(Efisio {GB}) can emerge from the mile's end with her record intact. She has already broken all the rules. The winner of the five-furlong G3 Queen Mary S. at this meeting 12 months ago, she stretched her speed out over Newmarket's Rowley Mile to claim 1000 Guineas glory May 2. Not content with that feat, the filly--famed for the unique, sprawling action of her forelegs-went boldly where none other had been before when following up in the Irish equivalent at The Curragh May 23. With half of this field already accounted for in either Clas-

sic, she appears to have the race at her mercy, despite the doubts as to her effectiveness trying one turn for the first time. "She's very well and in great form," conditioner Mark Johnston commented. "We hope she can remain in the same form and that that's all it takes. Before the Guineas they said she wouldn't stay a mile and before the Irish Guineas it was that she wouldn't stay a mile on the stiffer track. Now they are saying she won't go around the bend at Ascot. I don't know why she shouldn't as she goes round a bend fine at home and I don't know why it should be any different at Ascot." #### The Road to Gold...

Papineau (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) did not look a stayer in the making for Andre Fabre when prepping for the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club with a win in the Listed Prix de l'Avre at Longchamp last May. He returned with an injury after finishing fifth in the Chantilly Classic the following month, but he showed the benefit of his time out when emerging victorious first time in the Godolphin silks in a conditions race at Goodwood May 19. He rewarded the experiment of an extended trip with a 1½length defeat of last year's champ Mr Dinos (Ire) (Desert King {Ire}) in the G2 Henry II S., when in receipt of seven pounds. Finding the extra improvement here, his pace proved too much for that rival in the straight, and even the removal of Westerner's now infamous ear plugs could not stop the chestnut's march to glory. "He's a fantastic horse with so much class and everything fell right," commented jockey Frankie Dettori. "I got on the tail of Westerner, and when I asked him, he picked up straight away like a real good horse. When you've got class you can get away with staying 2 1/2 miles. He's so big and hits the ground so heavily, but he doesn't mind fast ground." Simon Crisford, Godolphin manager, added, "The G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. [at Ascot July 24] is definitely a possible. We always felt we were taking a big risk in running here and feel he is more of a one-and-a-half-mile horse. He's in lots of races over that trip, including the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 3]."

#### Gallant in Defeat...

Owner Alec Wildenstein was not downhearted by the defeat of runner-up Westerner (GB) (Danehill). "The ground was a bit hard for him and unfortunately, he found himself in front a bit too soon," he said. "He's going to run over a mile and a half now and be aimed at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 3]." Joe Fanning described the third-placed Darasim (Ire) (Kahyasi {Ire}) as having "ran a blinder," adding, "It was a very fast pace and he just emptied a little bit in the straight, but he kept going all the way to the line." Punctilious entered the G1 Epsom Oaks with major claims, but could only finish third behind the brilliant winner Ouija Board (GB). She had previously finished third in the G1 Fillies' Mile at this track in September and taken the G3 Musidora S. on her return at York May 11, but joined a long list of performers who found the undulations of Epsom against her June 4. Settled into the steady early rhythm of the race by Frankie Dettori, she tracked Sahool and Richard Hills throughout before joining battle with that rival on the turn into the straight. Getting on top with quarter of a mile remaining, she was pushed out to assert without recourse to the whip. "She is very strong and tough, but has a mind of her own," her rider explained. "I have to try and galvanise her the way she wants and that means not using the whip as she doesn't like it." Trainer Saeed bin Suroor, capturing his second renewal after Bahr (GB) also bettered her Oaks placing in 1998, added, "She didn't handle the track at Epsom, but had come back well and was working very well, seeming happy and fresh. She showed a good turn of foot at the end, but Frankie said there was something left in the tank." While the runnerup and fourth, New Morning (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), will be stepped up in trip for the G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster Sept. 8, Quiff has the more ambitious target of the G1 Irish Oaks ahead at The Curragh July 18. Allowed to stride past that rival at the quarter pole, he looked to have the contest sewn up, but was forced to fight up the hill as Mystical Land challenged late. "That's a big relief," said winning trainer Jeremy Noseda. "He needs a lead for a bit longer and Eddie's said he's just idled a bit. We'll go for it this year as he is a very well developed horse and has an advantage, so we'll campaign him hard and worry about next year at the end." Trainer John Gosden said of the runner-up, "We gave him a bit of a fright, but I'd like to meet him again over six [furlongs]. He could go for the G2 July S. [at Newmarket July 7]." 

If there are any holes in the favorite, Red Bloom and Illustrious Miss could capitalise. The former, who emanates from the Sir Michael Stoute yard responsible for four past winners, beat Sundrop (Jpn) and yesterday's G2 Ribblesdale S. heroine Punctilious (GB) in the G1 Fillies' Mile over course and distance in October. Jockey Kieren Fallon is convinced she "wasn't herself" when 1 3/4 lengths fourth to Attraction in the Newmarket Classic last time May 2. "Red Bloom is a very good filly and [Newmarket] wasn't her run," he said. "A few of our horses just had the virus and one thing and another. If she was right, I think she would have been right there in the finish." Illustrious Miss booked her ticket to the Curragh Classic by beating subsequent stakes winners Gonfilia (Ger) and Golden Nun (GB) in the G3 Chartwell S. at Lingfield May 8. She stayed on from the rear to finish three-lengths third behind Attraction there, with Kinnaird and Secret Charm back in fourth and fifth, respectively. That form was made to look even better when the runner-up Alexander Goldrun (Ire) ran fourth in Sunday's G1 Prix de Diane.

