starting gate by Lovely Rafaela (A.P. Indy), who covered fiveeighths in 1:02 3/5 on the main track Saturday. "She did it easy," trainer Paulo Lobo said of the GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup H. heroine. "I think the extra distance of the Oaks will help her." The three-year-old outgunned Western Hemisphere (General Meeting) in a battle royal in the Honeymoon and faces that filly once again Saturday. A full field of 14 fillies is expected for the third renewal of the American Oaks, including a trio of Southern Hemisphere shippers in Boulevardofdreams (NZ) (Daggers Drawn), Eternal Melody (NZ) (Shinko King {Ire}) and French Lady (NZ) (Entrepreneur {GB}). Hollywood has moved up Saturday's post time to noon, with the American Oaks slated to go off at 2:30 p.m. PDT as the sixth race on the card. It will be televised on ESPN.

SMARTY JONES: THREE CHIMNEYS

In the early 1990s, the bloodstock market in the U.S. and Britain had crashed, plummeting to 20-year lows. Japan's economy was still riding high, and one after another Japanese interests were picking off the cream of the American and European stallions and mares. But as early as 1991, Danehill was covering mares in both hemispheres, and by the middle of the decade Coolmore's policy of 'dual-hemisphere' stallions created enough of a revenue stream--aided by the market recovery--that American and European studmasters could once again be competitive for the top stallion prospects.

Now the virtual doubling of stallion books in a covering season has contributed to Three Chimneys Farm's ability to put a deal together to stand Smarty Jones, at a reported valuation of \$39-million: 60 shares at \$650,000. While Three Chimneys president Dan Rosenberg wouldn't confirm the \$39-million valuation, he did confirm yesterday that the deal does involve a 60-share syndicate, a 110-mare ceiling (plus one Breeders' Cup nomination), and an every-other-year bonus structure, which will effectively mean shareholders will get six seasons over the first four years. "We're absolutely thrilled to have the privilege of standing Smarty Jones," said Rosenberg. "We knew from standing horses like Seattle Slew how much charisma these really great horses have, and Smarty Jones has it. He has this cachet, in my opinion, because this horse has brilliant speed which he can carry over a distance, and is from arguably the best family in the stud book. We think he has unlimited potential as a stallion. So we were very keen to try and get him; but, obviously, we had to be creative to put a deal together that would work for the Chapmans, the farm, and the prospective shareholders. The expansion of sires' books provided us the key to putting the deal together," Rosenberg explained.

"The 40-share syndicate is a vestige of the days when stallions covered 50-70 mares," Rosenberg continued. "A 60-share syndicate enables us to value the horse at a level everybody can handle, while not in any way compromising the horse's breeding program in the contemporary environment." It's a radical proposal, but if it flies, it may signal a new round of stallion syndications--something that would be welcomed by a lot of people who like owning stallion shares, but have found the pickings to be slim-to-none in recent years. Smarty Jones's 60-share syndication may signal an end to that drought.

DAYLAMI UP TO THIRD

First Fasliyev made a Fappiano-like start among last year's European freshman sires. Then Cape Cross exploded at the beginning of this season, and when Ouija Board put up the season's most impressive European Classic performance in her seven-length Epsom Oaks win, Cape Cross passed Fasliyev for the first time to lead the cumulative European second-crop table (see p3). Now, with Grey Swallow's Irish Derby win, Daylami--with far fewer foals and runners--has claimed third spot on the second-crop table. He displaced Orpen, who does have only two SWs among his 105 runners, but both are Group winners and include another real-world Classic winner in this year's French 1000 Guineas winner, Torrestrella. All four sires have now passed the £1-million mark in cumulative progeny earnings (Northern Hemisphere crops only).

I remember watching an interview a year or so ago, when Saeed bin Suroor was asked what horse he thought was the best he'd ever had through his hands, other than Dubai Millennium. Bin Suroor thought for a minute; Daylami, he said. Hmmm, said I. You know how obsessed I am with the whole idea that a true assessment of ability--whatever that means--is the most important pointer of all in this game. I took that comment as a tip that Daylami should be taken very seriously as a sire prospect, and, sure enough, in this case it looks like the correlation works.

