Gates will open at 8:00 a.m. with free admission.

Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. Last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up jogged at Belmont Sunday and galloped Monday.

#### **Attraction Added to Irish Guineas**

The Duke of Roxburghe's Attraction (GB) (Efisio (GB)) has been supplemented to Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. Following her half-length defeat of Sundrop (Jpn) in the Newmarket Classic May 2, the unbeaten three-year-old will be attempting to become the first filly to complete the double. She was one of two fillies added at a cost of €40,000, alongside Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Illustrious Miss (Kingmambo), who took the G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. at Newbury May 8. Attraction's conditioner Mark Johnston has confirmed that she will line up provided the ground is not soft, but with drying conditions forecast, good to firm ground is almost assured. "We didn't have any hitches or stops before Newmarket and she more or less trains herself," he told the BBC yesterday. "She's had an awful lot of publicity and people love unbeaten records, but I don't know how long that will continue, so we're prepared." Of those that trailed Attraction at Newmarket, Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum's Secret Charm (Ire) (Green Desert) (fifth) is on course to re-oppose, while connections of Jaber Abdullah's Majestic Desert (GB) (Fraam {GB}), (ninth), will make a late decision. "She worked great this morning and I am really pleased with her," Channon said yesterday. "It is down to Jaber now and if we don't go there, we'll go for the G1 Coronation S. [Royal Ascot June 18]."

In just under three weeks time Smarty Jones is likely to attempt to make history by joining Seattle Slew--who achieved the feat in 1977--as the only undefeated winner of the Triple Crown. However, the connections of one of his potential GI Belmont S. rivals, Royal Assault, will be hoping to emulate more recent history. In 2002, War Emblem was trying to complete the Triple Crown, but finished off the board behind longshot Sarava, winner of the Sir Barton S.--a race captured by Royal Assault this weekend--on his previous outing.

Royal Assault has some way to go before his form measures up to that of Smarty Jones, but he does appear to be progressing quickly. He broke his maiden in his debut in January at Gulfstream Park, then ran third and second in strongly contested allowance events at the same venue. Tried in the GI Wood Memorial, Royal Assault stumbled at the start, but finished an encouraging fifth, beaten little more than six lengths by Tapit. The Sir Barton, on the Preakness undercard, was his first start since.

Royal Assault certainly has a classic pedigree. His sire Kris S. didn't win beyond the nine furlongs of the Bradbury S., but that win came from only two three-year-old starts, which both came in the spring of his sophmore season, and there is little doubt that he would have stayed further.

Kris S. has sired numerous horses which stayed well, among them the 2003 G1 English Derby winner Kris Kin; Japanese Horse of the Year Symboli Kris S.; champion turf mare Soaring Softly; GI Breeders' Cup Turf victor Prized; GI Haskell Invitational winner Kissin Kris, who also ran second in the Belmont; GI Super Derby hero Arch; Kicken Kris, successful in last year's G1 Secretariat S.; and Whitmore's Conn, who took the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. His other notables include champion three-year-old filly Hollywood Wildcat; GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile captors Brocco and Action This Day (the champion two-year-old of 2003); as well as Grade/Group 1 winners Dr Fong, Kudos, You and I, Evening Kris, Cheval Volant and Stocks Up.

Royal Assault is out of the very tough and talented racemare Fit for a Queen, a winner of 13 of 51 starts over four seasons for earnings of \$1,225,337. She captured eight stakes events, including the GII Rampart H., two runnings of the Turfway Breeders' Cup S. (one GII, one GIII), the GIII Louisville Breeders' Cup H. and GIII Churchill Downs Breeders' Cup H., and earned places in another 16 black-type contests, including when second in the GI Apple Blossom H. Royal Assault is the first of eight named foals out of Fit for a Queen to win a stakes, the best achievement of her previous offspring being a third in the GII Demoiselle S. achieved by her Mr. Prospector filly Kingsland. However, Fit for a Queen's second foal Gold Rush Queen (by Seeking the Gold), is dam of the A.P. Indy brother and sister, Ender's Shadow and Ender's Sister, who are both stakes winners and graded stakes placed performers in 2004.

Incidentally, Fit for a Queen brings in more stamina through her maternal grandsire, Fit to Fight. He completed the "Handicap Triple Crown" of GI Metropolitan H., GI Suburban H. and GI Brooklyn H., taking the latter event over the Belmont S. course and distance by no less than 12½ lengths. *Cont. p. 5*

#### THE 'S' CLUB

"Smarty...reminded me of Secretariat...," commented Gary Stevens, rider of Preakness runner-up Rock Hard Ten, "the way he pulled away." Trainer John Servis told of a conversation he had with Seattle Slew's trainer, Billy Turner. Something Turner said about Slew going into the paddock reminded him exactly of Smarty Jones. The next Secretariat? The next Seattle Slew? After a Preakness victory in which he just jetted away from the field to win by a record 11 1/2 lengths while running a Beyer 118, such comparisons do not seem blasphemous. Smarty Jones is 1-10 to win the Triple Crown.

