### A DIVINE VICTORY IN PRIX DU BOIS

With only one previous start to her credit, **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo) made up in talent what she lacked in experience when she cruised home an easy winner in Monday's G3 Prix du Bois at Chantilly. The filly looked to have a bright future ahead when record-

ing a fluent debut score at Maisons-Laffitte May 26 and confirmed that impression with an eye-catching success against seasoned opponents here. Settled in third early by Christophe-Patrice Lemaire, she stalked the speed duel between **Great Blood (Fr)** 

(Great Palm) and **Salut Thomas (Fr)** (Adnaan {Ire}) before pouncing passing the halfway. Taking command with 300 yards remaining, Divine Proportions was pushed out to surge clear in the closing stages for a convincing win. "I'm delighted with the way she quickened as the runner-up was not stopping," commented conditioner Pascal Bary. "We will seriously consider the G2 Prix Robert Papin [at Maisons-Laffitte July 25]."

Once, after my team had won the local PTA quiz night, a beaten rival spoke these words of wisdom to me: "Nobody likes a smartass, Andrew!" Bearing that in mind, I am hesitant to say that Daylami's emergence as a potentially top-flight stallion comes as no surprise to me. Indeed, I considered him to be extremely good value when his fee for this year was left at  $\leq 20,000$ , some  $\leq 5,000$  less than was charged for his services two years earlier.

Of course Daylami's fee this year had to take account of the arrival of his illustrious half brother Dalakhani to stand alongside him at Gilltown Stud, as breeders are all too willing to ignore the old in favour of the new and unproven. But there were plenty of reasons for breeders to stand by Daylami in his fifth season.

His first runners had hit the track in 2003 and they had done very well for a stallion whose progeny can fairly be expected to improve with age. Daylami, after all, had begun his highly distinguished career at two with a Timeform rating of 112p, which he improved to 124 at three, then to 126 at four and finally to an outstanding 138 at five.

Another factor to take into account was the type of mare he had often been paired with in his first season. As many as seven of the 80 foals in his first crop were out of mares by Sadler's Wells, while quite a few others were out of mares by winners of the English, French or Irish Derbys, such as Shirley Heights, Generous, El Gran Senor, Troy, Caerleon, Sanglamore, Kahyasi, Nashwan and The Minstrel.

The presence among the broodmare sires of several other notable mile-and-a-half performers meant that Daylami did well to come up with eight winners from his first 26 runners in Britain and Ireland, with further winners in France and Norway. His daughter Bay Tree had become his first stakes winner and his second, Grey Swallow, was rated the second-best two-year-old colt of 2003. Daylami also earned black type through the speedy filly Birthday Suit and the Group 1-placed Day or Night. I had also been impressed by another Daylami colt, Thajja, but injury prevented this youngster from adding to his debut win.

The winners have continued to flow from Daylami's first crop, with Hidden Hope becoming his third stakes winner in the Cheshire Oaks, while Day or Night failed by only a short neck to take the G2 Prix Greffulhe. Daylami has also caught the eye through his unbeaten son Bull Run, who won his first two starts by a total of 24 lengths; Thajja, who again looked useful when he made a winning return to action in April; Tamarillo, who took the UAE Oaks on dirt; and Remaadd, who made a pleasing winning debut at Newbury.

There is also the enticing prospect that Daylami's second crop could prove similarly effective. His early two-year-old winners include Whazzat (Chesham S.) and the Aga Khan's Kerasha, who could hardly have been more impressive when she made a winning debut at Saint-Cloud.

With Storm Bird as her broodmare sire, Kerasha is out of a grand-daughter of Northern Dancer, as are Grey Swallow and Day or Night, so Daylami promises to develop into a very valuable asset to the many European breeders looking for a top-notch outcross.

I was interested to hear one of Grey Swallow's connections say that he was sure the colt would be suited





by a mile and a half, because Daylami won over the distance and so did The Minstrel, the sire of Grey Swallow's dam. I am not sure I would have been quite so confident: Daylami--a classic winner over a mile--didn't score over that distance until he was five, and The Minstrel was somewhat unpredictable where stamina was concerned. Some of The Minstrel's group

winners, such as the Prix de l'Abbaye winner Silver Fling and the five-furlong winner Peterhof, possessed much more speed than stamina, and Grey Swallow's dam, Style of Life, also fit this profile.

Considering that Style of Life's broodmare sire was Nashua, twice winner of the Jockey Club Gold Cup over two miles, she could have been expected to stay reasonably well. However, a mile was the longest distance she was asked to tackle and she didn't win until she was dropped back firstly to seven furlongs and then to six. Style of Life's good sister Seasonal Pickup was also at her best at under a mile, winning four Listed races in Ireland.

With a son of Northern Dancer as her sire and Stolen Hour as her third dam, Style of Life was bred to a similar pattern to Northern Dancer's outstanding son El Gran Senor, who also has Stolen Hour as his third dam. It's worth remembering that, although El Gran Senor won the Irish Derby, the main legacy of his champion brother Try My Best has been one of speed, through the likes of Last Tycoon, My Best Valentine (Prix de l'Abbaye) and Pont-Aven. *Andrew Caulfield cont. p3*

El Gran Senor comes from the Best In Show branch of the Stolen Hour family which also numbers Xaar, Spinning World, Denon and Aldebaran among its galaxy of stars. Grey Swallow, though, comes from the branch descending from Best In Show's half sister Stolen Date, a mare best known as the dam of the successful Irish stallion Taufan. Stolen Date also produced the talented Nashua fillies Stoshka and Bubinka. Although Stoshka stayed a mile and a half well enough to win a Listed race over that distance in France, Bubinka--the second dam of Grey Swallow--gained her best win in the G3 Premio Buontalenta over a mile.

If I were asked to name the principal source of Grey Swallow's stamina, I would nominate Daylami's second dam, Damana. This daughter of the Prix du Jockey-Club winner Crystal Palace won at up to a mile and three quarters and her stamina dominated Miswaki's speed to the extent that Daylami's dam Daltawa was able to win over a mile and a quarter as a juvenile.

Even so, I don't anticipate any problems for Grey Swallow when he reverts to a mile and a quarter later this year.

DUO ADDED TO ECLIPSE Godolphin's Refuse to Bend (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Gary Tanaka's Maktub (Ity) (Love the Groom) were yesterday supplemented for Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown at a cost of £20,000. Described by conditioner Michael Jarvis as "a decent horse in his own right" and "a natural frontrunner," the G1 Premio di Milano runner-up Maktub will ensure a fast gallop for stable companion and G1 Prince of Wales's S. victor Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent), who headed the entry of 14 remaining in the 10-furlong contest at yesterday's stage. "He'll be there to try and recoup his supplement," Jarvis told PA Sport. "He loves fast ground and he loves to bowl along." Godolphin took the step of adding the G1 Queen Anne S. scorer Refuse to Bend, who was described by Racing Manager Simon Crisford as having "done very well since Ascot."






