

PULPIT COLT SETS THE BAR AT KEENELAND

Just when it looked like the million-dollar extravaganza which had set the tone at the year's three previous juvenile sales would fail to materialize at Keeneland,



hip <u>124</u>, a bay colt by Pulpit out of Canadian stakes winner In My Cap (Vice Regent), reeled in a cool \$3.3-million at yesterday's April Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale. The final bid smashed the previous Keeneland record of \$2 million set in 1999 and is the second highest price ever paid for a juvenile at auction. Aisling Cross-Duignan, representing Coolmore advisor Demi O'Byrne, saw off Kendall-Jackson wine master Jess Jackson to secure

the May 19 foal from the family of GISW Albert the Great. The bay represents yet another pinhooking coup for bloodstock agent Mike Ryan, who gave just \$170,000 for the colt at last year's Keeneland September Sale. Like the Stephen Got Even colt, pinhooked by Ryan for \$3.1 million at Fasig-Tipton Calder, he was consigned by Niall Brennan. "He is an outstanding horse," Brennan boasted. "He showed tremendous ability and we thought very highly of him all year. He is a picture of the athlete." Added Ryan, "He was a late foal and his body had to catch up. He was like a teenager, but all the parts were there. He's grown up physically and muscled up." *(Cont. p2)*

the much-prized Danehill--Prawn Cocktail colt for an Australian record A\$2.2 million. Freedman would not reveal details of the syndicate behind the purchase, but Coolmore Australia manager Michael Kirwan indicated that Coolmore would remain a shareholder. "This horse has a lot of appeal, internationally, on pedigree, and a lot of people could see the value in him," said Freedman. "I don't know that there will be any higher than him; there is no better colt in the sale. Danehill and I have had a great relationship over the years, and I think it is probably fitting that I train one of his really good sons down here that has gone through the ring." Asked how much higher he was prepared to go, Freedman said, "I was down on my knees." (Cont. p6)

Another Feather in Ryan's Cap...

The profitable sale of the Pulpit was one of several successful transactions on the afternoon for Mike Ryan, who also sold a Deputy Minister colt out of Date Stone for \$450,000 (see p5) and a Grand Slam--Schematic filly for \$460,000. Not one to rest on his laurels or on the abundance of success he's had at juvenile sales this year, even he was surprised at how well the topper sold. "We never dreamt he'd bring \$3-million plus, but a lot of the top-end buyers were interested, so anything can happen," he commented. "He really is a very striking horse. He is the complete package; physically, conformation, pedigree, he's extremely impressive." Added the colt's consignor, "He is bred to be a classic horse. The State of the Union...

Team Coolmore was back in action later in the session when Aisling Duignan went up to \$1.4 million for hip <u>232</u>, a bay colt by Lane's End's freshman sire Dixie



Union out of Sneaky Quiet (Seeking the Gold), who won the Florida Oaks and placed in the GI Kentucky Oaks during her sophomore season. The immediate underbidder on the colt was New York bloodstock agent Brian Morgan, who was on the phone with client Joseph Allen. "The horse is the

complete package," said Duignan, who was representing Demi O'Byrne, currently in Australia for the Inglis Easter Sale. "We liked everything about him." Consigned by Solitary Oak Farm, headed by Danny Pate, the May foal was sold to Robert Lapenta's White Horse Stables for \$160,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. The colt, a half brother to GSP Hidden Truth (Danzig), recorded the co-fastest time for a quarter mile during the first breeze-up session April 5.

Keeneland April cont. Fulton Falls for Slew Filly...

Stan Fulton, whose lime green silks will be carried aboard Fire Slam in Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland, went to \$800,000 on behalf of his Fleetwood/N.W. Management for hip 227, a filly from the final crop of Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew. The dark bay filly is out of the graded stakes winner and 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies third She's a Devil Due (Devil His Due). "She's a classy individual," Fulton explained. "She really truly is. There is nothing not to like about her. She is a beautiful young lady. She galloped out strong and she's out of a stakes winner. That's the kind you want to buy." The filly, named She's a Devil Slew, worked a furlong Apr. 5 in :10 3/5. The youngster RNA'd at FTSAUG at \$240,000. She's A Devil Due won the GII Walmac Alcibiades S. at two prior to her Breeders' Cup performance. Third in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks the following season, she was unplaced in the GI Ashland S., but was retired and bred to Seattle Slew. She's A Devil due died last December after suffering complications from colic. She was not in foal at the time of her death.