The Preakness is an odd race. Some years it seems almost redundant, leaving us wondering if there is any reason other than habit to maintain its stature as the second leg of the U.S. Triple Crown for three-year-olds. But in other years it can provide powerful confirmation that a champion has arrived on the scene. Yes, Secretariat broke Northern Dancer's track record when he defeated Sham in the Kentucky Derby and he won the Belmont in a cakewalk, but I have always believed his win in the Preakness was the most impressive of the three races. He was last of six when they turned into the backstretch, as I recall, yet when Ron Turcotte just chirped to him, he dragged him from last to first in the space of a furlong, and the race was over. Sham never made up a yard on him from that point to the wire. It was, without doubt, the most devastating turn of foot I had ever seen. After that, the Belmont was a formality.

So it is this year, I believe, for Smarty Jones. The acceleration he showed to draw off in the Pimlico stretch, without being seriously asked, was electric. Maybe the horses he beat--Rock Hard Ten, Eddington, Lion Heart--aren't Alydars, but it was the same in 1977, the year Seattle Slew won the second Triple Crown of the 'Seventies--unbeaten.

Didn't matter that Alydar wasn't behind him, Seattle Slew was a great champion, and a worthy Triple Crown winner. So is this guy.

It was 25 years between Citation in 1948 and Secretariat in 1973. Now it's been 26 years since Affirmed's truly epic wins over Alydar completed three Triple Crowns in six years. It's time. Off that race in the Preakness, Smarty Jones is in that class.

I believe victory for this 1-10 shot would actually make him, counting \$10-million in bonuses, the highest earner of all time. The week before the Derby, Dan Liebman wrote in The Blood-Horse that bonuses should not be counted as purse earnings, because they distort the statistics--especially sire statistics--to the moon. Based on average-earnings index, if Smarty Jones wins the Belmont, it will probably make Elusive Quality the greatest sire of all time. At least APEX ratings address that injustice, given that these bonuses will, of course, be counted as purse earnings. Through the end of 2003, Elusive Quality had a very respectable 2.48 APEX A Runner Index. As we've been saying, he, Distorted Humor (sire of last year's Derby winner), Grand Slam, and Tale of the Cat--all with their first crops now four-year-olds--are all highly promising young sires. None more promising than the sire of a Triple Crown winner in his second crop, of course.

As for Smarty Jones' female family, no problem. His first two dams were both stakes winners. His third dam, stakes-placed Stolen Base, is a half sister to Bold and Brave, and his fourth dam, Bases Full, was a stakes winner, a full sister to Hitting Away, and a half sister to Batter Up, Glamour (dam of Poker, himself damsire of Seattle Slew), and Intriguing (dam of Numbered Account and granddam of Private Account and Woodman). His fifth dam is Striking. There was never any question that Smarty Jones' pedigree has quality, the only caveat was both Elusive Quality and Smile were distinctly best at a mile or less. He isn't really bred to go past a mile but, as he has already far outrun his pedigree in that respect, I think he's so much better than his contemporaries, he'll get the Belmont trip just fine. #### Meanwhile, in Euroland...

Andrew Caulfield detailed Orpen's history yesterday, so it just remains for me to point out that Torrestrella's French 1000 win solidifies Orpen's hold on third place among European second-crop sires, behind budding star sires Fasliyev and Cape Cross. The cynics among you will no doubt point out that the two Coolmore sires, Fasliyev and Orpen, have 94 and 89 runners, respectively, for 45 and 46 winners. Darley sire Cape Cross (also in Ireland, at Kildangan) is not far behind, with 82 runners, of which 36 are winners. Yes, they do have a numerical advantage. Daylami has moved from eighth to sixth in the last month.

And there's been a very big move by the now German-based Tiger Hill, a son of Danehill (his name seems to crop up every other day these days) who ran third in the 1998 Arc and was a multiple Group 1 winner in Germany. He initially stood in France before moving back to Germany, and that first French-sired crop had just one stakes winner and one stakes-placed four weeks ago. He's not made a big jump yet on the second-crop money list, but he is now up to six stakes horses, including Mister Sacha, winner of the G3 Prix de Guiche (9f), and Young Tiger, second in the G3 Prix La Force (10f) in France. In addition, his good filly Saldentigerin was controversially upset at 1-2 in a G3 German Oaks trial at the weekend (pilot error, evidently). Watch out, Monsun and Lomitas, here comes Tiger Hill. This column will be on holiday the next two weeks. We return on June 9 to catch up on all the intervening Classic action in Ireland, at Epsom, and especially, at Belmont Park. I've managed to get 1-10 shots beat before, but even I'm not enough of a jinx to stop Smarty Jones. I'll give them a fighting chance, though: I won't bet on him.

