MIDWAY ROAD SETS TRACK RECORD

Ambassador W. S. Farish's **Midway Road** (Jade Hunter) turned in a tour-de-force in the GIII Ben Ali S. at

Keeneland yesterday, gliding over a sloppy track to win by 11 1/4 lengths while clipping a 1/5 of a second off the track record. Runner-up in last year's GI Preakness S., the smallish bay was sidelined with an ankle chip following a third in the GII Ohio Derby last June and didn't make it back to the races until Mar. 18, when he ran fourth in a Fair Grounds optional claimer. But all

systems were go this time. Midway Road went up to take command entering the backstretch, cruised along with his ears pricked forward and opened up down the lane. "This was a big move forward for this horse," said trainer Neil Howard, who saddled eventual Horse of the Year Mineshaft in winning last year's renewal.

Mandella Stars in Action at Churchill

Trainer Richard Mandella sent out his Eclipse Award-winning pair of **Action This Day** (Kris S.) and **Halfbridled** (Unbridled) to work in company yesterday at Churchill Downs. The three-year-olds completed six furlongs in 1:12.40 over a sloppy surface. "There was no winner;

it was a dead heat," quipped Mandella. "They both needed a work and they were the only two I had to work together. He needed a little more than her and galloped out a little stronger than she did on purpose. It worked out pretty well. Obviously they were very good times and we will make sure they come out good in the morn-

ing and away we go." Action This Day, surprise winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last fall, finished sixth in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. in his most recent start Apr. 10, but exited that race with some minor complaints. "[He] was a little sore in his back after the Blue Grass, and we have done some work on him chiropractically and therapeutically," explained Mandella. "He has responded very well, and his work today showed he is in pretty good shape." David Flores has the mount for next Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby.

Stablemate Halfbridled has come up second best in two starts this season, but may be rounding into form now. "We have had a few bumps in the road," admitted Mandella, who had nominated the filly to the Triple Crown at the beginning of the year. "We are not quite where we were last year, so we will go a little more conservative, which may not be conservative. The fillies might be tougher than the colts anyway. I wouldn't mind winning the Oaks, believe me."

Westerner proved a consistent performer at stakes level last year, but the application of earplugs, which enabled him to settle, worked the oracle in his final two outings of last term. The five-year-old exhibited a liking for his new equipment when successful in both the G1 Prix du Cadran at Longchamp Oct. 5 and the G1 Prix Royal-Oak at the same track Oct. 26. He continued the winning run here, at odds of 4-5 on his seasonal debut, comfortably accounting for his fellow stayers with a dominant final-furlong display, and the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 17 could be on the agenda. "It is nice to see him return like that and to quicken the way he did in a race with no pace at all," commented trainer Elie Lellouche. "We'll follow the stayers' route in France with the [G2] Prix Vicomtesse Vigier [at Longchamp May 23] his next target. We will then consider the Ascot Gold Cup, but time will tell if he goes there as the ground might be too firm for him in June." The eventual winner was reserved off the sedate pace in rear as Le Carre set the tone in advance from Swing Wing (GB) (In The Wings {GB}). The order remained largely unchanged until the home straight where Westerner began his forward move on the outside. With jockey Dominique Boeuf completely ignoring the panic button, Westerner quickened majestically to the fore at the eighth pole and his momentum carried him far enough ahead of his rivals in the latter stages to allow the Wildenstein colorbearer to ease to the wire under a hand ride for a comfortable victory.

Preachinatthebar Out of Derby Consideration

Trainer Bob Baffert has withdrawn **Preachinatthebar** (Silver Charm) from Kentucky Derby consideration after the grey colt turned in a moderate workout at Churchill yesterday, covering six furlongs in 1:14.80. "He worked OK, but it wasn't what I wanted to see," said Baffert. "His last work was just so-so. It was better today, but not enough to convince me that he's got a shot to win the Derby." Baffert did not rule out a trip to Maryland for the GII San Felipe S. victor. "Physically, he's fantastic," he said. "He could make the next leg [GI Preakness S., Pimlico, May 15], but he's got to turn it around."

Sinister G Sick

Sinister G (Matty G) coughed Thursday at Belmont Park, forcing trainer John Toscano to alter his training schedule for the surprise GII Lane's End S. winner. "It is touch and go right now," Toscano said of his charge's chances on making the Derby. "He just jogged this morning and he coughed once coming back. We have him on antibiotics now and we will have to play the next couple days by ear." The dark bay had been scheduled to work Saturday ahead of shipping Wednesday. "I might have to delay [the work]," said Toscano. "He has to work by Monday [in order to go to Louisville]."

Imperialism, Pro Prado Work

Trainer Kristin Mulhall was aboard Imperialism (Langfuhr) Thursday morning when the grey colt

worked three-quarters in 1:17.40, but the move was not without some anxious moments. "I wasn't expecting a horse to drop in on me," Mulhall explained. "At the five-eighths pole, a horse came in about four lengths in front of me and I took him to the outside when they dropped in. I took him about 12

lengths back." The 21-year-old conditioner indicated that her charge would blow out three-eighths on Wednesday...Pro Prado (El Prado {Ire}), who has chased home Smarty Jones in three consecutive starts at Oaklawn, breezed six furlongs in 1:13.40 yesterday at Churchill, but remains on the outside looking in on the graded earnings list. "If we get in, we get in," said trainer Bob Holthus. "If not, we will try to get in the Preakness."

Tricky Taboo (Mazel Trick), runner-up in the GII Lane's End S., has officially been taken out of Classic consideration after a nuclear scan Monday revealed a minor injury to his left cannon bone. "I hate missing the Triple Crown as much as anyone, but my first priority is with the horse," said trainer Ed Frederick. "He was going to be the longest shot in the race. This horse still has some conditions left, and in 60 days he is going to come roaring back. We think he can be one of the better three-year-olds in the country."

Still in a Hard Place

The highly regarded **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.), whose \$90,000 in graded stakes earnings seem unlikely to get him into the Kentucky Derby, has been entered for

OBS SPRING SALE THURSDAY'S TOP SEVEN LOTS

RECORD-BREAKING OBS SALE CONCLUDES

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company closed the doors on a very successful four-day run yesterday afternoon, posting all-time records in gross receipts and average. A total of 774 horses were reported as sold for \$23,183,000, an increase of 55.4 percent versus the 2003 figure. The average price of \$29,952 represented a 41.3-percent improvement on the corresponding figure from a year ago. The median price of \$18,000, while not a record, improved on last year's number by an encouraging 38.5 percent. Thursday's fourth and final session was highlighted by the sale of hip 963, a Farnsworth Farms-consigned colt by Double Honor, which realized a final bid of \$675,000 from Bill Condren. Already named Collegiate Honor, the chestnut, a full brother to stakes winner College Honor, was impressive in the under-tack show, covering three furlongs in :33 4/5. John Ferguson, who purchased the sales-topping colt by Distorted Humor during Wednesday's penultimate round of bidding, purchased the day's second most coveted offering, a Texas-bred colt by Smoke Glacken. Sold at last year's Keeneland September sale for just \$15,500, the Apr. 4 foal became a pinhooking success for Costanzo Sales, with Ferguson signed the ticket for \$500,000. Out of Flo White (Whitesburg), the chestnut recorded the fastest quartermile breeze in OBS sales history when he stopped the clock in :20 3/5. Ferguson, acting as agent for Sheikh Mohammed, was the sale's leading buyer, with three head purchased for \$1.825 million. Trainer Steve Klesaris, acting as agent for Puglisi Stables, signed eight tickets for gross receipts of \$1.075 million. Complete results are available on www.obssales.com. 
