Regular rider Robby Albarado has the call as he tries to exact revenge on Perfect Drift (Dynaformer), who defeated former stablemate and Horse of the Year Mineshaft in last year's Foster. Southern Image, the 122-pound highweight, and Peace Rules (Jules), set to carry just one pound less than the favorite, were both scheduled to arrive yesterday at Churchill.

We covered the pedigree of Birdstone following his victory in last year's GI Champagne S., but given his upset victory in the GI Belmont S., it's worth reviewing his background again.

Birdstone had already had a crack at Classic glory this year, and when he lined up for the GI Kentucky Derby, he was bidding to complete a triple for his sire line, as both his sire, <u>Grindstone</u>, and his grandsire, <u>Unbridled</u>, had won the race. Birdstone could only finish a distant eighth at Churchill Downs, but having missed his chance at his own historic triple there, he instead entered the history books by ending Smarty Jones's Triple Crown attempt in the Belmont.

It's probably a reflection on the changing face of the breed, that both Smarty Jones and Birdstone, second and first in the mile-and-a-half Belmont, are descendents of Mr. Prospector through sons who were both most outstanding at a mile. Smarty Jones is by <u>Elusive Quality</u>, a son of <u>Gone West</u>, and Grindstone is a grandson of Fappiano. Grindstone was, with Unbridled's Song, one of two members of the first crop of Unbridled to contest the 1996 GI Kentucky Derby. Unbridled's Song started as favorite and led into the stretch, but as he gave way, it was less-heralded Grindstone who got up on the line to defeat Cavonnier by a nose. **Porter cont. p2**.

Grindstone never ran again after the Derby, and at stud, he and Unbridled's Song have enjoyed widely differing fates, as indicated by their respective stud fees for the 2004 breeding season, with Unbridled's Song being advertised at \$125,000 against the fee of \$5,000



guoted for Grindstone. While nowhere near as fashionable as Unbridled's Song, Grindstone has had his moments, and looked good value for \$5,000, even before Birdstone's classic victory. He got the GIII Nashua S. winner, Ommadon, and one other stakes winner in his first crop. There were no black-type

winners in his second crop, but his third crop yielded Japanese stakes winner Ekolu Place, U.S. graded scorer Smooth Maneuvers and listed winner Heirloom Diamond. Birdstone is from his fourth crop.

Birdstone is not the first classic winner produced by his dam, Dear Birdie, as she is also dam of Bird Town, champion three-year-old filly of 2003 and heroine of the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Acorn S. Remarkably, both Birdstone, and Bird Town (from the first crop of Cape Town) are the first Grade I winners for their respective sires. For a mare who has achieved this very unusual feat, Dear Birdie had actually been rather slow to make her mark. She had produced six previous foals, all winners, but none earners of black-type until Mountain Bird, her foal of 1998 by Mt. Livermore, put in an appearance. Mountain Bird never won a black-type event, but she did take second in the 2001 GII Stonerside Beaumont S. Following the birth of Mountain Bird, Dear Birdie produced a dead foal in 1999, and then in consecutive years bore Bird Town and Birdstone.

On the track, Dear Birdie, a daughter of Storm Bird, won twice and finished second in the "white type" Senorita S. She is a half sister to Noactor, a Theatrical colt who took Aqueduct's Bowl Game S. at two and is out of Hush Dear, a long-winded turf mare, who took two runnings of the GII Long Island H., consecutive renewals of the GII Diana H. and the GII Tidal H.

By the Prince John stallion Silent Screen out of the Ashland S. winner You All (a daughter of Nashua), Hush Dear was bred on a version of the very successful Princequillo/Nasrullah cross. Go back one more generation and we come to a third straight stakes-winning mare in Honey Dear, heroine of the New York H. Dear Birdie's fifth dam, Boys I'm It, is a three-parts-sister to the breed-shaping broodmare sire Blue Larkspur.

