"It's in the horse's best interest to stop covering and to give him the rest he needs," said Liam O'Rourke, stud director at Dalham Hall.

Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) worked five furlongs at Keeneland yesterday in :58 2/5 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:11 and seven eighths in 1:25. "I was very happy with the work," trainer Patrick Biancone said. "I just wanted him to stretch his legs. I was actually going to work him Wednesday, but with the weather forecast calling for showers all over Kentucky, I just wanted to move it up a day and not take a chance." The colt, coming off a game runner-up finish in the Apr. 10 GI Toyota Blue Grass S., is expected to ship to Churchill Downs on Monday.

Pastoral Pursuits and Three Valleys Guineas Bound

Hugh Morrison yesterday issued an upbeat bulletin on his G1 2000 Guineas hope **Pastoral Pursuits** (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}). Unraced since taking the G3 Sirenia S. at Kempton in September, the colt has fully recovered from a knee injury and was reported on course for the Newmarket Classic May 1. "We've not had a totally clear run with him, but he worked very nicely on Saturday and as things stand I hope to run him first time back at Newmarket," his conditioner told *PA Sport* yesterday.

Roger Charlton is also preparing Juddmonte Farms' **Three Valleys** (Diesis {GB}) for the 2000 Guineas, despite his disappointing defeat by Haafhd (GB) in Thursday's G3 Craven S. "Khalid Abdullah has decided that Three Valleys should run in the 2000 Guineas to finally establish whether he is likely to stay a mile, or needs to revert to six or seven furlongs," the conditioner told the *Racing Post*. "There was a doubt in my mind before the Craven as to whether he would be fit enough to do himself justice, and I wasn't surprised to see him beaten--he got tired a furlong and a half out, but luckily was not subject to a hard race and lost only five kilos."

Colt With Tragic Past Eyes Triumphant Future

Despite the relatively young age of Kentucky Derby challenger **Smarty Jones** (Elusive Quality), the three-year-old has faced a lifetime of adversity. Under the care of the Philadelphia Park-based trainer Robert Camac early in his career, the Pennsylvania-bred was later transferred to John Servis' barn after Camac and his wife were murdered in December 2001. Following Camac's death, owners Patricia and Roy Chapman cut their Thoroughbred holdings down significantly and even contemplated leaving the game completely, but the pair decided to retain two horses, one of which was Smarty Jones.

Last July at Philly Park, the colt sustained numerous fractures to his skull after he reared up and crashed into the starting gate during routine schooling. According to Dr. Patricia Hogan, who treated the colt at New Jersey Equine Clinic, "The tissues around his eyes were so swollen you couldn't even see if [the eye] was intact." Despite the severity of the injuries, Smarty Jones escaped permanent damage to his vision, but he was forced remain in the hospital for another two weeks before spending another month at his owners' Someday Farm. "We brought him back very slowly," said Servis. "It took weeks of schooling before we had him back to his old self. He's learned to deal with it."

Smarty Jones, a winner by over 22 lengths in his two juvenile starts, captured last year's Pennsylvania Nursery and has reeled off four straight victories this term. A five-length winner of the Jan. 3 Count Fleet S. at Aqueduct, before wins in Oaklawn's Feb. 28 Southwest S. and Mar. 20 Rebel S., Smarty Jones kept his unbeaten streak intact with a professional 1 1/2-length win over Borrego last time out in the Apr. 10 GII Arkansas Derby.

From the most remote of chances to make the Derby lineup, Smarty Jones now stands as one of the early choices for the 1 1/4-mile Classic.

"I've dreamt of going to the Derby since I was 14," explained Servis. And this year, he thinks he has the horse to do it.

"I always knew he was very talented, but I never knew how talented," Servis said of Smarty Jones. "This horse is really pretty push-button. He trains hard and he races even harder."

Despite the stamina question swirling around Smarty Jones, who is by the talented miler Elusive Quality, Servis remains unfazed. "If you have ever watched him train, you wouldn't have any apprehensions about him getting 1 1/4 miles," he said. "He knows when he needs to settle and he knows when he needs to pick it up."

