THREE CHIMNEYS TO STAND SMARTY JONES

After weeks of speculation and negotiation, Roy and Patricia Chapman have chosen Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Kentucky, as the future home for their dual Classic winner Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality). The



farm, owned by Robert Clay, will purchase and syndicate a 50-percent interest in the future stallion and the Chapmans will retain 50 percent. No price was disclosed. "It will truly be our privilege to provide Smarty Jones his home upon retirement and to maximize his opportunities to be a success as a stallion," commented Three Chimneys' President Dan Rosenberg. "He is an extraordinary racehorse, by a world-record setting miler, and he is di-

Troienne. We're excited about

him as a stallion. I can't wait to see what Smarty does next on the racetrack, but I also can't wait to see his babies."

The Long and Winding Road...

With the assistance of Bridlewood Farm's George Isaacs, the Chapmans visited 10 farms in Central Kentucky in the week following Smarty Jones' loss in the Belmont S. and the choices were narrowed to three this past week. On Thursday it was announced that a decision had been reached. Mrs. Chapman admitted that the process had been a taxing one. "Everyone in Kentucky was so nice to us that this became a difficult decision," she explained. "But Three Chimneys was such a great fit. They are used to having the public visit their horses like Seattle Slew, Silver Charm and Point Given. They believe in limiting a stallion's book of mares and they are experienced in standing an important horse and making him a success as a sire. It's really just a great fit." A stud fee has yet to be announced.

Machiavellian (Mr. Prospector--Coup de Folie, by Halo), the sire of two Dubai World Cup winners, was euthanized yesterday. The 17-year-old stallion was withdrawn from stud duties early in the spring while suffering from laminitis. Europe's champion juvenile of



1989, Machiavellian captured the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Prix de la Salamandre and was second in the 1990 G1 English 2000 Guineas. He stood his entire stud career at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket, England. On the racetrack, he has been represented by Machiavellian www.darley.co.uk Group/Grade I winners Storming Home (GB),

Medicean (GB), Street Cry (Ire), Almutawakel (GB), Best of the Bests (Ire), Right Approach (GB), Invermark (GB), Rebecca Sharp (GB), Vettori (Ire), Patavellian (Ire) and Titus Livius (Fr). Almutawakel captured the 1999 running of the Dubai World Cup, while Street Cry won the 2002 renewal of the prestigious event. Machiavellian has sired 47 stakes winners and the earners of over \$28 million. "He's been a terrific stallion, one whose influence will be with us for years to come through his sons and daughters," said Liam O'Rourke, managing director of Dalham Hall Stud. "But above all else, he was a lovely animal."

Trainer John Servis, in conjunction with the Chapmans, has mapped out a three-race summer/fall schedule to get Smarty Jones to his ultimate goal, the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Lone Star Oct. 30. The Chapmans had previously indicated their desire to keep the colt in training at four and yesterday's agreement leaves open that possibility. "In no way does this signal Smarty's retirement," Roy Chapman confirmed. Three Chimneys has agreed to allow the Chapmans to retain control of all racing decisions regarding Smarty Jones and the decision to retire the colt will be the Chapmans' alone. The chestnut will be bred to no more than 110 mares and there is also a stipulation in the agreement that Smarty Jones will not be shuttled to the Southern Hemisphere for breeding purposes.

What this afternoon's first leg of New York's Triple Tiara may lack in numbers, it surely makes up in quality, as three Grade I winners, including the top two home in the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks, face the starter. A leading two-year-old filly of her generation, Ashado took the GI Spinaway S. and finished runner-up to champion Halfbridled in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies before ending the year with a nose victory in the GII Demoiselle S. The dark bay returned from her four-month vacation to take the GII Fair Grounds Oaks in New Orleans Mar. 6 and was second to Madcap Escapade in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 3 prior to winning the Oaks by 1 1/4 lengths over Island Sand. The latter, purchased privately before her win in Aqueduct's Busanda S. Jan. 25, was second to House of Fortune in the Apr. 9 GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn in her first start for her new trainer Larry Jones, who was hardly disappointed in his filly's Oaks performance in her next effort. "She didn't break real sharp from the gate," he explained. "She hopped and kind of got squeezed back and shuffled back a lot further than we wanted to be. There was a very good chance we weren't going to beat Ashado that day, but we had a very good trip once we got out and got to run." In her most recent effort, Island Sand made a victorious return to the Big Apple, taking the June 4 GI Acorn S. by 1 3/4 lengths over a hard-charging Society Selection. The latter, upset winner of last year's GI Frizette S. at this track, has been consistent this term, with a win in the GIII Comely S. Apr. 9 from four trips to the post.

Chorist stamped herself as one of the best older fillies in training in 2003 with a highly impressive success in the G3 Blandford S. over course and distance in September and returns to contest the first running of this race as a Group 1 contest. She had knocked heads with subsequent G1 Prix de l'Opera winner Zee Zee Top (GB) when second in the Listed Middleton S. at York last May before taking the Listed Hoppings S. at Newcastle the following month. She beat this year's G2 Windsor Forest S. scorer Favourable Terms (GB) in the G3 Golden Daffodil S. at Chepstow last July before disappointing when last of eight in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at York the following month. Her Blandford rout was followed by another disappointment when third in the G3 Princess Royal S. at Ascot in October, but that mile and a half stretched her stamina and she demonstrated her speed when winning the Listed Pipalong S. over a mile on her return at Pontefract last time June 7. KEEPing It Real By Andy Belfiore

Kentucky Equine Educational Partnership, created to educate the people of Kentucky about the horse industry and to unite the horsemen in the state, held its first official meeting May 26 with an estimated 600 people in attendance. Former Kentucky Governor Brereton Jones, one of the guiding lights behind KEEP, explains how the organization got started and how it will benefit the Kentucky horse industry.