As mentioned, Bird Town and Birdstone are both by Mr. Prospector-line stallions. They thus represent the tremendously successful cross of Mr. Prospector-line sires over Storm Bird mares, which also produced a radically different graded-stakes winner on the Belmont undercard when Speightstown (Gone West--Silken Cat by Storm Cat) took the GII True North Breeders' Cup H. in 1:08. Bird Town is a granddaughter of Seeking the Gold, a horse who himself has at least five stakes winners out of mares by Storm Bird and his son Storm Cat, including Champion Flanders. The Unbridled branch of the Mr. Prospector-line has a previous Grade I wnner in the shape of Buddha, the GI Wood Memorial S. winner, who is by Unbridled's Song out of a a Storm Cat mare.

It's no surprise that Dear Birdie has turned out to be particularly well-suited by Mr. Prospector-line stallions. In addition to being a daughter of Storm Bird, she also has a particularly good fit for Mr. Prospector in the pedigree of her granddam, You All. This is particularly clear when we compare the pedigree of Mr. Prospector's dam, Gold Digger, with You All. Gold Digger and You All are both by Nashua, and while Gold Digger is out of a mare by Count Fleet, You All is out of a mare by a son of Count Fleet. Going back one more generation, Gold Digger's granddam is by Bull Dog out of a Blue Larkspur mare, and You All's granddam is by a son of Bull Dogout of Boys I'm It, who we noted above as a three-parts-sister to Blue Larkspur, so at four generations, Gold Digger and You All are about seven-eighths relatives. Bird Town has the close relatives 4 x 3 and Birdstone 5 x 3.

UNBRIDLED DISAPPOINTMENT

For the sixth time in the last eight years, the Triple Crown was within the grasp of a dual Classic winner; for the sixth time, the Crown went unclaimed. Certain pedigree patterns may be emerging, a lot to do with Mr. Prospector and his most important son so far--in that he should be classified as a separate branch--Fappiano.

For the last three years, the would-be Triple Crown winner has been a Mr. Prospector-line colt: War Emblem, by Our Emblem, in 2002; Funny Cide, by Forty Niner's son, **Distorted Humor**, in 2003; and Smarty Jones, by Gone West's son, Elusive Quality, this year. For the last two years, and for three of the six failed assaults on the Triple Crown since 1997, the 'stopper' has been by a sire tracing to Fappiano: Victory Gallop (by Cryptoclearance) foiled Real Quiet (by Fappiano's son, Quiet American) in 1998; Empire Maker (by Unbridled) stopped Funny Cide last year; and, of course, Birdstone, by Unbridled's Derby-winning son Grindstone, was the 36-1 shock winner this year. For the last three years, the Derby and Preakness winners have been sired by horses who didn't excel past a mile themselves; 10-furlong Classic horses feature more as the sires of Belmont winners these days. Could be a trend.

What was different this year was the massive sentiment, public and professional, behind Smarty Jones. Whatever claims are made about Triple Crown contenders, there is a feeling that a Triple Crown winner now should be deserving. War Emblem was never going to get the trip in the Belmont; Funny Cide may have been a New York-bred, but he was also a gelding. But Smarty Jones was deserving, not because he was the "people's horse," not because he was owned and bred by an ex-Ford dealer who is a small Pennsylvania breeder, not even because the owners' trainer and advisor, Bob Camac, and his wife were tragically murdered.

LEADING SIRE


The momentum was behind Smarty Jones for one reason only: that devestating turn of foot he displayed in powering away in the last furlong of the Preakness. Yes, all those things are good stories, but at the end of the day, there is only one story that really matters in horse racing: how good was that horse? Smarty Jones's 118 in the Preakness is the equal fastest Beyer 'fig' recorded in a Triple Crown race since they started reporting the figures in print in 1992 (Silver Charm's 1997 Preakness was also a 118). He won by a record margin, and even if the opposition was just average, he had to be really good to draw off like that. That's why myself and others included Smarty Jones in the same sentence as Secretariat, Seattle Slew, and Affirmed: he is clearly an exceptionally good horse at up to 10 furlongs--keeping in mind that Birdstone's fig in winning the Belmont was only 101, and that Smarty Jones staggered home the last quarter in :27 seconds. All is not lost, though. In 1964, a very good colt who had won the Kentucky Derby in then-record time, and then the Preakness, could only finish third to Quadrangle in the Belmont. He still managed to make an impact on the breed, though, later on. His name was Northern Dancer.

