assurances from [regular exercise rider] Maxine [Correa] that it wasn't. And, more importantly, I got assurances from Cliff--the equine Cliff. He just loves Churchill Downs. He's two-for-two here and he just likes it. He was doing it on his own." The Cliff's Edge, who won the Apr. 10 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland in his latest, captured in successive starts the GIII Iroquois S. and the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill last fall.

### ...Borrego in a Three-Furlong Tune-Up

Working for the first time since finishing second to Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) in the Apr. 10 Gll Arkansas Derby, Borrego (El Prado {Ire}) worked three-eighths in :37 2/5 after the renovation break at Churchill. "I got him in :37 4/5, and he did it nice and easy," said trainer Beau Greely, who traveled Sunday to Louisville to watch Borrego's tune-up for the May 1 Kentucky Derby. Greely will remain in Louisville through the Derby and plans to give Borrego his final breeze, likely at five panels, next Sunday. "I generally breeze 10 days after a race," explained Greely. "Today was nine. The reason I did is I want to breeze him back six days out. You never know if they did a little bit too much and you'd rather have six days than five." Greely said the chestnut has settled in just fine at Churchill, adding, "He never missed a bit of feed since he's been here."



### DAIWA MAJOR SILENCES THE SKEPTICS

Daiwa Major (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), who ran third last time out in the Spring S. Mar. 21, was given little notice at 32-1 odds to record his first graded stakes score, but rocketed from just off the pacesetter to take Sunday's Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) at Nakayama Race Course in Japan. The victory marked the first Group 1 win for trainer Hiroyuki Uehara. Breaking from post seven in the field of 18, Daiwa Major tracked the early pace in second, gained command in the stretch and cruised home an easy winner over favored Cosmo Bulk (Jpn) (Zagreb). "The Satsuki Sho is my best race," exclaimed rider Mirco Demuro, who was winning the Japanese 2000 Guineas for the second year in a row. "I'm just very happy for the victory." Daiwa Major is slated to make his next start in the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) May 30.

Farish and he's good enough to ride Read the Footnotes for Seth Klarman." He added, "I do believe [Bailey] is riding the wrong horse. Read the Footnotes is doing freaky, he really is. I feel like he is back to his Fountain of Youth level and, if he is, we will have a lot to scream about from the eighth pole home on Derby day." Read the Footnotes will breeze at Palm Meadows tomorrow and fly to Louisville Friday.

### **Class Above All Class in Churchill Work**

Padua Stable's **Class Above** (Quiet American) readied for an expected tilt in the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks with a sharp five-furlong move in :59 flat yesterday at Churchill Downs. The work was the best of 33 at the distance and three ticks faster than Derby hopeful The Cliff's Edge. "The track was very demanding today," said trainer Bob Baffert. "It was dry and deep, and then she ran into a headwind. She got a good work out of it. That's a hell of a work on this track today." A disappointing seventh in her seasonal bow, the Feb. 15 GI Las Virgenes at Santa Anita, Class Above rebounded to win the Bourbonette Breeders' Cup S. by 3 1/2 lengths at Turfway Mar. 20.



### **Channon Ponders Gift Options**

Conditioner Mick Channon is considering supplementing Wednesday's G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner Silca's Gift (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) to the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2. With the possibility of soft ground for the mile Classic, for which he already has Saturday's G3 Fred Darling S. scorer Majestic Desert (GB) (Fraam {GB}), the Lambourn trainer is not ruling out a two-pronged raid. "Silca's Gift loves a dig in the ground and, if it looked like being soft come the supplementary stages next Monday, we would have to think long and hard whether to stump up the cash to have a shot," he told the Racing Post. The wet weather has compromised the preparation of fellow 1000 Guineas hopeful Secret Charm (Ire) (Green Desert), who encountered heavy ground in a racecourse gallop at Newbury on Sunday. Last year's Listed Radley S. winner "got a bit tired" according to conditioner Barry Hills, who told the Post, "Secret Charm is still backward in her coat, but then so was Russian Rhythm two weeks before last year's race, and when fillies start to come they can come quickly."

