerly among Gai Waterhouse's foremen at Tulloch Lodge, thwarted a bid by Waterhouse to break her father's record of six Doncaster H. wins when tenacious Private Steer won Australasia's richest mile race in astonishing fashion. The G1 Stradbroke H. winner, who normally races in touch with the leaders, was inexplicably last in running yesterday, but managed to weave her way through the field. Defending champ Grand Armee made a powerful charge to the line, but, as jockey Glen Boss waved cheekily to the crowd, Private Steer drove past in the final yards to win comfortably. O'Shea admitted he abandoned all hope when he saw the mare so far back. "I don't know what happened," he said. "The horse didn't want to go, she got hampered...that was the way it ended up, and I just gave up. I said there was no way she could win. I honestly didn't believe it until she went over the line. Grand Armee is a great horse and you don't give a horse like that 10 lengths start and run him down. It was pretty impressive really, wasn't it?" Boss, who won the G1 AJC Derby and the G1 Sires Produce S. Saturday, also thought his chances were ruined when he was shuffled to the rear from a wide barrier. "Before the turn, I thought I had no hope at all, but I decided to ride her patiently and ride her for runs because I could not go wide, and she went from an absolutely impossible position to winning," he said. Private Steer was an A\$18,000 purchase at a Magic Millions country sale. Widden Stud will offer her dam Lisheenowen, in foal to Danehill Dancer (Ire), at the upcoming Inglis Broodmare Sale.

Before I go any further, I think it might be worthwhile prefacing today's article with a reminder of where the last two winners of the Kentucky Derby came from. The 2002 star, War Emblem, is by Our Emblem, a Mr. Prospector horse who never won beyond a mile and who put up his best efforts when very narrowly beaten in two Grade I events over seven furlongs. Then came Funny Cide. His sire, Mr. Prospector's grandson Distorted Humor, never won beyond a mile and is perhaps best known for setting a track record in winning the GII Churchill Downs H. over seven furlongs.

In other words, it is clearly possible to worry too much about a possible lack of stamina in potential Derby contenders, which is just as well this year, when the top 12 contenders by graded earnings include sons of Gulch, Elusive Quality, Grand Slam, Tale of the Cat, Smoke Glacken, Wild Rush, Carson City and Langfuhr. While several of these stallions ran creditably beyond a mile, they largely ended up as sprinter-milers, with races like the Breeders' Cup Sprint, Carter H., Vosburgh S. and Metropolitan H. figuring in their resumés.

The question is going to be whether the sons of these speed influences are going to be strong enough in the final eighth of a mile in a field which could contain Friends Lake and Castledale.

These Grade I-winning sons of A.P. Indy and Peintre Celebre both have pedigrees which suggest they could improve again when they try a mile and a quarter. The same could possibly be said of the Wood Memorial winner Tapit. With A.P. Indy and Unbridled as his grandsires and a Nijinsky mare as his second dam, Tapit must have every chance of repeating the strong finish which brought him success three days ago (even though he is inbred 3x4 to Mr. Prospector and has a dam closely related to the champion sprinter Rubiano).

Another who has demonstrated his ability to finish strongly is The Cliff's Edge, even though the Blue Grass S. winner's parentage--by Gulch out of a daughter of Danzig--doesn't exactly shout mile-and-a-quarter excellence.

Gulch himself won the Wood Memorial prior to finishing sixth in the Kentucky Derby, fourth in the Preakness and a remote third in the Belmont. However, he is now 20 years old and we know that--given help from a stoutly bred mare--he can sire some very good middle-distance horses, such as Thunder Gulch (Kentucky Derby and Belmont S.), Nayef (Dubai Sheema Classic), Wallenda (Super Derby) and Scrimshaw. The lastnamed finished only 11th in last year's Derby after winning the Lexington S., but bounced back to finish third in the Preakness.

