She'd had some trouble finding the winner's circle recently, but Wonder Again (Silver Hawk) has always shown a fondness for the Belmont Park grass. She demonstrated her affinity for the course once again with a 3 3/4-length score in the GII New York H. yesterday afternoon. The bay capped a four-race winning streak at three with a victory in the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. at Belmont, but was shut out for more than a year after that effort. Back on track with a rallying win over her favorite turf in the GIII Noble Damsel H. last September, the Phillips homebred ended 2003 with a fourth-place finish in the Oct. 5 GII WinStar Galaxy S. at Keeneland. She was sidelined for eight months after that race, returning to run sixth in the June 5 GII Just a Game Breeders' Cup H. Off at 7-2 to get back on track in her second start off the extended layoff, Wonder Again tracked a moderate pace over the soft surface, angled wide for the stretch drive and sprinted down the lane to win handily.



"She finished up good," Smith told TVG, adding with a smile, "Somebody should check up on her--she runs like a four-year-old, not like a two-year-old. She's so professional. Heading Attraction's opposition is Soviet Song, one of many talented older fillies and mares who have remained in training thanks to this series of pattern upgrades. She lived in the shadow of Russian Rhythm last term, finishing fourth behind that rival in the 1000 Guineas in May and runner-up in the G1 Coronation S. the following month, but has emerged as a major force in her own right this season. After taking the G2 Ridgewood Pearl S. at The Curragh May 22, she failed by a neck to repel the challenge of subsequent G1 Eclipse S. scorer Refuse to Bend (Ire) in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 15. Her conditioner James Fanshawe took this 12 months ago with Macadamia (Ire), and she is sure to put it up to the sophomore. That applies to Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum's Favourable Terms, who made the most of the new opportunities for her sex when beating Monturani in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot June 16. But her connections are aware of the daunting task ahead of the four-year-old on these weight-for-age terms. "If Attraction is the horse we know, she will win," commented Joe Mercer, racing manager to Sheikh Maktoum. "Nine pounds is a lot of weight to give to a top filly like Attraction."

The Darley consignment features stallion prospects Dublin (Ire) (Carson City) (lot 153), winner of the 2002 G3 Vintage S., and Shami (GB) (Rainbow Quest) (lot 152), the first foal of champion Bosra Sham. Cheveley Park, which has sold the highest-priced mare at the last two Tattersalls July sales, has a consignment of 17 mares and two fillies in training at this year's auction. Among the farm's mares are five half-sisters to Group 1 winners, including Rendition (GB) (Polish Precedent) (lot 73), a half to Jovial, in foal to Kyllachy (GB); and Special (GB) (Polar Falcon) (lot 72), a half to Soviet Line (Ire), in foal to Where or When (Ire). Other lots attracting attention are the five-year-old Brian Meehan-trained gelding Savannah Bay (GB) (In the Wings {GB}) (lot 569), winner of the G3 Prix de Lutece, and the Sir Michael Stoute-trained First Charter (GB) (Polish Precedent) (lot 284), winner of the Listed March S. at Goodwood in 2002 and 2003. Stallions represented by broodmares or fillies in training include Danehill, Darshaan (GB), Deputy Minister, Diesis (GB), Fairy King, Gone West, Green Desert, In the Wings (GB), Kris S., Linamix (Fr), Machiavellian, Miswaki, Rahy, Sadler's Wells, Shirley Heights (GB), Unbridled's Song and Warning (GB). In many a soap opera, you will hear distraught parents demanding to know, "Where did we go wrong? They had every advantage. We gave them everything we could...and it's come to this!" Unfortunately numerous breeders also end up berating themselves with similar questions over the failure of broodmares that appear to possess every requirement for success.

Take Chapel of Dreams as an example. She gave Ted Sabarese little cause for complaint about her racing career, except perhaps that she took a little time to find her best form. Sabarese had paid \$850,000 for her at the 1985 Keeneland Summer Sale, a few months before her three-parts brother Storm Cat secured his first stakes victory in the GI Young America S.

