The third leg of the Triple Crown did not set up the way trainer John Servis had hoped. Unruffled before the start, **Smarty Jones** was away alertly and was on

was away alertly and was on the lead as they went past the stands for the first time. Jockey Stewart Elliott tried to make the best of the situation. "He broke very sharp," Elliott said. "I could have wrestled him back, but then I would have been fighting him." He managed to get him back to third behind **Purge** (Pulpit) and

Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) while getting floated three wide on the far turn, but Servis was already concerned. "When they turned up the backstretch, I knew he was in trouble," he said. "He just wouldn't relax." Elliott let out a notch as they hit the halfway mark, going six furlongs in 1:11.76, but still he couldn't catch a breather. "I couldn't get the break I wanted," he said. "The plan was to have an easy eighth at some point, but it just didn't happen." Still, Smarty opened up on the field as they dashed around the far turn and, as Elliott looked down the long stretch, he thought he had his Triple Crown win. "I was pretty confident," he said. "I was still sitting, I still had horse. He never stopped running. I thought a horse was really going to have to be coming to beat me." But someone was coming. A rank outsider off his eighthplace finish in the May 1 Kentucky Derby, Birdstone had bided his time early and was still five lengths off it at the half-mile pole, but came at the Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero in the final furlong and caught him in the shadow of the wire. "I looked over my shoulder and I saw him coming pretty strong," Elliott said. "My horse was really trying, but he just couldn't hold him off." Servis was gracious in defeat. "As much as I hate to say it, this race is what makes racing great," he stated. "It looked like we were heading to the winner's circle, but you just never know what will happen."

A Surprise Ending


Certainly, very few saw Birdstone as the horse to beat in the Belmont. The colt had looked like a serious contender at two, breaking his maiden by an eye-catching 12 1/2 lengths at Saratoga. He hit the gate at the start of the GI Hopeful S. and could do no better than fourth, but bounced back to take the Oct. 4 GI Champagne S. and was put away for the year. He came back

to win a Gulfstream allowance race Feb. 14, but never got untracked as the 3-5 favorite in the Mar. 20 GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Park and ended up fifth. His race in the Derby impressed few, but trainer Nick Zito had said more than once since that effort, "His race in the Derby wasn't as bad as it looked. He finished eighth, not 18th--he beat half the field." But he was more

than 15 lengths behind Smarty Jones, and was overlooked by the handicappers despite the return to the scene of his Champagne score. Off at 36-1, he settled in seventh early, but moved into contention with a half mile to race and jockey Edgar Prado said, "I hadn't really asked my horse." The bay was second as they straightened for home and slowly ate into Smarty's advantage before getting in front inside the sixteenth pole. Zito, who had been second in five of 11 previous Belmont tries, finally had his win in the "Test of the Champion." Said the New York native, who has two Kentucky Derby trophies to his credit, "I think this is my biggest win, obviously, and for so many reasons. Maybe it's the magnitude of the win and everything that Smarty Jones brought to the table, and the five seconds in the Belmont. I don't know. This was an incredible day for me." He had nothing but praise for the runner-up. "He'll go down as one of the greats," Zito said. "Hopefully he has a lot of racing left in him." Birdstone will now be pointed for the Aug. 28 GI Travers S. at Saratoga.

trate. We'd definitely take on the winner again in the G1 Irish Derby [at The Curragh July 27] and I think the flat climbing track would suit us better."

Drumming Up Excuses

John Gosden said of **Percussionist (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), "From the low draw we had to go, and finding the early pace was tough on this ground. He finished strong up the straight, but had had to use a lot of petrol early. If it had rained heavily last night he would have been right there, but the winner would still have won. We can freshen him up now and come back for the autumn and the G1 St Leger [Sept. 11]." Frankie Dettori was downhearted after joint-favorite **Snow Ridge (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who held every chance inside the final quarter, weakened out of contention. "He felt brilliant going to post and I let him warm up, but he only went for 100 yards after Tattenham Corner until the stamina started to tell," he explained.

Meteor Storm had established himself as one of California's top long-distance turf horses with back-to-back victories in the GII San Luis Rey H. Mar. 20 and the GII San Juan Capistrano H. Apr. 18. The bay hadn't been out since taking the latter, a 1 3/4-mile contest at Santa Anita, and was the fourth choice in his first start on the East Coast. Saving ground in the early stages, Meteor Storm was taken to the outside in the stretch and finished strongly up the center of the course to earn his first Grade I victory. "I didn't know how good he was," said winning trainer Wally Dollase. "You don't know until you meet Eastern horses." As for the fiveyear-old's next start, Dollase said, "We'll take him back to California and look around. We would like to be invited to the Melbourne Cup, but there are a lot of races between now and then."