Smarty Jones, who will attempt to become the first horse since Seattle Slew in 1977 to win the Kentucky Derby while undefeated, could also give Stewart Elliott, a Mid-Atlantic-based jockey, his first crack at the esteemed jewel in the Triple Crown. "Stewart Elliott has a world of confidence in the horse," said Servis. "He has developed a great rapport with the horse."

Although a prize in itself, a victory in the Kentucky Derby, coupled with earlier scores in the Rebel and Arkansas Derby, would net the colt a \$5-million payoff.

Pletcher Outlines Plans for Classic Hopefuls

Following a busy weekend of works, trainer Todd Pletcher has outlined plans for his star three-year-olds. **Ashado** (Saint Ballado), who worked five panels in :59 2/5 Sunday at Keeneland, is likely to make her next start in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30, while plans for **Value Plus** (Unbridled's Song), most recently sixth in the Apr. 10 GI Wood Memorial, remain uncertain. According to Pletcher, the gray, who is currently in New York, will only be considered for the Run for the Roses if "there are a few defections" from the Derby lineup. GII Illinois Derby winner **Pollard's Vision** (Carson City), who shipped to Churchill Downs Sunday following a five-furlong breeze in 1:01, will receive his final tune-up Sunday, as will stablemate **Limehouse** (Grand Slam).

VICTORY GALLOP SEIZES TOP SPOT

In the past few weeks, runners from the first crops of Forestry, [Silver Charm](#), and [Victory Gallop](#) have won graded races, so not surprisingly these three lead North American sophomore sires in 2004 progeny earnings, according to this week's [bloodhorse.com](#). (**chart p6**) Having been runner-up to [Stravinsky](#) for the 2003 North American Freshman Sire crown, the 1998 Belmont S. winner Victory Gallop, who stopped Real Quiet's bid for the Triple Crown, has now taken the lead among the group of North American sires with first foals 2001 and first three-year-olds this year ranked by cumulative progeny earnings. Already multiple Grade I-placed, Victory U.S.A.'s upset of champion Halfbridled in Keeneland's GII Stonerside Beaumont S. means her sire now has 20 winners of 25 races, with progeny earnings over \$1,460,000. He's displaced Europe's top sprinter of 1999, Stravinsky, who has made a slower start in 2004--largely because a high percentage of his runners are in Europe, where the turf racing's just getting underway for the year.

Stravinsky ranks only 12th so far in 2004 progeny earnings, but still holds second, narrowly, from Forestry. But don't look for any disappearing act from Stravinsky. It's early in his year yet, and he's leading freshman sire in Australasia with his first crop there, which includes six stakes winners so far. Those don't count among these earnings, but it does serve to show he's a pretty big name wherever he goes. His 36 winners easily tops North American sophomore sires.

As mentioned last week, Forestry's graded winner was also at seven furlongs. This was Forest Danger, who won the GIII Bay Shore S. on the Wood undercard with a Beyer 110. Forestry now has four stakes winners, two of them graded, plus another eight stakes-placed runners. He may not have a Derby contender, but he looks a big threat to secure the top spot among this group. He's been the commercial leader all along, and now leads in 2004 progeny earnings.

Forestry's only Grade I win came in the 1999 King's Bishop S., also the only graded stakes win (in fact, the only stakes win) for another son of [Storm Cat](#), [Tale of the Cat](#). So is this a formula for sire success--son of Storm Cat who wins the King's Bishop? It's working so far.

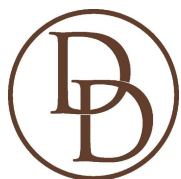
In fourth spot in cumulative earnings is Doneraile Court, the surprise package among this group when finishing third on the 2003 Freshman Sire List. By Seattle Slew and raced by Michael Tabor, Doneraile Court began his stud career with Doug Arnold at Buck Pond, and has now moved across town to Jay Sikura at Hill 'N' Dale. Like Forestry, he has four stakes winners so far.

Silver Charm has moved from ninth to fifth on the list--and in fact edges Victory Gallop for second in 2004--with GII San Felipe winner Preachinathebar, currently 21st qualifier for the 20 Derby spots. Though Preachinathebar is his only stakes winner, Silver Charm has another five stakes-placed. Winner of two-thirds of the Triple Crown, the Dubai World Cup, and over \$6.9 million, you just do get the feeling Silver Charm is moving in the right direction.