This contest has an impoverished feel this year after G1 Epsom Derby runner-up Rule of Law was ruled out due to a low-grade upper respiratory infection. Doubts also surround the participation of African Dream, whose connections have always stated that he needs softer ground than is prevalent this week. If the gelding were to take part, he holds pole position in continuing the single-handed renaissance of the career of his trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam, who claimed him for just £20,000 at Lingfield in February. Since that day he has made meteoric progress, beating subsequent G3 Chester Vase winner Red Lancer (GB) and the smart Gatwick (Ire) in a Newbury handicap Apr. 16, before following up in the G3 Classic Trial at Sandown Apr. 23 and G3 Dee S. at Chester last time May 7. Trainer Marcus Tregoning won this event 12 months ago with High Accolade (GB) and is represented by Elshadi (GB), who beat only one home in the Epsom Classic on his seasonal reappearance. That form was some way below his best as a two-year-old, when he had beaten the Derby third Let the Lion Roar (GB) in a Newbury conditions event in September. "Hopefully, he'll run a much better race than last time," Tregoning told PA Sport yesterday. "Some horses don't act at Epsom and he absolutely hated it. He seems in fine form and we know he goes on fast ground." Aidan O'Brien saddles Five Dynasties, who was eighth in the June 6 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly. "He's in good form," he told PA Sport. "He ran well in France and is improving and starting to get it together."

There was a lot to like about the way Two Miles West dominated a fast-ground Leopardstown maiden on his debut just nine days ago and he warrants respect pitched into the deep end here. Godolphin, who captured this in 2002 with Mamool (Ire), are represented by Duke of Venice this time. A conditions-race winner over a mile at Doncaster May 3, he split the useful Hazyview (GB) and Castleton (GB) when runner-up in the Listed Fairway S. at Newmarket last time May 22. Red Lancer, penalised for his success in the G3 Chester Vase May 6, finished third in the Listed Predominate S. at Goodwood last time May 18. Tamarillo took the UAE Oaks at Nad al Sheba Mar. 11 before finishing sixth in the G2 UAE Derby back at that track Mar. 27. She performed with credit when fifth in the G1 Oaks d'Italia in Milan last time May 23 and will not lack for courage over this extended trip.

**SMARTY JONES MAY RETURN IN 2005 Smarty** 

Jones (Elusive Quality) may return to competition as a four-year-old in an effort to cement his star status, according to Pat and Roy Chapman Thursday. "An awful lot of fans love Smarty and some may have doubts about his ability [following a length loss to Birdstone in the Belmont S.]," Pat Chapman told the Associated Press. "We don't want him to go out that way. We want him to go out the hero that he is, and if it takes racing when he's a four-year-old, I hope he will be able to do that." The Chapmans also indicated that they are close to making a final decision on where Smarty Jones will stand after his retirement. Contrary to earlier reports, Chapman said that the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. winner may make his next start in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Aug. 8, although trainer John Servis has yet to finalize the colt's remaining 2004 schedule. The GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 6 has already been earmarked for Smarty Jones, as has the Oct. 2 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park and the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Lone Star Oct. 30.

ECLIPSE NEXT FOR RAKTI Gary Tanaka's Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent) looks set to continue on the trail for the BHB Summer Triple Crown according to conditioner Michael Jarvis. Following his two-length defeat of Powerscourt (GB) in Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, the five-year-old is to be aimed at the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 3 before attempting the £1million bonus in the G1 International S. at York Aug. 17. "We were delighted with him as he has become much more relaxed this spring," he said yesterday. "The adrenalin was flowing yesterday and he pulled rather hard and this is why we think he can win a top mile race, but there is the big carrot of the bonus dangling, so he'll go for the Eclipse and International."

#### **NJ Racing Dates Change:**

There has been a change in the New Jersey racing dates for 2004. The New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which operates Monmouth and the Meadowlands, had applied for 141 days of Thoroughbred racing for this year. But, because telephone account wagering and off-track betting have yet to become reality, the NJSEA asked the New Jersey Racing Commission for permission to cut the calendar to 120 days, and the Commission has approved the request. The Monmouth meet will run 87 days, closing Sept. 26. The Meadowlands, set to present 33 programs this fall, will be open Oct. 1 through Nov. 13. Similar schedules will be in place for 2005 and 2006, but, as a date with the Breeders' Cup looms more and more likely, the NJSEA has requested a Labor Day weekend closing for the 2007 Monmouth meet. The early closing will give the Monmouth turf course the chance to rejuvenate prior to the Breeders' Cup, which, if the deal goes through, will be held in late October or early November. Racing will be held at the Meadowlands Sept. 7-Nov. 10, 2007.

#### **Elliott Fires Agent:**

Jockey Stewart Elliott has fired his agent of six years, Ray Lopez, and hired Joe Rosen to handle his book. Rosen also books mounts for jockey Chuck Lopez. Together, Elliott and Ray Lopez accounted for twothirds of the Triple Crown with Smarty Jones and four straight riding titles at Philadelphia Park. A regular on the Monmouth Park circuit for the first time since 1999, Elliott is off to a great start, sitting second in the 2004 standings behind perennial champ Joe Bravo. But the 39-year-old reinsman said Wednesday, "It was just time for a change. Ray and I did well together and I wish him all the best." Lopez was blind sided by the move. "I have had quite a few calls from people asking me, 'how is this possible?" Lopez said yesterday. "I have no idea. My record speaks for itself.
