The Juddmonte homebred's dam, True Flare (Capote), is a half to GII Shuvee H. winner Apple of Kent (Kris S.) and MGSW War Zone (Danzig). ### CLASSIC ROMP FOR CONTANTE

**Contante (Arg)** (Interprete {Arg}) led home a one-two finish for his champion sire and a top-four sweep for the sophomore class with a 14-length romp in yesterday's G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Classic at Hipodromo Palermo. Thrown to the wolves in his fifth career start, the three-year-old was 21st of 24 in the G1 Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini on the San Isidro turf Dec. 13, but rebounded with a 1 1/2-length victory in a nine-furlong turf allowance back at that track Feb. 15. Second over 10 panels Feb. 29, the dark bay was a 10-length winner when returned to this main track Apr. 12 and most recently crossed the line first in the May 1 G1 Gran Premio Republica Argentina, but was disqualified to second. Manpower, who took this event last year at San Isidro, was fifth.

She added a first Group success with a nose win over Valery Lady (Arg) (Roy) in the G2 Clasico Carlos Casares Feb. 6 and was most recently a five-length winner of this track's G1 Gran Premio Jorge de Atucha over 1500 meters Apr. 24. The winner was purchased by Sheikh Rashid following that race from her owner and breeder La Biznaga, represented in this event by runner-up Forty Marchanta.

Seventh and second in two tries over the main track at La Plata Racecourse to begin his career, Forty Mirage exploded to break his maiden by nine lengths in his turf debut at San Isidro Mar. 27. He made it back-to-back victories with a 1 1/2-length tally in the G1 Gran Premio Raul y Raul E. Chevalier at that same turf course Apr. 10, but was coming into this off a neck defeat at the hands of Frugal Lark (Arg) (Candy Stripes) in the G1 Gran Premio Gran Criterium over a heavy San Isidro turf May 23. Back on the dirt for this one, he stormed home an easy winner while Frugal Lark could do no better than a distant fourth.

For years now, one widely accepted theory has been that [Sadler's Wells'](#) progeny do not--repeat not--act on firm ground. Perhaps that will change now that the perennial champion sire has dominated a Royal Ascot meeting which started on good-to-firm ground and ended up on firm (or as jockey Steve Drowne colorfully put it: "It's like a road--the only thing that's missing is the cat's eyes."). As many as 11 of Sadler's Wells' representatives finished in the first four at the 30-race meeting.

Of course some Sadler's Wells animals aren't at their best when conditions are fast, but I have never been a fully paid-up subscriber to the blanket theory that his progeny are best avoided on firm ground. For a start, Sadler's Wells acted on any going, including firm, as he showed with his victories in the Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial and the G1 Coral-Eclipse. There is also the record of his American-raced progeny to take into account. Surely, if his offspring are so unsuited to fast ground, he would never have built up a total of 21 individual graded winners on turf in North America, including 12 at Grade I level. Some of those Grade I winners, such as Beat Hollow and Islington, actually preferred fast ground and it clearly holds no fears for his Royal Ascot winners Refuse To Bend, Doyen, Moscow Ballet or Double Obsession.

I speculated only a few weeks ago that Danehill might be poised to end Sadler's Wells' very long reign as champion sire. However, his Group 2 victories with Punctilious and Five Dynasties weren't enough to prevent his old rival from returning to his customary position at the top of the sires' table. Incidentally, Five Dynasties is out of a Sadler's Wells mare and the great stallion also made his presence felt through his son Entrepreneur, sire of the impressive Queen Mary S. winner Damson, and his grandson Singspiel, who was responsible for Papineau, winner of the G1 Gold Cup.

Sadler's Wells wasn't the only Coolmore-based son of Northern Dancer to hit the Group 1 target at the Royal meeting, as the veteran Night Shift landed the meeting's first Group 1 contest, the St James's Palace S.