Old Trieste looks like he was going to give [A.P. Indy](#) a positive tick in the Sire of Sires box, while Mazer Trick and Exploit are both getting plenty of winners this year, too, and occupy seventh and eighth spots among this group. These eight currently have progeny earnings between \$900,000 and \$1.5 million each.

Euro Power...

They may be improving and shaking themselves out, but the top North American sophomore sires still trail Europe's one-two, [Fasliyev](#) and Cape Cross, in cumulative progeny earnings. All right, they had huge foal crops, but Fasliyev's total of 82 runners (phenomenal), 41 winners, and seven stakes winners, for converted earnings of just under \$2 million, is still mighty impressive. Cape Cross never figured in this company going in, but it has to be said that his foals always looked good and sold well, and can they run. He's had 70 runners, for 32 winners, including four stakes winners and another six stakes-placed. His Privy Seal won the one-mile Easter S. at Kempton like he'd go further, and in fact is a possibility for the 10-furlong Sandown Classic Trial this weekend. **Cont. p. 4**

Three other second-crop European sires have achieved £400,000-plus in progeny earnings (about \$720,000, among the top 15 from North America and Europe combined): **Orpen**, son of **Lure**, now has 40 winners from 84 runners (again phenomenal), and has edged past Daggers Drawn into third spot among the Euros.

But Daggers Drawn, a good 1997 two-year-old by **Diesis**, is another serious overachiever. They may not be stakes horses (only one so far), but to kick a young mare off with a winner, Daggers Drawn looks a really good idea. Dr Fong, as noted last week, had the impressive winner of the G3 Prix Penelope, and since then, about every time you turn around, there seems to be a runner by him in a good race. He now has four

stakes winners and is another clearly moving in the right direction. As mentioned before, he's by **Kris S.**, so, along with Intikhab (seventh, by **Red Ransom**), and now Red Ransom himself, represents a possibility for a bit of a Roberto revival in Europe.

Daylami is eighth, but Grey Swallow could change all that, and if he doesn't, you get the feeling there are a few others who might. And Desert Sun (10th), a son of Green Desert who stood in Ireland by virtue of his daughter Sunline's exploits, has a serious Classic contender in the G3 Greenham winner, Salford City.

Informative Classic Trials...

In a lot of years, especially when the ground's riding good-to-soft, as it has been this year, Britain's first Guineas trials tend to shed more heat than light, but this year the trials all look good. At Kempton on Easter Saturday (same day as the Wood, Blue Grass, and Arkansas Derby), the Cape Cross colt Privy Seal, as mentioned, won the one-mile Easter S. The corresponding fillies' race, the Masaka, was won for fun by Sheikh Hamdan's Hathrah, a Linamix filly who had been runner-up in her final two starts of 2003 to two fillies who have not run this term and are lively outsiders for this year's English 1000, Kinnaird and Secret Charm. At Newmarket, the G3 Nell Gwyn was won in a big upset by the Cadeaux Genereux filly Silca's Gift, who wasn't even entered in the 1000, and who was considered not in the same class (except perhaps on soft ground) to

the same stable's Majestic Desert, who then went off even-money for Newbury's G3 Fred Darling (Dubai Duty Free) last Saturday, and won it in some style.

Mick Channon trained Queen's Logic for Majestic Desert's owner, Jaber Abdullah. He felt that she would have won the Guineas for sure had she not come up lame two days before the race, and he clearly feels this filly could provide compensation. As Andrew Caulfield detailed in yesterday's *TDN*, she is by the Wonder Sire, Fraam. He is one of those very rare cases who was just clearly a lot better than he could show on the racetrack, because starting from nothing, he is siring serious Classic contenders. It is reminiscent of horses like Raja Baja, Exclusive Native, and Gallant Romeo in the States, and Sharpen Up here and, because of the fairy-tale element, it would be great to see Majestic Desert win the Guineas.

