Godolphin's Snow Ridge (Ire) (Indian Ridge (Ire)) was dealt an even tougher hand and will exit from the 14 hole, but trainer Saeed bin Suroor has expressed himself "happy" with the condition of last year's G2 Royal Lodge S. winner since being shipped in from Dubai. "He has worked really good and had a very good trial," he told the Racing Post. Angus Gold, racing manager to Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum, owner of Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}), was

satisfied with the draw in four for the impressive G3 Craven S. scorer. "That's good enough for me," he said yesterday. "[Trainer] Barry [Hills] wants him where he's comfortable--he can either make it or sit in behind as he's relatively straightforward. [Jockey] Richard [Hills] sat on him last weekend and was happy with the horse. He's fit and well and he lengthened nicely up the hill last time." Among the notable withdrawals was the John Dunlop-trained Iqte Saab (Danzig), who "will be built up more gently to this level" according to Gold, and the Jeremy Noseda-trained Peak To Creek (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), who was ruled out after being discovered to have a temperature on Thursday morning. Also among the scratchings was the Aidan O'Brientrained duo Grand Reward (Storm Cat) and Newton (Ire) (Danehill), and Godolphin's Bayeux (Red Ransom) and Byron (GB) (Green Desert).

Friendly Michelle raced with a testing pace from the inside, looked hopelessly beaten turning for home, but dug in gamely in deep stretch for a hard-fought victory in the La Troienne. Fourth to Halfbridled in their respective racetrack debuts at Del Mar last July 27, the chestnut broke through with a 6 1/2-length maiden win at the Seaside Aug. 10 before getting a break. The \$77,000 Fasig-Tipton July graduate returned to annex a Santa Anita optional claimer on New Year's Eve, set the early fractions before fading to be third in the GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 15 and most recently cut back to one turn to win the Mar. 21 Santa Paula S. in Arcadia. Friendly Michelle alternated on the front end with Florida Oaks winner Ender's Sister, but was headed by that rival at the quarter pole and looked to be dropping out of it. Favored Bohemian Lady looped up on the outside and appeared to be going best of all, but Friendly Michelle rallied resolutely up the inside and was along late for the victory. COURT OKS JOCKEY ADS A federal court issued a temporary injunction yesterday that will allow the jockeys involved with the lawsuit against the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority to wear advertisements during Saturday's Kentucky Derby. Jerry Bailey, Shane Sellers, Jose Santos, Alex Solis and John Velazguez were among the jockeys who sued to overturn a state law that precludes riders from wearing advertisements. In response to the injunction, Churchill Downs released a list of "house rules" on the wearing of promotional material. Churchill will allow jockeys competing at its 2004 Spring Meet to wear advertisements with the following exceptions: the track reserves the right to disallow advertisements or logos featuring products that it feels are inappropriate or offensive, as well as advertisements to promote wagering or gaming companies or companies that compete with the track or its affiliate sponsors. "Churchill Downs has established House Rules on Jockey Advertising to balance our jockevs' desire to pursue sponsorship opportunities with our responsibility to protect the interests of our existing racetrack and affiliate sponsors, who have made longterm commitments to Churchill Downs, its marquee events and the sport of horse racing," explained Churchill Downs President Steve Sexton. "We are openly communicating our House Rules to jockeys and owners of horses scheduled to compete on the 2004 Oaks and Derby Day race cards--and will promptly respond to questions regarding Churchill Downs' House Rules and their application to specific sponsorships. In the future, we look forward to working with various industry participants to maximize sponsorship opportunities for the sport of horse racing." Churchill will also apply its house rules to jockeys' family members and agents in the track's paddock, winner's circle and Kentucky Derby presentation stand.