Until right at the end of 2002, when Elusive City was disqualified from his Richmond S. win, Elusive Quality was the leading freshman sire of what has turned out to be a very powerful group of young sires. Distorted Humor was ultimately awarded the title, and Elusive Quality dropped to third, behind also Awesome Again (sire of Toccet). The last time we ran the Top 30 of this group of North American sires with first foals being four-year-olds of 2004 ('Third-crop' sires, meaning their third crop of two-year-olds is ready to race, i.e. they've had two crops of three-year-olds now), <u>Grand Slam</u> had worked his way to the top, followed by Distorted Humor, <u>Tale of the Cat</u>, and Elusive Quality. *(cont. p4)*

Considering Smarty Jones has earned \$6,704,500 since then (it would have been another \$5.4 million had he stayed the Belmont trip), you won't be surprised to see that Elusive Quality is now back on top, maybe for good. Maybe not. Here's who we've got: group leader Elusive Quality had a dual Classic winner in his second crop. Current group number three Distorted Humor had a dual Classic winner in his first crop. Current number four Tale of the Cat was North America's leading sire of two-year-olds in 2003. And number two Grand Slam is so good he leads this group in number of graded SW (six), total number of stakes horses (34), and total number of races won (226) in spite of not having sired a Classic winner--though he did have last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint winner, Cajun Beat.

No fewer than nine of these sires have sired four or more GSWs in their first two crops, which I would say is a pretty impressive achievement. What a tribute to Mill Ridge's Gone West that he is the sire of the top two sires in this important sire group: Elusive Quality leads in progeny earnings and total stakes winners (15); Grand Slam leads, as noted, in number of graded stakes winners and number of stakes horses. The others from this sire group with four or more GSWs include the Deputy Minister sons Awesome Again and Touch Gold (Deputy Commander is fifth on the money list, though Ten Most Wanted is his only GSW so far); new Japanese sires Wild Rush and Coronado's Quest; and Stormy Atlantic, whose performances suggest he is no one-horse wonder, but is consistently siring class.

Euro Classics: It's Still Cape Cross

Just a few weeks ago, we declared Cape Cross the biggest winner on a weekend which saw Classics run in Kentucky and Newmarket, even though he had no Classic winners. Consider that rectified. But before discussing that, what a great tribute to Ballymacoll Stud, and the late Lord Weinstock, his son Simon, who tragically died so young before him, and their long-time stud manager, Peter Reynolds, that the two co-favorites for the Epsom Derby were both bred by Ballymacoll. It was also great for the underrated Dante S. (how can that not be a Group 1?) that the 1-2-3 in the Dante came back to run 1-2-3 in the Derby.

I remember that I was at Longchamp, on another mission entirely, on that day in 1992 when North Light's dam, Sought Out, ran for the first time in the Prix du Cadran. Trained by the wily Hammond, I thought she was the bet of the day. She led every step of the way, over 2 1/2 miles on heavy ground. So staying wasn't an issue for North Light last weekend. The Epsom Derby looked a decent race, probably better than the French version. Trainer Pascal Bary has been having a slow year, as has his underrated stable jock Thierry Thulliez, so the trainer's fifth French Derby win, and owner Jean-Louis Bouchard's fourth, compliments of Blue Canari (by top German sire Acatenango), came as kind of a surprise to everybody. One of the top two favorites, Millemix, had died suddenly, and the other, Voix du Nord, was injured on the eve of the race. So nobody was claiming it was a vintage renewal, but the winners were very happy to collect in any case.