There's a lurking feeling among the game's professionals that, somehow, Class Will Out. There were quite a few years when nobody wanted to know about [Nureyev](#) as a sire of sires, yet look at it now: Coolmore rolled the dice big-time on Nureyev, and they've ended up with [Peintre Celebre](#), Fasliyev, and Stravinsky--leading European second-crop sire of 2003, leading European freshman sire, and leading North American freshman sire of 2003, respectively. And, yes, even Fraam, by Nureyev's son Lead On Time, counts as part of this Nureyev Tsunami.

The other two colts' Group 3 trials, the one-mile Craven at Newmarket and the seven-furlong Greenham at Newbury, also looked good. In the Craven, Sheikh Hamdan's Haafhd crushed Three Valleys and the rest, powering away to win by five lengths and earning a *Racing Post* Rating (RPR) of 121--being roughly equivalent to a Timeform rating that translates to a Beyer

109. Another very good horse by Alhaarth and out of the top racemare Al Bahathri, by Blushing Groom, Haafhd goes to the 2000 Guineas off the best race this year of anybody.

And, as mentioned, Salford City, from the first European crop by Desert Sun, was an impressive winner of the Greenham. He had been bought over the winter by Michael Tabor, so he goes to the Guineas as a pretty good backup to current favorite One Cool Cat.

Grey Swallow, the Daylami colt trained by Dermot Weld who was two-for-two, including a Group 3 win last year, scraped home on bad ground in the Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial in Ireland, and now vies for second favoritism with Salford City and Haafhd.

The only two other colts under 10-1 are the French-trained Whipper, impressive winner of the Listed Prix Djebel earlier this month and Godolphin's Snow Ridge, who won this year's unofficial trial in Dubai impressively a couple of weeks ago.

Last Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. featured a number of horses chasing sufficient graded stakes earnings to guarantee them a GI Kentucky Derby start. As it turned out, they arrived after the gold rush, with Quintons Gold Rush leading from a long way out to score a decisive victory.

Quintons Gold Rush, who had finished fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby on his previous start, looks likely to join Wimbledon as one of two colts from the second crop of their sire Wild Rush to line up on Derby Day. This achievement marks a continuation in the remarkable turn round in Wild Rush's stud career which has taken place in the last few months. Highly touted before his first crop reached the racetrack, Wild Rush was initially extremely disappointing. He wasn't represented by a juvenile first-season stakes winner and by last September, when he was sold to Japan, he'd still only been represented by two black-type winners (the three-year-old fillies Fencelineneighbor and Friendofthefamily, who had earned her stakes win at Turf Paradise). Although the returns from Wild Rush's first crop remain modest as far as class is concerned--it's still only produced two stakes winners, even though it's yielded a very respectable 51 winners from 68 starters--his second crop began delivering the goods almost as soon as he was out of the country.

In fact, by the end of last year he was represented by no less than five two-year-old stakes winners, headed by Canadian champion two-year-old colt Judiths Wild Rush and the GI Hollywood Starlet S. heroine Hollywood Story. Add in Quintons Gold Rush and the GI Louisiana Derby winner Wimbledon, and Wild Rush now has seven second-crop stakes winners, three of them graded.

Quintons Gold Rush is out of the unraced Mr. Prospector mare Hollywood Gold. It's Wild Rush's second stakes winner bred on this cross, as Judith's Wild Rush is out of a mare by a grandson of Mr. Prospector. We can also note that Wimbledon is out of a mare by Darn that Alarm, a horse whose sire Jig Time is by Native Dancer and is a three-parts genetic relative to Raise a Native. Wild Rush's sire Wild Again worked with a remarkably wide range of broodmare sires, but he also seemed to have an affinity with Raise a Native. He sired GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Elmhurst out of a mare by Raise a Native himself; had three stakes winners, two graded, out of mares from the male line of Raise a Native's son Alydar (a 3/4-brother to the dam of Elmhurst); three stakes winners, all graded including GISW Shine Again, out of mares descending from Raise a Native through Mr. Prospector; and a stakes winner out of mare by Raise a Cup, a 3/4-brother to Alydar, who was also a three-parts genetic relative to Mr. Prospector.

