Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality), racing's now horse, continued to make his presence felt when trainer John Servis sent the Someday Farm star out for his first routine gallop yesterday at Philadelphia Park since Satur-

day's Preakness S. "I was real happy with what I saw [Wednesday]," said Servis. "My plan was to jog him a mile. We got about a half mile through that and he just got to feeling so good that I was more concerned with what tonight might be like. So I elected to turn him around and gallop him a half mile instead of finishing the jog. It was just to try and take a little bit of the edge off." The Smarty show will continue Saturday morning with another public work scheduled for 8:30

a.m. EST. Servis, who is considering sending Smarty Jones to Belmont Park May 26, indicated that those plans are still up in the air. "I talked to [Belmont officials Wednesday] and I told them if he continues to train well [at Philadelphia], I'm going to keep him here as long as I can."

Mustanfar Unlikely for Belmont

Mustanfar (Unbridled), third in his latest start in a May 14 Churchill Downs allowance, is highly unlikely to contest the GI Belmont S. June 5. "Doubtful is the best description," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We have a lot of respect for Smarty Jones and Rock Hard Ten. the Belmont looks like it will be a very tough race." As for the colt's most probable next start, McLaughlin added, "Mustanfar might want a mile and a half, but he might want it against lesser. We have some turf options with him and he's still eligible for a two-other-than allowance."

An \$800,000 KEEJUL yearling, Jade Robbery raced in France for the late Zenya Yoshida, breaking his maiden in the Listed Prix du Haras de la Huderie and capturing the G1 Grand Criterium at two while trained by Andre

Fabre. Retired following his three-year-old season with over \$230,000 in earnings, Jade Robbery began his stud career in Japan in 1991. He later shuttled to Australia's Widden Stud and stood the 2002 and 2003 Northern Hemisphere seasons in Dubai. According to *The Blood-Horse*, Jade Robbery stood the 2004 season at Lex Stud in Shizunai, Japan, covering over 100 mares. Among his leading representatives are Japanese champion Yamakatsu Suzuran (Jpn) and Taiki Sherlock (Jpn).

EPALO TO ARLINGTON

Epalo (Ger) (Lando {Ger}), winner of Sunday's second leg of the World Series Racing Championship in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup, is being pointed toward the series' fourth leg, the Aug. 14 GI Arlington Million, contested at Arlington Park in Arlington Heights, Illinois. Trainer Andreas Schultz confirmed yesterday that the five-year-old will bypass the third leg of the championship, the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 24. VALENZUELA RIDES FOR NOW, OUT FOR JUNE

Jockey Patrick Valenzuela will serve out the balance of a four-month suspension during the month of June, according to a ruling handed down by the California Horse Racing Board Wednesday at Hollywood Park. Following a 90-minute hearing, which was presided over by administrative law judge David Rosenman, the seven-member panel concluded that Valenzuela will serve out 30 days in June, with credit allotted for a three-month break from January to April. The 41-yearold jockey will also be required to complete 100 hours of community service, as well as additional drug testing. Although forced to miss a likely ride on Rock Hard Ten, previously ridden by European-based Gary Stevens, in the June 5 Belmont S., Valenzuela will be able to continue to ride for the remainder of May. Yesterday's ruling was precipitated by Valenzuela, in an effort to reinstate his licence after he was suspended for the remainder of 2004 for violating a conditional contract. Since his return Apr. 26, Valenzuela heads the Hollywood jockey rankings with 24 victories.

REDDATORE AND SPRING STAR RETIRED A

pair of Richard Mandella-trained horses, Spring Star (Fr) (Danehill) and Reddatore (Brz) (Roi Normand), have been retired from racing because of an ankle injury. Owned by brothers Alain and Gerard Wertheimer, Spring Star won five of 12 starts, including the 2002 G2 Prix Sandringham, 2003 GII Palomar BC H. and most recently, the GIII Wilshire H. Apr. 25. Mandella also confirmed that 2003 GI Shoemaker BC Mile hero Redattore has been retired due to an ankle injury. A winner in his latest in the GII San Gabriel H. Dec. 28, the nine-year-old retires with 15 wins from 32 starts and \$1,799,883 in earnings for owner Luis Alfredo Taunay. Stud plans have not been finalized.

ISLAND FASHION TO TOKYO Three-time Grade I winner Island Fashion (Petionville) is slated to make her next start in the mile G1 Yasuda Kinen S. at Tokyo Race Course June 6, according to trainer Marcelo Polanco Wednesday. Stewart Eyes Return With Clock Stopper:

On the sidelines since a convincing 2 1/4-length victory in the seven-furlong Perryville S. at Keeneland last October, Overbrook Farm's Clock Stopper (Gilded Time) is set to make his return in today's ninth race at Churchill Downs, an \$80,000 optional claiming event going six furlongs on the dirt. "He's been training solid," said trainer Dallas Stewart. "We're excited about getting him back." Slated to contest last year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, the gelding was forced to the sidelines because of a bone chip, but Stewart believes he can bring the four-year-old back to previous form. "He hasn't shown me any signs of regression. He was on the top of his game [before the injury] and it'll probably take a couple of races to get back to that level, but if all goes well, he'll come back to that level." Clock Stopper has finished first or second in seven of nine career starts, including a second-place finish to eventual Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Cajun Beat in the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint last September.

Current ante-post favourite Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) heads four entries for trainer Aidan O'Brien, along with Book Of Kings (Kingmambo), Meath (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Moscow Ballet (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).
