she proved it categorically in yesterday's G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot. After creating history when completing a 1000 Guineas double, expectations were riding high and conditioner Mark Johnston described the prerace pressure as "unbearable." The 6-4 pick eased that burden by leading from the outset and extending her advantage with adept handling of the tight turn

into the straight. Always in complete control, the margin of victory is no measure of her superiority as she just missed Russian Rhythm's record time. "To win it as easily as she did is amazing--she keeps raising the bar and I don't know what you can compare it with," her proud owner-breeder commented.

### THE NAME'S BOND

Monsieur Bond (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) bids to cement his position among Europe's sprinting elite in today's G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot. The chest-

nut bested **Steenberg (Ire)** (Flying Spur {Aus}) by an impressive seven lengths in the G3 Gladness S. over The Curragh's seven furlongs Apr. 4 and had 1½ lengths on that rival when dropped to six for the G2 Duke of York S. May 11. But he also proved he stayed a mile when sixth in the 2003 G1 2000 Guineas, and that stamina will benefit him over this stiff six. "We are going there all guns blazing and we are now just hoping for a bit of luck," trainer Bryan Smart told *PA Sport*. "I couldn't have been more

## An Easy Eight...

Her conformation meant she could not go to the sales, so Attraction was sent to the Johnstons' Middleham yard in the hope that she would win one race. Eight victories later, she continues to astound the Duke, who described her achievements as "beyond dreams" and who arguably would have just settled for her success in last year's G3 Queen Mary S. at this meeting. That was the tip of the iceberg, having added the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket last July before bouncing back from a layoff to become the first filly to win the Newmarket and Curragh mile Classics. "She's something else," explained jockey Kevin Darley. "She dishes, but is a natural athlete and you can't feel it when you are on her. You just throw the reins at her and she takes the race by the scruff of the neck. She got a bit keen running up the hill today, but pricked her ears and got straight for the turn and it was all over. People keep saying she's a freak and she keeps breaking all the records and how far can she go?" Her trainer expressed "relief" after concerns about the coughing in his yard beforehand. "Nothing but winning would do and with the cloud over the yard I just felt this morning that if she was 100 per cent she would win and if she wasn't it would be my fault," he said. "It looked a copybook of her previous two runs, particularly in Ireland, and when she turned for home I could see she hadn't even started going yet." Attraction will now take on the older horses, but may be kept to her own sex for the meantime. "The next dream is taking on the older horses, but I think we might take on the older fillies in the G1 Falmouth S. [at Newmarket July 6] before we take on the colts." Conditioner Mick Channon may also aim the runner-up at that race. "We probably won't see another like the winner in our lifetime," he added. "She has already kicked our ass three times, but we've got to keep running up against her and hope one day we get lucky and beat her." Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson said of Red Bloom (GB) (Selkirk), "She hasn't had the easiest preparation, but let's take nothing away from the winner. We might now look at stepping her up in trip."

A pair of scratches weakened this contest considerably, but Five Dynasties took full advantage to record a career best. Fourth in the G2 Beresford S. at The Curragh in October, he disappointed on his return when a distant third behind Percussionist (Ire) on heavy ground in the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial May 8. He encountered a faster surface in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly last time June 6 and put up an improved performance when beaten just five lengths in eighth behind Blue Canari (Fr). Always traveling easily under a confident Jamie Spencer here, he arrived at the head of affairs full of run at the quarter pole, quickened decisively and powered clear for a convincing score. "His disappointment first time was probably a combination of fitness and hating the soft ground," commented conditioner Aidan O'Brien, who has a quick return to the track in mind in next Sunday's G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh. As with stable companion Papineau (GB) in Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup, Duke of Venice was entering unknown territory as he stepped up to two miles here. He earned a supplementary for the G1 Dewhurst S. with a 13-length maiden score at Sandown in September, but disappointed when only 10th in that Newmarket contest the following month. He returned to win a one mile conditions event at Doncaster May 3 before finishing runner-up to Hazyview (GB) in the 10-furlong Listed Fairway S. back at Newmarket last time May 22. Switched off in mid-division throughout these early stages by Frankie Dettori, he joined Two Miles West traveling easily at the quarter pole before quickening away from that rival soon after, with his jockey able to ease down near the line. "There was a doubt about him staying on pedigree, but he relaxed so well," explained Dettori. "When I pressed the button he took off and it was a good performance."

Last year she had the mighty Choisir (Aus) to contend with, but Airwave may not find anything of his calibre lurking among this field. She entered this contest a warm order 12 months ago off the back of successes in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at two and in the G2 Temple S. at Sandown on her sophomore bow, but succumbed by a half length to the Australian giant. Perhaps suffering battle scars from that effort, she failed to score for the remainder of her campaign, but did manage third placings in the G1 July Cup and G1 Haydock Sprint Cup in September. She reportedly needed the outing when sixth in the Duke of York last time and is poised for her big moment. **Avonbridge** has developed into a smart sprinter, having finished a short-head runner-up in the G3 Palace House S. at Newmarket May 1 before beating Porlezza (Fr), with Tuesday's G2 King's Stand S. winner The Tatling (Ire) back in fourth, in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly June 6. While Cape of Good Hope (GB) was only second on Tuesday, he warrants respect turned out again so quickly.

