NO HAAFHD MEASURES

Avenging the narrow defeat of his dam Al Bahathri in the fillies' equivalent in 1985, Sheikh Hamdan bin



Rashid al Maktoum's Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) surged to an impressive 1 3/4-length score in yesterday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. The 11-2 second choice stalked a furious early gallop in the centre Haafd Julian Herbert/Getty Images as the pack spread across the Rowley Mile, was committed by

jockey Richard Hills passing the three-furlong marker and, despite the late challenges of Snow Ridge (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift), was always in command in the uphill climb to the line. "He's a very good horse," Hills said. "They were going very quick and he wanted to go after them, but I didn't want him to do too much. Perfect Smarts

Smarty Jones had sustained a skull fracture in a starting gate accident last July and spent some time at the New Jersey Equine Clinic, but recovered in due time and was the even-money favorite for his career opener Nov. 9. Few people who visited Philadelphia Park that day realized they might be witnessing the debut of a future Kentucky Derby winner, but that's exactly what happened. Smarty Jones posted a handy 7 3/4-length score, then trounced state-breds by 15 lengths in the Pennsylvania Nursery S. Nov. 22. He covered seven furlongs in 1:21 4/5 that day, earning a Beyer Speed Figure of 105, and trainer John Servis determined that it was time to take his charge on the road. After a comprehensive five-length tally in Aqueduct's Count Fleet S. going two turns Jan. 3, Smarty Jones took the Arkansas route of the Triple Crown trail. His victory in the Southwest S. Feb. 28 going a mile at Oaklawn didn't inspire confidence in his ability to handle added furlongs, but Servis tightened the screws afterwards and Smarty Jones responded, finding another gear to win the Mar. 20 Rebel S. with a 108 Beyer Speed Figure. The Chapmans, who sold off most of their stock following the murder of their previous trainer Robert Camac in 2001, resisted offers to sell Smarty Jones, and Servis declined switching to a higher-profile rider. The Apr. 10 \$1-million GII Arkansas Derby would be the one and only chance for Smarty Jones to pick up much-needed graded stakes earnings and the chestnut came through, posting his sharpest win to date with a 107 Beyer Speed Figure.

Servis With a Smile

Though Smarty Jones had been a perfect six-for-six while racing without medication, John Servis made the decision to treat the colt with Lasix as a precautionary measure for the Kentucky Derby. He had been training brilliantly ahead of his date with destiny, posting four straight bullet works, including three five-furlong breezes in :58 and change. His final tune-up for the Run for the Roses was completed in :58 under motionless jockey Willie Martinez.

Family Matters

But if there was one reason Smarty Jones was not the morning-line favorite for the Derby (he was the 9-2 second choice), it was likely based on pedigree concerns. After all, he was by record-setting miler Elusive Quality out of a mare by champion sprinter Smile. Once again, though, it pays to look a bit deeper. Elusive Quality, second (with Distorted Humor third) in the GII King's Bishop S. at three, set a track record going seven furlongs and a world record for a mile as a fouryear-old. With Hero's Honor as a broodmare sire and Sir Ivor as the sire of his second dam, Elusive Quality certainly had the credentials to endow his offspring with stamina. Smarty Jones' dam I'll Get Along was a confirmed sprinter, but she was produced by a stakeswinning Foolish Pleasure mare and had major stamina influence *Herbager the next generation back. And the aforementioned Smile, hero of the Breeders' Cup Sprint on his way to an Eclipse Award as a four-year-old, was an accomplished performer at two turns. At three, the Frances Genter homebred landed the nine-furlong GI Arlington Classic and finished third to Belmont hero Creme Fraiche in the 10-furlong GI American Derby.

Playing Favorites

The large crowd on hand at Churchill Downs sent Smarty Jones postward as the 4-1 favorite. Breaking from post 15--the first spot in the auxiliary gate--he had extra cushion to his left when the doors opened and used his natural speed to cross over several paths approaching the clubhouse turn. He was in a bit tight between Read the Footnotes (Smoke Glacken) and Pollard's Vision (Carson City) as Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) showed the way through an opening quarter of :22.99, but bowled along over the sloppy surface and began to edge closer to the leader after a half in :46.73. His fellow stalkers began to drop back on the far turn, but Smarty Jones set his sights on Lion Heart and moved up to tackle that rival passing the quarter pole. Lion Heart, once again game in defeat, could not match strides with the winner. Smarty Jones joins Fusaichi Pegasus (2000) as the only winning Derby favorites since Spectacular Bid in 1979.

