NORTH LIGHT HEADS DERBY 13

The Weinstock Family's North Light (Ire) (Danehill) heads a list of 13 colts remaining in Sunday's G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh. The G1 Epsom Derby winner will face Godolphin's Rule of Law (Kingmambo), who was supplemented yesterday at a cost of €95,000, and Neil Jones' Let The Lion Roar (GB) (Sadler's Wells); those colts were second and third, respectively, at Epsom June 5. The line-up could be boosted by the Sangster Family's Epsom fourth Percussionist (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Juddmonte Farms' G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) fourth Day Flight (GB) (Sadler's Wells), from John Gosden's Manton base. Both were scheduled for a racecourse gallop at Newbury yesterday evening, but were forced to miss that exercise after the forecast rain came too late. Aidan O'Brien still has a team of six, headed by Friday's G2 King Edward VII S. hero Five Dynasties (Danehill) and Thursday's Listed Hampton Court S. winner Moscow Ballet (Sadler's Wells), while Dermot Weld has Grey Swallow (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}). That colt will be stepping up from a mile, having finished fourth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1 and third in the Irish equivalent at this track May 22. "Grey Swallow is in tremendous form at the moment and will take his chance on Sunday provided the ground is good," Weld told Irish Racing online. Fieldspring Racing's Ecomium (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) was the most notable scratching, with his conditioner Jeremy Noseda revealing that he was not ready for the Classic.

OUR EMBLEM SHUTTLES TO BRAZIL

Our Emblem (Mr. Prospector--Personal Ensign, by Private Account), sire of Kentucky Derby winner War Emblem, will stand the 2004 Southern Hemisphere breeding season in Brazil. The 13-year-old stallion has been leased by Taylor Made Farm and WinStar Farm to Goncalo Borgs Torrealba's TNT Stud in Centro-Rio de Janeiro. He currently stands at Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky as part of a Taylor Made/WinStar venture. In addition to War Emblem, champion three-year-old of 2002, Our Emblem is also the sire of graded stakes winners Private Emblem and September Secret. From five crops to race, his progeny have earned over \$8 million.

injury took him off the Triple Crown trail, so how he would have faired against Funny Cide in the classics is a matter of conjecture. Still, with a hard-fought victory in this weekend's MassCap, Offlee Wild can boast two wins in two starts against the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner.

Had Offlee Wild gone on to classic success at Churchill Downs, he would not have been the first individual from his immediate family to triumph in a recent GI Kentucky Derby. Offlee Wild's granddam, the GI Top Flight H. victress Andover Way is a 3/4-relative to Regal Road, the third dam of 2001 Derby hero Monarchos (Andover Way is by His Majesty out of On the Trail, where Regal Road is by His Majesty's brother Graustark out of On the Trail). Offlee Wild is actually particularly closely related to Monarchos's dam Regal Band, since she was by a son of Northern Dancer, while Offlee Wild is by Wild Again, whose sire Icecapade is a three-parts relative to Northern Dancer. *Cont. p. 5*

HATS OFF

All comments about Royal Ascot 2004 must be prefaced by the phrase, "on the firmest ground in recent years ...," because the ground really was very firm, so much so that certain horses patently didn't handle it at all--Sulamani was an example of this--and there will be real worries that quite a few horses will be out of action as a result of very hard races on very firm ground.

So, on the firmest ground in recent years, Godolphin had a blockbuster meeting. The 'boys in blue,' including Frankie Dettori, won six races, including two Group 1s, two Group 2s, and two Group 3s. They won the G1 Queen Anne with Refuse to Bend (Sadler's Wells) and the G1 Gold Cup with Papineau (Singspiel); the G2 Ribblesdale with Oaks third Punctilious (Danehill); the G2 Hardwicke with super-impressive Doyen (Sadler's Wells); the G3 Jersey with last year's Norfolk second Kheleyf (Green Desert); and the G3 Queen's Vase with Duke of Venice (Theatrical). Three of their winners were three-year-olds, the other three were four-year-olds. They also had five two-year-old runners, of which Coventry second Council Member (Seattle Slew) and Norfolk third Skywards (Machiavellian) placed.

In all, Saeed bin Suroor saddled 26 runners over the five days, including three pacemakers (all ridden by Kieren McEvoy, all unplaced). His six winners represented 23 percent of his starters; the stable had four other placegetters, meaning 38 percent of his runners finished in the first three. By contrast, bin Suroor's great rival, Coolmore's trainer Aidan O'Brien saddled just 13 runners. Aidan had just two winners, both three-year-olds: one won a Group 2, the other a Listed. All four of Coolmore's two-year-old runners were unplaced, as were all four of their runners by Storm Cat. Their two winners represented a 15-percent clip, and they, too, had 38 percent in the first three.