Azamour is the latest in a very long line of major winners bred by the Aga Khan, whose current stud book lists 236 broodmares. It is interesting that none of them was listed to visit an American-based stallion in 2003, a policy which I believe partly stems from the Aga's concern about the use of drugs in racing, especially in the U.S. "Racing is the window which provides the evidence of a horse's capability," he told me many years ago. "If that window is somehow falsified, and the evidence no longer true, how do you make valued judgements of the horse? You can't."

When the Aga did have broodmares in the U.S., they almost invariably visited stallions who had raced in Europe and who had European bloodlines. A case in point is Azamour's second dam, the unbeaten Anaza, who had the distinction of becoming the first of many stakes winners sired by the Aga's excellent Darshaan. Anaza, who won the Prix Herbager over 1 1/16 miles as a juvenile, started her broodmare career in Kentucky, where she visited Shahrastani, Trempolino, Lear Fan, Alleged and Irish River before being returned to Europe.

Two of those matings resulted in stakes winners, with Alleged siring Astarabad, a French Derby third who later took the G1 Prix Ganay, and Lear Fan siring Azamour's dam Asmara. Racing for John Oxx, Asmara won the Listed Trigo S. over a 1 1/4 miles and she gave the impression she would stay further (her disappointing effort on her only attempt at 1 1/2 miles possibly owed more to the ground than the distance). **Cont. p.5**

Azamour's family was introduced to the Aga Khan's broodmare band in 1974 through the purchase of his fourth dam Arcana. Although Arcana failed to win, she possessed a high-class middle-distance pedigree, being by the Washington D.C. International and Prix Ganay winner Diatome out of the classic-placed Dreida, who was runner-up in the Prix Vermeille. Perhaps the incentive to acquire Arcana was that her female line traced to Anne de Bretagne, a source of many good horses, including the top filly Roseliere.

Arcana's purchase didn't provide any immediate dividends, as none of her four foals won a stakes race. Indeed her Ribero filly Azaarika (the third dam of Azamour) managed to win only when she was despatched to the minor provincial tracks of Vernon and Amiens as a four-year-old. As she was Arcana's only daughter, she was retained. Azaarika won at up to 1 3/8 miles, so all of Azamour's first three dams had middle-distance potential, which explains why the colt's connections are so keen to step him up from a mile to a mile and a quarter.

Night Shift has sired a wide variety of winners, including some very fast sprinters. His finest previous achievements, though, are arguably his daughters In The Groove, who collected four Group 1 successes from a mile to a mile and a half, and Daryaba, who won the Prix de Diane and Prix Vermeille for the Aga Khan. Azamour is his third son to win a group event at the Royal Meeting, following Nicolotte (1995 Queen Anne S.) and Baron's Pit (2002 Norfolk S.).

Azamour ranks alongside Kitten's Joy, D'Anjou and Policy Maker as one of four group winners out of Lear Fan mares this year. They follow last year's Grade I winners Johar, Dessert, Volga and Vallee Enchantee, so Lear Fan is doing very well in this department. Two recurring themes among the good winners out of Lear Fan mares are the three-parts brothers Sadler's Wells and [Nureyev](#), with breeders opting to produce pedigrees containing Lt. Stevens and his sister Thong. The Aga Khan has tried this ploy with Asmara, sending her to Entrepreneur (sire of her seven-furlong winner Arawan) and Baratheia (sire of her two-year-old colt). Although Azamour has no inbreeding in the first five generations of his pedigree, it's a safe bet that breeders will be sending him mares from the Sadler's Wells, Fairy King and Nureyev sire lines if he joins the impressive team of stallions at his owner's Gilltown Stud.

The Godolphin colorbearer was runner-up behind North Light (Ire) in the G1 Epsom Derby. "He cantered this morning and has made a speedy recovery from the minor infection that he had last week," explained Racing Manager Simon Crisford yesterday. "He seems very well in himself and as a result we are still considering the Irish Derby for him."

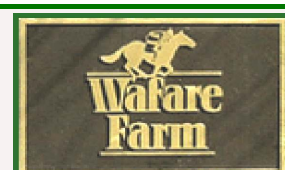