Thunder Gulch, Nayef and Wallenda all had a dam or second dam sired by horses which tackled distances of one and three-quarter miles or more in England, but The Cliff's Edge doesn't enjoy the benefit of an obvious stamina source in his immediate ancestry. His dam Zigember is by Danzig out of Red Ember, a Crimson Satan mare who won the California Oaks over a mile and a sixteenth. Zigember herself is an Elmendorf-bred who failed to hit the first three in any of her four starts

It is encouraging, though, that Zigember is closely related to Ziggy's Act, a winner of the GIII Pucker Up S. over a mile and an eighth on turf. Ziggy's Act was sired by Danzig from Red Ember's half-sister Comedy Act, who won the GI Santa Barbara H. over a mile and a quarter a year after finishing third in the same race. *Pedigree Insights cont. p9*

The fact that Comedy Act was well suited by that distance, even though she was by the champion sprinter Shecky Greene, suggests that there must be some stamina in her dam, Jacinto's unraced daughter Everglow. Sure enough, Everglow was a half to Oil Power, who won the 1 1/2-mile Lawrence Realization S., and Spout, winner of the Alabama S. Interestingly, Oil Power was by Crimson Satan, who sired Red Ember from Everglow. In other words, The Cliff's Edge's second dam had the potential to stay quite well.

As you would expect in an Elmendorf mare, you quickly come to some quality performers. The Cliff's Edge's fourth dam, Strike Oil, was a half to Oil Royalty, a very accomplished mare who also numbered a win in the Santa Barbara H. among her triumphs. Trace the female line back to The Cliff's Edge's seventh dam, Summer Time, and you'll find that she was a sister to Bull Lea. This celebrated stallion won the Blue Grass S. 68 years before his distant relative took the same race and then sired three winners of the Kentucky Derby.

The Cliff's Edge is bred to a similar pattern to Distorted Humor, sire of last year's Derby winner Funny Cide, in that they were both sired by sons of Mr. Prospector from daughters of Danzig. He is also bred along the same lines as Gulch's Kentucky Derby-winning son Thunder Gulch, in that they are both by Gulch out of granddaughters of Northern Dancer.

Roughly a third of Gulch's racing age progeny, to the end of last year, were sired from mares by sons of Northern Dancer. Significantly, this type of mating had achieved a strike rate of nearly 10-percent stakes winners, compared to Gulch's overall figure of 7.5 percent. In addition to Thunder Gulch and The Cliff's Edge, his 21 stakes winners out of mares by sons of Northern Dancer include the Classic-winning English filly Harayir (1000 Guineas), the highly successful Japanese colt Eagle Café and that smart turf filly Mariensky.

The Cliff's Edge, a graduate of Stonerside Stable, bids to become the seventh member of the Mr. Prospector male line to win the Derby in the space of 10 years. While I can't quite see him winning, he should be running on when others are crying enough.



GREAT EXPECTATIONS

A Golden Age has passed--that's not really up for discussion. We've all known it was coming, and now it has happened. The three great Triple Crown winners of the Seventies--Secretariat, Seattle Slew, and Affirmed-all dead now. The great sires of the last 30 years--Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector--and many other Top 10 sires, like Seattle Slew, Unbridled, Danehill--all

dead; and the ones that are left are in their 20s--<u>Danzig</u> (27), <u>Sadler's Wells</u> (23), even <u>Storm Cat</u> (21). The only true Top 10 sires in their teens are <u>A.P. Indy</u> (15) and <u>Kingmambo</u> (14)—and for both of them, the test as to whether they are 'just' top racehorse sires, or whether they will be long-term influences because their sons make successful sires—is about to begin.

As far as a new generation of top sires

goes, one of two things is going to happen. Most observers believe that one horse will emerge to seize the mantle as the "world's top sire," as Storm Cat most recently did, when Mr. Prospector faded and Danzig approached 25 himself. This is the more comfortable scenario, because that sort of identifiable hierarchy is what we're used to; we already know the marketplace can recognize and absorb that kind of development efficiently. But the other possibility--less certain, more unsettling--is that the distribution of power could change, that the top sires will not dominate so much as they have throughout the history of Thoroughbred breeding, but that class will, in a way, devolve. In this scenario a larger group of sires would be not so far in front of their contemporaries in the production of top horses--6 percent stakes winners, say, instead of 10 percent.

If this scenario proves to be the case, the market is likely to be slow to adjust, meaning inflated prices for horses who don't deserve them, and relative bargains among stallions who should be recognized as at least borderline top-grade, but aren't. It could pan out that way.

Every group of freshman sires is important (how else would buyers know who to buy record two-year-olds by?), but this year's freshman sires constitute a group

that is monumentally important; or rather, four of them do. Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Lemon Drop Kid, and War Chant all went to stud at fees of \$75,000 or more (all four stand for reduced fees now), and among them represent the best chance for years for a superstar young stallion or two to emerge. Yes, the likes of Pivotal (first foals 1998), Unbridled's Song (1998), Singspiel (1999), Grand Slam and friends (2000), Fasliyev and Cape Cross (2001) are all very promising young sires. But this year's group are what we used to call top 'summer sale'

sires; mind you, there are no summer sales anymore-maybe there aren't summer sale sires, either. This group might tell us.

