Switched wide for his challenge as Prospect Park (GB) (Sadler's Wells) struck the front at the eighth pole, he quickened when in the clear to wrest the spoils from that rival in the final stride, in a time just a second off the track record set by the 1986 winner Bering (GB). "Yes, I didn't rejoice like I usually do," the conditioner admitted, referring to his unusually subdued reaction following the race. "But I did look at the heavens again and gave my natural kiss. I think that when you're involved in a sporting event like we were yesterday, which is really special, it does humble you." Zito indicated that the colt will return to his Saratoga base in the next few days and will likely be aimed at the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 28, with a possible prep in the race named after his owner's family. "We'd probably find one race before [the Travers]," he said. "I don't know which one. Maybe the [GI] Whitney H. [Aug. 7]."

Despite a desperate spring, during which he was dogged by a virus, Bago finally made it back to the track and his return was every bit as scintillating as his previous exploits at two. Making an instant impression with conditions scores at Deauville in August and Longchamp in early September, he stamped himself as a colt of the highest order when easily beating Valixir (Ire) in the G3 Prix des Chenes back at Longchamp later that month. Soft ground failed to stop him destroying his rivals in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November, a performance which earned the honor of top rating in the 2003 International Classifications. Settled in fifth by Thierry Gillet off the furious early fractions set by Pearl of Love (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), he quickened to cut down that rival with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining before rushing clear to record a time just one half of a second off the track record. "We had a lot of problems bringing him back this year, but he's back to his best now and showed there that he retains all of his ability," commented conditioner Jonathan Pease. "That was his first try at nine furlongs and he stayed well, so he might go for the G1 Grand Prix de Paris [at Longchamp June 27." Gary Stevens said of Cacique, who finished well in the winner's slipstream, "He's definitely a nice horse for the future. They went very fast and he was taken off his feet, but he finished nicely."

Roger Charlton's barn houses G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner Patavellian (Ire) and Juddmonte Farms' smart duo of Trade Fair (GB) and Three Valleys, but he has another sprinting talent to complicate his race planning now in Avonbridge. Artie Schiller, part of an impressive triumvirate of three-year-old turf performers--including rival Timo and Kitten's Joy--for his sire El Prado (Ire), lulled the field to sleep through lackadaisical fractions, then sprinted home a clear-cut winner. Offered a 3 1/2-month breather before returning to the sod, he looked very sharp taking a secondlevel allowance over a flat mile at Belmont May 1. Jockey Richard Migliore had profuse praise for the colt as 'the Mig' steered him to a 3 3/4-length victory in the Woodlawn S. on the Preakness undercard and the two reunited here under gray New York skies. The pair wound up on the front end when no one else wanted it, and with easy fractions of :26, :51 2/5, and 1:16, they promised to be hard to catch through the stretch. A few taps of the whip was all that was needed as Artie Schiller sped away from the running-on Timo, who was clearly second best. "The [July 10, 1 1/4-mile, GIII] Virginia Derby and the [Aug. 14, 1 1/4-mile, GI] Secretariat S. would be the main objectives," said winning trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "How we get there, I don't know." "It looked like Pesci was the horse to beat, so I wanted to be close enough coming out of the gate," the winning rider explained. Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), fifth as the 6-1 second choice, returned to his bucking and balking at the gate which delayed the start of the Preakness. He was loaded smoothly after the gate crew blindfolded him and was part of the early pace before fading back to fifth. "I don't think the gate was a factor," said trainer Jason Orman, who was further disappointed later in the evening when his beloved Calgary Flames went down in double overtime. "I thought we moved too early, and then, with five-eighths to go, we got into a drive with Smarty Jones. I'm not saying we would have won, but we could have been second or third." The trainer said his runner would get a rest before a decision is made on a return to the races. Rock Hard Ten and Orman are scheduled to return to California today. Eddington (Unbridled), who forced the hand of Smarty Jones turning up the backstretch, finished an even fourth as the 14-1 fourth choice. "He's got plenty of talent and there are a lot of races ahead for him," said trainer Mark Henning. "He'll continue to grow and mature and, hopefully, he will get it together one of these days," he added. Sir Barton S. winner Royal Assault (Kris S.) made up seven lengths in the final eighth of a mile to finish a very respectable third. "That horse ran huge," said trainer Nick Zito. "I know he was beaten nine lengths, but that's a big time horse. That horse is going to get better. He's getting better all the time."

Purge (Pulpit), winner in his penultimate start of the GII Peter Pan S., lost his race before the field hit the track, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. "Purge had a complete meltdown in the paddock," he commented. "Even though it was a cool day, he got over-heated. Then he went to the track and the crowd really got him. He didn't run his race, so it's back to square one." Master David (Grand Slam), third in the Peter Pan, was beaten over 30 lengths into seventh and will get a surface switch in the near future. "I'll try Master David on the turf next," trainer Bobby Frankel said. "He's bred for it and it gives us more options." Out of a Sadler's Wells mare, Master David has been nominated to the GIII Virginia Derby July 10 as well as the Mid-America Triple over the Arlington turf in July and August. Those races also appear to be the goal for Caiman (Malibu Moon), eighth in the Belmont. "He looked perfect in his stall this morning," trainer Angel Medina explained. "I don't know what happened in the race. He was going fine and then he lost all chance. He's a better horse on grass." Tap Dancer (Sword Dance {Ire}) left the Belmont backstretch at 2 a.m. Sunday morning and was bedded down in his Philly Park stall. "We took our shot and I'm glad we did," said trainer Ned Allard. "Now we'll re-group and look over the right spots for him."

RECORDS FALL AT BELMONT Record crowds turned out Saturday to watch Smarty Jones sweep the Triple Crown, and although he was just a length short of collecting the Belmont S., he helped draw 120,139 patrons, up from the previous record total of 103,222 two years ago. The record crowd produced an all-time record for on-track handle at any New York Racing Association track with \$14,430,856 wagered on the 13-race card, while on-track handle for the Belmont S. drew \$4,331,463. Also surpassing the previous mark, handle for the Belmont S. totaled \$63,671,706 and overall handle from all sources also established a new record of \$114,466,087, smashing the previous record of \$103,257,457 from the 2001 Breeders' Cup. "New York fans demonstrated their loyalty and passion for the sport, coming out despite a bad weather forecast, to see Smarty Jones and the Belmont S.," said Barry K Schwartz, NYRAs chairman and CEO. "New York fans are the best in the nation. The enthusiasm of this crowd was spectacular." The day also generated a new North American record for Pick 4 wagering with \$1,739,609 on a pool that featured a \$1-million guarantee.

BELMONT RATING SOAR According to Nielsen Media Research, NBC Sports coverage for Saturday's Belmont S., in which Birdstone defeated heavily favored Smarty Jones, generated the event's highest overnight rating in 27 years. The program scored a 13.4 overnight rating/ 27 shares, the best Belmont overnight since a 15.4/47 rating for Seattle Slew's Triple Crown sweep in 1977. Recorded through the program's 5:30 p.m. to 7:15 p.m. telecast, the rating showed a 29percent increase over last year's 10.4/22. The race segment, from 6:15 p.m. to 7:15 p.m., generated a 15.6/31 overnight rating, an improvement of 32 percent over last year's 11.8/25. "It was America's love affair with Smarty Jones that got us the highest Belmont rating in 27 years," said Dick Ebersol, NBC Universal Sports & Olympics chairman. "I am incredibly proud of the telecast, but more importantly, the opportunity after the race to show what I think was the best display of grace and sportsmanship by both winners and losers that I have ever seen at a sports event."
