### **CITY EPSOM BOUND**

Michael Tabor's Salford City (Ire) (Desert Sun {GB}) was described as "increasingly likely" to line up in the June 5 Epsom Derby after pleasing connections in a racecourse gallop at Epsom yesterday. Despite a strangles scare, Salford City's trainer, David Elsworth, was one of a host of conditioners who took their Classic contenders to the Surrey venue for a feel of the unique undulations. Partnered by Johnny Murtagh, the G3 Greenham S. scorer was accompanied by two stable companions and handled the track in "most satisfactory" fashion, according to his trainer, who told PA Sport, "We have trained him since [finishing sixth in] the 2000 Guineas so that we could run in the Derby if we wanted to and it is looking increasingly likely that he will. The owner is quite keen to run and there is only one Derby." Despite the confirmation of two cases of strangles, caused by streptococcus equi, at a nearby livery yard, Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper reiterated that next weekend's Derby meeting would be unaffected. "All the livery yards around here have shut up and everybody is taking things very seriously," he told PA Sport.

## OUTBREAK WON'T AFFECT BREEDERS' CUP...

FOR NOW Breeders' Cup officials, following news that three horses in West Texas were stricken with



vesicular stomatitis (VS)--a contagious viral infection--have indicated that they have no immediate plans to relocate the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, set to take place at Lone Star Park Oct. 30. "We are closely monitoring the evidence of Vesicular Stomatitis virus in West Texas with the Texas Animal Health Center, U.S.D.A., and Lone Star Park officials," explained D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Limited. "It

is an isolated case that has affected three horses on a nine-horse farm in a sparsely populated area located about 500 miles west of Lone Star Park. It is our intention to conduct the 2004 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie. Any change to those plans will be determined based upon the containment of the virus. It is standard procedure for Breeders' Cup Ltd. to consider alternative sites when the situation calls for a possible change, no matter how remote. Presently, it is premature to speculate on any alternatives."

Lone Star officials announced Thursday afternoon that each of the 1,450 horses stabled on the grounds had been examined and none showed signs of VS. "Because Lone Star Park is hosting important national stakes races on Memorial Day and the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships this October, it's only natural that we pay close attention to this case, no matter how isolated and remote it is," said the track's Vice President and General Manager Jeff Greco. "To cast fears aside, we asked the Texas Racing Commission to oversee these independent examinations so that horsemen around the globe could be assured that it's safe to bring their horses to Lone Star Park."

MARY KAY JOHNSON DIES Mary Kay Johnson, wife of Hall of Fame trainer Phil "P.G." Johnson, died Tuesday night at St. Francis Hospital in Roslyn, NY, of an apparent heart attack. She was 79. Mrs. Johnson was admitted to Mercy Hospital in Rockville Center. NY, after suffering a fall on Monday. She was later transferred to St. Francis for additional testing. Phil and Mary Kay, who were married for 59 years, raced horses under the banner Amherst Stable. Their blue and pink silks became part of Breeders' Cup lore when 43-1 spoiler Volponi captured the 2002 renewal of the GI Classic, resulting in one of the biggest upsets in the history of the event. Funeral services will be private.
