NINE ENTER CANADA'S HALL OF FAME

Six horses and three horsemen have been honored as this year's inductees into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame. The newest Thoroughbred Hall of Famers are Langfuhr (Danzig), Classy 'N Smart (Smarten) and Wonder Where (Occupy), and trainer Ronald Smith and



breeder Don McClelland. The sire of last year's Canadian Triple Crown winner Wando, Langfuhr was the champion sprinter in Canada in 1996 after winning the GI Vosburgh S. and GII Forego H. He came back to take the GI Met Mile and GI Carter H. Langfuhr Tony Leonard photo in 1997. The leading second-crop stallion of 2002 and third-crop

stallion of 2003, the 12-year-old has also sired MGISW Imperial Gesture and GSW Imperialism, third in this year's GI Kentucky Derby. He stood the 2004 season at Lane's End for \$25,000. Sam-Son Farm's Classy 'N

Smart, the champion three-yearold filly in Canada in 1984, was Broodmare of the Year in 1991. She is the dam of Eclipse winner and Canadian Horse of the Year Dance Smartly, who beat the boys in taking the Canadian Triple in 1991; GISW and successful sire Smart Strike; and GISW Full of Wonder: and the

granddam of Queen's Plate winner Scatter The Gold and Canadian champions Dancethruthedawn and Hello Seattle. Wonder Where was the champion three-yearold filly and Horse of the Year in Canada in 1959. Smith won more than 2,200 races during his 46-year career and earned the Sovereign Award in 1977. McClelland, who passed away last year, bred and raised a number of champions, including 1953 Horse of the Year King Maple. Joining the Hall from the world of Standardbred racing are Precious Bunny, Goodtimes, Town Pro and breeder Chris Van Bussel. The Hall of Fame is located at Woodbine Racetrack in Rexdale, Ontario. The induction ceremonies will be held at the Toronto Congress Centre on Thursday evening, Aug. 26. The guest speaker will be Jack Knowlton, co-owner of Funny Cide.

The wheel turned full circle once again last fall when the 14-year-old Lure returned to his birthplace, Claiborne Farm, to be pensioned. Of course, this wasn't the first time that this brilliant turf performer had returned to Claiborne, but the circumstances had been very different on the previous occasion, nine years earlier. He was hailed on that occasion as the obvious heir to his astonishing sire, Danzig, thanks to a 25-race career which had yielded 14 victories and eight seconds, plus earnings in excess of \$2.5 million. He had twice taken the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, on one occasion lowering the Gulfstream Park track record to 1:32.80, and he had also set a new figure for a mile and an eighth at Churchill Downs. Bearing in mind that Lure was also a handsome, correct individual from a very successful female line, failure seemed out of the question and his opening fee of \$50,000 made him the highest-priced freshman sire of 1995.

Unfortunately worries about Lure's fertility soon surfaced. Changing his breeding schedule didn't help and Lure was finally credited with having sired only 15 live foals from the 37 mares he covered in his first season. Consequently, Claiborne lodged a claim against his fertility insurance. Lure was then bought by the Coolmore operation, which stood him first at Coolmore before returning him to the States to try his luck at Ashford.


Sadly, his luck didn't change--the first eight of his nine years at stud produced only 100 foals in the Northern Hemisphere, with another 29 foals resulting from his coverings to Southern Hemisphere time. We can only wonder what he might have achieved with normal fertility, as there were two Grade I winners among his first 83 named Northern Hemisphere foals.

One of the last mares covered by Lure at Claiborne was Bonita Francita, an extremely well-related Devil's Bag mare who conceived June 22. Bonita Francita's main distinction at the time was that she is a daughter of Raise The Standard, a half-sister to Northern Dancer, and that she was a three-parts sister to Coup de Folie, one of the world's most influential broodmares who numbers Machiavellian among her five Group winners and the French champions Bago and Denebola among her other descendants. Bonita Francita has done her best to match the success of her famous relative. Her first foal, Black Penny, produced Bluemamba, winner of the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in 2000. Her second, Etterby Park, became a Listed winner and her third, Jules, won the GIII Nashua S. before becoming the sire of the redoubtable Peace Rules and some Group 1 winners in Brazil.

Best of all, though, was Orpen, her son by Lure. Despite being born as late as May 20, Orpen was ready for action in August of his juvenile season, when Aidan O'Brien sent him firstly to England to win a six-furlong maiden race and then to France to win the G1 Prix Morny with his ears pricked. Although O'Brien took care not to ask too much of Orpen at two, his patience wasn't rewarded. After managing to beat only one of his 15 rivals when favorite for the 2000 Guineas, Orpen finished a respectable third behind his stablemate Saffron Walden in the Irish version, only to disappoint badly in his two subsequent starts.

With his racing career having turned into an anti-climax, Orpen retired to one of Coolmore's sub-stations at the modest fee of Ir7,000 guineas.

