CONGAREE TO ADENA SPRINGS

Stonerside Stable's MGISW **Congaree** (Arazi--Mari's Sheba, by Mari's Book) will stand the 2005 season at Adena Springs in Kentucky for a fee of \$15,000 live foal. "Adena Springs and Stonerside have already had a stellar and successful relationship," said Bob McNair of Stonerside Stables. "Congaree represents the ideal horse for both our programs in that he possesses speed, durability, stamina and versatility." A winner of \$3,267,490, the handsome chestnut was effective at a variety of distances, notching the seven-furlong GI Carter H., the GI Cigar Mile twice and the 1 1/4-mile GI Hollywood Gold Cup. Trained by Bob Baffert, Congaree made 22 consecutive starts in graded races. "He was always a man amongst boys," Baffert said. "He probably has the most efficient stride that I've ever seen on a horse. He's got the speed and fluid stride it takes to make a sire." The six-year-old was retired following a fourth-place finish in the GI Churchill Downs H. Kentucky Derby day.

MOBIL RUNS OFF WITH DOMINION

Outclassed while ninth in Belmont's GI Metropolitan H. last time, **Mobil** (Langfuhr) returned to his winning ways with an impressive 12 3/4-length victory in yesterday's GIII Dominion Day H. The bay colt has always fared well at Woodbine, notching seven of 11 career starts, including the GIII Toronto Cup H. and GIII Ontario Derby. He closed out his sophomore campaign with a second-place finish in the GIII Woodbine Slots Cup H. Nov. 8, then returned with a win the GIII Vigil H. May 1. The heavy chalk this time, he was allowed to settle off the pace by leading rider Todd Kabel as **Slim Dusty** (Anjiz) opened up a 4 1/2-length lead. Mobil began to rally on the turn and drew off to post an easy victory. "That's the way you like to see him run," trainer Mike Keogh said. "You never want to see a horse get beat like that [ninth, Met Mile], especially for their confidence. But he trained back very well and when he worked a mile [June 19], he was super."

STRONACH SEEKING MAJOR CHANGES A day after the Gulfstream Park's grandstands came down, Magna Entertainment Corp. chairman Frank Stronach unfurled his plans for the 2005 racing season and beyond. Those plans could make for a difficult relationship with Calder Race Course, located on the other side of Miami. Stronach would like more racing dates, and the only way to get them is from Calder. Asked if Gulfstream would go head-to-head with Calder, Stronach said, "Look, we don't mind talking to them, but if it's a one-sided deal, we first and foremost want to put on a good show for the customers. Without customers we don't have anything." Asked if he was talking about racing year-round in South Florida, Stronach said, "We could be talking about six months, seven months, eight months, maybe all year. That's why we are building the great clubhouse, the stable area, so the horsemen can run here or at Calder." Stronach said he wants to be able to run his complex year-round, and to do that he has to have either live racing or simulcasting. In going head-to-head with Calder, Stronach appears to want his racing dates to coincide with the tourist season in South Florida, from approximately early November to late April. Florida law stipulates that a pari-mutuel facility can only simulcast when it is running a live meeting. Calder president Ken Dunn has been adamant about not wanting to exchange signals with Gulfstream in the past. "I would have expected him [Stronach] to check with the key players in the business, Calder and the horsemen, before investing the kind of money he's spending," said Dunn. "His plan is to put as many people out of business as possible. There are not enough horseplayers or horses in South Florida to support two race tracks running at the same time."

Stronach also announced that within the next two months, Magna would have a "racing charter of rights." Stronach defined that as a contract between Magna and the horsemen, guaranteeing them a revenue sharing plan that would give management and the horsemen an equal 47.5-percent split, with three percent going to breeders and two percent going to workers on the backside for medical and educational services.

Third in Hallandale Feb. 8, the chestnut scored a 3/4-length victory at that track Feb. 28, was fourth back at Aqueduct Apr. 28 and was coming into this off a third-place effort sprinting over the Belmont turf June 5. Well in hand, Personal Touch gained on the inside approaching the stretch, came out for the drive and won handily.

JUDDMONTE FACES INVESTIGATION Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms will face a Jockey Club investigation after it was revealed that **Endless Summer (GB)** (Zafonic) was a three-year-old and not a juvenile when he won the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood in August 2000. Juddmonte's Manager Philip Mitchell announced to the *Racing Post* that he had registered the colt's birth on Jan. 2, 1998 instead of the actual date of Dec. 26, 1997, as an "operating decision." Mitchell also revealed that he had offered his resignation to Prince Khalid. The allegations, which arose from a witness statement as a result of a case settled out of court involving a former Juddmonte Farms employee, were described by Jockey Club spokesman John Maxse as "serious." He told the *Post*, "Philip Mitchell contacted us today and informed us that Endless Summer had in fact been foaled before Jan. 1, 1998. They [Juddmonte Farms] have promised full cooperation with our enquiry into the matter. The Rules of Racing do allow for retrospective action in the event of a horse being found to have been the subject of fraudulent practice. Juddmonte have said that they will provide the Jockey Club with a written statement." Mitchell explained his decision to the *Post*. "The mare foaled a small premature foal just after Christmas, and I personally took an operating decision to register the foal on Jan. 2," he said. "I want to make it very clear than in doing that there was no form of deception or deceit intended on my part. I personally made the judgement on what I considered to be in the best interests of the foal. There is a choice to be banished to the Southern Hemisphere, where he would be a very late foal, or for the sake of three or four days be allowed to compete in the Northern Hemisphere, which was the purpose for which he was bred. Obviously as a premature foal he was already disadvantaged. To be quite honest, the present ruling [on foaling years] is an extremely difficult one for these situations if and should they ever arise." Endless Summer, who was also runner-up in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville and G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket in 2000, missed the following season before finishing third in two claimers at Hollywood Park the following summer. He proved infertile after being purchased by Terry Holdcroft to stand at Bearstone Stud in Shropshire and has subsequently returned to racing, first for Kevin Ryan and then for Karl Burke, who is his current trainer. In his most recent start, the six-year-old was sixth in a Class D handicap at Warwick June 27.
