Grand Slam, a dual Grade I winner over the Belmont main track at two, was seriously injured in the 1997 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but returned to his favorite track to record a two-length victory in the following year's GII Peter Pan S. His son, the talented Master David, has his chance to follow in his father's footsteps



as the likely favorite in this event, which could produce more than a few opponents for Smarty Jones in the Belmont S. in two weeks. The chestnut colt has performed admirably in two starts in the Big Apple, finishing runner-up in the GII Remsen S. in his U.S. bow Master David S Sherack last November before a secondplace effort to Tapit in the GI

Wood Memorial Apr. 10. He comes in off a 12th in the Kentucky Derby. "I don't know if I was disappointed or not in the Derby," trainer Bobby Frankel said. "I didn't really go in there thinking I was going to win. I was just hoping for the best." His best is exactly what he'll need to defeat a salty bunch, including GI Florida Derby winner Friends Lake (A.P. Indy), 15th in the Run for the Roses. "That was a real bummer," trainer John Kimmel said of the Derby effort. "The horse was dead-on ready to run. The weather disintegrated and the track fell apart." Purge (Pulpit) must be happy not to hook Smarty Jones for once. The bay colt finished second to the dual Classic winner in the Mar. 20 Rebel S. before fading to fifth in the GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 10.

HOUSE RULES

Brian Meehan saddles his first runner in an Irish Classic in today's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh and Leitrim House (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) is likely to prove no back number. He is yet to test the water at this grade, but he has progressed in leaps and bounds since finishing fifth over rain-softened ground in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September. If the faith of connections was shaken by that show, he restored it when beating Milk it Mick (GB) on his return in the Listed International Trial S. on Lingfield's polytrack Apr. 3. He was just over a second off the seven-furlong track record set by Hawk Wing when wiring the G3 Tetrarch S. at this track last time May 3, easily beating Grand Reward (Storm Cat) by 3 1/2 lengths in the process. With the defection of One Cool Cat, jockey Jamie Spencer will have the call on Grand Reward. Second in the G1 Middle Park S. in his final start at two, the bay colt was making his seasonal debut in the Tetrarch. "We've always thought Grand Reward is a very good colt," trainer Aidan O'Brien told irish-racing.com. "He hasn't had the best of luck with one or two things going wrong last season. He's had the one run back in the Tetrarch, which we were delighted with." Irish 2000 Guineas field, p2

GROUP ONE WINNERS RETURN IN EUROPE

Sunday racing in Europe features the return to action of three top-class performers. Longchamp's G1 Prix d'Ispahan over an extended nine furlongs has attracted the Niarchos Family's Six Perfections (Fr) (Celtic Swing {GB}), who makes her first start since defeating the world's top milers in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile last October. The competition includes Juddmonte Farms' Nebraska Tornado (Storm Cat), last year's G1 French Oaks winner who was last seen taking the G1 Prix du Moulin by a half-length Sept 7. Gary Stevens rides the four-year-old filly for the first time. At The Curragh, Godolphin's Sulamani (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) kicks off his five-year-old campaign in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup. The winner of last year's GI Arlington Million, the bay is making his first appearance since reporting home fifth behind High Chaparral (Ire) and Johar in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf.


Classic Form

Newmarket's 2000 Guineas form is represented by Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift), Grey Swallow (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}) and Bachelor Duke (Miswaki), who finished third, fourth and seventh, respectively, behind Haafhd (GB) in that Classic May 1. Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), who doubled up in 2002, and Indian Haven (GB), who improved on an unplaced effort at Newmarket to win this last year, have gone some way to restoring the importance of a previous run in that Classic. However, the jump from Newmarket to The Curragh is far from straightforward, as the list of losers stretching back to Barathea (Ire) in 1993 testify. Azamour, who took the G2 Beresford S. over course and distance in October, has a length on Grey Swallow on their running in the mile Classic and is bidding to provide John Oxx with his first renewal.