Q: What was the catalyst behind the creation of KEEP? Gov. Brereton C. Jones: Several people collectively came up with the idea. We were talking about how sad it was that the Kentucky horse lobby is one of the weakest lobbies in the state and we decided we needed to do something about that. We realized that the lobby was weak because we were not united with all of the various breeds. Thoroughbreds make up less than half the horses in the state--there are actually more Quarter Horses in Kentucky than Thoroughbreds. We wanted to unite the industry, because strength comes from numbers. We also wanted to start a grass roots campaign to educate the people of Kentucky about our industry. The key to all success in life is education.

Q: Why do the citizens of Kentucky need to be educated about the horse industry?

Jones: Once the people of Kentucky understand the economic importance of the horse industry, when they are made aware of the jobs and the economic opportunities it provides, they will become supportive of the industry. Right now, the average citizen thinks that horse people are all wealthy, with big houses and big farms, and that they don't need any special help or considerations. The truth is, the average person in our industry is not wealthy. The jobs directly and indirectly tied to what is a \$4 billion-plus industry are overlooked by the majority of people.

Q: How will the KEEP message be spread?

Jones: We are going to educate people through a grass roots effort. We will have a chairperson in each of our 120 counties and we are in the process of developing a video that will demonstrate the importance of our industry. We are also creating a Speakers' Bureau--our speakers will appear before every Lion's Club, every Rotary Club, every Kiwanis Club, every civic group in the state. We will tell them our story, and they will understand why their lives will be better off if they preserve, protect and defend the horse industry.

Q: Why is KEEP vital to the industry? Jones: First and foremost, we need it to educate the people of Kentucky. We also need to rally the horsemen. One of the great things about our state is that



pride runs deep in the souls of Kentuckians, and that generates a lot of positive thinking, which is necessary to succeed in any endeavor. By the same token, it can sometimes inspire complacency and a feeling that we are the best and always will be the

best, but that won't always be true if we aren't willing to roll up our sleeves and do the work to

meet the competition. History has a way of repeating itself. In 1960, the Standardbred industry in Kentucky was extremely strong. It was the Standardbred capitol of America. But several other states set out to steal the industry from Kentucky. They established breeders' awards and stallion awards, and Kentucky did not meet the competition. In 1960, there were 206 Standardbred stallions in Kentucky--today, there are six. Other states are in the process of trying to duplicate that in the Thoroughbred industry, and it would be extremely sad if that were allowed to happen.

Q: How will the support of horsemen and of the citizens of Kentucky translate into prosperity for the horse industry in the state?

Jones: We need to go from being the weakest lobby to being the strongest. When we can get the support of the horsemen and the citizens, we can go to talk to the senators and the representatives with the support of the people who put them in office. Those people will help lobby for the legislation we need. That should be extremely effective.

Q: Are you pleased by the response to KEEP from the horse industry?

Jones: We have had a great response so far, much greater then we could have expected. We have a strong representation already, and we are reaching out even farther. We already have a board of 20 people from a variety of different horse breeds--the last two spots were filled by a member of the American Saddlebred Association and a member of the U.S. Equine Federation--and we have had hundreds of e-mails from people wanting to join.

Q: What can horsemen do to help?

Jones: We need the horsemen to contribute their time and their money. They can donate their time in many ways. Our Speakers' Bureau will be in every county in the state, we will be giving thousands of speeches to show the economic significance of the horse industry and to answer questions. Volunteering to deliver those speeches is just one way horsemen could help. We also need financial contributions. Organizing our grass roots campaign will involve significant expenses, and we will also need to go on television and radio to get behind specific pieces of legislation that are important to us. It is very much like a grass roots political campaign.

Q: How can people get in touch with KEEP?

Jones: We have a website at <u>www.equinealliance.com</u>, and, after July 1, we will have a staff in place. Next week, we will announce our executive director, our equine director and our operating director. We will be setting up an office at the Kentucky Horse Park. Our mailing address is P.O. Box 1597, Lexington, KY 40588.

PA Slots Issue Likely to Pass State Senate:

After reaching an agreement "in principle" Wednesday to legalize slot machines in the state of Pennsylvania, it was reported yesterday that up to 29 state senators are prepared to vote in favor of the legislation when it comes up next week. A total of 26 votes are needed for passage, but as many as 30 "yea" votes could be counted should a Pittsburgh-area legislator, who wants an OTB facility for the city, votes in favor. The plan agreed to Wednesday night calls for 3,000 slot machines to be placed at up to 12 sites in the state, eight of which may be race tracks, and up to five at off-track facilities.

Cooksey Calls it a Career:

Jockey Patricia "P.J." Cooksey, who in recent years has overcome a battle with breast cancer and injuries suffered in a nasty spill at Keeneland in 2003, has retired from the saddle following Thursday's live racing program at Churchill Downs.