Holding Down the Fort...

Peachtree Stable principle John Fort, sitting with his main trainer Todd Pletcher, purchased lot 111, a daughter of last year's leading freshman sire Stravinsky, for \$500,000. The pretty bay, who RNA'd at Keeneland September for \$100,000, worked a bullet :10 1/5 at the Apr. 5 preview. "I like the fact that she was the fastest horse in the sale to begin with," Fort explained. "She worked against the bias at a time when horses were working much slower than people anticipated. She worked very fast." Asked what he liked about the filly, Fort said, "She's got a great top line and a great head. She's a very feminine filly with a great hip and muscle way down into the gaskin. She's just Peachtree's kind of horse. She's a smaller version of Cherry Bomb." Three-year-old filly Cherry Bomb (Honor Grades), now a winner of two of three, captured a Keeneland allowance last week.

Chace Busy for the Joneses...

Buzz Chace, racing manager for Aaron and Marie Jones, who was also an underbidder on the \$3.3-million sales-topping colt, walked away a winner after bidding \$750,000 on lot 208, a son from the first crop of Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus. The dark bay colt, named Foxglove, was part of the dispersal of the late Jeanne Vance, who purchased him for \$900,000 at last summer's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga August sale. "He's got a two-turn pedigree and he was a nice individual," Chace said of the purchase. "He just looked like an athlete." None of the two-year-olds from the dispersal worked during the under-tack show, but Chace thinks that might be a good thing for this Apr. 26 foal. "This is a horse who did not work, which is in our favor, I guess, because a big horse like him, he's not going to be early anyway. But he galloped beautiful. He's a very good mover. He's smooth and has a nice long stride. We just liked the way he moved." The juvenile is out of Rokeby Rosie (Prized), a half sister to champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy). Asked if expected the \$750,000 price tag, Chace admitted, "I thought we'd have to pay a little more because he's such a nice individual and a lot of people liked him." Ready for one final purchase toward the end of the session, Chace signed the ticket on hip 217, a full brother to GIII Pennsylvania Derby third-place getter Ashmore. Purchased on behalf of the Joneses for \$475,000, he was consigned by Tony Bowling and Bobby Dodd. "He is a big beautiful horse and we really liked him," said Chace. "They were really disappointed back at the barn with the way the colt worked last time [in :22.1 on Apr. 5], but I think that worked it our favor." Chace confirmed that all of the purchases will be trained by Todd Pletcher.

For Moore, The More the Merrier...

Investment banker and industry newcomer David S. Moore stepped back up to the plate yesterday, bidding \$450,000 for hip 75, a colt by Deputy Minister out of the Forty Niner mare Date Stone. Consigned by Niall Brennan, agent, the dark bay is a three-quarter brother to multiple stakes winner and dual graded-stakes placed Deputy Warlock (Silver Deputy). "Obviously, I liked the colt's conformation and pedigree," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He is well bred and I expect him to go two turns. Basically, we liked the whole package." A resident of Summit, New Jersey, Moore, added, "We think we bought the best horse at this sale." A fresh face on the scene at last year's sale, Moore, with the help of Pletcher and pedigree advisor Eddie Rosen, plucked GII Illinois Derby winner Pollard's Vision (Carson City) and graded-stakes placed Hermione's Magic (Forest Wildcat) out of the catalog. As for the colt's future, Pletcher added, "I wouldn't think he's an early-maturing type of horse, but I hope to have him ready for Saratoga."



Pulpit Colt tops Vance Horses of Racing Age...

