Sadly, just two weeks after he passed away, the Duke of Devonshire's straw colors were carried to

success by the maiden Bachelor Duke (Miswaki) in yesterday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Held up towards the rear by Seb Sanders off the even early tempo set by Grand Reward (Storm Cat), the 12-1 shot was eased wide for his run passing the halfway mark

and was devouring the ground as Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift) battled to the front with 150 yards remaining. But that rival's lead was short-lived, as Bachelor Duke's relentless gallop carried him to the front with 75 yards to race and on to a length success. "That was fantastic and it's just a shame the owner couldn't be here to see it," commented an emotional trainer James Toller, enjoying his first Classic success. ## ATTRACTIVE PROPOSITION

With all the ingredients to become the people's horse, Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}) can take one step closer to their hearts in today's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. Her breeder the Duke of Roxburghe's decision not to send her to auction due to the conformation of her front legs is already the stuff of folklore, but further spice is added by John Hills' rejection of the ugly duckling and her subsequent metamorphosis into a beautiful swan under the eye of Mark Johnston, who famously commented that, "when buying a Ferrari you don't look at the tires." Attraction's paddling action proved no impediment to her forward propulsion at two as she was always moving at a greater rate than her struggling rivals in both the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot in June and G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket in July. The next twist of the tale came with a pedal bone fracture and ongoing bony changes in her knees, which led to a period of deserved rest at her owner's Floors Farm. However, it was not only the layoff that she had to overcome in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2, but also the question of whether she could carry that blazing speed to the mile's end. She did so the hard way from the front with her formidable engine churning out enough power to hold Sundrop (Jpn) by a half length. Creating the necessary drama here is the foreboding fact that no filly has completed the Newmarket-Curragh Guineas double, but that can be misleading as only six have tried in the last 35 years. "She's absolutely fine and in good form," Johnston told Racing Post. "I would hope she has come on a bit from Newmarket...that was her first run of the season after a long time off the track. You are never confident at this level, but we are hopeful." Cont. p3

## ☆ Irish 2000 Guineas☆

BACHELOR PARTY Bachelor Duke (Miswaki) was winless on arrival at The Curragh, but he had mixed it with the best since finishing third at Yarmouth on his debut in September. Sent to Newmarket twice in the space of 16 days last October, he was far from disgraced when third to Milk it Mick (GB) in the G3 Somerville Tattersall S. and fourth behind that rival in the G1 Dewhurst S. He was making his seasonal debut when a respectable seventh behind Haafhd (GB) in the G1 2000 Guineas May 1, but turned that form on its head back on his favored fast ground here. "When I heard that Haafhd was not running, I was tempted to have a go," trainer James Toller explained. "He'd been working very well. He liked that fast ground and although he hits a flat spot, he comes home. What a way to break his maiden!" Looking ahead, he added, "We'll have to go home and think about it, but the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 15] could be next." He is likely to meet runner-up Azamour again at Royal Ascot. Trainer John Oxx, pleased with the run, said, "He did everything to win and ran to the line. He will probably go for the St James' Palace S." But Dermot Weld revealed that a step up in trip is on the cards for Grey Swallow (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}), who had every chance inside the final eighth before staying on at one pace. "He's run a very good race and stayed on as he did at Newmarket," he said. "I'm thinking of the G1 Prix Jean Prat [at Chantilly June 6] and possibly the G1 Irish Derby [at The Curragh June 27] for him."

### Party On...

Bachelor Party becomes the 96th stakes winner for his 26-year-old sire, who is still covering mares at Walmac. But Miswaki, already the sire of Horse of the Year Black Tie Affair (Ire) as well as Arc heroine Urban Sea in the 1990s, has been enjoying a successful 2004. This Classic winner is his third graded/group winner of the year to date, following the Grade III victories of Etoile Montante and Sir Shackleton.