Now, as for Cape Cross...well, bin Suroor trained him, too, and while he was a nice horse, his claim to fame was that on three separate occasions as a four-and five-year-old, he led all the way to upset more fancied stablemates in top mile races. Cape Cross proves that a horse can be a top sire without having been an absolutely top-class racehorse; Daylami is in the process of proving that an absolutely top-class racehorse can sometimes make a sire. Fasliyev had already proved that a very precocious top-drawer six-furlong two-year-old can sire very good two-year-olds.

It's beginning to look like quite a deep group, this contingent of European second-crop sires this year, much like the North American third-crop group which includes Elusive Quality, Grand Slam and Tale of the Cat. Fifth-ranked Dr Fong, for example, has had lots of runners in the right sorts of races, and included among his four SWs is the G1 winner Ask for the Moon. Cont. p4

Even a little group of four sires ranked 13th-16th are all showing promise: Soviet Star's first SW back from Japan (in his second crop back) is last weekend's G2 Railway S. winner Democratic Deficit, who upset the previously unbeaten Russian Blue. In 14th is another Green Desert son, Shinko Forest (he also has #1 Cape Cross and #9 Desert Sun), whose Moss Vale is going for next week's G1 sprint, the July Cup. Next is Docksider, up four spots to number 15; his runners starting to make an impact, especially in 1m-10f handicap company; and in number 16 is Tiger Hill, sire of seven stakes horses, four of them SWs, and a son of Danehill who could now make his mark in Germany, having sired this crop in France. He had been third to Sagamix, as a three-year-old, in the 1998 Arc.

MILESTONES

Peter Savill retires today after six years as Chairman of the British Horseracing Board. He came as close as anybody ever could have to unifying a racing industry, an accomplishment which is made 10 times the more remarkable because bookmakers have really had a hammerlock on the politics of racing in Britain for 40 years. The bookmakers in Britain are analagous to the state regulation of racing in the U.S. in that they effectively counter all moves which could otherwise unify the industry. Peter Savill was not universally loved during his tenure as, effectively, the CEO of British racing, but he was universally respected. He is succeeded by the much lower-key Martin Broughton.

The other major interest group in the politics of racing, in America and Britain both, is the racetracks. In America, the issue of slots at racetracks is a huge one, so much so that almost every racetrack which is prospering is doing so because of video 'slot machines'. Supposedly slots could cure California as well...at least, the California racetracks, including Santa Anita and Hollywood, which have an initiative on the November ballot. The chances of that initiative passing were dealt a blow when California Governor Schwarzenegger reached an agreement with the Indian tribes which will essentially wipe out the state's huge budget deficit, from what we read.

As soon as he'd done the deal, the Governor pronounced the racetrack slots issue dead in the water, and it's hard to see it passing when the popular Governor dissmisses it so readily. But, you know what, it doesn't even include all the state's racetracks (Del Mar and Oak Tree not included). And isn't it terribly short-term to be depending on other forms of gambling to prop up horse racing anyway? How long can that last? Horse racing needs to address its own problems. Doesn't this prove why racetracks can't be depended on to make the right decisions for horse racing? They have their own agendas, which sometimes do and sometimes don't coincide with the interests of the rest of the industry. What's to say horse racing won't end up being a sideshow for racinos, and from there it's not too big a leap to deciding they can do without those messy live horses.

Last weekend, Offlee Wild, a son of Wild Again, upset Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide in the GII Massachusetts H. This weekend we had a similar story as Stellar Jayne, a granddaughter of Wild Again, surprised the Kentucky Oaks heroine Ashado in the GI Mother Goose S.

Stellar Jayne had actually run against Ashado, and another of her Mother Goose victims--Island Sand-when that duo ran one-two in the Kentucky Oaks as Stellar Jayne finished seventh, beaten 10 lengths. At that stage in her career, Stellar Jayne was still employing the off-the-pace, late-closing style which had brought her victory in the Pocahontas S. as a two-yearold. However, the Kentucky Oaks marked her seventh consecutive defeat since the Pocahontas, a period in which she only once hit the board, finishing third in the GII Fantasy S.

Following the Oaks, different tactics were employed, and next time out Stellar Jayne was never more than a

length off the lead when capturing the GIII Dogwood Breeders' Cup S. In the Mother Goose, she battled for the lead most of the way before drawing off in the closing stages.

Stellar Jayne was purchased for \$150,000 as a weanling--the most expensive by her sire that year--by the Corner Woods Farm of veterinarians Chuck Kidder and Nancy Cole at the 2001 Keeneland No-

vember Sale. Reoffered by Spendthrift Farm at the 2002 Saratoga Yearling Sale, she failed to make her reserve and was bought back for \$170,000. She now races as the property of a partnership consisting of Cole, Kidder, Spendthrift Farm and Nick Strong.

