HISTORY IN THE MAKING

It has been 48 years since a horse has won the Kentucky Derby without a race in April. It has been 27 years since an undefeated colt wore the blanket of



roses. It has been 25 years since the reigning two-year-old champion stood in the winner's circle at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May. But losing streaks can't last forever, as Funny Cide proved last year when he became the first New York-bred ever, and the first gelding since Clyde Van Dusen in 1929, to capture the Kentucky Derby. Will today's 130th

running of the Classic change the history of the race? Don't be surprised. On paper, Read the Footnotes (Smoke Glacken) will be the fastest horse in the starting gate this afternoon. The New York-bred bay has not started since running fourth as the favorite in the Mar. 13 GI Florida Derby, but ran the race of his life off a layoff, earning a 113 Beyer with his neck win in the Feb. 14 GII Fountain of Youth S. Trainer Rick Violette Jr. could not be happier with the way his colt is coming into the Derby. He's not even worried about the impending wet weather. "The mud might help us," Violette said vesterday. "We're going to be up near the lead, which is an advantage on a muddy track. The closers are going to be faced with a tidal wave of mud, and a horse has to be very brave to run through that."

His Day to Shine?

In addition to the possibility of a wet track, the laterunning Action This Day (Kris S.) will have to overcome the juvenile champion's jinx and must rebound from



two sub-par efforts. The Eclipse winner was sixth in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. last time out. But this year's undefeated starter Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) ran his record to six-for-six with his

A COOL THREE MILLION

It cost Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor \$3.1 million to buy One Cool Cat (Storm Cat), but a victory in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket this afternoon would mean a solid return on that investment. Whatever his

price tag, this good-looking Cat is not just about pedigree and aesthetics. There was substance in his racetrack performances in 2003, from his York maiden score in June to his easy disposal of his rivals in the G1 National S. at The Curragh One Cool Cat Getty Images in September. Versatile over six



and seven furlongs at two, he holds strong claims of providing Aidan O'Brien with his third English Guineas renewal since King of Kings (Ire) opened the scoring in 1998. Three of the last four Kentucky Derby winners have come out of the GI Wood Memorial S. Fusaichi Pegasus won the 2000 renewal en route to his "Run for the Roses," but both Monarchos (2001) and Funny Cide



(2003) rebounded from runnerup finishes to win on the first Saturday in May. This year's Wood winner Tapit (Pulpit) has attracted a lot of pre-race press. The eye-catching gray was sixth in the GI Florida Derby in his seasonal bow, but came out of the race with a

lung infection. He bounced back to post a rallying score at Aqueduct Apr. 10. "It

takes 28 days to get over a lung infection, and that was the 28th day," trainer Michael Dickinson said. "He was not completely healed. He won that race on talent and courage alone, because he wasn't totally healthy." He added, "I want him to peak on Derby Day." Trainer Bobby Frankel is also hoping that Wood runner-up Master David (Grand Slam) improves off that effort. "You hope he goes in the right direction," Frankel said. "He has to improve to win this race, but he's a nice tough horse and he tries real hard. He has that going for him."

In the Catbird Seat?

Nick Zito is the only trainer in Derby 130 who knows what it's like to win the big one. Zito, who earned Derby trophies with Go for Gin in 1991 and Strike the Gold in 1994, saddles potential favorite The Cliff's Edge (Gulch), winner of the GI Toyota Blue Grass S., and Birdstone (Grindstone). Birdstone has not been out since running fifth in the Mar. 20 GII Lane's End S. "He is the forgotten horse," Zito said. "He got sidetracked, but he was brilliant as a two-year-old...l couldn't ask for anything better from either horse."

Derby Field Reduced to 18

There were two late scratches from the Derby yesterday morning. Trainer Bob Baffert, who has had a Derby starter every year since 1996, had to take out Wimbledon (Wild Rush) after discovering a knot on the gray colt's left front tendon Friday morning. "He must have rapped himself," Baffert said. "The injury doesn't appear career threatening, but you have to be extremely careful with soft tissue damage. We won't know the extent of the injury unitl we get an ultrasound." The defection of Wimbledon leaves jockey Jerry Bailey without a Derby mount for the first time since 1991. Also scratched yesterday was St Averil (Saint Ballado), who had been on the fence until Monday because of his sore feet. "His feet have been tender," trainer Rafael Becerra said. "We reshod him this morning, taking off the bar shoes he has been training in, but I still wasn't satisfied with the way he was traveling. He's too nice a colt to take a chance with and he has a great future ahead of him." St Averil will head to Greenfield Farm in Lexington for R and R.

A Hard and Fast Rule?

Will there ever be also-eligibles for the Derby? With early-bird betting, it would complicate matters, but history says it would make sense to work out the technical kinks. The last time 20 three-year-olds actually made it to the gate for the Derby was in 1984. In the 20 years since, the race has drawn a field of 20 just three times--but there were scratches on the day before the race on all three occasions. Trainer Jason Orman shipped Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) cross-country on the chance that the colt, who ended up 22nd in gradedstakes earnings on the list of Derby candidates, would make the cut. "Obviously, with the position we were in, we would have loved it if they had also-eligibles for the race," Orman said yesterday. "But maybe they have a really good reason why they don't--l just don't know what it is." Rock Hard Ten has been training well since scratching from the Apr. 24 GIII Derby Trial S. "He's doing really good," Orman said. "If he keeps training this well, we'll go on to the [May 15] Preakness."