The Magnier family did have a group-winning two-year-old, the Entrepreneur filly Damson, trained by John Magnier's son-in-law David Wachman and winner of the G2 Queen Mary. Of all the ironic results this spring, how about Entrepreneur having a pair of two-year-old stakes winners already?

Perhaps as notable as Godolphin's six winners was the fact that Sadler's Wells had four, considering his well-earned reputation for siring runners who prefer a bit of ease in the ground. There was none of that, yet he was clearly the meet's dominant sire, with four winners and nine placegetters (in the first three). Two of Godolphin's six winners were by the 13-time champion sire, as was one of Coolmore's, and the Handicap winner Double Obsession. Two sons of Danzig, Danehill and Green Desert, were the only other sires with more than one winner. Danehill had two 12-furlong three-year-old Group 2 winners, Punctilious (Ribblesdale) for Godolphin and Five Dynasties (King Edward VII) for Coolmore, while Green Desert had three-year-old Kheleyf (G3 Jersey) and the 10-furlong Listed Handicap winner Red Fort, a four-year-old. Green Desert also had the bang-up G1 St James's Palace S. second (to Azamour) Diamond Green. Significantly, all eight winners for the game's two most important operations--Godolphin and Coolmore--were Northern Dancer-line.

The week's three most impressive winners were Rakti, a five-year-old by Polish Precedent, in Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S.; the three-year-old Attraction (Efisio), the first filly ever to win the English and Irish 1000 Guineas plus the Coronation S., on Friday; and Godolphin's Doyen, in the G2 Hardwicke S., on Saturday. These three in particular registered absolutely top-drawer, world-class performances at the world's top racing festival. *Cont. p. 3*

Norfolk 1-2 Lead Promising Freshman Sire Group...

Namid, winner of the Prix l'Abbaye in 2000, always looked a reasonable bet to make a sire of precocious runners, and Blue Dakota's narrow win over Sheikh Mohammed's (not Godolphin's) Xaar colt Mystical Land in Thursday's G3 Norfolk propelled his sire Namid into the lead among European freshman sires of 2004. Now unbeaten in four starts, Blue Dakota is one of six winners already for Namid, who becomes the first freshman sire to pass the £100,000 mark in progeny earnings. From the first crop of Zafonic, Xaar was the top-rated two-year-old in Europe in 1997, when he won five of six, including the G1 Dewhurst.

Xaar has five winners, among them two-year-olds who ran second, third, and fourth in the G3 Norfolk, G2 Queen Mary, and G2 Coventry, respectively. That's what you call hitting the board in the right sort of races. Interestingly, Zafonic turned out to be a very good sire of two-year-olds in particular. He was by Gone West, also sire of Smarty Jones's sire Elusive Quality and of Grand Slam. Cont. p. 4

Three other freshman sires registered Royal Ascot placings: third-ranked Rossini (a 3/4 brother to Elusive Quality, in fact), whose Tournedos ran second in the Windsor Castle S.-listed; and the sires of the two-three finishers in the Albany S.-listed, fillies by Lend a Hand and Almutawakel. Giant's Causeway has a winner of three races, including a Listed Race, in Italy, and is in fourth spot, followed by Lujain, whose seven winners are the most of any freshman sire to date. Of course, he does have 31 runners so far, too. Many by Selkirk want further than a mile, but that was Trans Island's best trip--he is out of a Green Desert mare from a speedy family--and he has made a good start, with four winners, including the useful Royal Island. More of a surprise packet is Adnaan, a stakes-placed (staying) Nashwan half brother to Hernando and Johann Quatz; his only runner is a stakes winner at Longchamp.

Just outside the top 10 at this early stage is Sinndar; he was the bargain of the year this year at €20,000, and though he has just one winner so far, nearly every one I've seen run has shown ability. If I could afford to own one now, I would call it Take The Hint.

Offlee Wild's dam Alvear is by Seattle Slew out of Andover Way, but she scarcely lived up to this illustrious pedigree on the track, winning just twice in nine starts for earnings of \$21,240. Offlee Wild is her only black-type earner from her first five runners. Alvear is a sister to the minor stakes winner White Bridle, but her dam Andover Way produced a far more important horse in Roberto's son Dynaformer. Winner of the GII Jersey Derby and GII Discovery H., Dynaformer has overcome a modest initial stud fee to become one of the nation's most successful sires, getting 62 stakes winners in his first 12 crops, including Grade I winners Critical Eye, Collect the Cash, Film Maker, Perfect Drift, Riskaverse, Starrer and Vergennes. Another of Andover Way's offspring--her daughter Personal Glory (Danzig)--is the dam of GSW Supremo and SW Personal Love.

