CONGAREE RETIRED

Robert and Janice McNair have announced the retirement of their multiple Grade I winner **Congaree** (Arazi-Mari's Sheba, by Mari's Book), who will enter stud in 2005. "Congaree has been everything one would want in a racehorse," Bob McNair commented. "He's a big, beautiful, deceptively fast, extremely durable horse with a winning personality."

A very large foal, Congaree suffered two fractured ribs and three cracked ribs when he was foaled and was confined to a stall for a month and a half, but he always showed class, so much so that when he lost his career bow in September 2000, connections were dumbfounded. Congaree was diagnosed with a knee chip and missed the rest of the year, but found his way onto the Triple

Crown trail with three consecutive victories, including a 2 3/4-length conquest over subsequent Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos in the GII Wood Memorial. An excellent third in the Run for the Roses, Congaree was third in the GI Preakness S. and won the GI Swaps S., but was injured when third in the GI Jim Dandy S. in August of his three-year-old season. A Grade I winner from seven to 10 furlongs, the Bob Baffert trainee won the first of his two GI Cigar Mile H. at the end of 2002 and became the first horse in NYRA history to win each of Aqueduct's signature races when he defeated subsequent champion Aldebaran in the GI Carter H. last April. The winner of the 2003 GI Hollywood Gold Cup over the classic distance of 1 1/4 miles, Congaree was a gallant fourth to Pleasantly Perfect in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic to end the season. He was fourth in last Saturday's GII Churchill Downs H. "He's as brilliant a miler as I've ever ridden," said jockey Jerry Bailey, who carried Stonerside's colors to five Grade I wins aboard Congaree. "[He was] so talented, he could carry [his speed] a mile and a quarter in Grade I races, which is pretty unique." Congaree retires with a record of 25-12-2-4 and earnings of \$3,267,490. A decision on where he will enter stud will be released later.

Servis "Leaning Towards" Preakness for 'Smarty'

John Servis, trainer of GI Kentucky Derby winner **Smarty Jones** (Elusive Quality), is leaning towards running his charge in the GI Preakness S. May 15. "We're concentrating on playing it by ear," he said during a national teleconference yesterday. "He came out of the race really, really good. He's been eating up real well and trained real well with a pony [Thursday] morning. I'm going to turn him loose and let him gallop by himself tomorrow." Although the chestnut colt appears to be doing fine, Servis is still not declaring his Derby winner a definite starter for the second jewel of the Triple Crown just yet. "Tomorrow will be a big

tell-tale sign on what we are going to do, but right now I'm leaning towards for the Preakness," Servis added. "If my horse isn't 110 percent, he's not going to run though. The Triple Crown is a great thing. It would be a great thing to have a horse going through it undefeated, but it's not worth jeopardizing the horse. [Owners] Mr. and Mrs. Chapman are behind me 100 percent." Smarty Jones will not work Saturday at Philadelphia Park as was previously announced. Instead, he will gallop at 8:30 a.m. and, if he goes on to the Preakness, will do so without an official timed work.

Lion Heart Gearing Up For Preakness

Second-place finisher in the GI Kentucky Derby **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat) is doing well since his valiant effort, according to trainer Patrick Biancone. "He's come out of it good," Biancone said during a national teleconference yesterday. "He's a very tough cookie. He eats well and is very happy. He's a very tough horse. Hopefully he'll recover very nice to be ready for Saturday." Biancone believes that the horse that recovers the best from the Derby will be in good position to take the Preakness. Despite being sent off at 9-1, Red Lancer had solid claims entering this contest based on his smart handicap form. Twice a runner-up to subsequent G3 Classic Trial winner African Dream (GB), latterly in a competitive Newbury handicap Apr. 16, he failed by a short head to give subsequent Listed Newmarket S. scorer Hazyview (GB) five pounds in a handicap at Sandown last time Apr. 23. Always traveling with ease towards the rear yesterday, he arrived at the head of affairs with quarter of a mile remaining and duly turned the race into a procession, being eased when clear in the closing stages. "He's only little but he's got some engine," jockey Robert Miles said. "He's very underrated and in this ground he really does quicken." Conditioner Richard Price is more accustomed to the winter sport of national hunt, but will have to look at some of the better flat races for his gelding now. "Being a [predominantly] jumps trainer I don't know the program for flat races so I'll have to take another look at it. He'll go anywhere for a good race so long as there is soft ground and even the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 3] is a possibility."

