KEEPING UP WITH The (Smarty) Jones



Smarty Ready To Work

On the eve of his main prep ahead of next Saturday's GI Belmont S., Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) jogged a mile yesterday morning at Philadelphia Park to the delight of trainer John Servis. "He went super. He's very good," the conditioner said, adding, "I am a little con-

cerned about the work. I hope he doesn't do too much." The chestnut is scheduled to go to the track this morning at 5:30 for a seven-furlong breeze with jockey Stewart Elliott up. "He's going to start out slow," Servis explained. "I'd love to see him go about the same time [as he did when he worked seven furlongs

Feb. 11 in 1:29 3/5 at Oaklawn Park] and ease him off the pony. Have him off the rail and settled up the backside and pick it up from there. Ideally he'll go in [a minute]:28 or:29."

Next Saturday's event will not mark the first time that Servis has saddled a horse in a Grade I event at Belmont Park going 12 furlongs. Jostle, conditioned by Servis for Fox Hill Farms, went wire-to-wire to win the 2000 GI Coaching Club of America Oaks, an experience he is sure to draw upon next weekend. "One thing that I've been concentrating on is not to have him too sharp going into the race," he commented. "This horse doesn't seem to get tired, so I actually think he might enjoy the 1 1/2 miles," he added.

Despite all of the new-found notoriety, Servis continues to take everything in stride. "Nothing has slowed down really," he said. "I'm getting calls from Australia, Japan, London, Canada. This is a pretty popular story. But I'm a country boy at heart. I've always considered myself a horseman, but my first love is my family. Then my second love is my horses."

Orman Stuck Between Rock and Hard Ten's Place

Were trainer Jason Orman not charged with the task of saddling GI Preakness S. runner-up Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) in the Belmont, he might be cheering right



along with most of the racing world. "You'd like to go up there and beat him, but if you can't, then sure you'd like to see Smarty Jones pull it off," Orman said yesterday during a national teleconference. The lightly raced colt is well-bred for the Belmont trip and his ability to get the 12furlong distance has Orman hopeful, if not entirely confident, about challenging Smarty Jones. "I think he got a lot out of his

Rock Hard Ten Horsephotos last race and will improve with the longer distance," he com-

mented. "But if Smarty Jones were to run the race he ran last time and we beat him, I'd be surprised." Orman is still awaiting word from jockey Pat Valenzuela as to whether he will be able to ride the colt in the Belmont.

Fiske Looking For Tapit To Improve

David Fiske, racing manager for Winchell Thoroughbreds LLC, said that Tapit (Pulpit) has emerged from his six-furlong breeze Wednesday in good order and that all systems are go for the Test of the Champion. "[Trainer] Michael [Dickinson] said he worked fine, came back good, travelled good and is feeling good," Fiske said yesterday. "The schedule is for him to work again on Monday. I think he's as good as he can be and he seems to be healthy at the moment." Fiske believes the GI Wood Memorial winner is sitting on a big effort. "I still don't think we've seen this horse's best race," he said. "We always seem to be getting him to peak and then something happens. At Churchill, it was the rain. Our catch phrase going into the race had been 'game on' and then when it started raining, I looked over at [owner] Ron [Winchell] and said 'game over.'" Having skipped the Preakness, Tapit was last seen when ninth in the May 1 Kentucky Derby.

Unraced as a juvenile, Puppeteer progressed quickly through the ranks to win the Listed Prix du Pont du Jour at Craon on his fourth and final sophomore start last September. Sixth on his seasonal bow in the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc at Saint-Cloud Mar. 28, he was second to Vasywait (Fr) in the Listed Prix de Montretout over course and distance Apr. 29. He secured a first group race win here with a dominant closing flourish to deny last year's winner Saratan more easily than the winning margin of a neck would suggest. Held near the back of the pack during the first half of the contest, he was pushed along to close on the leaders with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining. He was ridden to challenge at the distance and ran on strongly for Christophe Soumillon urgings in the closing stages to prove narrowly best. "We think this horse is even better over a mile, but he is quite keen and needs a truly-run race," said the owner's racing manager Jean-Louis Branere. "That is why we tried him over this trip, where the tempo is always that much guicker, and it worked out perfectly well. Even though he has won, we still think, and the jockey also agrees, that a mile, on good ground, is his best trip. We will probably now have to travel abroad to find a suitable race for him, maybe England or Germany for a Group 2 race." Click for the france-galop.com chart.

