Belmont Park Braces for Smarty Mania

The **Smarty Jones** (Elusive Quality) road show is scheduled to roll into Elmont, New York today, when racing's newest star arrives at Belmont Park for a tilt at Saturday's GI Belmont S. Fresh off a routine 1 1/2-mile gallop yesterday morning at Philadelphia Park, Smarty Jones is set to have one final gallop over his home base



before departing by van between 9:30-10:00 a.m. "We let him have a good strong gallop [Tuesday] and he handled it great," said trainer John Servis. "He was playing a little bit while he was in there cooling out in the barn, and he gave a little back jump." Thrust into National prominence following a convincing score in the Kentucky Derby May 1, Smarty Jones' popularity vaulted him into the stratosphere after a romp in the GI Preakness S. May 15. "He'll have a police escort the whole way," confirmed Servis. "The police [in Philadelphia] will excort him out

of Pennsylvania and then the New Jersey police will pick him up. The New York police will then escort him once he leaves New Jersey." And how is the horse on the verge of racing immortality holding out under all the pressure? "Very, very good," said Servis. "He's an amazing horse. I don't know when the time is going to come that he has reached his peak."

VALENZUELA TO MISS MOUNT ON 'ROCK'

Jockey Patrick Valenzuela was denied a stay of a California Horse Racing Board suspension yesterday in Los Angeles Superior Court and will not be able to ride Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) in Saturday's GI Belmont S. Following the news, trainer Jason Orman announced that Alex Solis will be aboard the Preakness runner-up, who is expected to be the second choice behind Smarty Jones in the Belmont."I'm very surprised and I'm not happy with it," said Valenzuela's attorney Don Calabria. "Basically, life has to go on. He's the greatest jockey in the world and I'm sorry the public isn't going to get to see him on this horse, Rock Hard Ten." Calabria said there may be other legal avenues he could take in an attempt to allow Valenzuela to ride Saturday, but added that he would not pursue them. "Enough is enough," he said. Valenzuela was hoping the court would grant him a stay of the final month of a fourmonth suspension handed down by the CHRB after Valenzuela missed a mandatory drug test at Santa Anita Jan. 22. Having been given credit by the California racing board for the three months he sat out while his case was waiting to be heard, the final month of his suspension was set to begin yesterday, barring a court ruling giving him a stay. Calabria said Valenzuela, who did not return a phone call seeking comment, took the news well and is looking forward to his return July 1. "Patrick is a very optimistic young man," Calabria said. "He is disappointed that he won't get to ride this horse, but every horse he jumps on he improves. And he'll be riding for a lot of years and will be riding a lot of good horses. He said to me, I just hope I can get back on him by Breeders' Cup so I can win the Classic on him and show everyone.'" Orman said he was disappointed that Valenzuela will not be allowed to ride Rock Hard Ten, but was pleased that Solis was available. "Obviously, I would have liked to have had Patrick ride him, but sometimes things happen for a reason," Orman said. "Alex is as good as anyone out there. We'll just have to move forward." This race promised to be a spectacle to savor and did not disappoint as Bandari and Ikhtyar battled it out up the Sandown hill, with the former winning the war of attrition. Always in the front two, Bandari was committed at the start of the winding turn into the straight by Willie Supple and looked beaten as the smooth-traveling Ikhtyar loomed upsides and briefly passed him inside the final quarter. Relishing the rain-softened ground, he battled to regain the lead soon after and pulled out extra in the dying strides to continue his recent renaissance. Despite collecting the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial, G3 Gordon S. and G2 Great Voltigeur S. at three, he failed to collect in the major prizes, having disappointed when only eighth in the G1 Epsom Derby before faring better when third in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster.

Things can only get better..

Bandari proved consistent if not impressive throughout his four-year-old campaign, highlighted by a second placing in the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket in July, before injury intervened. He was 11th in the G3 John Porter S. after the lengthy lay-off at Newbury Apr. 17, but bounced back to a Newmarket conditions race and the Listed Huxley S. at Chester in the space of five days in early May. "He is a much more relaxed horse this year and Willie said there's no reason why he can't go back to a mile and a half," commented trainer Mark Johnston. "He has lots of options, with the likes of the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [at Royal Ascot June 16] and G1 Eclipse S. [at Sandown July 3] the exciting ones to think about, but Sheikh Hamdan will have his own input." Jockey Richard Hills, who chose Ikhtyar before the rain, suggested that the weather had made the difference. "I felt my fellow had a bit more turn of foot, but it's gone soft tonight and had it been good ground it would have been a different result." Click for the racingpost.co.uk chart.