Favored when tackling two turns in stakes company next out, the handsome bay had to settle for second when Smarty Jones overcame him in the stretch of the Rebel S. at Oaklawn Mar. 20. Purge set the pace in the GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 10, but faded to fifth and was brought here to regroup. Forced to take the overland route from his outside post, the second choice ranged up four wide turning for home and showed a clean pair of heels, drawing off in a sharp 1:47 4/5. "I thought we were taking an easier route going to Arkansas," admitted winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "Unfortunately, we ran into the best three-year-old in the country." So will Purge take Smarty on a third time? "We didn't really plan on running in the Belmont, so we'll play it by ear," said Pletcher. "I would say that anything is a possibility." ## 🛣 Irish 1000 Guineas 🛣

BACK FOR ANOTHER GO Last year's Listed Radley S. scorer Secret Charm (Ire) (Green Desert) suffered a troubled trip in the G1 1000 Guineas and will be looking to continue the trend of also-rans in that Classic winning this in recent years, including the last two heroines Gossamer (GB) and Yesterday (Ire). "She ran a cracking race in the 1000 Guineas and Barry [trainer Hills] thought that she could probably do with another couple of weeks before she went there," Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Maktoum al Maktoum, told Racing Post. "She ran a great race, though, but was sadly impeded from the top of the hill down to the dip."

"It is possible that she could have finished fourth," Mercer added. "We were delighted with her and thought she would come on a lot for the race. She is in there with a very good chance of a pretty big place and the stiffer track and faster ground should be in her favour." Majestic Desert (GB) (Fraam {GB}) disappointed when finishing ninth in 1000 Guineas off her victory in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury Apr. 17. Illustrious Miss (Kingmambo) could prove the fly in the ointment for the Classic fillies, with her unorthodox preparation only exemplifying her talent. After a smooth debut score at Newbury Apr. 16, she beat subsequent Listed Conqueror S. winner Gonfilia (Ger) and a clutch of older fillies in the G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. at Lingfield last time May 8.

Soviet Song gave the members of the Elite Racing Club a day to remember when winning the G1 Fillies' Mile in September 2002. But she had failed to revisit the winner's enclosure since, despite maintaining her reputation as one of the top fillies of her generation. The bay held her own against Russian Rhythm, Six Perfections (Fr) and Intercontinental (GB) when fourth in the G1 1000 Guineas last May and was the runnerup to Russian Rhythm in the G1 Coronation S. the following month. Fourth to Nebraska Tornado in the G1 Prix du Moulin, she ended the season with a fifth to Falbrav (Ire) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. in September. She was beaten a short head on her return in the Listed Snowdrop S. Apr. 10 before suffering a troubled trip when third in her latest, the G2 Sandown Mile Apr. 24. Settled on the rail in a stalking third by Johnny Murtagh throughout the early stages, she quickened to swamp the long-time leader Echoes in Eternity passing the quarter pole before stretching clear for an emphatic score. "Today she really showed her turn of foot," conditioner James Fanshawe said. "She's in two races at Royal Ascot. If I'm brave she'll go for the G1 Queen Anne S. Making his stakes debut, Laura's Lucky Boy hit another gear at the top of the stretch en route to a stakes-record setting performance and could have a very bright future on the grass. The powerful bay, produced by a 3/4-sister to Horse of the Year Cigar, had a troubled trip when 10th in his career opener Feb. 28, but put that experience behind him with a victory next out Mar. 27. He added a narrow allowance win Apr. 28 and was the second choice in this eight-horse contest. Allowed to settle into stride as Running Free (Soft Gold {Brz}) and Boomzeeboom (Explosive Red) disputed the lead, Laura's Lucky Boy loomed boldly on the far turn and the race was suddenly over as the three-year-old opened up smartly. It was the first career stakes victory for trainer Jason Orman, who was scheduled to fly last night to New York to prepare Rock Hard Ten for the Belmont. "I always thought he was going to be a good horse, but he's developed a lot quicker than I thought," said the 35-year-old conditioner.

A seven-length winner for a \$50,000 tag Sept. 7, Judiths Wild Rush added a head victory in an Oct. 19 allowance at this track and tacked on a 10-length score in the 1 1/16-mile Display S. Nov. 15. Despite a ninthplace effort as the favorite in the Dec. 5 Delta Jackpot S., the grey was named the champion of his generation in Canada and had just one start to his credit this term, a sixth-place finish behind Forest Danger in the GIII Bay Shore S. at Aqueduct Apr. 10. Favored on his return to Canada, Judiths Wild Rush assumed command entering the first turn, set a measured pace, kicked on at the quarter pole and was kept to task to account for Organ Grinder. "The Delta race had us confused," admitted winning trainer Scott Fairlie. "He didn't run a jump there. He was gawking the whole way around and was scrambling over the racetrack. When we got him back to the farm, he was quite foot-sore when we pulled the shoes off him. He got outsprinted in that race in New York." The winner is likely to be pointed for the Queen's Plate over 10 furlongs June 27.