Parrish Honored With Silver Star:

David C. Parrish Jr., who operates under the banner of Indian Creek near Paris, Kentucky, was awarded yesterday with a Silver Star (Army Air Force) for action over France in 1944. During the war, Parrish was also honored twice with the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medals with 21 Oak Leaf Clusters and other medals from the English, French and American governments. Parrish and his brothers Jim and Shack joined the U.S. Army Air Force (later the U.S. Air Force) with the outbreak of World War II. Shack, a B-24 pilot, lost his life in combat over the South of France, while Jim served with distinction as a B-29 gunner in the Pacific, Dave became a P-47 pilot with the 368th Fighter Group and participated in the D-Day invasion. Parrish left the service in 1945 and began farming that year. In 1961, he, Douglas Parrish, A.B. Hancock Jr. and Anthony Hughes-Gibb purchased the James Clay Ward Agency, which engaged in equine insurance. Parrish resides with his wife of 59 years, Susan, at their home of 43 years, Johnston's Inn. The Silver Star is awarded to "a person who, while serving in any capacity with the U.S. Army, is cited for gallantry in action against an enemy of the United States while engaged in military operations involving conflict with an opposing foreign force, or while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in armed conflict against an opposing armed force in which the United States is not a belligerent party." Senator Mitch McConnell of Kentucky presented the award to Parrish.

Overflow Crowd for KEEP Town Hall Meeting:

An estimated 600 people turned out for the first town hall meeting of KEEP, the Kentucky Equine Education Project, at the Kentucky Horse Park Wednesday evening. The organization, which sets out to build broad-based education and to increase awareness of the state's \$4-billion horse economy, will likely not be ready to have an influence on the 30-day legislative session for 2005, but should be a force at the 2006 session, former Governor Brereton Jones told those on hand. John Gaines, who serves KEEP as its honorary chairman, said, "I've never been associated with a more important organization in the horse industry and if you give us the tools, we'll finish the job." KEEP hopes to be fully operational by this summer, with an executive director, staff and promotional video.

Slots Bill Killed in Ohio:

The Ohio House of Representatives has voted against sending the state's slots bill to public referendum, the Harness Tracks of America *Executive Newsletter* reports. After a 90-minute debate that didn't end until 1:15 Thursday morning, the vote fell three shy of the two-thirds majority needed to send the bill on. Ohio's seven tracks could try to get the bill on the November ballot by getting the signatures of 323,000 registered voters by Aug. 4. If not, the measure will have to be reintroduced next year.

Barbara Dege, a racing fan and \$2 bettor, passed away last July at the age of 50 after battling chronic heart problems. The New Jersey resident bequeathed nearly \$900,000 to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation. The gift is one of the largest ever made to the TRF, second only to a donation made by the Paul Mellon Estate upon his death. The TRF, the nation's oldest and largest equine rescue organization, cares for and finds home for retired race horses. "We know Barbara was a kind and caring person," TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "Her wonderful gift to the TRF will go towards helping with our infrastructure so that we can save more horses and feel confident in our ability to care for our horses. It will also add to the Forego Fund, which is dedicated to the daily costs of feeding and caring for our steadily increasing horse population. Clearly, Ms. Dege recognized the huge task involved with fulfilling the TRF's mission. We are forever grateful to her for her generosity." An only child, Dege was not married and had no children. She wrote for American Turf Monthly. "She lived a very spartan life, although she didn't need to, as you can guess from the size of the bequest," said Susan Schink, a friend of Dege and an Episcopal priest. "There was about a 10year period where I didn't see much of Barbara and during that time she got interested in horse racing. When we reconnected, she was an absolutely avid fan and loved to go to the track."