Marbye turned in an excellent effort when third behind Bright Sky (Ire) and Six Perfections (Fr) in the G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville last August and transferred that promise to the domestic sphere in three course-and-distance events in the fall. She won the Listed Premio Pietro Bessero in September before finishing fourth in the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua and taking the G3 Premio Sergio Cumani. She rounded off her campaign by finishing a half-length third to Duca d'Atri (Ire) in the G2 Premio Ribot in Rome in November and returned with a stylish score in a conditions event in Rome Mar. 21. She was disappointing when only fourth in the G3 Premio Carlo Chiesa back at that venue last time May 1, but may have found the testing ground against her. Caluki started off his 2004 campaign in good heart, showing a liking for an artificial surface when winning the Listed Grand Prix de la Riviera Cote d'Azur at Cagnes-sur-Mer Feb. 7 and Listed Winter Derby at Lingfield Mar. 20. His form on turf leaves him with something to find and he even looked below par on the dirt last time when a poor ninth in the Listed Pramms Memorial at Jagersro May 6. Giovane Imperatore has generally struggled to maintain his form in the best company since a profitable sophomore campaign, which included success in the G2 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) and G2 Premio Ribot in Rome. He needs to improve off his fourth behind Le Vie dei Colori (GB) in the Listed Premio Natale di Roma last time Apr. 25.

Ground Fears Ease for American Post

Juddmonte Farms' American Post (GB) (Bering {GB}) looks certain to make the line-up for Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom after rain eased the ground at the Surrey venue. With the conditions now officially described as "good," connections of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) winner are happy that he will run in the Classic. After Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe stated that the colt would not run in the race if the ground was "very firm," conditioner Criquette Head-Maarek told PA Sport, "Very firm ground could be a problem for him as he didn't move as well as he can on the quicker ground in the Poulains." She also revealed that American Post's Chantilly workout on Friday had helped them to make up their mind about the Derby. "He was on a perfect even keel going down the hill and up it, and went away from the other horses at the end when Richard [Hughes] asked him to lengthen. He came out of the work so well that as far as I was concerned the right thing was to run him at Epsom."

In recent years we've become accustomed to Kentucky Derby winners sired by relatively inexpensive stallions. Back in the 80's and early 90's, however, the race was more frequently the province of Thoroughbred royalty, with victories for the offspring of such as Alydar (twice), Fappiano, Halo, Caro, Seattle Slew and Nijinsky II. Even then, however, there was the occasional interloper, such as the 1985 hero Spend a Buck, who went on to become champion three-year-old and Horse of the Year.

He was a son of GII Saranac S. and GIII Peter Pan S. victor Buckaroo (by Buckpasser), a horse now best know as sire of the leader of the Florida stallion community, Montbrook, but never a stallion at the forefront of fashion. At stud, Spend a Buck threw more to his pedigree, which was more adequate than spectacular, than his race record. He began his stud career at Lane's End Farm, in Lexington, Kentucky, but after standing at Red River Farms, Louisiana, in 2001, he was exported to Brazil, a country to which he had been shuttling for several seasons. He died of anaphylactic shock in that country in November 2002.

Top Buck ..

The best of Spend a Buck's U.S.-sired runners was Antespend, a three time Grade I winner, who is also the dam of this year's GI Florida Derby hero Friends Lake. Spend a Buck sired seven other U.S. graded stakes winners--No Spend No Glow, Adhocracy, Pie In Your Eye, Dust Bucket, Cheerful Spree, Table Limit and Worth Avenue--and has a lifetime total of 32 stakes winners. Antespend was out of an Argentinean-bred mare, and as it turns out, this was a signpost to Spend a Buck's suitability for the environment in South America, and from his Brazilian crops he sired at least eight Grade I winners, including two--Hard Buck and Pico Central--who have captured Grade I events in the U.S. in 2004.