The two most impressive performances of the weekend belonged to Epsom Oaks winner Ouija Board, and Bago (by Nashwan), last year's top-rated two-year-old in Europe, who had to miss the Classics but returned with an impressive three-length score in the G1 Prix Jean Prat over nine furlongs. For her part, Ouija Board gave Cape Cross his first Classic winner for real--and how. She murdered her field, reporting home by seven lengths with jockey Fallon almost shaking his head in disbelief, she won so easily. This win finally propels Cape Cross past Fasliyev as Europe's leading second-crop sire (oldest are three-year-olds of 2004) by cumulative progeny earnings. Cape Cross now has eight stakes winners (five this year, plus another four stakes-placed), passing Fasliyev, with seven (just one so far this year).

<u>Orpen</u>, sire of the French 1000 Guineas winner Torrestrella, is now comfortably third in cumulative progeny earnings, while Dr. Fong, sire of G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Ask For the Moon, is edging out Daggers Drawn for fourth spot. Daylami has just slipped into sixth, just ahead of Gold Away.

From the Burgeoning 'What Were You Thinking?' File

I leave the country for two weeks, and what happens? When I left, we were down to zero TV racing channels. Now we'll have two next week when the new version of At The Races starts showing British as well as American racing. There were two satellite channels (so if you're in a city, with cable, it was one or none) showing racing, yet neither of them could manage to show the Belmont. Wait for this: the *Racing Post* put in its box that the Belmont was to be shown on the new racing channel (Sky 425). So we dutifully turn this on, except that at about 9 p.m. they started showing 'Live ... Greyhound Racing from America,' and they just kept on showing it all the way past the time the Belmont was run. Nobody on 425 in the afternoon coverage referred to them showing or not showing the Belmont. They did do a preview of the race for about 15 minutes on satellite channel 415, but about the time the horses loaded, the screen went into a pattern and stayed like that until well after the race; some message like 'technical fault' appeared on the screen, like in 1960. What a joke. Furthermore, the BBC, which was televising the Oaks and Derby from Epsom on Friday and Saturday, never referred to the Belmont, as far as I heard. This was the biggest story in American racing in years, and yet nobody could manage to find a way to show it or even talk about it in Britain. What a missed opportunity. Are we all on the same side, or not?

And that's not all. The first race of the two-day Epsom meet, televised by the BBC on Friday, was the G2 Temple S., run over five furlongs. The stalls handlers had announced they were taking industrial action and not working that race, so it was begun with what is called a 'flip' start, like they use in jump racing. The second favorite whipped around as the tapes went up, and never ran a vard; some bookmakers even treated him as a non-runner, which is almost unprecedented in bookmaking annals. Another joke. Now, would you like me to tell you why the stalls handlers are taking industrial action? If I have the story straight, it basically boils down to permanent jobs being lost because the racecourses are too cheap to buy their own sets of starting stalls each. That's right; at the moment, as I understand it, sets of stalls get shipped around from track to track--an absurd situation! The stalls handlers in this country already have to deal with horses who are very unschooled compared to American horses. I don't care how much it costs, it's ludicrous that every racetrack isn't required to maintain their own sets of starting stalls.

But Praise for Pennsylvania

The entire broadcast received a rating of 11.3 making it the second most watched sporting event of 2004, behind only the Super Bowl and ahead of events such as the NCAA Tournament finale in April, the Masters golf tournament, in which Phil Mickelson won his first major, and this past Sunday night's broadcast of game one of the NBA finals between the Pistons and the Lakers. Saturday's race provided the best overall ratings since Pleasant Colony's failed Triple Crown bid in 1981. Overall, NBC's coverage of the Triple Crown earned a national rating of 8.3/20, up by 22 percent versus 2003 and the highest ratings for the series since 1989.