### Mick it Mick to Be Tried in Net

Milk it Mick (GB) (Milkom {GB}) looks likely to be tried in a net as he bids to redeem his reputation in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1. Conditioner Jamie Osborne revealed the plan for last year's shock G1 Dewhurst S. scorer after he disappointed when fifth in Saturday's G3 Greenham S. at Newbury. "We are virtually guaranteed a fast-run race in the Guineas and, while some professionals will claim that I have lost my marbles, knowing the horse as I do, I still feel that if the cards fall our way we are in with a chance," he told the *Racing Post*. "I accept that he needs to settle ultra-well at Newmarket, and that is why I'm considering the net, which may help him drop his bridle."

Very few people breed the winners of as many as four of Britain's five classics--let alone with mares from a single family--yet that is what the late Jim Joel achieved with between 1944 and 1980. The one classic which eluded Joel was the Oaks, but he had gone within inches of landing this classic with West Side Story in 1962 and his Picture Play family finally completed the classic set with User Friendly in 1992, just months after Joel's death at the age of 97. Needless to say, breeders flocked to Joel's dispersal at Tattersalls' December Sales in 1986, when his 1,000 Guineas winner Fairy Footsteps topped the mare category at 720,000 guineas and his Magic Slipper topped the fillies at 700,000. I'm pleased to say that many buyers received good value. <u>Desert Prince</u>, the highest-rated three-year-old of 1998, is a grandson of Fairy Footsteps, and the Picture Play family provided the winners of two of the three group races contested at Newbury three days ago.

Firstly, the G3 Dubai Irish Village S. went to Dubai Success, a very-well connected colt whose second dam, Crystal Fountain, had made 380,000 guineas at the Joel dispersal. Later in the afternoon, the G3 Dubai Duty Free S. was won in determined style by Majestic Desert, a filly whose third dam, Photo, had fetched 280,000 guineas. Photo's second dam, Picture Play, won the 1,000 Guineas back in 1944 and Majestic Desert is now a leading contender for the same classic.

It makes an interesting exercise to compare the career paths that Crystal Fountain and Photo have taken. Crystal Fountain had the attraction of being a half-sister to Royal Palace, winner of the 2,000 Guineas and Derby for Joel, and to Glass Slipper, dam of his classic winners Light Cavalry and Fairy Footsteps. Although she produced two stakes winners after her sale, including a Group 2 winner, Crystal Fountain's main legacy has come through Crystal Spray, the last of the foals she produced for Joel. A distinctly ordinary racemare, Crystal Spray has fulfilled the potential of her bloodlines by producing four group winners, one at Group 1 level. Two of them came during the time she was owned by Michael Poland--an ardent admirer of the Joel stock who eventually sold her for 500,000 guineas in 1995.

Poland once told me that he was attracted to the Joel mares because "they offered many years of continuity."

"I saw in the catalogue," Poland continued, "that there was a partially blind mare called Photo and I thought 'no-one will want a blind mare--she'll go for nothing.' So I went to my bank manager and asked for an overdraft of £20,000." *Caulfield cont. p5*

Instead, Photo sold for 280,000 guineas, with Poland being left to pick up the cheapest mare in the batch, the 5,200-guinea Regal Beauty. For a long time Poland must have thought he had got very much the better deal. While Regal Beauty was to be represented by the champion juvenile High Estate and the King George winner King's Theatre, Photo failed to produce a single black-type earner among her eight foals.

However, the power of this female line continues to assert itself and three of Photo's five daughters have produced a group winner: Itgan's son Hello won the G1 Gran Criterium prior to his third in the GI Santa Anita Derby; Zoom Lens' son Atlantis Prince completed his unbeaten juvenile campaign in the G2 Royal Lodge S.; and Camera Girl's son Dano-Mast is a dual Gruop 2 winner in France.

Then there is Photo's daughter Happy Snap, by the unsuccessful stallion Jalmood. Happy Snap was culled by Joel for only 10,500 guineas as an unraced two-year-old in 1987. She was covered at three by the unproven and inexpensive Night Shift, who was to develop into a very good stallion, but Happy Snap's daughter, Calcutta Queen, didn't help him climb the ladder. Calcutta Queen's two third places in all-weather maiden races represented such poor form that she made only 1,000 guineas at the sales. She then finished tailed off in a claiming race on her only appearance on turf.