In the Epsom Derby, at this writing there are only three horses quoted at under 10-1, and two of them were bred by the late Lord Weinstock's Ballymacoll Stud. The Derby second favorite is Snow Ridge, sold to Godolphin after winning last year's G2 Royal Lodge and subsequently unplaced in the Dewhurst, but a bang-up second to Haafhd in the English 2000 Guineas and a pretty reasonable shot to give Frankie Dettori his first Epsom Derby winner. Snow Ridge is by Indian Ridge out of the Ela-Mana-Mou mare Snow Princess, now a resident of the Newsells Park broodmare band. Ballymacoll still owns G2 Dante winner North Light, who is by Danehill out of Sought Out, a Rainbow Quest mare who won the 2 1/2-mile Prix du Cadran on heavy ground. So he should stay the trip all right, and the way Danehill is going this spring, it wouldn't be a surprise to see him win.

The Derby favorite is unbeaten Yeats, trained by Aidan O'Brien and, like Montjeu, by Sadler's Wells out of a Top Ville mare. Sadler's Wells has been champion sire in Britain and Ireland 13 times, yet he never had an Epsom Derby winner until Galileo in 2001, followed by High Chaparral in 2002. Now he could make it three in the last four years, after a brief interruption last year by Kris Kin, by America's sire who could do no wrong last year, Kris S.

There is nothing else approaching Fit for a Queen's class under her dam or granddam, although both produced other stakes winners. Her granddam Titled Heroine became the dam of Hungria, the champion imported three-year-old filly in Mexico and a Grade I winner in that country. However, Fit for a Queen's fourth dam is Lady Angela, a Hyperion mare who just happened to be carrying a Nearco foal--later named Nearctic--when imported into North America in the mid 1950s.

There have been five stakes winners by sons of Roberto out of mares descending from Fit to Fight's sire Chieftain (the cross which produced Royal Assault), but three of those are by Silver Hawk out of the Chieftain mare Strait Lane, including Grade I winner Hawkster and Group winner Silver Lane, while another is by Silver Hawk out of a Fit to Fight mare. There are four other stakes winners by Kris S. out of mares descending from Chieftain's sire Bold Ruler, but in three of those four--Secretariat (twice) and Gold Meridian (by Seattle Slew)--the Bold Ruler is combined with Princequillo, as is the case with Chieftain, whose second dam is by Princeguillo. This is significant, as Kris S. is by great-grandson of Royal Charger out of a Princequillo mare, where Bold Ruler is by Royal Charger's 3/4-brother Nasrullah, so the Bold Ruler/Princequillo crosses have a similar background to Kris S. Of course, any mare carrying Princequillo when bred to Kris S. gives the pattern of duplicating the broodmare sire of the sire, and this can often be a very effective way to go. In the case of Kris S. it appears in almost a third of his stakes winners (26 of 79).

The reason for Donn's resignation was not specified in a press release. Donn had served as chairman of the Gulfstream Park Racing Association since March 2000, a role he took after being replaced as president of 22 years after Magna Entertainment Corp. acquired the South Florida track in 1999. "I would like to commend Doug on his 35 years of service to Gulfstream Park during which time he oversaw Gulfstream's emergence as one of the pre-eminent Thoroughbred racetracks in North America," Magna President Jim McAlpine said in a statement. "We have been fortunate to benefit from Doug's experience and insight since our purchase of Gulfstream in 1999."

"I took him to Newbury and schooled him on Saturday and he was as cool as a cucumber being saddled up, because he got a bit bothered at Lingfield. We'll probably take him to Epsom give him a school there and wander round and see the place. He couldn't be in better form."

Michael Tabor's Salford City (Ire) (Desert Sun {GB}) may make the line-up for the G1 Epsom Derby June 5. Conditioner David Elsworth yesterday suggested that the Classic was a target for the G3 Greenham S. winner, who was sixth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1. "We've always considered him for the Derby and it's still a strong consideration," he said yesterday. "We'll have him organised for the Saturday in June at Epsom and if we decide not to go there, we'll go for the G1 St James's Palace S. [Royal Ascot June 15], but it is still undecided. He's got the qualities and he's got plenty of speed, but you need a lot of luck in the Derby and it's an awful track. It's a tricky track and a glorified fairgound--horses become very unbalanced. It obviously takes a very good horse to win the Derby and everybody wants to win it, including myself, and it would seem if one has got a chance of winning the Derby you really ought to give it a go. Michael Tabor, his owner, is quite keen to have a go and I'm not going to spoil it, so there's every likelihood he could run, but the final decision hasn't really been made."


