#### ROAR ABILITY

Trainer John Dunlop has won the G2 Dante S. at York three times, with Shirley Heights (GB) in 1978, Erhaab in 1994 and Sakhee in 2000. Let The Lion Roar (GB) (Sadler's Wells), will be the latest representative from Dunlop's Arundel vard in today's competitive renewal of the Dante. The colt already has Classic success in the blood, being a half brother to G1 St Leger-winning stable companion Millenary (GB). Like that stalwart, he enjoyed a low-key campaign at two, winning a Newmarket maiden in August before finishing second in a conditions race at Newbury the following month. He returned to that track to beat Top Seed (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) by a half length at the same level last time Apr. 16 and will relish the prevalent give on the Knavesmire. Sir Michael Stoute, who has won this race three times in total, saddles North Light (Ire) (Danehill). Judging by the action he showed when taking his maiden at Goodwood in September, that colt should also improve on a softer surface. David Loder, gradually reestablishing himself as a Classic conditioner, has an exciting prospect in Andean (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}). He was barely out of third gear when winning a Yarmouth maiden by seven lengths last time Apr. 12, but his chance may be compromised if the ground does not dry out quickly. Aidan O'Brien took this in 1998 with Saratoga Springs and is represented today by Moscow Ballet (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who had Rule of Law (Kingmambo) back in third when runner-up to Snow Ridge (Ire) in the G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot.

(GB) (Danehill) just might upstage stable companion and current G1 Epsom Oaks favorite Sundrop (Jpn) in the 12-furlong Classic three weeks hence. Taken to the front in the early stages by Frankie Dettori, she was allowed to set moderate fractions and moved to the centre of the track at the top of the straight. The bay was threatened briefly by Glen Innes (Ire) (Selkirk) there, but she strode clear in commanding fashion inside the final quarter to earn the plaudits. After failing to meet her reserve as a yearling for 190,000gns, Punctilious was purchased

out of Michael Jarvis' yard following victories in a Yarmouth maiden in July and a conditions event at Salisbury in September. She justified that transaction when finishing third behind Red Bloom (GB) and Sundrop in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot and had pleased connections in her spring preparations. Steel Princess lived up to her title to maintain her unbeaten record in game fashion in this trial for the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes at Chantilly June 13. Successful on her debut in a conditions event at Deauville in December, the diminutive filly returned to take a better contest at Longchamp last time Mar. 30. Stalking the early pace in fifth, she appeared to struggle as the action wound up early in the stretch, but responded to Thierry Jarnet's urgings to challenge inside the final eighth. She quickened to pass outsider Love and Bubbles and Barancella with 75 yards remaining, and looked to have won a shade cosily as her rider eased up in the final strides. "She surprised me today as I thought she might have trouble handling the ground," commented winning conditioner Richard Gibson. "She's very game and does the bare minimum and never any more than what's required." Steel Princess is the first group scorer for San Diego-born, Irish-based farm owner Richard Barnes, who purchased her privately as a yearling. She becomes the third Classic trial winner in less than a week for breeders Barronstown Stud and Orpendale, who are also responsible for Baraka (Ire) and Yeats (Ire). ### WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Despite standing a commanding 17.0 hands, Unbridled's Song was a precocious individual. He worked in sensational fashion at the two-year-old in training sales, and on only his third juvenile start he defeated Hennessy, Editor's Note and Honour and Glory to take the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. As a stallion, however, Unbridled's Song's offspring have generally tended to fall more in line with what one would expect of a sire of his physique. He has sired some sharp two-year-olds, including Eurosilver who captured the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and Marylebone the GI Matron S., but over all, the Unbridled's Songs have tended to do better with at least a little time. That point is underlined by a trio of GI: winners Unbridled Elaine, heroine of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff; the GI Wood Memorial S. victor Buddha; and the GI Fountain of Youth winner. Songandaprayer, who scored their most important victories at three. And this year two of Unbridled's Songs trio of graded stakes winners have been the West Coast handicap stars, four-year-old Domestic Dispute, winner of the GII Strub S., and Even the Score, a six-year-old who recorded his first ever graded stakes victory in the GII Mervyn LeRoy H.

We've held that crossing horses of diametrically opposing type generally gives disappointing results, so having commented on Unbridled's Song's stature, it's

interesting to note that his dam, Ashtabula, is by the diminutive Blushing Groom stallion, Rahy. In general, the Fappiano/Blushing Groom cross which produced Even the Score has underperformed, but Unbridled's Song does have another stakes winner out of a mare by Blushing Groom's son Mt. Livermore, while 2003 Grade I winner Candy Ride is by Ride the Rails (by Fappiano's son, Cryptoclearance) out of a mare by Blushing Groom's son, Candy Stripes.