There was no shortage of breeders prepared to give him a chance at that fee, no doubt because Orpen had the distinction of being bred along similar lines to the exceptionally successful Danehill. Whereas Danehill was by Danzig out of a grand-daughter of Natalma, Orpen is by a son of Danzig and his dam is another granddaughter of Natalma. What's more, whereas Danehill was inbred 3x3 to Natalma, Orpen is inbred 4x3 and has three lines to Natalma's dam Almahmoud.

Although Orpen was swamped with over 170 mares in his first season, his book arguably represented quantity rather than quality. Many of his first yearlings didn't receive a particularly warm welcome in the sales ring, and roughly two-thirds of those sold made the equivalent of 10,000 guineas or less.

Orpen therefore faced quite a struggle if he was to achieve anything better than just a sizeable number of winners. To his credit, he has sired two Group-winning daughters. The first, a 10,000-guinea purchase called Gracefully, was winning for the third time in three starts when she took the G3 Prestige S. last summer, and the second, a €30,000 purchase called Torrestrella, was decidedly too good for the opposition in Sunday's Poule d'Essai des Pouliches. Torrestrella's win means that two of Bonita Francita's first five foals are responsible for winners of this French equivalent to the 1000 Guineas.

Torrestrella's purchaser was her trainer Francois Rohaut, who sprang to prominence nearly 20 years ago as the original trainer of Balbonella. That very speedy filly was so impressive in winning her first three starts for Rohaut that Maktoum Al Maktoum stepped in to buy her for a very substantial sum shortly before she won the G1 Prix Robert Papin. I can't help thinking that Rohaut was influenced by Balbonella when he bought Torrestrella. Balbonella, who was out of a Riverman mare, produced the champion sprinter Anabaa to Danzig and the highly talented Key Of Luck to Danzig's son Chief's Crown. Torrestrella also represents the Danzig-Riverman cross, as she is by a grandson of Danzig and her second dam, the Group-placed Blue River, is by Riverman.

Although breeders have often hesitated to cross Danzig with Riverman, fearing knee problems, this cross has enjoyed considerable success at Classic level in Europe in recent years. The Derbys in England and France have both fallen to colts sired by sons of Danzig from Riverman mares, with Erhaab taking the Epsom variety and Anabaa Blue the Chantilly equivalent.

Then we have seen the French 2000 Guineas go to Landseer (a son of Danehill with a Riverman mare as his second dam) and the French Oaks to Aquarelliste (a Danehill filly with an Irish River mare as her second dam). Lure, incidentally, sired the GIII Lexington S. runner-up Plato from a Riverman mare.

Torrestrella's dam Sea Ring is by Bering, who completed a Guineas double of sorts when his son American Post took an extraordinary Poule d'Essai des Poulains later in the afternoon. Bering mares have also produced stakes performers to Anabaa, Desert King (a son of Danehill) and Lure.

Sea Ring has previously done well with two sons of Sadler's Wells, producing the useful French stayer Torrealta to In The Wings, and Lingo, a very useful flat performer who is a Group 1 winner over hurdles, to Poliglote. Torrestrella's second dam, Blue River, was a half-sister to the Group-winning Anitra's Dance (herself dam of the Group-winning Solveig) and their dam Azurella was a dual Group 3 winner at around 1½ miles. This is also the family of Goldamix, winner of the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in 1999, so Torrestrella was very well bought as a yearling.

She should continue to prove a fine advertisement for Orpen, who certainly won't fail for lack of numbers. Having shuttled between Ireland and Australia in each of his first four years as a stallion, he had covered nearly 1,200 mares by the time he turned eight this year. Don't be surprised if he proves to be the next Danehill Dancer for Coolmore.

"Mr. Ferguson was in this morning and he was able to go through all the horses that we had to look at," Bell told Thoroughbred Times, adding, "This horse is similar to the type of horse we've been buying. He's fluid on the racetrack with a lot of room for improvement." The session topper, consigned by Bridlewood Farm, was a colt by Stormy Atlantic out of the unraced mare Story Book Girl (Siberian Express). From the family of Broom Dance and End Sweep, he worked three furlongs in :34 1/5 at the under tack show. The top-selling filly yesterday was a daughter of Golden Missile out of stakes winner Requesting More (Norquestor). Consigned by Terry Oliver, agent, the dark bay was purchased by Steve Klesaris, agent for Puglisi Stables, for \$270,000. She worked a bullet three furlongs in :33 1/5 at the sale's preview. Historic Newspapers Added to Museum Collection:

Author Edward Hotaling has donated six newspapers, dated from May 1847 to May 1878, to the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame. The newspapers will be added to the Edward Hotaling Collection, a compendium containing prints, photographs and research files that was established in 1999. The newspapers include editions of the *New York Daily Tribune* and *New York Times* from Aug. 4, 1863 that feature articles detailing the first day of Thoroughbred racing at Saratoga Race Course. Hotaling is currently working on a book about jockey Jimmy Winkfield, which is scheduled to be published by McGraw-Hill later this year.
