### **IRISH RIVER DIES**

THOROUGHBRED DAILY NEWS

Champion and leading sire Irish River (Fr) (Riverman--Irish Star {Fr}, by \*Klairon), who had been pensioned since 2001, died in his paddock Apr. 25 at Gainesway Farm near Lexington, Ky. He was 28 years old. "He was in reasonably good health for a stallion his age," farm representative Annete Covault told The Blood-Horse. As a juvenile, the chestnut captured three Group 1 events in France--the Grand Criterium, the Prix Morny and the Prix de la Salamandre--and was named that country's champion two-year-old of 1978. The following year, he earned another championship title in France by virtue of victories in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois and the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. Irish River began his stud career in France, but was acquired by Gainesway and transferred to the Kentucky farm in his second season. From his first Kentucky crop came Seven Springs, a multiple Group 1 winner at two who later produced top miler Distant View. He later sired additional Grade/Group 1 winners Brief Truce, Exit to Nowhere, Irish Prize, Leariva, Orban and River Bay, but enjoyed perhaps his best season in 1994, when he was represented by U.S. champions Hatoof and Paradise Creek. As a broodmare sire, Irish River is present in the pedigrees of Group 1 winners Arcanques, Dolphin Street (Ire), Insight (Fr) and Saffron Walden (Fr). In all, he has sired 82 stakes winners to date. His final crop consists of four-two-year-olds.

#### **The Forgotten Champion**

After running second in her two attempts as a sophomore, last year's champion juvenile filly **Halfbridled** (Unbridled) looks to get back on track in the Oaks. Breaking from the four hole, trainer Richard Mandella is currently happy with the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies victress. "She's doing well, really well," Mandella commented. "I'm very happy with her." Last seen finishing second, 8 1/4 lengths behind **Victory U.S.A.** (Victory Gallop) in the seven-furlong GII Beaumont S. at Keeneland, the 9-2 third-choice is scheduled for a threefurlong move this morning.



#### Master David Works Five Furlongs in Company

Second-place finisher in the GI Wood Memorial S., **Master David** (Grand Slam) stopped the clock at 1:00 4/5 for a five-furlong Churchill Downs move in company with three-year-old maiden stablemate Coded Warning yesterday. With veteran exercise rider Joe Deegan aboard, Master David was outside his partner for the drill and easily outran his less experienced rival, who finished in 1:01 3/5. "He sometimes gets a little lazy at the end of his works," explained trainer Bobby Frankel, who was nearly kicked by his Derby hopeful prior to the five-furlong drill. "He's O.K. the first part, but then he gets lazy. This way he'll stay after it."

#### **Minister Eric Given Final Tune-Up**

With his Kentucky Derby rider Pat Day in the irons, **Minister Eric** (Old Trieste) worked a half mile in :50 over a fast Churchill Downs main track yesterday morning. "We didn't do much away from the pole, but he finished up strong," Day said. "He surprised me how hard he pulled." Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up was last seen winning a Keeneland allowance by 4 1/4 lengths Apr. 14.

### Azamour Gets the Green Light

His Highness the Aga Khan's **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift) will run in Saturday's £300,000 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. The unbeaten winner of the G2 Beresford S. at the Curragh last October was declared a certain runner in the mile contest due to the drying conditions, leaving the track now riding good to firm. However, Clerk of the Course Michael Prosser is expecting rain. "We missed out last night, but I've been assured that we'll get rain by tomorrow," he said yesterday. "Thursday is forecast to be dry, but there could be showers on Friday. Although the ground has inevitably quickened up over the last few days, there's a great covering of grass and we'll be racing on virgin ground for the Guineas Festival."

### **Snow Ridge Settles Well**

Godolphin's **Snow Ridge (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) looks likely to line up in the 2000 Guineas after connections announced themselves satisfied with his condition. Last year's G2 Royal Lodge S. scorer shipped in on Monday and Racing Manager Simon Crisford revealed to the *Racing Post* that all was well. "There are loads of different options, but Snow Ridge is our principal contender--we will have to see but the early signs are positive," he commented. Crisford also suggested that Snow Ridge could be the sole contender in the mile Classic, with **Byron (GB)** (Green Desert) holding the option of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 16, and **Bayeux** (Red Ransom) also entered in the Listed Newmarket S. on the same afternoon.