But Dermot Weld made no secret of the fact that Grey Swallow would improve for the experience at Newmarket and he will be hoping that the grey can end a long drought in this race. Weld's last Irish 2000 Guineas winner came in 1986, when Flash of Steel (Ire) secured his only success. Grey Swallow holds **Newton** (Ire) (Danehill) on the form of the G3 Killavullan S. at Leopardstown in October, when he handed Aidan O'Brien's colt an eight-length drubbing. Newton appears the second string from Ballydoyle, successful in four of the last seven renewals, but the tough performer ran better than his sixth placing suggests in Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp.

KINNAIRD KICKS OFF Newsells Park Stud's acquisition Kinnaird (Ire) (Dr Devious {Ire}) will bid to become another rags-to-riches story in tomorrow's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh, which has drawn a deep field of 15. Purchased for just 10,000 guineas at the Doncaster Breeze-Up sale last March, her exploits on the track, which included successes in the Shergar Cup Juvenile at Ascot in August and G2 May Hill S. at Doncaster the following month, tempted Klaus Jacobs to add her to his roster. Despite missing the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2, conditioner Pat Haslam is hopeful that she can handle this test on her seasonal debut. "I'm hopeful and she should run a good race," he said yesterday. "We were hoping to get her to Newmarket, but she wasn't quite right so we sidestepped that. A decent run here would allow her to have a tilt at the G1 Epsom Oaks [June 4]." Haslam is unconcerned about the possibility of fast ground in tomorrow's contest. "She won on firm at Ascot and very soft before that so it's not necessarily a factor," he added. "She's a racy type, is fit and well and has trained on mentally. She has a good temperament and took her racing well last year and has been to Ripon and York for racecourse gallops in recent weeks." The Duke of Roxburghe's unbeaten Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}) will exit from the five hole, next to Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. scorer Illustrious Miss (Kingmambo) in sixth. The former's conditioner Mark Johnston yesterday described himself as "hopeful" that she can become the first to complete the Newmarket--Curragh Guineas double. "She's absolutely fine and in good form," he told PA Sport. "I would hope she has come on a bit from Newmarket and there's every reason to expect she would, as that was her first run of the season after a long time off the track."

Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum's Secret Charm (Ire) (Green Desert), fifth in the Newmarket Classic, has fared worse with the draw, having been handed the widest hole in 15. Jaber Abdullah's G3 Fred Darling S. winner Majestic Desert (GB) (Fraam {GB}), ninth behind Attraction last time, will exit from stall seven. "We were delighted with Secret Charm and thought she would come on a lot for the race, and she seems to have come the right way since," Racing Manager Joe Mercer told PA Sport yesterday. "She is in there with a very good chance of a pretty big place and the stiffer track and faster ground should be in her favour." Mercer also said of Majestic Desert, "The warmer weather over the past couple of weeks has helped her and the fillies like the sunshine, so hopefully she will run a big race. Mick (Channon) thinks a lot of her--as she is a very nice filly--and we don't think that the mile will be against her."

This inaugural venture for The Curragh adds further lustre to the program for older fillies and mares and has been repaid with a select entry headed by Godolphin's Echoes in Eternity. Snapped up by the boys in blue after showing potential in her only start at two, she took longer than expected to warm to the task in her sophomore year. A dismal first run in the G3 Musidora S. at York in May was a distant memory by the time she had turned the corner when winning the G2 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket five months later. She met rain-softened ground and an improving filly in Beneventa (GB) when fourth in the G3 Dahlia S. back at that track on her return May 2 and can be expected to improve on this faster surface. Attempting to give three pounds to 2002 G1 Fillies' Mile winner Soviet Song will not be an easy task, however. The latter has failed to score since that day, despite putting up high-class performances when fourth in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket in May and second in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot in June. She was not disgraced when fourth in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and fifth in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in September. Beneventa also proved a sticking point for her on her return, when going under by a short head in the Listed Snowdrop S. at Kempton Apr. 10, before she acquitted herself well against the colts when third in the G2 Sandown Mile last time Apr. 24.