Alydar, Mr. Prospector and Raise a Cup are all by Raise a Native (by Native Dancer) out of mares by sons of Nasrullah (by Nearco). This is the reverse of the Nearco/Native Dancer cross which produced not only Wild Again's sire Icecapade, but also Northern Dancer, and it may be this factor which in part accounts for the success of the Northern Dancer/Mr. Prospector combination, as well as Wild Again and Wild Rush's affinity for similarly bred horses.

For a horse with classic aspirations, it's encouraging to note that Quintons Gold Rush's granddam is Lady in Silver, heroine of the 1989 renewal of the G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) and also runner-up the same year in the GI Arlington Million. **Cont. p8**

Lady in Silver is a daughter of the Roberto horse Silver Hawk, and we can note that Roberto also features as the sire of Dynaformer, the broodmare sire of Wild Rush's GISW Hollywood Story. Quintons Gold Rush's granddam Lorn Lady was unplaced, but is by Lorenzaccio, conqueror of an admittedly past-his-peak Nijinsky II in the Champion S., and is half sister to Riverside, a French stakes winner who is ancestress of numerous stakes winners, including the brilliant French filly Riverqueen.

Of course with the Derby looming, the most pertinent question to ask of Quintons Gold Rush's pedigree, is will it carry him a mile and a quarter? Wild Rush himself was a versatile performer by current standards. His victories included the over nine-furlong GII Illinois Derby, which he took in record time, and the nine-furlong Remington Park Derby at three, and at four the GI Metropolitan H., the seven-furlong GI Carter H. and the nine-furlong GIII Kentucky Cup Classic, where he dead-heated with Silver Charm. Quintons Gold Rush's broodmare sire Mr. Prospector has sired everything from champion sprinters to a Belmont S. victor, but he's certainly no detraction from prospective stamina when other staying sources are present, and Quintons Gold Rush has plenty of that quality in his female line. His granddam scored her most prestigious victory (the French Oaks) over 10 1/2 furlongs, and she is by a horse who placed in G1 English and G1 Irish Derbies, both of which are run over a mile and a half.

So, overall, we'd have to say that if Quintons Gold Rush is good enough, he has a more than reasonable chance of lasting the Kentucky Derby distance.

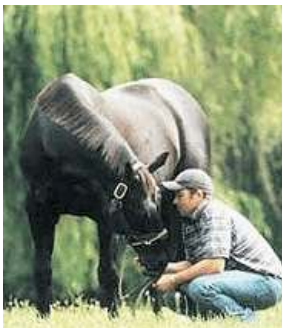

The 23-year-old stallion had been standing at New Zealand's Waikato Stud at the time of his death. "He's the sort of stallion that every stud would love to have and we feel very fortunate to have stood him all these years," said Waikato principal Garry Chittick. "He was marvelous to work with--a real mate, never a horse who gave us any problems and one you could trust in every way." A Group 3 winner on the racecourse, the brown

horse developed into a top sire, leading the New Zealand standings in 1992-93 and finishing second on the Australian list the same season. Among his 12 Group 1 winners were champion Slight Chance (NZ) and top performers Foxwood (NZ), Kinjite (NZ) and Sixty Seconds (NZ). Centaine has gone on to become a prominent broodmare sire as well: he is represented by Group 1 victors Amalfi (NZ), Giovana (NZ) and Tully Thunder (Aus), among others. He is expected to have over 30 foals from his final crop, conceived last season.

INGLIS SALE CONCLUDES STRONGLY The Inglis Australian Select Broodmare Sale concluded yesterday with another strong session. Leading Tuesday's results was a co-sale topper in champion **One Under (NZ)** (Volksraad {GB}), who sold for A\$700,000 to Fincam Developments. The seven-year-old, New Zealand's champion juvenile filly of 1998-99, is in foal to top European miler Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). The second highest price at Tuesday's session was for **Slice of Paradise (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), a stakes-placed maiden who is a full sister to juvenile sensation Alinghi. Grant Pritchard-Gordon signed the ticket at A\$375,000. In all, 233 lots sold yesterday, grossing A\$9,936,500 and averaging A\$42,646. Clearance rate for the two-day auction was 84 percent.
