Like that dual Royal Ascot scorer, he emanates from Australia and booked his ticket here with a fine success in the G1 Newmarket H. at Flemington last time Mar. 6. Ruled out of his own tilt at the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at the Royal meeting due to a virus, the four-year-old has been giving all the right signals in his homework on this town's slopes. "He's an exciting horse," commented rider Kerrin McEvov. "We had that hiccup with the virus when he first got here, but I have

ridden him in a few pieces of work and he's got good tactical speed. I imagine I can get him right up in the first half dozen and I'm hopeful he can quicken well and maintain that right to the line."

Pius Devotion...

Heading the list of challengers is Michael Tabor's Antonius Pius (Danzig), who bids to extend the fine recent record of his sire and connections in this race. Danzig has been responsible for six winners since 1986 and Aidan O'Brien has saddled two of the last five winners in Stravinsky and Mozart (Ire). Like those colts, Antonius Pius is stepping back in trip for the first time. In a bizarre turn of events, he was disqualified from second place behind American Post (GB) in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau at Longchamp Apr. 25 before stumbling in the closing stages and finishing fifth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) over the same course May 16. He cruised throughout the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last out June 15 before running out of stamina when only beaten a length by Azamour (Ire) and will be able to use his natural speed more efficiently this time. FOLLOW THE BAND

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's Bandari (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) was sent off at 12-1, but he had the last laugh when beating the favored Sulamani (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) by a half length in yesterday's G2 Princess of Wales's S. on Newmarket's July Course. Ignored by the punters due to his disappointing ninth placing in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 16, he was settled in the rear by Richard Hills and gifted the 11-8 pick first run inside the final half mile. Quickening on the inner passing the quarter pole, he reeled in Sulamani and Frankie Dettori on the uphill climb before asserting in the final 100 yards. "He is clearly a horse of great ability and although some people had doubts at the beginning of this season, a couple of great races this year have shown that he's got it when he wants to use it," commented conditioner Mark Johnston. months ago, he was generally below par, mainly due to an injury which required surgery and a rest. After a tame return in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury Apr. 17, he bounced back to take a conditions event on the Rowley Mile here May 1 and the Listed Huxley S. at Bandari (left) wins the Princess of Chester five days later. He outgamed the smart lkhtyar (Ire) by a neck on rain-soft-

ened ground in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown June 1 before his poor show on quick conditions at the Royal meeting last time. "He had earplugs in before the start today," Johnston added. "He was very, very relaxed and calm and everything went perfectly--we saw the real Bandari today and that's him at his best. He will possibly go for the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. [at Ascot July 24]." Conditioner Saeed bin Suroor said of Sulamani, "He is definitely happier when the ground is softer and it is still possible that he will run in the King George if the ground is right for him."

Sophomores have taken this 13 times since 1980 and Sandford Robertson's **Balmont** bids to emulate his sire, who was one of the most impressive of those victors in recent times. He took the G2 Gimcrack S. at York last August before being promoted to first in the G1 Middle Park S. at the Rowley Mile here in October. He may have found the G1 Dewhurst S. coming too quickly after that effort when only seventh 15 days later and has to overcome a 264-day absence here. "Balmont is 90 percent fit, while he is in really good shape mentally-and ready for his first start of the year," commented trainer Jeremy Noseda yesterday. "His last two bits of work have been as much as I could have asked of him and I'm sure he'll run a bold race, although it's a huge ask to win a race like this after a nine-month layoff."

Another interesting member of that generation is Godolphin's **Kheleyf**, who impressed when winning the G3 Jersey S. over seven furlongs at Royal Ascot June 16. "The drop back to six is a concern, but he traveled so well last time and has a tremendous turn of foot, so he has a great chance," said Racing Manager Simon Crisford yesterday. Of the older brigade, Tim Easterby's G1 Haydock Sprint Cup winner **Somnus** and G1 Golden Jubilee S. scorer **Fayr Jag** need contrasting ground conditions, with the former requiring significant rain and the latter loving the lightning-fast surface over which he won that six-furlong contest last time June 19.

ATTRACTION ON A BREAK Conditioner Mark Johnston confirmed vesterday that the Duke of Roxburghe's Attraction (GB) (Efisio {GB}) will be rested after Tuesday's 2 1/2-length defeat by Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket. The Middleham conditioner reported the English and Irish 1000 Guineas and Coronation S. winner to be "fine" yesterday, before revealing that she will "have a bit of a break now." He added, "It's a little bit unfair that Soviet Song did not get the credit she deserved, but having analyzed the race, the first half was slow and that's not typical of Attraction. Kevin [Darley] said she wasn't really striding out, but at halfway no horses were under pressure behind her and that's unusual. That has taken the pressure off now and everything else is a bonus, so she'll have more of a break than in the past and come back in August. There is nothing to consider before the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois [at Deauville Aug. 15] and as her finest hours have been at a mile we'll stay there. I'd love to have a go at a big race over seven furlongs, but there is only the G1 Prix de la Foret [at Longchamp Oct. 9] and that's usually run on soft ground." Johnston also revealed that the Duke of Roxburghe had suggested that she may stay in training at four, adding that "she's done so much already."

Locally-based breeder Les Ward of Wyck Hall Stud later paid 72,000gns for a two-year-old Benny The Dip (Silver Hawk) filly out of Dream Lady (GB), herself out of G1 2,000 Guineas winner Entrepreneur (GB) (Sadler's Wells)'s sister, Dance A Dream (GB). Dance A Dream finished second in the 1995 G1 Oaks. "We bought her as a breeding prospect and will take her back to stud then make a decision about her future. I liked the Roberto line-breeding in her pedigree and there is plenty of black type on the page," said Ward. The sale concludes today with a morning session starting at 9:30 a.m.