A five-length winner of the six-furlong GII Genuine Risk H. at Belmont May 9, Bear Fan was made the heavy favorite to repeat here, and did so with style, equalling Confide's 1997 record time for the distance. The bay jumped out of the gate and seized the lead, set the pace along the inside, drew away when asked and was ridden out to the wire for her fourth straight stakes win. Chantilly stages the long-awaited return to the track of last year's unbeaten champion juvenile Bago. The colt put himself on the map with an easy defeat of Valixir (Ire) in the G3 Prix des Chenes at Longchamp last September before annihilating Top Seed (Ire) in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November. There was a strong suggestion that both performances were merely scratching at the surface of his talent, but he has had a troubled spring due to a virus and may not be firing on all cylinders here. That leaves the way open to Mister Sacha to secure his place in the top flight. He still looked green when winning the G3 Prix de Guiche at Longchamp May 13, but is ideally placed to provide Jean-Claude Rouget with his second renewal after the exploits of Millkom (GB) in 1994. Like Bago, Pearl of Love has been dogged by problems this spring, but is already proven at the top level. His half-length defeat of Spirit of Desert (Ire) in the G1 Gran Criterium at the San Siro in October, where Moscow Ballet was fifth, was made to look even better when the runner-up took the G2 Premio Parioli in Rome last month. Ershaad caught the eye with a flourish that carried him into fourth, beaten just over a length, in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 16. He strengthens this renewal, as does the fascinating **Cacique**. He has done everything asked of him so far in two conditions events at Saint-Cloud Apr. 14 and Longchamp May 19.

Transferred from its traditional base of Mulheim, this year's renewal has been billed as a straight match between Saldentigerin and Amarette, from the power bases of Peter Schiergen and Andreas Schutz. While the latter came out on top in their previous meeting in the G1 Schwarzgold-Rennen at Cologne last time May 16, blame for the defeat of Saldentigerin was placed squarely on Filip Minarik, who was judged to have gone off too fast in that contest. She had entered the trial as the hot favorite on the basis of her second in the G3 Premio Dormello in Milan in October and her defeat of Dalicia and Vallera in the Listed Jean Harzheim-Rennen in Cologne Apr. 24. She needs to curb her natural enthusiasm in the early stages if she is to reverse form with the unbeaten Amarette, who hails from the allconquering Schutz barn. La Ina brings Classic form into the contest, having finished runner-up in the G2 Henkel-Rennen at Dusseldorf May 9, and promises to take a hand on her final start before departing for the States.

Third, beaten about a length in this event last year, Lohengrin traveled to France to finish runner-up to Nebraska Tornado in the G1 Prix du Moulin Sept. 7, but closed the year with a 13th in the G1 Tenno Sho Nov. 2. Winless in a pair of starts this term, the five-year-old prepped for this with a second-place finish behind My Sole Sound in the G2-JRA Yomiuri Milers' Cup Apr. 17. Telegnosis also journeyed overseas last summer, finishing a good third to eventual Breeders' Cup Mile winner Six Perfections (Fr) in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, but was well up the track in the Moulin. Winless since the spring of 2002, the Shadai homebred returned from a six-month absence to finish second, a neck behind Win Radius, in the G2-JRA Keio Hai Spring Cup May 16. She bids to emulate Banks Hill (GB), who placed in that Classic before winning this in 2001. She had previously shown a liking for a fast surface when winning conditions events at Longchamp Apr. 11 and at this track Apr. 26, so may be vulnerable if the rain continues. Miss Me split Torrestrella and Agata (Fr) in the Listed Prix Finlande at Longchamp last time Apr. 11 and rates a threat, as does the progressive Baqah, who beat Dolma in the Listed Prix d'Angerville at this track May 17. Carlos Laffon-Parias has a particular affection for this race, which he has won with Pharatta (Ire), Ronda (GB) and Spring Star (Fr) since 1998, and saddles Bright Abundance. She performed with credit when sixth in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac in October and comes here off a confidence-boosting minor conditions win at Angers last time May 16.

Porlezza practically owns this contest and is looking to snag her third consecutive renewal of the event. One of France's finest sprinters, she proved she was more than just a five-furlong specialist when beating Etoile Montante in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest over 61/2 furlongs at Deauville last August. She was beaten less than two lengths when fifth in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp in October and showed she retained her enthusiasm when winning the Listed Prix Servanne at this track last time Apr. 26. Unlike on previous occasions, she enters this race heavily penalised and could be vulnerable. Avonbridge hails from the Roger Charlton stable bulging with talented sprinters and he has shown admirable progression since winning the Listed Cathedral S. at Salisbury last June. Campaigned almost exclusively over six furlongs, he ran third in the Maurice de Gheest, fourth in the G3 Prix de Meautry at Deauville in August and third in the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. at The Curragh in September. Dropped back to five furlongs for his return in the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket, he succumbed by only a short head to a race-fit Frizzante (GB) May 1.
