"OUINTON" STRIKES GOLD IN LEXINGTON

Add Quintons Gold Rush (Wild Rush) to the list of Kentucky Derby contenders. The chestnut colt, 28th in graded earnings on the list of Derby hopefuls going into



Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S., emerged with a 2 3/4-length victory and a spot in the starting gate on the first Saturday in May. Now 17th in graded earnings, he knocks Saratoga County (Valid Expectations), seventh Quintons Gold Rush Horsephotos after a tough trip yesterday,

down to 21st, but that colt

was always an unlikely Derby candidate. Quintons Gold Rush, however, is on his way to Churchill and jockey Jerry Bailey, who was aboard the colt for the first time vesterday, has a decision to make. Bailey is also the regular rider for GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Read the Footnotes. Who will he choose? "That's why I pay [agent] Ron Anderson 25 percent," the Hall of Fame horseman said. Baffert Duo Drills at Churchill

Trainer Bob Baffert sent out his two grey colts for workouts yesterday at Churchill. Wimbledon (Wild

Rush) and Preachinatthebar (Silver Charm) broke off together, but the former pulled away in the stretch to stop the clock in a bullet :58.40 for five furlongs, with his stablemate finishing up in :59.40. "I feel a lot better about them after this morning," said Baffert about his charges, each of whom was unplaced in their most recent starts. "Usually I can tell if they have a chance by the way they work over this track. But they've got to stay like that and continue on, and we've got to have a lot of good luck with them." Wimble-

don, hero of the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 7, faded to fifth in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3. "I trained him wrong for the Santa Anita Derby," Baffert explained. "I was very apprehensive in my training because I knew he'd gotten in [on earnings] and I'm so afraid of hurting these horses. I'm trying to get to the Derby in one piece, and I thought that if I can just get through the Santa Anita Derby, I'll get down here and I'll tighten the screws on him and we'll be ready to go. So that's what we were doing today." Preachinatthebar surprised St Averil to win the GII San Felipe S., but was seventh in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. "Preachinatthebar's next work will be much better," said Baffert. "I just told him [jockey Sal Gonzalez Jr.] to just sort of cruise and don't worry about the other horse [Wimbledon]."

Friendly Florida

Florida Derby hero Friends Lake (A.P. Indy) went fiveeighths in 1:03 at Payson Park Saturday. "He went very well; went out in 1:17, and when he came back, he wouldn't blow out a match," said trainer John Kimmel. "That was a good work for here." It was the final Florida breeze for the chestnut, who will van to Kentucky Tuesday.

Song of the Sword (Unbridled's Song), second in the Apr. 3 GII Illinois Derby, closed some ground to be third as the 4-1 favorite at Keeneland. "He broke badly and I think that really cost me," jockey Norberto Arroyo Jr. said. "I had plenty of horse [in the stretch], but the horse in front of me stopped and by the time I was able to angle out, it was too late." The bay missed second by a neck; the \$32,500 difference in purse would have put him into the Derby field at number 20, but he is currently 23rd on the list. "If we have the earnings, we're in the Derby," trainer Jennifer Pedersen said.

Disqualified and placed seventh after weaving her way to victory in the Mar. 27 GII Santa Ana H., tiny Megahertz was on the short end of the traffic situation yesterday, but overcame trouble to win going away. The winner of the GII Illinois Derby, GII Super Derby and GI Travers S. last season, Ten Most Wanted ended his sophomore campaign in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but suffered through a disastrous trip and finished eighth. His return was nearly an instant replay of the Classic--sent off the 5-2 second choice in the Feb. 29 GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds, the dark bay was once again forced very wide around the first turn and never got into the hunt, running a distant fifth. Looking for a clean trip as the heavy chalk yesterday, the four-year-old settled in third for six furlongs, carried jockey David Flores to the front as they straightened into the stretch and pulled away under only mild encouragement. "I was a little worried that maybe he was going a little too early, since the stretch is so long, but it was so easy for him," trainer Wally Dollase said. "Hopefully he'll come out of it OK and we'll be off and running. He had two very bad experiences and he needed this." Dollase added that the colt would be pointed for the May 14 GI Pimlico Special. Superlatives about the "black flash" flowed thick and fast throughout Australia Saturday, but the partisan crowd left disappointed, as underrated Grand Armee ruined Lonhro's much-publicized farewell at Randwick. Grand Armee, a A\$150,000 Easter purchase for owner Alan Bell, had been scorched by Lonhro's blistering speed twice in recent times, finishing second to the 11-time Group 1 winner in the G1 George Main S. last spring, and again a fortnight ago in the G1 George Ryder S. But, allowed to dawdle at the rear as Grand Armee set a leisurely pace, Lonhro had an impossible amount of ground to make up and toiled home second in front of some 30,000 fans. Winning jockey Danny Beasley explained he took his cue from Lonhro's unsuccessful Cox Plate tilt last fall. "I thought I'd get going a long way from home and make him chase me and...it worked," he said. "There's always mixed emotions when something like this happens, but when they let him get away with sectionals like he was running and you're not going to run him down." Winning trainer Gai Waterhouse, recording her third Group 1 win for autumn, added, "It was a clever front-running ride by Danny Beasley. He made it a real sit and sprint. He stole the show and the good horse, Lonhro, couldn't pick him up in the final stages." Lonhro's rider, Darren Beadman, was chastised by chief steward Ray Murrihy who told him, "Initiative was required, but no initiative was shown. You set Lonhro an impossible task." Ironically, Lonhro's sire, Octagonal (NZ), also made his final appearance in this event in 1997 and was downed by Intergaze (Aus). But not everyone was disappointed by the result--Sporting Bet took A\$5 million in wagers off an overseas-based Australian businessman, who stood to win just A\$1 million on the bet.

