COOLMORE FEVER

While most trainers handling talented three-year-olds are dreaming of roses at this time of year, Vladimir Cerin is keeping it real. Cerin, who sends out **Boomzeeboom** (Explosive Red) in today's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland, said, "We're just looking at this race. For \$325,000, that's a lot of money. We don't have Derby fever, we have Coolmore fever." Not that the bay doesn't have Triple Crown potential.

Second in three of four starts at two, he was beaten only a length by subsequent GISW Lion Heart in his second start last October, with Preachinatthebar another three lengths back in third. He ended the season with a fourth at Santa Anita Dec. 26, but

came back to break his maiden by 8 1/2 lengths Mar. 6 and made it two in a row with a half-length score over Derby candidate Minister Eric in an allowance test at the Lexington distance three weeks later. He makes his stakes debut. He faces a trio of colts coming out of their first stakes starts: **Song of the Sword** (Unbridled's Song) and **Suave** (A.P. Indy), second and third, respectively, in the Apr. 3 GII Illinois Derby; and **Gamblin** (Family Calling), third in the Mar. 20 Rushaway S.

LONHRO SAYS HIS FAREWELL

Lonhro (Aus) (Octagonal {NZ}), 11 times a Group 1 winner in an illustrious career, makes his final racetrack appearance in this afternoon's G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick in Sydney. Since finishing a close third in the G1 Cox Plate last October, the "Black Flash" has rattled off four consecutive victories, including the G1 Australian Cup Mar. 8, where he looked hopelessly beaten and the G1 George Ryder S. over a sharp 1500 meters Apr. 3. Trainer John Hawkes is not the least bit concerned about the outcome this afternoon. "You always hope you go out a winner, but even if he gets beaten, Lonhro can't lose," trainer John Hawkes told *Australian Associated Press*. "He's done everything he had to. The Australian Cup was the big one, the one we wanted, and his last two runs are a bonus." A victory this afternoon would give the five-year-old his 27th from 35 career starts and would push him over the A\$6 million mark in earnings. Lonhro is set to enter stud next season at a record debut price of A\$66,000.

DANCE HERO SHOOTS FOR TRIPLE CROWN

Dance Hero (Aus) (Danzero {Aus}) faces just three rivals as he looks to complete Australia's juvenile Triple Crown in the G1 Champagne S. over 1600 meters at Randwick today. Since finishing second in his career debut, the bay has found the line first on five consecutive occasions. The gelding upset Alinghi (Aus) to win the G1 Golden Slipper S. by 3/4 of a length Apr. 3 and returned last weekend to defeat stablemate Wager (Aus) by 1 1/4 lengths in the G1 Sires' Produce S. The only question this afternoon appears to be the distance, but Dance Hero's trainer thinks he'll be equal to the task. "I have no worries about the mile," Gai Waterhouse told *AAP*. A win would make Dance Hero the first juvenile Triple Crown winner since Burst (Aus) in 1992.

First across the finish line, **Megahertz** failed to keep a straight course during the stretch run of the Mar. 27 GII Santa Ana H. and was disqualified and placed seventh. But the chestnut, five-for-nine on the Santa Anita lawn even after losing that victory, was clearly much the best in that event and should take her second consecutive renewal of this race. **Mandela**, a Listed winner and third in the G1 Preis der Diana in her native country, made her U.S. bow in the Nov. 15 GII Long Island H. and finished fifth. She returned to take a Santa Anita allowance test Mar. 4, then closed some ground to finish fifth (moved into fourth) in the Santa Ana. Undeclared at 10 furlongs, she should appreciate the extra eighth of a mile this time. **Noches de Rosa**, third in this event last year, was sidelined after running second in the May 24 GIII Yerba Buena Breeders' Cup H. The six-year-old rallied to be fourth in her return, a one-mile Santa Anita allowance test Mar. 28.