Ironically, this group's first crop was badly affected by MRLS in 2001-02, or, to be precise, we assume the three out of the four who were standing in America were. Giant's Causeway stood his first season in Ireland, and he has 149 foals registered in his first crop. Since that is 61 more than Fusaichi Pegasus, in second place with 81, Giant's Causeway starts the season with a huge numerical advantage over his contemporaries. No doubt MRLS stopped Fusaichi Pegasus from having more than 100 foals, but at least he still does have 88; Lemon Drop Kid has 57, and War Chant 53.

All right, 10 years ago those would have been a normal crop size, but in this day and age, they're at a big disadvantage. Their crops are barely a third the size of Giant's Causeway's.

Let's just briefly 'refresh our recollection', as we learned to say in the O.J. trial, about the leading contenders for superstardom from this group of sires:

FUSAICHI PEGASUS: \$4-million yearling, Kentucky Derby winner, \$60-something million stallion. By Mr. Prospector out of a Danzig mare. Ran a Beyer 111 winning the Wood, a 108 in the Derby, career best 115 (estimated Timeform 127) in the Jerome. Half his 88 first crop sold as yearlings, 44 averaging \$316,423. Not especially precocious (second in his only start at two), though out of a very fast and precocious mare.

GIANT'S CAUSEWAY: Bred by Messrs. Magnier and Tabor, who had bought Mariah's Storm carrying him for \$2.6-million at the 1996 Keeneland November sale. He won all three of his starts at two, including the G1 Prix de la Salamandre (Timeform 119p). After winning the G3 Gladness S. first time out at three, he was beaten in both the English and Irish 2000 Guineas, then reeled off five consecutive Gr 1 wins at 1m. and 10f., beginning with the St. James's Palace at Royal Ascot and ending with the Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. Upset by Observatory in the Queen Elizabeth, then beaten a head by Tiznow in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic; Timeform 132. Nicknamed 'The Iron Horse', and deserved it: 13 career starts, for nine wins and four seconds.

LEMON DROP KID: One of two top-class sons of Kingmambo to have his first two-year-olds this year, the other being the English 2000 Guineas winner in 2000, King's Best. Lemon Drop Kid was a New York GI winner on dirt at two, three, and four (he won five New York GIs in all), and is out of a Seattle Slew mare who is actually a 3/4-sister to A.P. Indy; LDK himself certainly looks and throws much more Seattle Slew than Kingmambo. He's from probably Lane's End's very best family; his yearlings impressed everyone so much even a few Europeans bought them.

WAR CHANT: By Danzig out of triple G1 winner and champion Hollywood Wildcat, by Kris S. out of a Mr.

Prospector mare. War Chant, like Fusaichi Pegasus, was trained by Neil Drysdale. He ran seven times in his life, the first five on dirt, the last two on turf. He broke his maiden in his only start at two over 6f, then won an allowance and the GII San Rafael at Santa Anita before running second to The Deputy in the GI Santa Anita Derby. He

took his chance in the Derby, but was only ninth behind stablemate Fusaichi Pegasus. War Chant didn't reappear until October, when he won the GII Oak Tree Mile in his first start on the grass, then went off the lukewarm 7-2 favorite for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs, came from the clouds, and got up to get the money.

As candidates for superstardom go, a pretty interesting group; but there are more than 50 other freshman sires with 20 or more foals in North America this year, and our budding superstars have to contend not just with each other, but with quite a few other horses with the same sort of credentials possessed by some very successful, originally \$10,000 stallions like that sizzling 2000 group with Grand Slam, <u>Distorted Humor</u>, <u>Elusive Quality</u>, Tale of the Cat, and Wild Rush.

In the breeding game, the supporting cast has a habit of upstaging the stars, and in particular there were four other North American stallions with 30+ yearlings sold for six-figure averages. Two of the four are, like Giant's Causeway, by Storm Cat, and the 1999 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Cat Thief did particularly well at the sales, with 35 yearlings averaging \$172,114, almost five times his \$35,000 stud fee. He won only four of 30 career starts, but that did include two GI wins and nine GI placings, with earnings over \$3.9-million. He was very tough and sound, and his yearlings impressed the buyers. *Cont. p3*

The other three sires with six-figure averages were: Golden Missile, a GI-winning son of A.P. Indy (34, averaged \$124,882); High Yield, a triple GI winner by Storm Cat (44, averaged \$114,030); and the very good-looking Dixie Union, a G1-winning son of Dixieland Band whose 34 yearlings averaged \$112,050.

