the GI Santa Maria H. in February; Adoration turned the tables last time they met, taking the Mar. 14 GI Santa Margarita H. by two lengths. Who will come out on top in the GI Vanity H. at Hol-Ivwood Park this afternoon? Adoration, a perfect two-for-two at nine furlongs, has the advantage

at the distance. The five-year-old mare led from gate to wire to take the BC Distaff at 40-1 in her first try at a mile and an eighth, and drove past Star Parade in the stretch to take the Santa Margarita. But Star Parade, in receipt of three pounds that day, gets five pounds from her rival this time. Trainer Darrell Vienna also sees a different pace scenario in

the Vanity. "We were trying to slow the pace down when Adoration beat us in the Santa Margarita, and we won't do that again," Vienna said. "We're just going to let Star Parade go. We're not going to fight her." The Argentine import has started once since the Santa Margarita, finishing a troubled third behind Azeri in the Apr. 3 GI Apple Blossom H. A claim of foul against runner-up Wild Spirit (Chi) was disallowed by the Oaklawn stewards, but that decision was later reversed and Star Parade was awarded the second-place purse.

Bending Strings (American Chance) was unsuccessful in her first two tries against graded company, but finished a respectable second at 10-1 in the Apr. 9 GIII Comely S. She went one better yesterday, closing for a 4 3/4-length victory in the GII Nassau County Breeders' Cup S. at Belmont Park. The dark bay kicked off 2004 with a fourth in the Jan. 19 GII Santa Ynez S., then took on the boys and was second in the Feb. 8 Golden State Mile. After heading across the country, she could get no closer than sixth to Ashado in the Mar. 6 GII Fair Grounds Oaks at 1 1/16 miles, but fared much better when dropped back to a one-turn mile for the Comely. The third choice in the seven-furlong Nassau County, Bending Strings bided her time just off the pace, strode to the lead in the stretch and drew clear. But Kiaran McLaughlin, who took over from Jerry Hollendorfer before the Comely, does not feel the filly is strictly a sprinter. "I think she will go a little farther," he said. Night Lagoon finished runner-up in the Listed Berberis-Rennen at Mulheim in September before returning to that track to beat Vallera (Ger) and La Ina in the prestigious G3 Preis der Winterkonigin the following month. She failed by a short head to give La Ina four pounds on her return when runner-up in the Listed Kolner Fruhjahrs-Stuten-Preis at Cologne Apr. 12. Her conditioner Andreas Schutz, who won this with Elle Danzig (Ger) in 1998 and Dakhla Oasis (Ire) in 2001, also saddles the unbeaten Apokalypse, who rattled off two scores at this track in October and at Mulheim the following month, and Freedom. The rider lay motionless on the track as the field rounded the first turn of the 1 1/16-mile claiming test and, as emergency workers were not able to move him immediately, the outriders and starting crew had to signal the jockeys to pull up their mounts at the head of the lane. The race was ruled 'no contest' by the stewards and all bets were refunded. Wilson was taken to the hospital by a state police helicopter. There was no specifics on the extent of his injuries.