Short Pause took the Listed Prix de Boulogne at this track in September before finishing fourth in the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte later in the month. He split Weightless (GB) and Execute (Fr) when runner-up in the G2 Prix Dollar back here in October, before returning to finish third in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt again at this venue last time Apr. 4. Settled wide in a stalking second throughout the early stages by Gary Stevens, he was asked for his effort at the top of the straight. Responding in game fashion to battle his way to the front at the eighth pole, he pulled out extra to repel the persistent challenge of Kindjhal and Dominique Boeuf in the drive to the line. "He's a horse that winds up and when I rode him last time he gave me the feeling that he would stay further and he proved it today," Stevens said. "He's a really tough horse and can really run all day. He is a horse that stays very well." Short Pause will now head to the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly June 13. Rock Hard Ten Will Finally Get His Chance

After missing a chance to run in the GI Kentucky Derby due to a lack of graded stakes earnings, the lightly raced **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.) will get a chance to prove himself in the GI Preakness S. The handsome colt made his last start in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3, where he was placed third through disqualification. "He's a big horse, so we took our time with him and let him grow up a bit before we started him," trainer Jason Orman explained during a teleconference Thursday. "For a big horse, he's very athletic. He's one of the most athletic horses I've ever been around. He's doing good right now, he only lacks experience."

Imperialism in the Preakness Mix?

Originally considered unlikely for the Preakness, Steve Taub's **Imperialism** (Langfuhr) is now a possibility for next Saturday's race. "We won't know a thing until this weekend," Taub told officials at Pimlico. "The door is not closed, the door is not open. There is a possibility the horse will run in the Preakness, but he will be the dictator." Imperialism was a closing third in the Derby.

This Epsom Derby trial has thrown up two subsequent winners of that Classic in 1999 hero Oath (Ire) and last year's winner Kris Kin. **African Dream** is not going to Epsom as he has been gelded, but he has solid claims based on his defeat of Privy Seal (Ire) in the G3 Classic Trial at Sandown last time Apr. 23. That was his first dip into stakes company, having won a conditions event at Kempton Mar. 27 and competitive handicap at Newbury Apr. 16. He gives three pounds to two unexposed types in **Andean** and **Always First**. While the former was impressive when taking a Yarmouth maiden last time Apr. 12, he may need a faster surface to show his best.

TOC CET TO FRANKEL BARN Toccet (Awesome Again), a multiple Grade I winner who is winless in his last 12 starts, has been transferred to the Belmont Park barn of Bobby Frankel, according to *The Blood-Horse*. In his final start for trainer John Scanlan, the four-year-old ran last in the GIII Westchester H. at Belmont Park Wednesday. "The reason I decided to make the switch had nothing to do with [Scanlan]," owner Dan Borislow told *Blood-Horse*. "I changed trainers because I could not trust myself with making bad decisions with Toccet anymore and I didn't

listen to my trainer on his advice with the horse. I asked Frankel to take over his training because he is known for being his own boss, with little exception." With Scanlan, Toccet won the 2002 GI Champagne S., GIII Laurel Futurity, GII Remsen and GI Hollywood Futurity. Sidelined by an ankle injury for much of 2003, the bay opened his sophomore campaign with a victory in Philadelphia Park's Widener S. last August. Although he is winless since then, Toccet was third in last year's GI Cigar Mile H. and second in the Jan. 10 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. To date, he has won seven of 21 starts and earned \$914,387. Frankel plans to send Toccet for a nuclear scan before making any decisions about the colt's next start. Borislow said his other horses will remain with Scanlan.

17 MILLION WATCHED SMARTY WIN NBC

Sports' broadcast of Smarty Jones' victory in the GI Kentucky Derby was watched by 17 million viewers, the second biggest audience since 1992, and represented a 17-percent increase on the 2003 viewership of 14.5 million. The entire telecast received a national rating of 7.4 with an 18 share, a 16-percent improvement on last year's event. The 7.4 rating ties the 1996 rating for Grindstone's win as the second-highest national rating since 1994. "The 17 million viewers for the Derby represent a continuation of the remarkable performance of this great event over the past four years," commented NBC Sports' President Ken Schanzer. "The magnitude of the audience is testimony to the strength of the VISA Triple Crown. The great story of Smarty Jones that emerged from the Derby should propel terrific viewership going forward." The race segment (from 5:44-6:46 p.m.) yielded a 9.3 rating and a 22 share while the pre-race segment (5-5:45 p.m) produced a 5.0 rating and a 13 share, 22 percent better than 2003.