As there are no fewer than 57 North American stallions with 20 or more two-year-olds in their first crops this year, there will be no shortage of other names to mention as the year goes on. One who has already hit a home run ball is Stephen Got Even, who had a \$3.1-million two-year-old briefly hold the world record; by A.P. Indy, he's got a little bit of a cult following already. But one stallion has the best credentials I've ever seen to sire early two-year-olds: More Than Ready. He won four stakes between 5-6 furlongs before the end of July, winning the Flash S. at Belmont in :57:0 flat (Beyer 102), the 5 1/2 -furlong GIII Tremont in 1:02:2, and the six-furlong GIII Sanford. He ran a Beyer 105 in both the Tremont and the Sanford; I don't remember ever seeing a horse run as high as 100 in either. More Than Ready's sire Southern Halo was just an average sire up north, but he was Champion Sire in Argentina about five times, and was a particularly good two-year-old and speed sire. More Than Ready has outstanding credentials to make an early impression.

These industry leaders are going on record with their opinions about this year's group of freshman sires

Mike Ryan Mike Ryan Bloodstock

This is a deep group of freshman sires, as deep as we've seen in a long time. They are very solid from top to bottom.

- 1. FUSAICHI PEGASUS His two-year-olds are very well-grown individuals. They are naturally talented, gifted athletes who are precocious mentally; they are very smart. I think they will be good two-year-olds who can carry their speed. As a group, they all have size and stretch and are good movers. They all seem to have tremendous natural energy.
- 2. STEPHEN GOT EVEN We bought his two highestpriced yearlings [in 2003] and they haven't disappointed. [Note: Ryan purchased a colt out of Blacktie Bid for \$157,000 at Fasig-Tipton July; the colt brought \$3.1 million at Fasig-Tipton Calder in February]. They are solid individuals and are very stout. They are mature mentally now, but they will develop into two-turn horses. I think they have lots of natural pace which they will be able to carry a distance. We had three this year and I liked all three. They are very genuine, very willing horses who are graceful movers. The one we sold to John Ferguson-what a spectacular individual! He had a lot of class and he displayed it on the track.
- 3. <u>LEMON DROP KID</u> I haven't seen many of them at this year's sales, but they were a very strong group of yearlings [in 2003], and I wished I'd seen more. They are solid individuals: great muscle, great bone, great substance. He covered a very good book of mares. I think you'll see them come around in late summer and into the fall.

Best Value: CHIEF SEATTLE - I was very impressed with his first crop. He seems to be quite dominant as a stallion; they all look like him. They are racy individuals with lots of natural speed and ability. They impressed me both as yearlings and as two-year-olds.

In a year where you can make an argument for many young stallions to excel in their new careers, it was very difficult to narrow it down to three, plus a "dark horse" selection. My choices are Giant's Causeway, Yankee Victor, Golden Missile and Precise End.

- 1. GIANT'S CAUSEWAY Has everything you could ask for and more in a sire. He has looks, pedigree, and a fantastic race record. He just missed to Tiznow in the 2000 Breeders' Cup Classic in his only effort on dirt. His G1 wins on the turf overseas were very impressive. And remember, he was a perfect three for three as a juvenile. With a foal crop of at least 149 foals, we should learn very soon how good a sire Giant's Causeway is destined to be. He's the chalky selection. But given the Storm Cat sire line's propensity for preciousness, he should have the most juvenile winners come Dec. 31, 2004.
- 2. YANKEE VICTOR An interesting stallion prospect. Here is a GI-winning miler by Saint Ballado out of a

Caro mare and an outcross to Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector. His female family may appear a bit light to some. However, considering his second dam only produced four foals and the third dam produced GII winner Angel Island, an excellent producer in her own right, appearances may be

deceiving. Saint Ballado's record as a sire of sires is a work in progress. It may not be with his two-year-olds, but over time Yankee Victor can help establish Saint Ballado as a sire of sires.