Ashtabula, who produced Even the Score as her first foal, was a talented performer in her own right, winning eight races and \$321,748, including the Las Madrinas H., and earning a graded stakes placing when third in the GII Bayakoa H. Until the appearance of Even the Score, Ashtabula was the only stakes winner to appear under Even the Score's second and third dams, Now Your Teapottin (by Native Royalty) and Sweet Bernice (by Speak John), although both mares were graded stakes placed. Sweet Bernice, who is by a son of Prince John out of the mare La Eva, is also bred on very similar lines to Ingoldsby (by a grandson of Prince John out of a daughter of La Eva), dam of Formal Gold, winner of the GI Woodward S., and GI Donn, GII Philip H. Iselin and GII Brooklyn H. in 1997, a year in which he was probably the best older horse in training.

Another underperforming cross is Mr. Prospector/Blushing Groom, which apart from the previously mentioned Ride the Rails, has produced only two other Grade I winners, the sisters Queena and Chic Shirine. With Unbridled and Unbridled's Song, however, there is at least one pedigree link between them and Blushing Groom. Unbridled's dam is a daughter of the French Derby winner Le Fabuleux, and Blushing Groom is out of a mare by Le Fabuleux's sire, Wild Risk.

The key to Even the Score's pedigree, however, might be the relationship between Mr. Prospector and Native Royalty, the sire of Even the Score's second dam. Mr. Prospector is by Raise a Native out of a mare by Nashua (by Nasrullah) and Native Royalty is by Raise a Native out of a mare by Nasrullah, so the pair are bred on very similar lines. The Mr. Prospector/Native Royalty connection is found in at least seven other unrestricted stakes winners, including graded scorers Could Be, Point Prince and U Can Do It.

### DERBY PREPS AVERAGE FIVE-RUNNER FIELDS

Today's G2 Dante S. will be the 10th recognized British or Irish Derby prep run at 10-12 furlongs in the last four weeks, and it will be the first to have a double-figure field, if all 10 stand their ground. Even then, the average field for these 10 races will be exactly five runners per race. I say 'recognized' Derby trials because three major trial winners came out of Class C Handicaps, which are not usually responsible for future Derby contenders. The two Group 3 winners at Chester last week, African Dream and Red Lancer, are geldings who came the Handicap route, but before that were bought out of a claiming and a selling race, respectively. Red Lancer, impressive winner of the six-runner Chester Vase on Thursday, went into the race with a Handicap Rating of 88. African Dream's facile win in the three-runner Dee S. was his fifth win in a row, and his second in a Group 3. He was rated 94 when he won the five-runner Sandown Classic Trial three weeks ago. Hazyview, who won the 10-furlong Newmarket S. (L) at the Guineas meeting off a rating of 84, won three in a row (including one of those C Handicaps) before his string was snapped last Saturday (at 12 furlongs, like fellow son of Cape Cross, Privy Seal) by Percussionist in the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial.

Besides the fact that this pathetic turnout has serious implications for the existing program for middle-distance three-year-olds leading up to the Derby, it's embarrassing for the sponsors. "They come, cap in hand, offering it as a commercial opportunity," said one, "and we go along because we really like the sport and want to support it. But what can you say when you have five horses turn out race after race, what good is it doing you? You can't exactly defend it as a good promotional investment, can you?" In pure commercial terms, it's hard to justify.

Of the 10 classic trials, two were Conditions races (Let The Lion Roar, at Newbury Apr. 16) and Epsom's Blue Riband Trial, won by Bull Run, on Apr. 21. The other eight were black-type races, of which the last seven were brought to you by the following 'sporting' (so far) sponsors:

April 18: *P.W. McGrath Memorial Ballysax S.* (not sponsored, this is the whole race title), *G3*, 10f, Leopardstown (Ire): three runners, won by **YEATS** (Sadler's Wells), soft ground.

**April 23:** *Betfred Sandown Classic Trial, G3*, 10f, Sandown: five runners, won by **AFRICAN DREAM** (Mark of Esteem), ground good-to-soft.

May 1: Rolls Royce Newmarket S., Listed, 10f, Newmarket: five runners, won by HAZYVIEW (Cape Cross), good ground.

May 6: MBNA Europe Bank Chester Vase, G3, 12f, Chester: six runners, won by RED LANCER (Deploy), ground good-to-soft.

May 7: Jardine Lloyd Thompson Dee S., G3, 10f, Chester: three runners, won by AFRICAN DREAM (Mark of Esteem), ground good-to-soft.

May 8: Gallagher Group Lingfield Derby Trial, G3, 12f, Lingfield: four runners, won by PERCUSSIONIST (Sadler's Wells), soft ground.

