"We broke off slowly as it was the intention only to do an easy piece of work, so we could get a feel of the track and surroundings for the horse," explained jockey Christophe-Patrice Lemaire. "After a furlong I heard a noise and I knew that something was wrong, so I stopped immediately and dismounted. I checked the course for any holes, but found only the hoofprints of the two horses. It's just a very unfortunate thing to have happened." The three-year-old was vanned from the course to a local veterinary clinic, but was unable to be saved after the bone was found to be broken in five places. A homebred for the Head family, Millemix took the Listed Prix Isonomy at Fontainebleau in November and returned to finish second under a penalty in the Listed Prix de Courcelles at Longchamp Apr. 4. Sadly, that's life and it must go on. In such circumstances, you have to keep your head on your shoulders."

The GII Peter Pan S. has traditionally been a stepping stone to a Belmont S. challenge for horses which have skipped one or both previous legs of the Triple Crown. This year, however, the race appears to have tightened Smarty Jones's grip on the Belmont trophy as several potential rivals were conclusively put in their place by Purge, a horse who had been beaten by Smarty Jones in his two most recent starts.

Purge looked very impressive when winning first time out as a two-year-old at Saratoga. He didn't return to the races until this February, when he took a six-furlong allowance race at Gulfstream Park in a very sharp 1:09. 2/5. Purge lost his unbeaten record next time out when he couldn't hold off Smarty Jones in the Rebel S., eventually going down by 3 1/2 lengths, and he then finished fifth behind that horse in the GII Arkansas Derby. The Peter Pan was his first outing since that defeat, and he underlined the quality of the Classic form with an easy 6 3/4-length triumph.

Purge is from the third crop sired by Pulpit. A member of the first crop of champion <u>A.P. Indy</u>, out of the Grade I-winning Mr. Prospector mare Preach, Pulpit earned rave reviews when winning four of his first five starts, including the GII Blue Grass S. and GII Fountain of Youth S. He started favorite for the 1997 GI Kentucky Derby, and after contending until midway through the stretch, he finished fourth to <u>Silver Charm</u>. He came out of the race with an injury and was retired to his birthplace at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky.

Although he sired high-class performers in each of his first two crops, Pulpit's early stud career has been a little up and down: he stood at \$75,000 last year, but was advertised for \$35,000 for the 2004 season. With the roll he is currently on, that number will almost certainly be due for upward revision for 2005. When reviewing Pulpit's career, it is important to note that he has had much smaller books of mares than many contemporary stallions (a result of farm policy, not popularity). In fact, Pulpit's total of 162 foals in his first three crops isn't far shy of the number the most prolific stallions are getting in a single year. This season has been Pulpit's best year to date, and he's taken his total of stakes winners to 10 with Purge joining the GI Wood Memorial S. victor Tapit (who is expected to challenge for the Belmont); Stroll, winner of the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic; and the GIII Aegon Turf Sprint winner Lydgate as graded stakes scorers. He's also got Essence of Dubai, a multiple graded stakes winner of over \$2 million, in his first crop, and Grade I victor Sky Mesa in his second, this pair both being in their first seasons as sires in 2004. Incidentally, with Pulpit, the prematurely deceased Old Trieste (sire of three stakes winners and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Minister Eric in his first crop) and Malibu Moon (sire of graded stakes winner Perfect Moon with his first crop two-year-olds last year), A.P. Indy is showing plenty of promise as a sire of sires. He's got some more bright prospects to come too, with 2004 seeing first two-year-olds by Golden Missile and Stephen Got Even as well as first yearlings by Aptitude. (Cont. p.3)

Purge is the first live foal produced by his dam Copelan's Bid Gal, a stakes winning daughter of Copelan, one of the top two-year-olds of 1982. Copelan's Bid Girl is half-sister to the multiple graded stakes winning sprinter/miler Valid Wager, himself sire of last year's GI King's Bishop S. winner Valid Video. She is also half-sister to Miss Bold Appeal, the dam of Jersey Girl--winner of nine of 11 starts, including the GI Mother Goose, GI Test and GI Acorn S .-- and the Australian-raced Group 3 winner St. Petersburg. Purge's granddam Bid Gal (by Bold Bidder) is out of a half-sister to champion two-year-old and Kentucky Derby hero Foolish Pleasure, who was by What a Pleasure, like Bold Bidder a son of Bold Ruler.