Lonhro's fairytale farewell may have been an anti-climax, but all went to script here, with Dance

Hero's win never in doubt. The colt concluded his juvenile season on a high note as only the fifth to complete Australia's two-year-old Triple Crown. But unlike former Triple victors Baguette (Aus) (1970), Luskin Star (Aus) (1977), Tierce (Aus) (1991) and Burst (Aus) (1992), Dance Hero had to run on three consecutive Saturdays to complete his task, taking the Apr. 3 G1 Golden Slipper, Apr. 10 G1 AJC Sires' Pro-

duce S. and yesterday's G1 Champagne S. over progressively longer trips. The professional gelding led from start to finish and was clocked in 1:34.75 to smash the 28-year-old race record by :0.45. Dance Hero now has six wins from seven starts and a record \$3,156,940 prizemoney. Trainer Gai Waterhouse made a bold assessment of her game youngster after the race. "I wonder if he's going to be a horse as good as Kingston Town, because he's got the most brilliant speed," she said. "He doesn't care if he's over 1000 meters or over a mile, he just runs those brilliant times. I know he's only a two-year-old, but what else can you ask him to do? He's backed up three times in two weeks and he's just shown them a clean pair of heels." Stablemate Wager again chased Dance Hero home.

Among his vanquished rivals that day were Gene de Campeao (Brz) and Runaway Dancer, who are back for another try. Gene de Campeao, a Group 1 winner in his native Brazil, will try to take it wire to wire. "Our strategy will be to send, just send," stated trainer A.C. Avila. "Follow me if you can catch me." Rhythm Mad twice won going 1 5/16 miles in France before concluding his tenure under Andre Fabre with a fourth in the G2 Prix Niel Sept. 14. But finishing ahead of him that day were Derby heroes Dalakhani (Ire) and Kris Kin, suggesting that the four-year-old is capable of handling today's foes. Following a fourth-place finish going a mile in his U.S. debut Feb. 19, he captured a nine-furlong allowance Mar. 18. Eight-year-old Ringaskiddy, who captured this event when it was a Grade I in 2002, recently returned from an 18-month layoff. PAT VALENZUELA ISSUED TEMPORARY STAY

Pending an appeal, John Harris, chairman of the California Horse Racing Board, has issued a temporary stay of the suspension handed down by the Santa Anita stewards that would have sidelined jockey Pat Valenzuela through Dec. 31, 2004. The stay permits the 41-yearold to resume riding Apr. 25. Valenzuela's appeal first goes to the Office of Administrative Hearings, then to the seven racing commissioners. Harris made his decision based on information and testimony that the rider's most recent troubles were due to clinical depression and not substance abuse. "It's important to realize that Patrick has been tested hundreds of times and has not had a drug positive in four years," Harris said. "Still, clinical depression is a serious concern, and we need to know that Patrick is healthy both physically and mentally if he is riding horses."

Record Attendance at Keeneland:

With four days left of its spring meeting, Keeneland set a record Saturday for on-track attendance when 31,028 fans went through the turnstiles for the GII Coolmore Lexington S. and its undercard. "Keeneland has some of the best fans in the world," said Keeneland President Nick Nicholson. "The weather has been great. We've had two Fridays in a row with more than 20,000 people in attendance. This has been a tremendous meeting and we look forward to four more days of great racing." The previous record was 29,687, set on Apr. 15, 2000.

Wando Returns to Action:

Reigning Canadian Horse of the Year and Triple Crown winner Wando (Langfuhr) makes his return to the races in this afternoon's sixth race at Keeneland. A homebred for Gustav Schickedanz, the four-year-old colt went on a five-race tear last summer, capped by a 1 1/2-length victory in the Breeders' S. that completed his Triple Crown. Fourth as the tepid favorite in the GI Atto Mile in his penultimate start of the year, the chestnut was last seen running third, beaten 2 1/4 lengths, in the GIII Indiana Derby Oct. 4. Wando, who trained very well over the winter before shipping to Keeneland, was originally expected to make his comeback in the GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. Apr. 10. He faces a stiff test in this 1 1/16-mile turf affair, in which each of the 10 starters is a stakes winner.