Andover Way is one of a number of major runners and producers sired by His Majesty and Graustark from the family of her fourth dam Golden Trail. Others include graded winner Java Moon, granddam of MGISW Memories of Silver; Autumn Glory (granddam of champion Ryafan); GSP Kelley's Day (dam of Brian's Time, winner of the GI Florida Derby and later an outstanding sire in Japan; and Outward Sunshine, the dam of champion turf horse Sunshine Forever.

Veteran sire Wild Again is a stallion with a very unusual record, as his 81 stakes winners are out of mares by more than 70 different broodmare sires, with no one broodmare sire providing more than three of them. Offlee Wild is his only stakes winner out of a mare by Seattle Slew, but he does have at least 12 stakes winners out of mares descending from Seattle Slew's great grandsire Bold Ruler. Perhaps the key to this trend is that Wild Again has a pedigree which is much older than most of his mates, his paternal grandsire Nearctic being born in 1954 and his maternal grandsire Khaled in 1943. As a consequence, strains close up in the pedigree of Wild Again--he has Nearco 3x4 and Hyperion 4x3--and their backgrounds are found back in a large proportion of the breed, enabling a sizeable segment of the broodmare population to have the potential to supply Wild Again with reinforcements of the key ancestors in his pedigree.

With regard to Seattle Slew, we can note that Wild Again's granddam Dama II is by a son of Nearco out of a mare by Mahmoud. Seattle Slew is inbred to Nasrullah (by Nearco out of Mumtaz Begum, a 3/4-sister to Mahmoud) and also has Royal Charger (by Nearco out of a daughter of Mumtaz Begum). Wild Again has also sired five other stakes winners out of mares carrying either His Majesty (sire of Offlee Wild's second dam) or his brother Graustark. They are out of a mare by Alibhai, a very close genetic relative to the dam of Nearctic (grandam of Wild Again). Incidentally, Wild Rush, who is by Wild Again out of a mare by a grandson of Graustark, sired 2003 Grade I winner Hollywood Story out of a mare by Dynaformer. As we noted earlier, Dynaformer is a half brother to the dam of Offlee Wild, so Offlee Wild and Hollywood Story have very similar backgrounds.

was euthanized last Wednesday at a Florida equine clinic, according to Thoroughbred Times. The fiveyear-old, second in the 2002 GII Peter Pan S., won last vear's GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. and was third in the GI Woodward S. After winning the GIII Hal's Hope H. in January, he was fourth in

the GI Donn H. "He had that infection and they kept trying to get it, but they couldn't," trainer H. Allen Jerkens told the Times. "He was a nice, nice horse; very honest. And he was nice to be around, too." On the board in 14 of 22 starts, Puzzlement won six times and earned \$717,590.

Master David Returns Saturday:

Master David (Grand Slam) returns to the track in Saturday's GIII Kent Breeders' Cup S. at Delaware Park. The three-year-old colt, second in the GI Wood Memorial and 12th in the GI Kentucky Derby, has been off since finishing seventh in the June 5 GI Belmont S. He will be making his first turf appearance since beginning his racing career in England last summer. Trained by Bobby Frankel, Master David will be ridden by Jose Santos in Saturday's nine-furlong contest. Also in the nine-horse field is GIII Jersey Derby winner Icy Atlantic (Stormy Atlantic) and GIII Transylvania S. winner Timo (El Prado {Ire}).

TCA Grant to Groom Elite Program:

Thoroughbred Charities of America has awarded a \$3,000 grant to the Groom Elite Program, an education outreach program originally started in 1998 by Texas Thoroughbred breeder Susan O'Hara, Texas A&M University Extension Service and the Texas Horsemen's Partnership. Since the first program at Sam Houston Race Park in 2001, Groom Elite has conducted 22 programs at 14 racetracks in eight states, Canada and South Africa. The six-to-eight week program of two to three classes per week covers a broad curriculum on equine physiology, nutrition, horse care and welfare, OSHA based work and barn safety and racing rules. "This is great recognition of our program that started from modest beginnings and has now gone international," O'Hara said of the grant. "We run this program on a very modest budget with lots of volunteers and local support. The Thoroughbred Charities of America \$3,000 grant will help support this summer's classes that have already begun in Virginia, Iowa and Minnesota." To date, 450 grooms have achieved certification as "Elite" grooms.