### **Creek Peaking**


**Peak to Creek (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) pleased connections yesterday as the G3 Craven S. third-place finisher came through his final serious exercise for the 2000 Guineas. Partnered by Eddie Ahern in a 6½-furlong spin on Newmarket's Limekilns gallop, he showed all the right signals with a sharp work. "He pleased me immensely and he's definitely come on for his first run of the year," conditioner Jeremy Noseda said yesterday. "We wanted to get a good piece of work into him today and now he'll just canter in the days before the race."

### Holland Gets Majestic Call

Darryll Holland has been booked to ride Jaber Abdullah's **Majestic Desert (GB)** (Fraam {GB}) in Sunday's £325,000 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. Re-establishing the link with that owner began when he partnered Zafeen (Fr) to take the G1 St James' Palace S. at Royal Ascot last June. Holland will partner the G3 Fred Darling S. winner for the first time in the mile Classic. Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's **Necklace** (**GB**) (Darshaan {GB}) is also in need of a jockey after Jamie Spencer was unsuccessful in his appeal against a one-day ban picked up last weekend.

#### Katie to Carry On in France?

Godolphin may switch **Carry On Katie** (Fasliyev) to the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 16, it was revealed yesterday. Last year's G2 Lowther S. and G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine is one of three Godolphin fillies left in the 1000 Guineas, but it could be **Sundrop (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) who takes her place. "Carry On Katie may run in the French Guineas as opposed to the English," Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the *Racing Post*. "We will decide nearer the time. Sundrop is the most likely runner. **Cairns (UAE)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) could run, but we will see how they are later in the week." Sundrop was runnerup in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot in September, while Cairns took the G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket in October prior to being transferred from Mick Channon.

### WILD RUSH GOES FOR 3RD-CROP TOP FIVE

Two years ago, War Emblem, from the second crop of his sire <u>Our Emblem</u>, won the Kentucky Derby. Our Emblem began his stud career at Claiborne as Miner's Mark's faster, but non-stakes winning little brother. But by the end of 2001, when he'd had two crops of two-year-olds and one crop of three-year-olds, Our Emblem was in Maryland. Six months and somewhere in the neighborhood of \$10 million later, he was back in Kentucky. It was a dramatic illustration of how a correct rule of stallion analysis--don't bail out before a sire's second crop of three-year-olds have run--can have no commercial significance. It was the correct business decision to sell Our Emblem, because he was going to get next to no mares in 2002.

The rest, as you well know, is history. And there is a similar candidate this year, only maybe more so, in Wild Rush. Winner of the 1998 GI Met Mile (Beyer 118 in the mud), Wild Rush went to stud, along with the two Deputy Minister sons Awesome Again and Touch Gold, at Adena Springs in 1999, first foals 2000. But whereas those two ranked second and sixth, respectively, on the 2002 Freshman Sire List, Wild Rush ranked only 27th. Things didn't look much better by the middle of last year, so he looked expendable and was sold to Japan. Presto Change-o: by the end of 2003 he had five two-year-old stakes winners in his second crop of two-year-olds, and had advanced to ninth spot in cumulative progeny earnings among second-crop sires.

Now Wild Rush is one of five third-crop sires (meaning their third crop are two-year-olds, so this is their second crop of three-year-olds) who between them could be represented by as many as seven starters--35 percent of the runners--when the Derby field is drawn later today. Wild Rush and group leader <u>Grand Slam</u> have two candidates each (Wimbledon and Quinton's Gold Rush for Wild Rush, Master David and Limehouse for Grand Slam), and there is one each by <u>Tale of the</u> <u>Cat</u> (Lion Heart), <u>Elusive Quality</u> (Smarty Jones), and top Euro third-crop sire, <u>Peintre Celebre</u> (Castledale). It underlines, for about the umpteenth time, the quality and depth of this group of sires.

It would take a \$5-million bonus payout to Smarty Jones, I'm pretty sure, to dislodge Grand Slam from his position as the group's leader in cumulative progeny earnings. True, Grand Slam does have almost twice as many foals of racing age in his first two crops as does runner-up <u>Distorted Humor</u> (sire of last years' Derby winner); nonetheless, Grand Slam ranks third on the 2004 General Sire List going into Derby week, with over \$2.7 million in progeny earnings already this year, including six stakes winners.