Easy To Swallow?

Trainer Dermot Weld waited a long time for a colt good enough for the Guineas, but his patience was finally rewarded 12 months ago when Refuse to Bend (Ire) landed the prize. He returns with another live chance in the unbeaten **Grey Swallow (Ire)** (Daylami {Ire}). There were shades of his sire in his emphatic eight-length defeat of Newton (Ire) in the G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown in October, which followed the rush of excitement he created when powering to a 10length maiden score at Galway in July. He had to battle to defy a five-pound penalty in the mud when winning the Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial last time Apr. 18, but should improve off that game effort.

Bucking The Trend

No winner of the G3 Craven S, has followed up in this since Tirol (Ire) in 1990, but Haafd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) bids to put that right after an impressive return in that prep Apr. 15. His five-length defeat of Three Valleys (Diesis {GB}) may flatter him, as he was left alone in front, but he proved his quality when breaking the juvenile track record in the Listed Washington Singer S. at Newbury last August. France have been responsible for only two winners since '83, but Whipper (Miesque's Son) is a worthy contender. After a shock score in the G1 Prix Morny in August, he was a staying-on fifth to Three Valleys in the G1 Middle Park S. at this track in October. He confirmed his class with a smooth success in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte later that month and began his sophomore campaign with an eightlength score in the Listed Prix Djebel Apr. 6.

Worse than second just once in her short career, Ashado followed a third-place effort in the GI Frizette S. with a second-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juve-



nile Fillies. She ended the season with a gallant nose victory in the Nov. 29 GII Demoiselle S. at Aqueduct. Freshened off that effort, the Triple Crown nominee opened 2004 with a handy score in the Mar. 6 GII Fair Grounds Oaks,

while giving winner Madcap Escapade five pounds. She was favored to turn the tables with the added distance at Churchill Downs.

Mad About the Mud

While Madcap Escapade had raced only on fast tracks, Ashado had shown an affinity for off going in the past, breaking her maiden by seven lengths in her debut in the slop at Belmont last June and cruising to a three-length score in the GII Schuylerville S. over a soupy Saratoga strip last July. But the Ashland heroine appeared to handle the mud as she opened up 4 1/4 lengths through a half in :46. She was still four in front after six furlongs, but began to tire as they came down the lane. Ashado kicked it into gear, fought her way to the front and had enough left to hold Island Sand safe to the wire. "That was beautiful," winning jockey John Velazguez said. "I couldn't have asked for a better trip. I was closing the way I thought I would. Madcap Escapade wasn't going to get away from us--I wasn't afraid of her at all. We were in good striking distance. My filly responded to everything I asked for--and she runs on anything." Island Sand, who had broken her maiden by 12 3/4 lengths on a muddy track at Laurel, was easily second best. "My filly kept running all the way to the wire, but [Ashado] felt us coming and picked it up again," jockey Terry Thompson said. "At the eighth pole I really thought we were going to get there, but the winner just kept going." Click for the brisnet.com chart or the free brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree.

First Loss for Escapade

Madcap Escapade won her first three starts by a combined 26 1/2 lengths, including a 4 3/4-length tally in the Mar. 13 GII Forward Gal S., and extended her streak in her two-turn bow, the GI Ashland. On the lead from the break again yesterday, she just couldn't hang on, tiring to be third. "She broke running and she felt comfortable all the way," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "The fractions were quick, but not ridiculously fast. She ran as hard as she could. I don't think she wants to go this far against this kind."

No Draw Fears for Johnston

A deep field of 17 fillies will line up for Sunday's £325,000 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, but, despite the promise of "virgin ground" and the placing of



the stalls in the centre of the track, fears that the field may split into separate groups are widespread among connections of the contenders. But conditioner Mark Johnston, whose unbeaten Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}) has drawn Attraction J Herbert/Getty Images in the middle in stall eight, is

unconvinced of a potential bias. "They said when Mister Baileys won the 2000 Guineas in 1994 that the horses on the far side had the advantage and were racing on the better ground, but the form held up all season," he said yesterday. "The same thing happened with Rock of Gibraltar and Hawk Wing two years ago. I've never been a believer that there is a draw bias at Newmarket. Obviously, you don't like to see them split and I hope they don't--it's far better to stay together. We'll probably go stands' side, but we'll wait and see."

Sweet Sixteen

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Hathrah (Ire) (Linamix {Fr}), who powered to a nine-length score in the Listed Masaka S. at Kempton Apr. 10, has been given the go-ahead after drawing post 16 yesterday. "If I read it correctly, it's not the strongest renewal and she's in good form," commented racing manager Angus Gold. "I've never seen her as a speed filly and probably 1 1/4 miles will be perfect, but I'd like to see her run on at the finish, and if there's any more ease in the ground she'll appreciate that." Cheveley Park Stud's Red Bloom (GB) (Selkirk) was also handed a middle berth in the seven hole, while Godolphin's trio of Carry on Katie (Fasliyev), Sundrop (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and Cairns (UAE) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) are split across the track. Sundrop, the first Classic mount of new Godolphin rider Kerrin McEvoy, will exit from the one hole, while Carry on Katie and Frankie Dettori will depart from stall 10. That draw position has seen two of the last four winners: Lahan (GB) and Ameerat (GB). 1000 Guineas Preview cont. p7