Trained by Andre Fabre last term, Doyen outclassed the subsequent dual group two scorer Policy Maker (Ire) in the G3 Prix du Lys at Longchamp in June before giving best to Dalakhani (Ire) when runner-up in the G2 Prix Niel back at that track in September. He had only that rival, Mubtaker and High Chaparral (Ire) ahead of him when fourth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe back there the following month before being transferred to Godolphin. Despite a slow spring, he came right in time for the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom last time June 4, where he finished 1 3/4 lengths behind Warrsan (Ire) in second despite suffering a troubled trip. High Accolade (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) finished just a short head behind Doyen in fourth at Epsom and returns to his beloved Ascot. This track was the scene of his finest moments at three, when winning the G2 King Edward VII S. in June and G3 Cumberland Lodge S. in September, having proved he could be a force elsewhere when finishing runner-up in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster. Both may have most to fear from last year's G1 Irish St Leger runner-up Gamut, who is penalised for his 1 1/4length defeat of Systematic in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket last time May 2.



"It is such a shame that we had to put down Wavering Monarch, because he was a home product through and through, and excelled as both a sire and a broodmare sire," said farm spokesman David

Greathouse. "He will be sorely missed." Bred and raced by Glencrest, the bay didn't race at two, but quickly blossomed at three, winning the GI Haskell Invitational H., the GII Ak-Sar-Ben Omaha Gold Cup and the Jefferson Cup as well as finishing third in the GI Blue Grass S. At four, he added the GI San Fernando S. to his laurels as well as a second in the GI Charles H. Strub S. and a third in the GI Santa Anita H. He retired with a record of 13-6-1-3 and earnings of \$466,773. Since entering stud in 1984, Wavering Monarch has sired 38 stakes winners to date, including 1995 Eclipse Champion Two-Year-Old Maria's Mon, now a successful sire; and 1989 Canadian Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Wavering Girl. His daughters have produced 27 stakes winners to date, headed by champion and classic winner Prairie Bayou. Wavering Monarch will be buried at Glencrest Farm.

HIGHEST EUTHANISED Godolphin's Highest (Ire) (Selkirk) has been euthanised after rupturing his suspensory ligament during Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup. Formerly trained by Sir Michael Stoute, he was purchased by Godolphin after finishing runner-up in the 2002 G1 St Leger at Doncaster. Among his finest efforts in the royal blue came when second in last year's G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom. He had finished lame when seventh behind stable companion Papineau (GB) in the marathon contest. "Unfortunately, Highest had to be put down because of a ruptured suspensory," explained Racing Manager Simon Crisford yesterday.





#### Candy Ride Nears Return to Training:

Last seen winning the GI Pacific Classic over Medaglia d' Oro in track record time last summer, the undefeated Candy Ride (Arg) (Ride the Rails) could return to training for Ron McAnally July 1. This will be the third attempt to get the Argentine champion back to the races. "The first time we stopped on him [in early spring] was because of his feet," trainer Ron McAnally told Daily Racing Form. "The second time we had him up to five-eighths and he had a filling in an ankle. It's set and hard now." The earliest the five-year-old could return is October.

#### Southern Image Set for Hollywood Gold Cup:

Southern Image (Halo's Image) has returned in top shape from his runner-up effort in last weekend's GI Stephen Foster H. and will probably make his next start in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup at Hollywood July 10, according to trainer Mike Machowsky. "He came back Sunday night and has been on the track jogging this week," Machowsky said. "He would probably work twice before the Gold Cup." The Florida-bred has won six of eight starts totaling \$1,843,750. He seeks to become the first horse since Affirmed in 1979 to win the GI Santa Anita H. and the Gold Cup in the same year.

#### House Passes FSC Bill:

The United States House of Representatives, by a vote of 251-175 (with five no votes), passed the Foreign Sales Corporation/Extra-Territorial Income Bills bill, also known as the "American Jobs Creation Act of 2004." The U.S. Senate had previously passed its version of the bill on May 11, which included language from Senator Jim Bunning (R-KY) that would repeal a 30-percent tax on winnings by foreign bettors on American racing. This has, by and large, forced the preclusion of sending simulcasts to most overseas markets. "We are pleased to have cleared an additional hurdle to passage of the FSC bill, which we believe will help open the \$85 billion international pari-mutuel market to the American simulcast market," said Greg Avioli, the deputy commissioner of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. The FSC bill now proceeds to a conference committee to reconcile the differences between the two versions of the bill. "As soon as we know which conferences will be assigned this bill, we will begin intensive lobbying to ensure that our provision remains intact and appears in the final legislation."

#### Belmont Celebration Raises \$235,000:

The Belmont Celebration, hosted by the New York Racing Association and The Jockey Club June 4 at Belmont Park, raised \$235,000 for the Grayson-Jockey Club Foundation. This year's honoree was turf writer Joe Hirsch of Daily Racing Form, whose writing career spanned five decades. "I am most grateful for the continued support of the New York Racing Association and all of the individuals and organizations who contributed to the success of the Belmont Celebration," said Nancy Kelly, vice president of development for Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation. "The money raised will greatly aid in the costs of research in important areas of equine health, leading to benefits throughout the horse community." Among the current research projects are studies on laminitis, West Nile Virus, pneumonia and cartilage repair.