Paul Dixon's shock G1 Dewhurst S. scorer **Milk it Mick** steps forward against a group of unexposed types in this vital 2000 Guineas prep. Despite winning that prestigious race fair and square, many are still keen to put his head defeat of Three Valleys down as a freak result. Nevertheless, the colt described by his proud owner-breeder as "my Seabiscuit" had deep juvenile form, having previously taken the G3 Somerville Tattersall S., in which Wednesday's impressive Listed European Free H. winner Brunel (Ire) was left trailing in his wake. He returned to finish second in the Listed International Trial S. on Lingfield's polytrack last time Apr. 3, but will be all the sharper for that effort.

Hesmond Stud's **Spotlight** did little wrong at two, progressing off a Warwick maiden score to finish runner-up to Top Romance (GB) in the Listed Oh So Sharp S. at Newmarket in early October. She relished the step up to a mile when routing her rivals in the Listed Montrose S. back at that track in November, but there are questions to answer dropped back to seven furlongs here. Juddmonte Farms' **Phantom Wind**, a daughter of the multiple Group 1 winner Ryafan, ran away with a six-furlong Newmarket maiden in October and is reportedly shaping up well for this 1000 Guineas trial. **Majestic Desert** was beaten a short head by Carry on Katie in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October and her stable received a boost on Wednesday when Silca's Gift (GB) took the G3 Nell Gwyn S.

HOLLENDORFER JOINS 4,000 CLUB Becoming only the sixth trainer in history to reach the mark, Jerry Hollendorfer picked up his 4,000th winner in the sixth race at Bay Meadows Thursday. Hollendorfer joins Dale Baird, Jack Van Berg, King Leatherbury, Richard Hazelton and D. Wayne Lukas on the list. He achieved the milestone with the four-year-old filly Gonetorule, who took the optional-claiming event by a half length. "It's kind of a big deal for me," Hollendorfer said. "I wanted it real bad and I worked hard to get here. I get all the credit, but I have good horses, good owners and a good staff." He added, "I'd like to continue to train for a few more years. I don't know if I can reach 5,000 wins, but I'd like to try. My wife [Janet] and I love doing this--she's been a great help to me and so has my staff." The 55-year-old Ohio native started training in 1979. He has earned 27 straight training titles at Bay Meadows and 24 at Golden Gate.

Birdstone Breezes at Churchill Downs

Birdstone (Grindstone), who was scratched from the Apr. 10 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. due to an unsatisfactory blood report, worked at Churchill Downs Thursday morning. The Nick Zito charge went five furlongs in 1:01. "He worked sensational," Zito said. "I'm very, very happy with everything." The colt clicked off fractions of :12.80, :25, :36.80 and :49.20 and galloped out three-quarters in 1:14.

Sinister G On To Derby After All

GI Lane's End S. winner **Sinister G** (Matty G) is being pointed for the Derby after connections revealed an excuse for his next-to-last place finish in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 10. Trainer John Toscano Jr. told *Daily Racing Form* that he discovered some mucus in the horse's lungs following his performance and that he expected the slight infection to subside in a matter of days. On the decision to go on to Louisville, Toscano told the *Form*, "The owners sat down and talked and they realized how tough it is to get to the Derby, so we are going for the gusto."

Silent Sighs Set for Kentucky Oaks

GI Santa Anita Oaks heroine **Silent Sighs** (Benchmark), pointing for the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks, worked seven furlongs in 1:23 at Santa Anita Friday. "I put her behind another horse so she could relax," trainer Julio Canani said. "I thought she worked unbelievable." Also prepping for the Kentucky Oaks, GIII Santa Ysabel S. winner **A.P. Adventure** (A.P. Indy) went six furlongs in 1:11.40 at Hollywood yesterday.

Settled just off the early pace while racing four wide, the five-year-old poked a head in front at the three-eighths marker, dueled in the stretch with Outathechute and outgamed that rival for the win.