Foolish Pleasure was a product of the Bold Ruler/Tom Fool cross. Another version of that cross produced Weekend Surprise, the dam of A.P. Indy. As we have mentioned in previous columns, the combination of Bold Ruler and Tom Fool was an extremely interesting one on pedigree, as the two horses owned very similar backgrounds. Unfortunately in real life, close encounters between the two tended to create unsoundness. However, we're now frequently finding multiple crosses of the pairing further back in the pedigrees of numerous good horses, the most recent star being Smarty Jones, who has his distaff Bold Ruler/Tom Fool through Foolish Pleasure, the close relative to Purge's granddam. Purge takes things a step further as he has three crosses of both Bold Ruler and Tom Fool.

DAILY RACING FORM SOLD The Daily Racing Form has been sold by Alpine Equity Partners L.P. to The Wicks Group of Companies in a deal which was finalized May 24. The Wicks Group is a Manhattan, New York-based firm which, since 1989, has specialized in growing businesses in the media, communications and information sectors. "This sale should only mean good things for the Form and our readers," said Steven Crist, who will continue in the role of chairman and publisher of the DRF. "We think the change of financial backers will be transparent in the short term, allow us to grow and serve racing fans and the industry in the future and remain an independent voice for news and information," he added. The Wicks Group will be the sixth owner in the 110-year history of the publication, which began as a four-page broadsheet in Chicago in 1894. Crist and Charlie Hayward, who will remain as president and CEO of the DRF, put together an investment group headed by Alpine to purchase the Form from Primedia Company in 1998. "We were very impressed by what the management team has done," said Craig Klosk, comanaging partner of The Wicks Group, "and we believe there is now an opportunity to enhance and expand an already strong company and prominent consumer brand." The corporate headquarters of *Daily Racing* Form will remain at 100 Broadway in lower Manhattan.

EU PLACES RESTRICTIONS ON U.S. HORSES The European Union (EU) will impose restrictions on the export of U.S. horses to Europe as a result of the recent outbreak of Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) in Southwest Texas. The EU will require any horses to take and pass a virus neutralization for the disease 10 days prior to export for temporary export horses and three weeks prior to export for horses being permanently sent to EU countries. EU horses currently in the U.S. and scheduled to return to the EU must certify that they have not been on affected premises during their stay in the U.S. This test requirement is to remain in place until six months after the VS outbreak.

GODOLPHIN HIGH ON DERBY HOPEFUL SNOW RIDGE Trainer Saeed bin Suroor was upbeat about the chance of G1 Epsom Derby contender Snow Ridge (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who worked over seven furlongs under Ted Durcan. "Snow Ridge is very honest in his work," he said. "He is a star and a very professional horse--whatever you ask him he gives from his heart. He has a good turn of foot and is nice and relaxed. I am confident that he will run a big race. A mile and a quarter will be no problem and I believe the horse has the class to stay the mile and a half trip." Bin Suroor believes the operation have their "best chances" of Epsom glory in recent years. "Sundrop has plenty of speed and a good turn of foot," he added. "I have confidence about a mile and a guarter -- the filly has class and I think she will stay a mile and a half. Punctilious came back very well after her last race and I feel she will have no problem staying a mile and a half--they both have what is needed to win the Oaks." Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum was also keeping a keen eye on the Epsom hopefuls, describing that they are "only guessing" as to whether G1 2000 Guineas runner-up Snow Ridge will stay the mile and a half trip. "I think that Snow Ridge's best distance is a mile and a quarter, and mile and a guarter horses sometimes stay a mile and a half if they have class," he said. "Snow Ridge is going the right way and we are happy with him--we are going there for a big fight. I think Snow Ridge is a balanced horse and there should be no difficulty coming down the hill at Epsom." Dettori was in a bullish mood ahead of the Derby, a race which still evades him, describing Snow Ridge as his best chance so far. "Success in the Derby would really be the last piece in the puzzle for my career as a jockey," he said. "It would be a great accomplishment, but when you have done it once, you want to do it again."

FRANKIE OAKS DILEMMA DRAGS ON