A draft of seven horses of racing age from Phase I of the dispersal of the thoroughbred holdings of the late Jeanne Vance closed out yesterday's activity. Out of luck earlier in the day on the \$1.4-million Dixie Union colt, agent Brian Morgan, representing owner Joseph Allen, outlasted the competition at \$775,000 for hip 261, named Ecclesiastic. By Pulpit out of stakes winner and Grade I stakes placed Starry Dreamer (Rubiano), the bay recently broke his maiden going 1 1/16 miles at Keeneland Apr. 2. "His last work really impressed us," said Morgan. "He ran as good a Ragozin number in his last race as any three-year-old this year. We have a lot of confidence in him and we think he'll turn into a nice graded stakes horse." According to Morgan, the threeyear-old, who is likely to remain in allowance company for the moment, will be sent to the barn of trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. Inducement (Danzig), a recent maiden winner over the Gulfstream turf, sold for \$450,000 to Centennial Farm while Munchkin (A.P. Indy), who graduated at Keeneland on Blue Grass day, went to Mrs. Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation for \$425,000. The dispersal's trio of two-year-old prospects, including \$750,000 Foxglove, grossed \$1,265,000.

A Record-Setting Performance...

Not only did the sale record the first and third-best selling juveniles in the history of the sale, but the average for the main body of the sale (\$217,941) easily surpassed the old record of \$174,015 from 2002 and improved on last year's results by a whopping 29.5 percent. The buyback rate was up, something that was not entirely unexpected, according to Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We were fearful of [high buybacks] going into the sale because of not having the gallop show yesterday," he confirmed. "So we were fearful. In the end it was a very successful exercise and like Niall Brennan said, 'It was a whole lot of fun.' When you have Jess Jackson, Darely and Coolmore all bidding against each other, you just don't know where it's going to end. Thank God for telephones to Australia [O'Byrne bidding from down under]." In the end, sales officials were pleased to see the general tenor of the juvenile market carry over to Keeneland. "Going in, the two-year-old market was very strong--I think I used the word buoyant," Russell commented. "There are a lot of people at the high end of the market who want to play and it's very exciting."

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Mother Nature did not cooperate with the goings-on in Lexington. Here's a taste of how the inclement weather might have affected the sale.

Buzz Chace, racing manager for Aaron and Marie Jones "It affected all the buyers. We were all in the kitchen playing racehorse rummy. It's hard on the horses, the buyers and everyone. But this morning we had to go out. We had to dress up like eskimos and go out there."

"It has put a damper on the sale. All the right people were here, but the weather made it difficult to see horses. It was very slow early on and it has made the overall sale very soft."

Coolmore Australia's Michael Kirwan said the recordpriced colt, a full-brother to stakes winners One World (Aus) and Langoustine (Aus) from the family of Storm Cat and Royal Academy, was particularly valuable since



only about 36 Danehill yearlings, bred to Southern Hemisphere time to Danehill in Ireland, will be available in 2005. "There's a good possibility we'll retain a share--we'd love to," said Kirwan. "He is such a well-bred horse, the last of the real good colts down here, and why wouldn't you?

There will be some Danehill year-

lings next year, and it will be a sad day for everyone when the last horse goes through the ring," he said. "[Danehill] has been a great horse to us and he will be sorely lost; he was a great stallion who is proving to be an influential sire of sires, in an unbelievable way."

Around the Ring...

Trainer Tim Martin gave A\$750,000 for lot 128, a 3/4-brother to Exceed and Excel (Aus) (Danehill) by Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) out of the Lomond mare Patrona. Exceed and Excel, sold for a reported A\$20 million to Darley in March, has established himself as a top young sprinter. Redoute's Choice, a popular young stallion, had 11 go under the hammer for an average A\$255,455...Stravinsky proved extremely popular, with four selling at an average A\$361,250, More Than Ready had three sell at an average of A\$243,333 with a top price of A\$525,000.

Sangster Saga Continues...