May 9: Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial, G2, 10f, Leopardstown (Ire): Five runners, won by YEATS (Sadler's Wells), ground good-to-yielding.

It may be tempting to point out the correlation between small fields and the prevalent soft ground for these trials, not to mention that Yeats, Percussionist, and Condition Race winner and Dante runner today, Let The Lion Roar, are all by Sadler's Wells. By the way, the other Conditions Race winner, Bull Run, and the Cheshire Oaks (Listed) winner Hidden Hope are both from Daylami's first crop. But I'm afraid the soft-ground contention is a red herring--as is the contention that this division is overrun by Coolmore and Godolphin runners. They've hardly been showing up for these trials either, and when they have done, they haven't particularly dominated. Godolphin does have the Derby second favorite in Snow Ridge, and the Oaks favorite in Sundrop, off very good seconds for both in the one-mile 2000 Guineas and 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, and Coolmore has Yeats.

There can only really be one explanation for these small fields. At the end of the day, the financial incentives for winning Derby trial races is not sufficient to entice owners to run in these races, and breeders to breed for them. The four Group 3 races run in Britain averaged just under £38,000 to the winner. Not bad, you would say, certainly compared to the pay scale a little bit further down the class ladder. Evidently you'd be wrong: maybe if they averaged £138,000 to the winner, they would average more than five runners.

Then there's the matter of the program book, especially when compared to the American Triple Crown. The excitement generated over there has to be seen to believed. Something like 96,000 people turned up at Belmont last June to see the New York-bred gelding Funny Cide try to win the Triple Crown. The Smarty Jones story is a tear-jerker in the Seabiscuit mold, and no kidding, either, there was a lot of tragedy before he collected that \$5-million bonus at Churchill Downs. Five thousand people came out to watch him gallop the other day at his home base of Philadelphia Park.

Though traditionalists may not want to admit it, there could be a logical 12-furlong Triple Crown for three-year-olds here which would generate excitement and could justify carrying a £5-million bonus.

The first leg would be the Epsom Derby, run the first Saturday in June. Three or four weeks later would be the Irish Derby at The Curragh. The final leg would be the King George and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot in late July, which of course is open to three-year-olds and up. Fine, so it's not exactly the same as the American Triple Crown. Obviously any three-year-old that wins it is top-class, and it is the logical progression for Europe's best 12-furlong three-year-olds who can handle spring and summer ground. The King George has been won by four sophomores in the last 10 years, but Galileo, in 2001, was the only one to win all three races.

The idea of creating a new 'European Triple Crown' for three-year-olds would be to generate excitement and charisma, perhaps even to exploit the fact that Thoroughbreds' careers are often short-lived. Another side effect would be that the preps would become valuable targets in their own right, as they are in the build-up to the American Triple Crown. The fact is that European middle-distance three-year-olds do usually benefit from one or two runs before the Epsom Derby--especially if it was not only a great target in its own right, but also the first leg of a European Triple Crown which carried with it a lot of fame...and a lot of money.

will be out for at least the next four months after being diagnosed with bone chips in both front ankles, reports the *Bloodhorse*. Owned by Mr. and Mrs. Martin Wygod, the three-year-old filly was last seen running ninth behind Ashado in the GI Kentucky Oaks Apr. 30. "She has two chips in the left [ankle] and one in the right," trainer Julio Canani told the *Bloodhorse*. "She'll have surgery on either Wednesday or Thursday. chips are there. [The chips] are in good places, so they just have to go in and out." Overall she has won four of six starts, totaling \$442,700.

ROYAL SKI DIES IN JAPAN Royal Ski (Raja Baba--Coz O'Nijinsky, by Involvement), a Grade I winner in the United States and sire of Japanese champion Agnes Flora (Jpn), died Apr. 30, according to the Japanese Association for International Horse Racing. The 30-yearold stallion died at the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association Nasu Stud Farm in Tochigi Prefecture, where he had lived since he was pensioned last year from the JBBA's Shimosa Stud Farm. During his racing career, Royal Ski won the 1976 GI Laurel Futurity, GII Remsen and GIII Heritage S. He began his stud career in the U.S. in 1978, siring Grade I winners Snow Plow and Ski Goggle, as well as graded stakes winner Rash But Royal. He relocated to Japan in 1980 where he sired 1990 Japanese champion three-year-old filly Agnes Flora. Agnes Flora is the dam of 2000 Japanese Derby winner Agnes Flight (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and 2001 Japanese 2000 Guineas winner Agnes Tachyon (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). Ski Goggle is the dam of G1 Prix du Moulin winner and 1993 Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Ski Paradise (Lyphard), as well as Argentinian Group 1 winner Ski Champ (Icecapade).