3. **GOLDEN MISSILE** - A GI-winning son of A.P. Indy out of a Cure the Blues mare. He raced 25 times, with

five stakes wins and over \$2.1 million in earnings. His overall pedigree is intriguing; Golden Missile's female family shows six SWs in the first three dams. The jury is still out on A.P. Indy as a sire of sires. Like Yankee Victor, he is also free of Raise a Native and Northern Dancer. With the success of outcross stallions in

the past few seasons, Golden Missile has as much upside as any freshman sire in 2004. He too may be better recognized when his offspring turn three.

A longshot to watch in 2004 is **PRECISE END**. The son of End Sweep should get plenty of juvenile winners

and don't be surprised if he finishes near the top in that stat. The Forty Niner sire line continues to show a propensity for early maturity. With Precise End's solid racing career, he should be an exciting stallion offering great value for New York Breeders!

EUROPEAN SCENE BY ANDREW CAULFIELD

As so often these days, last year's race for freshman sire honors developed into a battle between the might of the Coolmore and Darley camps, with both being able to claim victory. Although the Coolmore-based Fasliyev comfortably headed the European prize-money table, it was Darley's Cape Cross who came out on top on the important Anglo-Irish table.

Another heavy-weight contest between the two camps looks likely this year, with Coolmore relying largely on the hard-hitting Giant's Causeway and Montjeu to triumph over Darley's power-packed pair of Dubai Millennium and King's Best.

Giant's Causeway commanded a fee of IR100,000gns in his only season in Ireland, where he covered nearly 180 mares. The universal admiration he generated on the track didn't extend to all of his first yearlings, with some judges complaining that he hadn't stamped his stock. I recall similar complaints about two other stallions. One, Caerleon, became champion sire in 1988 with only two crops on the track, and the other, Warning, headed a strong team of new sires in 1993!

I expect Giant's Causeway to silence his critics in the best possible way. With over 130 youngsters, he has numbers very much on his side and he has every right to sire quick-maturing individuals, having won all three of his juvenile starts, beginning in July.

The question is whether he can become the first major stallion son of Storm Cat. You would have to hope so, judging by the 1.8 million guineas paid for his weanling filly out of the Arc winner Urban Sea in 2002 and the 1,250,000 guineas paid by John Magnier for his daughter out of Colorsnap.

Sheikh Mohammed has placed his faith in the one and only crop by his magnificent but ill-fated Dubai Millennium: no fewer than 28 of the 56 members of this crop are listed among Godolphin's team, currently at Al Quoz stables in Dubai. Dubai Millennium's death at such a young age virtually guarantees that he will prove an excellent stallion and the omens have received a boost from the success enjoyed by several other stallion sons of Seeking the Gold.

It is tempting to think that Dubai Millennium's stock will not reach their peak at two, as he ran only once at that age and was at his best at four, but he has youngsters out of several excellent two-year-olds.

Lujain is another G1-winning son of Seeking The Gold among Darley's sizeable roster of new stallions. Although this good-looking horse trained off after winning the Middle Park S., he is well-qualified to sire plenty of winners among his 80 youngsters. Several are in training with David Loder and Mick Channon, two specialists in speedy juveniles.

There will be a lot of interest in the first runners by King's Best, a spectacular winner over Giant's Causeway in the 2000 Guineas before being injured on his next start. As a classic winner by Kingmambo, from a

red-hot family, King's Best received strong support and he has a first crop of 109. They sold for up to 775,000 guineas and many of them appear to be in the right hands. The 775,000-guinea colt is one of six juveniles that Sir Michael Stoute has by his former star, while Godolphin, David Loder and Jeremy Noseda all have five each, and Mick Channon has four.

Coolmore must be hoping that it is third time lucky with Montjeu, who follows Entrepreneur and King of Kings as

the third classic-winning son of Sadler's Wells to have stood at Coolmore/Ashford. The first two disappointed but Montjeu was a much better racehorse than either of them. His six G1 wins included the Arc and impressive victories in the Prix du Jockey-Club and Irish Derby, with Timeform rating him 137 at three and four. Montjeu proved popular in the sales ring, with his yearling sons in particular being well received. Even allowing for the fact that Montjeu won both his starts at two, anything that his progeny achieves this year will surely be just a prelude to bigger things in 2005.