Robert Sangster altered the face of Australian Thoroughbred racing over more than three decades, and his presence was felt Tuesday as he was the owner/breeder of two seven-figure Danehill colts, including Lot 32, a colt from Kensington Gardens (NZ)

(Grosvenor {NZ}), making him a full brother to the Sangsterowned G1 Victoria Derby winner Blackfriars (Aus) as well as Group 1 heroine Larrocha (Aus). The colt was knocked down to Inglis as agent for A\$1.1 million. John Ingham confirmed that the powerfully built bay would race in the Ingham family's famous cerise colors as a potential stallion prospect for Woodlands

Stud. "We've gone outside the camp, so to speak," he said. Collingrove also offered Lot 84, a Danehill colt from Gone West mare Mirbeck, which was sold to Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa for A\$1 million. Collingrove Victoria is owned by the Sangster and Hayes families, while Collingrove NSW, in the Hunter Valley, is owned by Sangster's Swettenham Stud and is home to some 70 mares. Collingrove spokeswoman Jenny McAlpine said the million-dollar plus pair had buoyed the Sangster family. "It was a little more than we expected for both horses," she said. "Unfortunately, Adam Sangster is not at the sale, but I spoke with him this morning and he was over the moon, and it has given the family, and the Collingrove team, a lift during a very sad time." The elder Sangster died last week after a battle with cancer. "I think we will be witnessing Robert Sangster's legacy here fore a very long time," she added. "He bred some brilliant horses and they are still coming through the ring, and his legacy will be felt through Collingrove, and his own sons here in Australia. He was in Australia a long time before anybody else even thought about coming down here, and he imported broodmares as well as instigating shuttle sires. We can all learn a lot from his breeding tactics."

breeze-up world alight earlier this year when responsible for a \$4.5 million colt in the U.S. bought by Fusao Sekiguchi. It is believed a representative of Sekiguchi will be attending the sale. A Fusaichi Pegasus filly out of U.S. Grade III winner Evening Promise (GB) (Aragon), Lot 69, shone in Emma O'Gorman's draft, as did Lot 184, an Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian) filly.

Young and Old Alike...

A good mixture of promising young stallions and proven veterans compose a well-balanced catalogue. Danehill has four representatives, including a well-related filly out of Supamova (Seattle Slew), Lot 156, consigned by Bansha House Stables, while Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables has 16 entries, including Lot 176, a Niarchos-bred Machiavellian filly out of Egine (Irish River {Fr}), and Lot Lot 177, a daughter of Grand Lodge (Chief's Crown) from the family of G1 Epsom Derby winner Erhaab. Wiltshire-based Malcolm Bastard has a strong team including Lot 51, a Zafonic (Gone West) colt, while another well-represented British vendor is Jamie Railton, whose draft includes Lot 36, a Stravinsky filly bought for \$40,000 at Keeneland September, and Lot 91, a U.S.-bred son of Storm Creek. Kip Elser's Kirkwood Stables sends over a draft from the U.S. that includes a Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}) colt, Lot 170, who breezed well, as did Lot 169, Step Lightly, a son of Swain (Ire) and Lot 114, a daughter of Aljabr (Storm Cat). "It's probably the strongest catalogue ever assembled for a European Breeze-Up Sale," said Tattersalls' Marketing Director Jimmy George. "The morning breeze-up went very smoothly, the ground was perfect and we saw some really smart breezes." Rock Hard Ten Works at Churchill

Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), still on the Kentucky Derby bubble due to a lack of graded-stakes earnings, got his first serious work over the Churchill Downs main track yesterday morning, breezing five-eighths of a mile in the slop in 1:01 4/5 beneath his exercise rider, retired jockey Corey Black. "It was a good work," trainer Jason Orman said. "To be honest, I didn't see much of it because of the [infield] tents, but when he came by me, he was moving pretty well. Corey said he handled the track well." The imposing dark bay won his first two career starts before crossing the line second in the GI Santa Anita Derby in his most recent start Apr. 3. He was subsequently demoted to third for drifting in and impeding Imperialism (Langfuhr) in deep stretch.