One of the reasons that Stellar Jayne failed to appeal to the yearling buyers is probably that the first crop of two-year-olds by her sire Wild Rush were not showing much signs of life by the time she was back in the ring. Wild Rush is now standing in Japan after being sold to that country last September. Since that time, his second crop, of which Stellar Jayne is a member, has proved to be as good as his first was disappointing. The first crop yielded only two stakes winners, neither graded; the second crop, which contained just one more foal than the first, has produced eight stakes winners thus far. Aside from Stellar Jayne, the second crop includes Canadian champion two-year-old colt Judith's Wild Rush; Hollywood Story (GI Hollywood Starlet S.); Wimbledon (GII Louisiana Derby) and Quintons Gold Rush (GII Coolmore Lexington S.).

Even though the purchase of Stellar Jayne didn't pay initial dividends, the partners did receive a bonus before Stellar Jayne ever reached a racetrack. Her half-sister Starrer, a graded stakes winner at the time of Stellar Jayne's purchase, became a multiple Grade I winner in the spring of Stellar Jayne's two-year-old season, when she captured the GI Santa Margarita H. and GI Santa Maria H.

Although her dam To the Hunt is now the dam of two Grade I winners, the family's rise to prominence is comparatively recent one. To the Hunt never won a stakes, but this daughter of Relaunch did take five races and nearly \$90,000, earning graded black type with a second in the GIII Next Move H. and a third in the GIII Rare Treat H. At the time, this made her the only black-type performer under her dam, and her first matings were with the modest Maryland-based sires I Am the Game and Carnivalay. However, the commercial value of her mates improved dramatically following the appearance of her 3/4-sister American Royale (by American Standard, a son of Relaunch's sire In Reality). Undefeated in three races at two, including the GIII Adirondack S. and Colleen S., American Royale retired with a lifetime record of six wins in eight starts after adding the GIII Prioress S. and Blue Norther S. at three. Initially, the upgrading didn't pay dividends. To the Hunt's third foal--the Storm Cat colt Devon Lane--won three races, but earned only \$6,317, and he was followed by a Deputy Minister colt who never raced. The next two years saw To the Hunt produce winners by Capote and Smarten, before Starrer appeared as her seventh foal. To the Hunt's eighth foal is a colt by Marquetry who has yet to win, and Stellar Jayne is her ninth foal.

As we mentioned last week, it's somewhat difficult to pick out pedigree trends for the Wild Again male line, as Wild Again has worked with such a wide range of broodmare sires, getting stakes winners out of mares by at least 70 different horses. There have been at least four other stakes winners bred on the Wild Again/In Reality cross which Stellar Jayne represents, the best being Allen's Oop (by Nine's Wild), winner of the GIII New Orleans H.

Starrer and Stellar Jayne do carry one common pedigree factor which might be important here. Starrer's sire Dynaformer is out of a mare by His Majesty, while Wild Rush is out of a mare by Plugged Nickle, a grandson of His Majesty's full brother Graustark. To the Hunt's dam Royal Advocator is by by Majestic Prince, a horse whose granddam Your Hostess is a 3/4-sister to Flower Bowl, the dam of His Majesty and Graustark.

GULFSTREAM GRANDSTAND DEMOLISHED At

9:22 a.m. yesterday, Gulfstream Park's grandstand tumbled down. The only thing remaining from Gulfstream's past was a sign with "1999," a reminder of the last Breeders' Cup event held at the South Florida track. The grandstand and clubhouse are being demolished to make way for a new structure, which isn't slated for completion until the 2006 racing season. In 2005, Gulfstream expects to have temporary structures erected to house patrons. The tent-city will be similar to the corporate tents used at Churchill Downs for the Kentucky Derby and Pimlico for the Preakness. The Gulfstream structure, built in 1939, had pre-World War II steel and showed her grit before begrudgingly going into history. "She didn't want to go down," said Gulfstream president Scott Savin. The demolition is part of a \$120-million rebuilding project, which will dovetail into a \$400-million venture between Gulfstream's parent company Magna Entertainment Corp., and Forest City Developers to build a mall, condominiums, hotel and entertainment center in Hallandale Beach.
