AZERI POINTED FOR PHIPPS

After finishing a dismal eighth against the boys in the GI Metropolitan H. Memorial Day, 2002 Horse of the



Year **Azeri** (Jade Hunter) will be pointed to the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont June 19, according to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "Obviously, she came out of the race very well," Lukas told *Daily Racing Form*. "Right now the [Phipps] is the only Grade I out there, and the particulars of the race are right. All the positives are there

for a filly like this. We wouldn't want to drop her to a Grade two and go somewhere [too far] out of town." The classy mare earned a bullet for a five-furlong 1:00 breeze at Churchill Wednesday. Jockey Pat Day, who replaced Mike Smith in the Met Mile, will retain the mount. Others expected for the Phipps are 2002 champion filly **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat), defending Phipps victress **Sightseek** (Distant View) and GI Personal Ensign H. winner **Passing Shot** (A.P. Indy).

QUEEN ANNE OUT OF RHYTHM

Cheveley Park's Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo) has officially been ruled out of Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. The chestnut, who tallied three Group 1 wins last year, opened her four-year-old campaign with a victory in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. May 15, but spiked a fever after that race and has been given some time to recover by trainer Sir Michael Stoute. A total of 18 runners remained in the Queen Anne entries at the five-day stage, including Breeders' Cup Mile heroine Six Perfections (Fr) (Celtic Swing {GB}), French Classic winner Nebraska Tornado (Storm Cat), the Godolphin trio of Firebreak (GB) (Charnwood Forest {Ire}), Lateen Sails (GB) (Elmaamul) and Refuse to Bend (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), and Stoute trainee Arakan (Nureyev). The international flavour of the race is further spiced by the presence of G1 Hong Kong Mile runner-up Bowman's **Crossing (Ire)** (Dolphin Street {Fr}). "Bowman's Crossing has settled in well and I am very happy with his work," his Hong Kong-based trainer David Oughton told PA Sport. "Realistically, I think he is in at the deep end, but he deserves to win a big race and this could be it."



MILLION AND BEVERLY D. NOMINEES

Sulamani (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}), last year's GI Arlington Million winner via disgualification, heads a group of 97 nominees to this summer's Aug. 14 renewal. Godolphin's charge seeks to be the first back-to-back winner in the event's 21-year history. The legendary John Henry is the only two-time Million winner to date, capturing the inaugural running in 1981 and repeating that effort three years later. Impressive winner of the GI Manhattan H. on Belmont S. day, Meteor Storm (GB) (Bigstone {Ire}), is another highly regarded nominee. Crimson Palace (SAf) (Elliodor {Fr}), who has not lost a race when facing members of her own sex during the last two years of her career overseas, is joined by Intercontinental (GB) (Danehill) to top a list of 76 filies and mares nominated to the GI \$750,000 Beverly D. Aug. 14. The latter was last seen notching the GII Just a Game Breeders' Cup H. at Belmont June 5.

TAKING A STAND

A maximum of 22 will line up for the five-furlong G2 King's Stand S. Tuesday at Royal Ascot, with Hong Kong challenger Cape of Good Hope (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) a notable hopeful at the confirmation stage. Placed behind Hong Kong champion speedster Silent Witness (Aus) in his three most recent starts, he is also entered in next Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. "I entered Cape of Good Hope for both sprints, but I think he will run in the King's Stand," trainer David Oughton told PA Sport. "I have also put him in the [G1] July Cup and, if he acquits himself well at Ascot, he could well run at Newmarket too. Mick Kinane has ridden him in Hong Kong and knows him well and will ride next week." The race promises to be a mouthwatering affair with the home defense led by last season's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye winner Patavellian (Ire) (Machiavellian), recent G2 Prix du Gros-Chene victor Avonbridge (GB) (Averti {Ire}) and impressive sophomore sprinter Boogie Street (GB) (Compton Place {GB}). PALACE ASPIRANTS Unbeaten Listed Surrey S. winner Madid (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) has been supplemented, at a cost of £18,000, to an already exciting field for the one-mile G1 St. James's Palace S. at yesterday's confirmation stage. He will bear the same Sheikh Hamdan blue and white colors as G1 2000 Guineas hero Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}). The remaining 15 entries include G1 Irish 2000 Guineas one-two Bachelor Duke (Miswaki) and Azamour (Ire) (Night Shift), G1 2000 Guineas runner-up Snow Ridge (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), G2 German 2000 Guineas victor Brunel (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) as well as G1 French 2000 Guineas unfortunates Antonius Pius (Danzig) and Diamond Green (Fr) (Green Desert).

Andre Fabre's **Grey Lilas (Ire)** (Danehill), runner-up in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 16, was one of two fillies added, along with **Barancella** (**Fr**) (Acatenango {Ger}), to this Sunday's field for the G1 Prix de Diane-Hermes at Chantilly after yesterday's declaration stage. Grey Lilas is set to renew rivalry with Pouliches heroine **Torrestrella (Ire)** (Orpen). There will be a maximum of three foreign raiders; Clive Brittain's **Menhoubah** (Dixieland Band), G1 Irish 1000 Guineas runner-up **Alexander Goldrun (Ire)** (Gold Away {Ire}) and **Baraka (Ire)** (Danehill), trained by Jim Bolger and Aidan O'Brien respectively.



Clock Stopper Possible for Calder's Summit of Speed:

Overbrook Farm's **Clock Stopper** (Gilded Time), an impressive six-furlong allowance winner in 1:08 3/5 at Churchill Wednesday, may be seen next in the GIII Smile Sprint H. July 10, part of Calder's Summit of Speed. The race was Clock Stopper's second since returning to training following the removal of an ankle chip. "He was impressive," trainer Dallas Stewart said of the effort. "I don't think he could run much faster than he's run. I just want to keep him happy and he's okay as long as he keeps running hard like that." The four-year-old finished second, beaten 3/4 of a length behind Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Cajun Beat in the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint Sept. 13, before ending his sophomore campaign with a win in Keeneland's Perryville S. Oct. 9.

Japanese Filly Oaks Bound:

Teruya Yoshida Shadai Farm's homebred Dance in the Mood (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), a winner of four of five starts and \$1,773,565 while racing in Japan, has accepted an invitation to contest the \$750,000 GI American Oaks at Hollywood July 3. The Japanese 1000 Guineas victress was last seen finishing fourth as the favorite in the Japanese Oaks May 23. "Mr. Yoshida is a true sportsman," Hollywood Park racing secretary Martin Panza said. "He wants to race his horses outside of Japan and not everyone is willing to do that. Hopefully this will open the door to more Japanese horses racing at Hollywood Park in the future." A daughter of the recently deceased Dancing Key (Nijinsky II), Dance in the Mood is a full sister to dual Japanese champion Dance Partner (Jpn) and prominent Japanese sire Dance in the Dark (Jpn). The 11-year-old stallion stands at Shadai Farm and is responsible for Jpn-G1 Yasuda Kinen winner Tsurumaru Boy (Jpn).