She had the requisite stamina for this trip when runner-up in the Listed Cheshire Oaks at Chester last time May 5. Germany has been responsible for three of the last five winners of this Classic and can add another with Lotta. Andreas Wohler's filly holds strong claims, having won the Listed Premio Zanoletti di Rozzano at this track Apr. 17. Of the home team, Noble Stella looks to have the right credentials and shaped up for this by taking a conditions event at this venue last time Mar. 20. Her stable companion Rumba Loca caused an upset when winning the G2 Premio Regina Elena in Rome May 1 before disappointing when only 10th in last Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp.

Godolphin received a blow yesterday when intended representative Sulamani was scratched due to a subcutaneous pastern infection. That has taken much of the shine off this contest, which has played a pivotal role in the launching the campaigns of Europe's top performers since it was upgraded to Group 1 status in 1999. Nysaean may be able to pick up the pieces after the withdrawal of the favorite, having been supplemented on the strength of gaining consecutive wins in the G3 Mooresbridge S. at this track May 3. Connections will be hoping he can stand up to a busier campaign than last term, when his only subsequent run came when seventh in the G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp in October. He has certainly been made to work this spring, returning to finish fifth in the G3 Prix Exbury at Saint-Cloud Mar. 6 and fourth in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt at Longchamp Apr. 4. Fifth in the Listed Magnolia S. at Kempton just eight days later, he showed he was moving forward by finishing runner-up to Chancellor (Ire) in the G3 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown Apr. 24. He may be more suited to this test than last year's G2 Great Voltigeur victor Powerscourt, who represents the Aidan O'Brien team responsible for the impressive 2003 winner Black Sam Bellamy (Ire). He has been off the track since finishing third behind Vinnie Roe (Ire) in the G1 Irish St Leger at this track in September and will need further than this to be seen at his best. Godolphin used this to reintroduce Daylami (Ire) in 1999, when he finished runner-up to Shiva (Jpn), and two years later as a springboard for Fantastic Light. They are left with Naheef, who has graduated from rabbit to his illustrious stable companion to the operation's main hope. He is a decent performer in his own right, having finished third behind Victory Moon (SAf) in Round Three of the Maktoum Challenge at Nad al Sheba last time Mar. 6.

Six Perfections began her Six Perfections Horsephotos sophomore campaign with a mighty reputation earned by an

easy success in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at this track. Her subsequent unlucky defeats in both Newmarket's and The Curragh's G1 1000 Guineas in May, albeit by two top-class rivals in Russian Rhythm and Yesterday (Ire), did little to tarnish her halo. After a second to Bright Sky on her return in the G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville in early August, she gained the top-level success she deserved when winning the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at that track two weeks later. Her subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Mile success from a poor draw was nothing short of exceptional and she is primed to provide Pascal Bary with his third renewal after the exploits of Highest Honor (Fr) in 1987 and Croco Rouge (Ire) in 1999. Nebraska Tornado's rise to the top was more dramatic and meteoric in 2003, capturing the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes at Chantilly just a month after making her debut. She returned from a break to finish sixth behind Six Perfections in the Prix Jacques le Marois before blitzing her rivals in the G1 Prix du Moulin at this venue in September. However, she has proved difficult in the preliminaries, and her refusal to take part in a recent planned racecourse gallop is grounds for concern.

He was so professional, and that's what's making him the horse that he is. It's a joy to me to see people come out and flock around this horse like they do. It's great for the whole industry and I just hope it carries on." Servis indicated that the unbeaten colt would likely breeze at the end of next week. Although plans had originally called for Smarty to ship to New York Wednesday, Servis said that he would instead van the colt up a day or two before the Test of Champions. When asked whether Smarty Jones would acclimate to Belmont, Servis responded, "Well, [Belmont Park] is a lot like Pimlico. I've run a lot of horses there and I've taken them up the morning of the race and they've run very well. My horse is doing really well right now, and you know the old saying, 'if it ain't broke, don't fix it.' We're keeping things the way they are."

Indy), winner of the GI Florida Derby in March, will skip the Belmont following a lackluster seventh in the Peter Pan. "Richie [jockey Migliore] said he was very spotty," said trainer John Kimmel. "He would give a little run and then drop the bridle. He's not going to the Belmont."