First Time for Everything

At 39, Stewart Elliott had his first Derby mount aboard Smarty Jones. But the journeyman rider kept his

nerves in check. "Before the race, they played 'My Old Kentucky Home,'" said Elliott. "People were right, that is pretty emotional. But I think riding him in the Arkansas Derby helped me a lot. I was pretty relaxed today." Elliott summoned his experience to give the favorite a perfect ride. "I've been doing this a long time," he added. "A

horse race is a horse race, even if it is the Kentucky Derby. I've ridden in thousands of them." Winning trainer John Servis was rewarded for keeping faith in Elliott. "Stewart Elliott gave this horse a masterful ride," said Servis. "Like I was saying all week, after the Kentucky Derby I'm not sure I can get him to ride for me back at Philadelphia Park. He can go anywhere he wants and ride. I'm sure his phone will be ringing off the hook after this."

Smarty's Next Test?

Servis said that he would give his Derby winner a few days before committing to the GI Preakness S. two weeks hence. "I'll have to see how he comes out of this race," he said. "He's had a pretty tough schedule since February, running three weeks apart. He came through it very well. I can't imagine him training any better than he did this week. If he comes out of this race and trains as well, I'm going to be real excited about the Preakness."

The Heart of a Lion

A surprise 5-1 second choice, **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat) went right to the front and tugged jockey Mike



Smith as they clicked off solid fractions. Still a head in front after a mile in 1:37.35, the chestnut battled gamely to the eighth pole before grudglingly giving way. "I had a great trip and every opportunity to beat him, but Smarty Jones just had another gear today," jockey Mike Smith said. "I tried to get away from him and he

hung with me--I knew it was going to be a dogfight to the end."

Wet Track Takes Its Toll

GI Toyota Blue Grass hero The Cliff's Edge (Gulch), looking to give trainer Nick Zito his third Derby trophy, was far back early after getting away slowly and was carried five wide around the first turn. Seventeenth at the guarter pole, he came with a mild late bid to be fifth, beaten 12 1/2 lengths. "He just didn't handle the track at all, not one bit, and he had to overcome a horrible trip," jockey Shane Sellers said. "There were 16 horses in front of me, bumping me around. It's the greatest race in America and the toughest race to win." Zito was gracious in defeat. "First of all, I definitely would like to salute the winner," he said. "He ran a great race and he's a champion. I hate making excuses and I know the fans hate it too, but The Cliff's Edge lost two front shoes during the race. Due to that fact, you definitely have to give my horse a lot of credit." GI WoodMemorial winner Tapit (Pulpit) also had trouble with the muddy Churchill surface. Next to last after the opening quarter, he closed some ground on the far turn, but had nothing left for the stretch drive and finished ninth. "[Jockey Ramon Dominguez] said he never handled the surface," trainer Michael Dickinson said. "In the Wood Memorial, he was always cruising and just took Ramon to the lead. Today, he never had much horse and he had to ask him to go. He said that, throughout the race, he never thought he was going to win."

Haafhd looked a top-class prospect at two as he smashed the juvenile track record in the Listed Washington Singer S. at Newbury in August, but could only manage third behind Lucky Story in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster the following month. He filled the same spot behind Milk it Mick (Millkom {GB}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. at this track in October, but had his picture taken again after beating Three Valleys (Diesis {GB}) by five lengths in the G3 Craven S. over course and distance Apr. 15. Looking to become the first Craven winner to follow up in the 2000 Guineas since Tirol (Ire) in 1990, Haafhd was settled just off a quick pace as Golden Sahara (Green Desert) and Tumblebrutus (Storm Cat) took them along. The chestnut drove to the lead with more than two furlongs to run and held on with determination. "This one's for Sheikh Hamdan, Tom Jones [trainer of Al Bahathri] and everyone who has helped me," said winning jockey Richard Hills. The Thrill of Victory