Ironically, if Smarty Jones were to win the Derby and thus catapult his own sire, Elusive Quality, into at least a temporary lead over Grand Slam, there would be a lot of glass-clanging out at Mill Ridge Farm. Both Grand Slam and Elusive Quality are sons of Mill Ridge's now-venerable sire <u>Gone West</u>. Otherwise--unless Smarty Jones is the winner and the bonus does get counted--Grand Slam will still be on top of the pile this time next week. But if either of the Wild Rush colts win, that would seal his top-five position in a group of sires in which a top-five finish means you're in the big leagues--or you would be, if you weren't in Japan.

If you, Mr. Studmaster, have a sire whose second crop of two-year-olds are showing any promise at all, you might be better off waiting a year before bailing out, even if you risk getting no mares to your sire the next spring. In two of the last three years now, one sire a crop has come back from the dead to become a \$10-million horse. **Cont. p.5**

About halfway through their sophomore campaigns, top three-year-olds are asked to step out and begin measuring themselves against older horses. In the same way, groups of young sires are better compared against others with runners the same age up to a certain point, and then they have to step out into the wide world of all sires to see how they measure up. Statistically, that time does not really arrive until the end of the year their first crop have raced as four-year-olds. For this group of sires, that will be the end of 2004. But, as we've seen demonstrated only too convincingly, market pressures force breeders and stallion masters to make moves earlier. At least by now the fact that Wild Rush is very likely a top-five sire in this group is becoming evident, so there shouldn't be too many more shocking surprises left. And there's a lot we do know about this really good group of young sires.

Grand Slam, as mentioned above, is already third on the 2004 General Sire List. Distorted Humor had the Derby and Preakness winner in his first crop. Tale of the Cat was Leading Juvenile Sire in North America in 2003 and Elusive Quality, disqualified Leading Freshman Sire of 2002, has 14 stakes winners, more than any of the three that rank above him in cumulative progeny earnings. Each of the four has sired at least four graded stakes winners, more than 10 stakes winners, with cumulative progeny earnings of over \$5 million each. So they look pretty successful. Yet, because of the new big-foal crop phenomenon, the four combined have sired only 6.2 percent stakes winners/foals in their first two crops, and 10.6 percent stakes horses (SH, which is SW + SP)/foals. The standards simply have to change. If these sires are representative of the new wave of top stallions--and how can they not be, given their accomplishments so far?--the old figure of 10 percent stakes winners/foals simply doesn't apply for these sires. It's six percent stakes winners and 10 percent stakes horses.

Two of the big three Deputy Minister sons from this sire group, Deputy Commander and Awesome Again, are closely matched for fifth and sixth spots in cumulative progeny earnings at this point, about \$1 million ahead of Wild Rush, who has now worked his way up to seventh, but could be fifth by this time next week if he has the Derby winner. Deputy Commander has only two stakes winners--one percent of foals--but another eight stakes-placed; and his profile so far has been that they're improving with age. Awesome Again, by contrast, is still in the group top five with five graded stakes winners to date, and he has been very good with two-year-olds. He only needs a horse like Ghostzapper to come back strong this year and his name will be right back on everybody's lips. Wild Rush is already one of only five sires in this group with 10 or more stakes winners. The top 10 by cumulative progeny earnings is rounded off by <u>Souvenir Copy</u>, Touch Gold and Indian Charlie, each with over \$3.5 million to date.

Besides Wild Rush, three other stallions who have made good forward moves this year are <u>Skip Away</u>, Benchmark (in California), and <u>Arch</u>. Skip Away ranks eighth in 2004 progeny earnings among this group, and has moved from 17th overall, at the end of 2003, to 12th. He now has 14 stakes-placed horses to go with four stakes winners, making 18 stakes horses in all--a respectable nine percent of foals, in today's context.

Benchmark, like many other California sires recently, has exploited the opportunities caused by short fields in California, but even if you happen to live there, you still have to be good enough to earn the money. He's ninth in 2004 earnings, and now has two graded stakes winners. Arch finished 2002 in 51st place on the Freshman Sire table, and is working his way up the list. He's just had his first graded stakes winner, now has eight stakes horses, and ranks 14th among this group in 2004 earnings, though still 29th overall. He still looks like a great buy, for those breeders who really can wait, at \$5,000 this year.

