TEN MOST WANTED TO COME BACK?

Grade I winner **Ten Most Wanted** (Deputy Commander), whose retirement was announced in May, could return to the races in 2005, according to *Daily*

Racing Form. The four-year-old sustained a torn ligament in his right foreleg shortly after winning the GIII National Jockey Club S. at Hawthorne Apr. 17. But after undergoing a stem cell procedure in an attempt to renew growth in the damaged area, the bay colt may attempt a comeback if no stud plans are finalized. "In November,

we can make a decision on whether to sell him as a stallion or try a comeback," trainer Wally Dollase told *DRF*. "He'll need six months off. He may run if we don't sell him as a stud." Winner of the GI Travers S., the GII Super Derby and the GII Illinois Derby last year, Ten Most Wanted has bankrolled over \$1.7 million while capturing five of 13 career starts.

COLONIAL COLONY SUBURBAN BOUND

Colonial Colony (Pleasant Colony), who scored one of the biggest upsets of the year with his narrow defeat of Southern Image in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 12, will make his next start in the 10-furlong GI Suburban H. at Belmont July 3. "We'll see if that is an aberration or if he's really gotten better," said trainer Walter Bindner. "To me, personally, I've never seen him train as good as he's training right now." The Stephen Foster was just the fourth career win for the six-year-old. He could be joined on the flight to New York by lightly raced five-year-old **Alumni Hall** (A.P. Indy), who has captured three of four starts since making his belated career debut at Keeneland in April. "We're going to see how [the Suburban] comes up," said trainer Neil Howard. Also possible for the \$500,000 Suburban are **Dynever** (Dynaformer), **Newfoundland** (Storm Cat) and **Peace Rules** (Jules). **Seattle Fitz (Arg)** (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}) will skip the Suburban in favor of the GI Whitney H. Aug. 7.

Flight Gets Green Light

Juddmonte Farms' **Day Flight (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) will take on **North Light (Ire)** (Danehill) in Sunday's G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh, it was confirmed yesterday. The colt, who finished fourth in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly June 13, was given the go-ahead to contest the Classic after pleasing connections at John Gosden's Manton base yesterday morning. "He worked nicely at Manton this morning and he's an intended runner, but it's going to be a real contest," Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to owner Khalid Abdullah, told *PA Sport* yesterday. The decision was made easier by the heavy rain that has fallen on the Kildare venue since Tuesday, with Racecourse Manager Paul Hensey revealing that over 19 millimetres had eased the ground to good on the straight course, good-to-firm on the round course. He added, "Possibly the round course will be good all over by tonight, and the straight course may even go on the slow side of good. Once the rain goes today I think we'll get the odd scattered shower, but not much, with the weather generally set fair."

RHYTHM MISSES FALMOUTH Cheveley Park Stud's **Russian Rhythm** (Kingmambo) was missing from the 31 entries released yesterday for the £200,000 G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 6. After the *Racing Post* revealed that the chestnut had undergone a scan for treatment of a damaged suspensory ligament, the four-time Group 1 winner was not entered for the mile contest, which has been upgraded to the highest level for the first time. The Duke of Roxburgh's unbeaten **Attraction (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) will bid to supplement her history-making exploits in winning the G1 English and Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Coronation S. She was joined in the list by Elite Racing Club's G1 Queen Anne S. runner-up **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G2 Windsor Forest S. heroine **Favourable Terms (GB)** (Selkirk) and Godolphin's **Crimson Palace (Saf)** (Elliodor {Fr}), who disappointed when sixth in that contest. "To have Attraction all set to put her unbeaten record on the line in the first running as a Group 1 contest of the Falmouth S. is fantastic news for the July Meeting," commented Newmarket's Clerk of the Course Michael Prosser. "If she can beat high class older fillies like Soviet Song and Favourable Terms in the same way that she's been beating her own age group, then we'll know for sure that she's a real champion."

ASK FOR THE MOON OUT OF OAKS French Group 1 winner **Ask for the Moon (Fr)** (Dr Fong), a recent U.S. import, will miss next weekend's \$750,000 GI American Oaks at Hollywood Park, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "She's arrived in remarkable condition, but I think it's coming up too close," trainer Laura de Seroux told *DRF*. "I want to run her when she's ready." The three-year-old filly will likely point for the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 21. Winner of the G1 Prix Saint-Alary May 23, the bay ran seventh to the unbeaten Latice (Ire) in the G1 Prix de Diane June 13 in her most recent outing.

Zawzooth gained command in upper stretch and jetted clear to the wire.