Montjeu isn't the only outstanding middle-distance horse making his bow in 2004. Sinndar also won two Derbys and the Arc, suffering defeat only once in eight starts. The fact that Sinndar's fee has fallen from 30,000 euros in 2003 to 20,000 this year is an indication that his yearlings didn't all sell as well as expected. However, one of his fillies made 470,000 euros. It's in his favour that ten of his 72 representatives are owned by the Aga Khan, including sons of the top-class racemares Ebadiyla and Timarida.

I've got my fingers crossed that Sinndar will prove an excellent replacement for his sire Grand Lodge, who is also responsible for two other new sires in Raise a Grand and Indian Lodge.

This top-notch miler has 59 two-year-olds, whereas another Rathbarry stallion, the champion sprinter Namid, has 109. Like Indian Lodge, Namid was at his best as a four-year-old, but he was also a Group winner at two and he is the type of stallion whose stock could collect plenty of money in the rich sales-linked races. Although his opening fee was only IR7,000gns, Namid had a colt sold for 170,000 guineas and a filly for 250,000 euros. Expect a bold show from him.

Surprisingly, I haven't so far mentioned any stallions from the Danzig line, which is widespread in Europe. However, there are two Group-winning sons of Danzig in Mujahid and Monashee Mountain, plus two highly talented sons of Danehill, in Dansili and Indian Danehill.

Mujahid was 25-1 when he won the 1998 Dewhurst S., which proved to be the last win of his career. He started his stallion career at a fee of only £4,000, an attractive price for a good-looking Danzig colt out of a Storm Cat mare. A few good winners among his 54 juveniles could see that fee rise sharply.

Monashee Mountain's racing career also tailed off. He

started favorite for the French 2000 Guineas on the strength of four wins from four starts, but a muscle problem compromised his effort there. He could hardly be better bred, as a half-brother to Mineshaft, and he has a sizeable crop, sired at the modest fee of IR4,500gns.

Dansili has the attraction of being by a proven sire of sires in Danehill, as well as being a brother to Banks Hill

and Intercontinental and a 3/4-brother to Heat Haze. Very unlucky not to win the 2000 Breeders' Cup Mile, Dansili has proved very popular at Banstead Manor Stud. Khalid Abdullah has supported him strongly and the Juddmonte youngsters have gone into training with all the

Prince's top trainers, with Andre Fabre having a pair of very nice fillies in Changeable and Winter Silence. With a crop of 93, Dansili is definitely one to keep an eye on in the fall - especially as he comes from the same family as Bold Fact, who has had two winners from two runners, despite limited opportunities.

Indian Danehill, who has 42 juveniles, combines very good form with impressive bloodlines. Two other stallions from his family, Poliglote and Quest For Fame, have done well and three of Indian Danehill's yearlings sold for sums equivalent to over 120,000 dollars, off a IR7,000gns fee.

Then there's Bachir, a dual Guineas winner by Danzig's grandson Desert Style. He was sent to Japan after one season in Ireland. Dayjur's fast son Tipsy Creek has a crop of 40 to start with.

When it comes to siring quality two-year-olds, none

of the new stallions is better qualified than Xaar. His International Classification rating of 127 was the highest achieved by any juvenile in the last nine years and his wins in the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and G1 Dewhurst S. were mightily impressive. He also comes from the same fe-

male line as El Gran Senor. Xaar's yearlings met with mixed fortunes at the sales, but two made the equivalent of over 420,000 dollars.

As Machiavellian's sons Vettori and Titus Livius have done well at their level, his Dubai World Cup winner Almutawakel must be treated with respect. This well-bred horse started his career at only IR6,000gns, but two of his daughters sold for the equivalent of over \$170,000.

Other relatively inexpensive stallions to keep an eye on are Rossini, a 3/4-brother to Elusive Quality who won his first three starts including the G2 Prix Robert Papin; Bold Edge, a fast grandson of Sharpen Up whose yearlings made up to 135,000 guineas; and Trans Island, another grandson of Sharpen Up who is already off the mark.

Then there's Josr Algarhoud, Darshaan's fastest son who has four youngsters with his former trainer Mick Channon, and Lend A Hand. The latter, a very good sprinter-miler, has the handicap of an unfashionable sire but John Ferguson bought two of his sons for substantial prices.

France has a promising young sire in Sendawar, a top-class miler with excellent finishing speed. His 71 foals include eight belonging to the Aga Khan. There is also the 1998 Arc winner Sagamix.

So who is going to be my tip for first-crop honors in Britain and Ireland? The last few years has shown that G1 form at two years is very important and on that basis my vote has to go to Giant's Causeway.