Although it came too late to earn him a place in the Derby lineup, Sir Shackleton's victory in Saturday's GIII Derby Trial S. marked him as a three-year-old to watch. Sir Shackleton didn't reach the track until mid-February this year, when he took second to the subsequent GIII Bay Shore S. winner Forest Danger in a maiden. Winner of a Gulfstream maiden event and a Keeneland allowance in subsequent starts, Sir Shackleton had to overcome proven performers on his stakes debut. The runner-up was the San Pedro S. victor Courageous Act; the third was Bwana Charlie, winner of the GIII Lafayette S. on his previous start; and another 2004 stakes winner, Quick Action, finished off the board.

Sir Shackleton is by Mr. Prospector's veteran son Miswaki. Winner of the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and Prix Yacowlef on turf at two, Miswaki raced on dirt in the U.S. at three, winning the Charles Hatton S. and finishing second in the GII Fall Highweight H. Miswaki has sired top-class performers on dirt and turf, but less predictably, in view of his own record as a sprinter, they have excelled over an extremely wide range of distances. In fact, we can note Group/Grade 1 winners at five furlongs (Kistena, who took G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp); a mile (Italian champion Misil); a mile and a guarter (GI Breeders' Cup Classic victor and champion older horse Black Tie Affair); and a mile and a half (the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Urban Sea, and GI Japan Cup winner Marvelous Crown).

Sir Shackleton has a somewhat unusual female line in that, while each of his first three dams was a runner of some distinction, none either won a stakes event or, until the weekend, had produced a stakes winner. His dam Naskra Colors was a daughter of champion sprinter Star de Naskra. She made 28 starts over five seasons, winning five races and amassing \$411,437.

She somehow avoided winning a stakes event, even though she was good enough to take second in three such events, including the GIII Pimlico Distaff H., and third in GI Spinster S., GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H., GIII Falls City H. and GIII Modesty H. Sir Shackleton is only her second foal.

Naskra Colors was one of two stakes performers produced by her dam, the True Colors (by Hoist the Flag) mare True Chompion, the other being the GIII Golden Rod S. runner-up Mollie Creek. True Chompion herself was no mean runner, taking second or third in five stakes events and also finishing fourth in the GIII Boiling Springs S. and GIII Suwanee River H. at a time when such efforts merited inclusion on the catalog page. Naskra Color's granddam Beseech was a minor stakes-placed performer by the Tom Fool grandson Chompion, and it is with Beseech that we reach the first graded stakes winner in the family prior to Sir Shackleton. This was Beseech's half-sister Castle Royale, a New Jersey-bred daughter of Slady Castle, who rose above state-bred competition to capture the 1982 renewal of the GII Sheepshead Bay H. Sir Shackleton is a product of the Mr. Prospector/Naskra cross, which has produced at least 20 unrestricted stakes winners.

In addition to being the product of a relatively proven cross, the pedigrees of both Sir Shackleton and his dam reflect what appears to be a thoughtful mating process. Naskra Colors is inbred to the good sprinter Clandestine, who appears as broodmare sire of her sire Star de Naskra and as sire of her third dam Dotsie Go. Even more intriguingly, Sir Shackleton is inbred 3x4 to the Matron S. heroine Rose Bower, who appears as granddam of Miswaki and the dam of True Colors, sire of Sir Shackleton's second dam True Chompion.

The connections between Miswaki's dam Hopespringseternal and True Chompion are even closer. They are both by stallions who have War Admiral as their broodmare sire, and Hopespringseternal is by a son of Tom Fool, while True Chompion's dam is by a grandson of that horse. This pattern is obviously no coincidence, as True Chompion herself was also bred to Miswaki, although the result of that mating, the filly Inlay, was only a minor winner.

Sir Shackleton is not the only good Miswaki with a duplication of his sire's family. The French stallion Targowice is a very close relative to Rose Bower, and he appears in three Miswaki stakes winners, including two-time French champion Kistena and Daylight Come, a three-time stakes winner in Canada.