It's hardly surprising then that, while Dubai Success' dam has been visiting such great stallions as  $\underline{N}$ ureyev and Sadler's Wells, Calcutta Queen has been operating at the opposite end of the scale. Fraam, her mate in 2000, commanded a fee of only £1,250 in his early years at stud, but-as Bill Oppenheim has pointed out often in recent years -- Fraam has proved himself worthy of much better opportunities than he initially received.

Breeders could hardly be blamed for thinking that Fraam wasn't an obvious candidate for stallion success. This son of Lead On Time didn't race at two and then finished lame, having split his near-fore cannon bone, on his second appearance at three. He later suffered a similar injury to his near-hind, which also required screws. In the circumstances, Fraam could be said to have done well to win a very valuable handicap under 135 lbs and a Listed race at five. He was also beaten less than a length when second in two Group 3 events at six, before injuring his near-fore again.

So Fraam covered his first mares in 1996 at the age of seven, never having won a group race. He also had to overcome the handicap of being by Lead On Time, a stallion who never sired a Group 1 winner.

Lead On Time was a very well-bred Nureyev horse whose second dam was a sister to the brilliant Vaguely Noble. Speed proved to be his main asset, as he showed with his win in the G2 Prix Maurice de Gheest over 61/2 furlongs. However, Lead On Time never made it to the races when kept in training at four and managed only five starts in all. The suggestion was that, like Fraam, he was somewhat delicate. I also wonder whether he wasn't the most fertile of horses, as he had only 154 animals in his first five crops. Lead On Time's classic-placed brother Great Commotion certainly had fertility problems, but not enough to stop him siring some smart performers, including the sprinter-miler Lend A Hand, whose first foals race this year.

One thing in Fraam's favour was the fact that his third dam is Exclusive, an outstanding broodmare who numbered the dual champion sire Exclusive Native among her stakes winners. Both of Exclusive Native's parents appear among the grandparents of Fraam's dam, the good Canadian mare Majestic Kahala.

While Fraam himself was fragile, his progeny are anything but--to the extent that Majestic Desert's trainer Mick Channon describes them as "tough horses with a touch of class."

We will start to get a proper idea of how good Fraam is this year, when he has a 78-strong crop of juveniles-by far his largest so far. He earned this support in 2001 by having had six winners from 10 first-crop runners in 1999 and by siring the group-winning juvenile Lady Lahar and the group-placed Dayglow Dancer in his second.



Ferguson went to \$350,000 to buy the session topper, Hip 249, a colt by A.P Jet out of Manor Queen (Wavering Monarch). The bay, named Blue Sunday, topped Wednesday's under tack show with a quarter mile in :21 4/5. Out of a stakes-placed winner of \$320,145, the New York-bred is a half brother to stakes winner Infinite Justice (Sultry Song). He was consigned by Nick de Meric, Agent XVI. The popularity of freshman sires continued at the OBS opener. The day's second best-selling lot, Hip 138, is from the first crop by Tiger Ridge (Storm Cat--Weekend Surprise, by Secretariat), a half brother to A.P. Indy standing at Walmac. Consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, LLC, agent, the dark bay colt was purchased for \$210,000 by Narvick International. A winner of the G3 VRC Toohevs New S, and G3 MRC Mannerisms S, and second in the G1 STC Coolmore Classic, the six-year-old was purchased by Trelawney Stud, on behalf of Deborah Ho, as a broodmare prospect. Also among the stars was G1 South Australian Oaks and G1 Australasian Oaks heroine Episode (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}--Apache Girl {Aus}, by Best Western {Aus}). Believed to be in foal to first season sire Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill), the nine-year-old mare brought A\$510,000 to the bid of John Hutchins. Consigned by Edinglassie Stud, agent, the bay made headlines last week when her Flying Spur (Aus) yearling filly sold for A\$200,000 at Inglis' Easter Sale. At the conclusion of the first of two sessions, 227 lots averaged A\$42,346 with gross receipts weighing in at A\$9,612,500. Last year, when the Broodmare sale was conducted over three days, Inglis cataloged 149 lots more than this term.