Smarty Jones Headed to Pegasus:

Trainer John Servis is planning to run **Smarty Jones** (Elusive Quality) in New Jersey at least once this year. Servis is still on the fence regarding the GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Aug. 8, but he has mapped out a fall campaign for his Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero that will use the GIII Pegasus H. at the Meadowlands as a prep for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Lone Star Park Oct. 30. Officials at the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority are going to do everything in their power to make that plan of action a reality. The exact date of the Pegasus has yet to be set, but the nine-furlong event will be run at the beginning of October--the spot on the calendar that best suited Smarty Jones. The purse is another factor still to be set in stone. "I have a ballpark figure, but we have to figure out how we are going to do it," Kulina said. "We will probably set the purse at one level if Smarty Jones runs. If he doesn't run, the money will be more in line with what a Grade III race should be." Kulina would not say what "ballpark figure" he had in mind, but the purse of the Pegasus was \$1 million when Behrens won it in 1997.

ESI: ESPECIALLY SAVVY IDEA?

The concept behind Early Season Income LLC, a new Kentucky-based company launched by Gainesway Farm founder John R. Gaines and Tom Appleton, is quite simple: ESI will purchase, from stallion share holders, live-foal breeding contracts for up to 80 percent of their value. Contracts valued between \$10,000 and \$300,000 are eligible.

Here's how an example of how it works using three principals: Bob (share owner), Sally (mare owner), and ESI.

Bob owns a share of the stallion Make Pretend, who stands for \$10,000, live foal. Sally owns a mare who she thinks matches well with Make Pretend, and she purchases the season from Bob for \$10,000. Because of the live-foal stipulation, Sally won't have to pay Bob the \$10,000 until her mare drops a foal, and then, only if the foal stands and nurses.

Here's where ESI comes in. Upon confirmation that the mare is 42 days in foal, ESI will offer to buy the contract from Bob for 80 percent of the value of the season, in this case \$8,000 (80 percent of \$10,000). In return, ESI takes over all responsibilities of the contract and Bob walks away completely from the situation. When it comes time to collect the stud fee, ESI is responsible for billing and collecting.

The transfer of the contract from Bob to ESI will have no bearing on Sally, her mare, or the season. While some of the Sallys out there might be a bit hesitant about the transfer of the contract, Appleton said that hasn't been an issue yet.

"We've run into some owners that simply want to be educated on ESI," said Appleton. "We don't change the terms of the contract at all. There's no cost to the mare owner other than what was originally agreed upon. I'll spend as much time as need be to explain how we work, and we haven't yet had one owner that hasn't been receptive."

If you think the whole thing sounds vaguely like the concept of a no-guarantee season, you're not entirely off. From Bob's perspective, he is essentially morphing the \$10,000 live foal contract into an \$8,000 no-guarantee contract. With \$8,000 in his pocket, Bob no longer holds any financial responsibility if Sally's mare fails to produce a live foal. ESI now takes on that responsibility and, should Sally's mare not produce a live foal, it is ESI who will not be paid the original \$10,000 fee.

The benefits to Bob could be significant: Whereas a no-guarantee season might be sold for 60 or 65 percent of the live-foal price (ex. \$6,500 n/g : \$10,000 l/f), an ESI "season" would pay 80 percent of the live-foal season (\$8,000 : \$10,000). Bob would make an additional \$1,500 (\$8,000 - \$6,500 = \$1,500) with the ESI season.

The obvious risk to Bob lies in that first 42 days of pregnancy. If the mare slips during that time period, and Bob bound by live-foal contract, he misses out on \$10,000. But had Bob sold it as a true no-guarantee season in the first place for, say, \$6,500, he would still post a tidy profit.

Though we've used lonely season-holder Bob as an example here, the real benefit of ESI could come to larger outfits. Stud farms carrying a substantial number of live-foal contracts could opt to liquidate a portion of those contracts. The money could then be used for repairs, put toward the purchase of a new stallion, or in whatever way the farm chooses to reinvest its income.

Money saved on labor is also something that large stud farms would have to consider, according to Appleton.

"It takes a huge workload off their employees," he said. "They don't have to worry about collecting stud fees, or repaying stud fees if the foal aborts. And if the mare owner, for whatever reason, doesn't pay, it becomes our problem."

Appleton, the grandson of Bridlewood Farm owner Arthur Appleton, began laying the groundwork for ESI last December, and the path to fruition was remarkably quick.

"I met with Mr. Gaines and discussed with him the concept of ESI," said Appleton. "He was immediately interested and we began exchanging ideas. His experience in the business helped immeasurably. He had a lot of input, and I changed my thinking on some things because of that input. And the response we've received has been very good, once people understand the concept."

While the prospect of another bout of Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome (MRLS) looms as a danger over the entire industry, ESI has taken precautionary measures to ensure that the company will be ready for any situation that arises, according to Appleton, who added, "We're set up to be a business that's around for a very long time."