Hard Buck, who took the GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H., and Pico Central, are both members of Spend a Buck's 1999 Southern Hemisphere crop. Pico Central, a winner of four of eight starts in his native land, established himself as champion sprinter in Brazil, winning the G1 Gran Premio Major Suckow and GI Gran Premio Estado do Rio de Janeiro. In the U.S., he's now taken his first four starts, and after claiming Grade I honors with a win in the GI Carter H. in April, he defeated what was almost certainly the strongest field gathered in the U.S. this year to capture Monday's GI Metropolitan H.

Pico Central is the third known foal of his dam, Sheila Purple. She was a daughter of the Grey Dawn II horse, Purple Mountain, a tough sprinter whose best victory came in the GII Fall Highweight H. A half-sister to Brazilian Group 3 winner Real Balafre, Sheila Purple is out of Ecoute, a mare by another U.S. bred stallion, T. V. Lark's stakes placed son, Tumble Lark. Ecoute's sister, Damascus Blade, is granddam of another Brazilian horse to makes his name as a sprinter in the U.S. Her Grade I winning daughter Met Blade is the dam of Blade Prospector, who in 2001 won the GIII Berkeley H., and finished second in the GI San Carlos H., a race won earlier this year (as a Grade II) by Pico Central.

Baron Thierry de Zuylen de Nyevelt's **Voix du Nord** (Fr) (Valanour {Ire}) yesterday headed a list of 28 remaining entries in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly. The G2 Prix Noailles and G1 Prix Lupin winner completed his final serious work-



out on Monday ahead of his Classic engagement, where he will be accompanied by stable companion **Alcinos (Fr)** (Highest Honor). "This horse is a rock, he's got nerves of steel," jockey Dominique Boeuf told *PA Sport*. "For him, the harder the race,

the better he is. He loves to battle. He pleased me when he worked on Monday, and, as usual, he'll have his pacemaker to ensure a decent pace." He may be reopposed by the Lagardere Family's Valixir (Ire) (Trempolino), beaten just two lengths by Voix du Nord when third in the Lupin at Longchamp last time May 16. He is one of three entries from the Andre Fabre stable, including Listed Prix de l'Avre scorer Reefscape (GB) (Linamix {Fr}). A strong overseas representation is headed by Moyglare Stud Farm's Relaxed Gesture (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who was runner-up to Yeats (Ire) in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown last time May 9. He was described as a "possible" for the Classic by trainer Dermot Weld, who also has Cairdeas (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) engaged. The latter was beaten by Susan Magnier's Meath (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the G3 Gallinule S. at The Curragh last time May 23 and that colt may still represent Aidan O'Brien, who has left five in the race. Track Manager Matthieu Vincent described the going as soft yesterday, reading 3.6 on the penetrometer.

Yeats Undergoes Physio

Aidan O'Brien has revealed that Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby contender **Yeats (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) is currently undergoing physiotherapy for a "tweaked muscle." Susan Magnier's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner was found to be stiff after exercise last week and has been duly treated on a daily basis by Liz Kent, famed for her treatment of Alamshar (Ire) before that colt's success in last year's G1 Irish Derby.

His nearest duplication is War Admiral 5x5, and he also has Nasrullah 5x6x6 (two of the Nasrullah strains are via Nasrullah/Man o' War crosses, which appear in Spend a Buck's granddam, Battle Dress, and in Tumble Lark, sire of Pico Central's second dam). Further back there is a large build up of Man o' War and two of his grandparents, Fairy Gold (dam of Man o' War's sire, Fair Play) and Rock Sand (sire of Man o' War's dam, Mahubah), through three related strains--War Admiral, War Relic and Eight Thirty. War Relic, a son of Man o' War was out of a mare by Friar Rock (by Rock Sand out of Fairy Gold), and inbred 3x3 to both Rock Sand and Fairy Gold. Eight Thirty was by Rock Sand with a second dam by Man o' War and so also inbred to Rock Sand and Fairy Gold.

Eight Thirty's Man o' War strain came through Seaplane, who was half-sister to the granddam of War Admiral, himself of course, a son of Man o' War.