"Its probably the greatest thrill since Rheingold won the Arc in 1973," commented conditioner Barry Hills, who also took this event with Tap on Wood (GB) in 1979. "[Richard] rode an enterprising race on the horse, which was the plan--to take the race to the others. Haafhd has a very laid-back attitude and that was important today." As for future plans, he added, "Sheikh Hamdan takes a keen interest in this horse, knows the family very well and will decide the next step. If he stuck at a mile, the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 15] would be an obvious race." Saeed bin Suroor expressed himself "very pleased" with the run of Snow Ridge, who heads to the June 5 G1 Epsom Derby. That Classic may also be the target of Azamour, but owner-breeder His Highness the Aga Khan revealed the colt would have a prep run beforehand.

Success Begets Success

Purchased for \$650,000 as a yearling in 1983, Al Bahathri developed into an excellent two-year-old, capturing the G2 Princess Margaret S. and the G2 Lowther S. as well as finishing third in the G1 Cheveley Park S. She just failed to hold off Triple Crown heroine Oh So Sharp (GB) in the G1 1000 Guineas, but earned Classic success in her next start by taking the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas before adding a victory in the G2 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot. Her first foal, Listed winner Hasbah, was second in the G1 Coronation S., but Al Bahathri didn't come up with another stakes winner until her 1998 colt Munir captured the G2 Challenge S. and the G3 Greenham S. Barren to Unfuwain in 2002, the chestnut mare has a yearling colt by 2000 Guineas hero King's Best. She failed to conceive to Alhaarth last year.

One Cool Cat Eased

One Cool Cat, who was well-supported into 15-8 favoritism, failed to quicken from the rear before being eased. He was found to have an irregular heart beat by Jockey Club vet Howard Robinson. "After the race, he was selected for routine testing," Robinson told *Channel 4 Racing*. "We listened to his heart and lungs and found his heart had an irregular beat. This means, in his case, that there were several fast beats followed by several slow beats. This is very abnormal after a race." But, he added, "The horse is fine. He is recovering well, his recovery rate is normal and there's no welfare problem whatsoever." The condition could be career-threatening, but more tests will be taken before deciding on the \$3.1 million colt's future.

IN BLOOM

Cheveley Park Stud finally broke their maiden in the G1 1000 Guineas with Russian Rhythm 12 months ago and they have the chance of a quick follow up with Red Bloom (GB) (Selkirk) at Newmarket this afternoon. A July Course maiden winner last August, Red Bloom was pitched into the deep end for her second start and displayed professionalism, belying her inexperience when beating Sundrop (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) by 1 1/4 lengths in the Sept. 27 G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot. Classic ability is in the blood--her dam, the talented Red Camellia (GB), managed a third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches despite being plagued by injury throughout her brief career. She faces Cartier Award winner Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}), who makes her first appearance since July. The unbeaten filly showed blistering speed to win the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot in June and G2 Cherry Hinton S. at this track the following month, but was laid up thereafter with a fractured pedal bone. She will be trying a mile for the first time. "I can't say she's done enough for me to be confident she'll stay, but the hope is based on pedigree and build," said trainer Mark Johnston. "Most Efisios stay a mile, but it's her temperament more than physique which will determine whether she gets it."

Godolphin Goes for the Triple

Like Red Bloom's conditioner Sir Michael Stoute, Godolphin have two renewals in the locker and they are all out for a third with a three-pronged attack this time. But while stamina doubts surround unbeaten **Carry On Katie** (Fasliyev) and **Cairns (UAE)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), Godolphin's third bullet Sundrop is more in the mold of their 2002 heroine Kazzia (Ger). She shaped like a stayer in the Fillies' Mile, where she encountered trouble at a crucial stage and had to settle for second, but has displayed adequate speed in her training in Dubai this spring. She makes her third career start today.

But a determined Mayo On the Side, getting 11 pounds from Azeri, put her head down first on the line. Winning trainer Carl Nafzger had nothing but praise for the gallant runnerup. "We won the race and we were very glad we won it, but a great filly like Azeri running in a Grade I should not be giving weight," Nafzger said. "These Grade Is should be equal weights."