Minister Eric: Allowance Over Lexington

Trainer Richard Mandella has opted to pass on Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington for Minster Eric (Old Trieste) and will instead run the Triple Crown hopeful in an allowance race at Keeneland this afternoon. "All along I wanted to run in the allowance race, but I wasn't sure it would go," admitted Mandella. "If I can get an easier race into him at this point, that's better than a knock-down, drag-out [race]." With \$350,000 in graded earnings from a pair of runner-up finishes in the GII Del Mar Futurity and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the Diamond A Racing colorbearer is all but assured a spot in the GI Kentucky Derby, if Mandella chooses that route. Carded as race seven, the mile-and-a-sixteenth NW1X on the main track has drawn six other three-year-olds. Minister Eric, installed as the 2-5 morning-line favorite, will break from post five with Alex Solis in the irons.

A Call for Change

Trainer Todd Pletcher raised a few eyebrows on the Triple Crown scene when he suggested that he could cross-enter his star filly Ashado (Saint Ballado) in the Kentucky Derby and the Kentucky Oaks, thus keeping the likes of Rock Hard Ten and Eddington out of the Derby lineup. Pletcher charged that the current system of giving sophomores a berth in the first jewel in the Triple Crown based on earnings in graded stakes company is flawed. "There exists the potential for people to enter the race, but not be serious about running them," explained Pletcher. Although unsure of the course of action that should be taken, Pletcher offered suggestions. "Possibly they should have an also-eligible list," he said. "But that would be difficult because of advanced wagering. Another possibility might be a system similar to the Breeders' Cup, where they use a point system," he said, adding, "Every system has it's flaws and people can use it to their advantage. I think this issue needs to be addressed."

Smarty Jones to Prep for Derby at Keeneland

Undefeated Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality), who remained unbeaten with an easy win in last Saturday's GII Arkansas Derby, was scheduled to arrive vesterday afternoon at Keeneland, where trainer John Servis has chosen to prepare the Pennsylvania-bred colt for the GI Kentucky Derby May 1. The winner of his first two career starts at Philadelphia Park, the chestnut won the Count Fleet S. in New York before spending the bulk of the winter in Hot Springs. He won the Southwest S. and the Rebel S. prior to the Arkansas Derby and stands to earn a \$5-million bonus offered by Oaklawn Park should he win the Derby.

CHURCHILL OFFERS TO BUY FAIR GROUNDS Churchill Downs Incorporated has reached an agreement with the Louisiana Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association to purchase its legal claims against the New Orleans Fair Grounds and has made an offer to purchase the financially strapped racetrack for a reported \$45 million. Under the proposal, the local horsemen would agree to a payment of \$33 million from Churchill Downs to offset the near \$90 million they are owed from video poker proceeds over the last decade, which Fair Grounds neglected to pay. An additional \$12 million is payable to the track's other creditors. Churchill Downs has given Fair Grounds officials a deadline of 4 p.m. this afternoon to accept the offer. If the track chooses to do so, it would be forbidden from entertaining other bids for a specific period of time. In March, Churchill Downs made a \$28-million offer for the facility, \$20 million of which would have been earmarked for the horsemen. Other interested parties include former track owner Louis Roussel III and Kentucky Derby winning owner Mike Pegram. Churchill Downs operates six full-time racing facilities and owns a partial interest in Kentucky Downs in the south part of the state. The company does not own a track which operates during the winter months. In response to the newspaper report, track president Bryan Krantz released a statment, which says in part, "While there are reports of potential suitors, our main focus is to remain owners and operators of the business we have given so much to make a success. In regards to Churchill Downs Inc., we have not had any formal discussions. We continue to talk to many different organizations as it relates to our reorganization plan and look to complete the process as quickly as possible."

After scratching Paul Dixon's homebred from a potential rematch with Dewhurst runner-up Three Valleys (GB) in tomorrow's G3 Craven S. at Newmarket, the Lambourn conditioner told PA Sport, "We think there will be a good pace in the Greenham, there are four days for the ground to dry out further and the race is over seven furlongs rather than a mile which should suit us better. That is why we have opted for Newbury."