By the end of her second season, Chapel of Dreams had repaid only \$66,900 towards her purchase price, but she more than made up for lost time at four. Her 13 starts yielded six wins, three at graded level, and nearly \$550,000 in earnings. She notched Grade II successes in the Wilshire H. and Palomar H., and three times failed by less than a length to become a Grade I winner, notably beaten a nose in the Gamely H. At the end of the year, the *Blood-Horse* handicappers rated her at 118, just three pounds below the best American-trained older turf fillies.

As you might guess from her price tag as a yearling, there was no fault to be found with Chapel of Dreams' pedigree. She is a daughter of the extraordinary Northern Dancer, who twice headed the broodmare sires' table in North America. His 299 broodmare daughters have so far produced around 240 stakes winners.

Chapel of Dreams' dam is Secretariat's celebrated daughter Terlingua, who looked so sensational as she blitzed her way through her first four starts in California. When another of Secretariat's daughters was mated with Northern Dancer, the outcome was the 1984 Epsom Derby winner Secreto, so Chapel of Dreams was certainly bred along the right lines.

So why has Chapel of Dreams failed to fulfill the high hopes held of her to the extent that she was sold for \$170,000, in foal to the Texas-based Valid Expectations, as an 18-year-old? She has 10 foals of racing age, yet the best that any of them has done is to finish third in a \$50,000 stakes at Ellis Park.

You can hardly say that she hasn't been given every chance. Her first nine foals were by Mr. Prospector, Gulch, Woodman, Seeking The Gold, Seattle Slew, Seeking The Gold, Seeking The Gold again, Pleasant Colony and Coronado's Quest. As seven of these stallions are members of the Mr. Prospector male line, you could argue that too many eggs have been placed in one basket. You could also argue that, as Chapel of Dreams made only one appearance on the main track during her 24-race career, she should have been tried with a horse with a turf pedigree. Admittedly the American-bred Woodman raced on turf in Ireland, but Chapel of Dreams wasn't mated to another turf horse until 2000, when the inexpensive Comic Strip was given his chance at turning the tide.

Of course, one important area which could have affected Chapel of Dreams' prospects as a broodmare is her conformation. As I have never seen her, I don't know whether she had any serious faults. The chances are that any mare which races 24 times has no major flaws, but Ted Sabarese once described her as small (something which could have been said of many of Northern Dancer's successful broodmare daughters).

Often, when high-class racemares disappoint as producers, their daughters and granddaughters make amends. This appears to be happening with Chapel of Dreams. The first indication came when her eldest daughter, the winning Gulch filly Bridal Tea, produced Postponed, winner of the GII Peter Pan S. in 2000. Interestingly, Postponed was inbred 3x3 to Northern Dancer and 3x4 to Secretariat, and it is fair to give this inbreeding some of the credit for reviving Chapel of Dreams' talent.

Chapel of Dreams' second daughter, the Woodman filly Wiener Wald, earned only \$200 in five races, but is the dam of On Reflection, a middle-distance Listed winner in France. Now Wiener Wald's first daughter, the non-winning Argent du Bois, has produced a daughter worthy of Chapel of Dreams and Terlingua in Ticker Tape, winner of the GI American Oaks.

Argent du Bois follows Louju as the second Silver Hawk mare this year to be represented by a Californian Grade I winner that started its career in Europe. Louju is responsible for Castledale, winner of the Santa Anita Derby, and Silver Hawk is also the broodmare sire of Percussionist, a good fourth in the Epsom Derby after running away with one of the main trials.

Had I been at Hollywood Park for the American Oaks, I rather doubt that I would have backed Ticker Tape, simply because she was untried over a mile and a quarter. Her sire, the admirable Royal Applause, ventured beyond six furlongs only once during his distinguished career and is proving a strong influence for speed. His mature stock have an average winning distance in Britain and Ireland of only 7.2 furlongs, compared to the 11.1 furlongs of Silver Hawk's progeny, so Silver Hawk appears to be the key to Ticker Tape's stamina.
