He's been very consistent all his life and we'll make sure he's entered in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest [at Deauville Aug. 8] if it stays on the lively side." **Exceed and Excel** (Aus) (Danehill), favored at 4-1 in his first start in four months, attempted to make all, but faded with 1 1/2 furlongs to run and finished second last. "He never felt comfortable and never traveled smoothly," bemoaned jockey Kerrin McEvoy.

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum could not have designed a finer script for the start of the short-lived stud career of his beloved Dubai Millennium (GB) as **Dubawi (Ire)** took his sire's record to a perfect three-for-three in Thursday's G3 Superlative S. at Newmarket. The juvenile provided the landmark first success for that ill-fated stallion when taking a Goodwood maiden June 4, so it was fitting that he recorded the first stakes victory in this contest. Held up towards the rear by a confident Frankie Dettori throughout the early stages, Duwabi traveled strongly down the outside of the pack passing halfway before being asked to quicken inside the final guarter. Despite taking a few strides to pick up, he responded in game fashion on the rain-softened ground to reel in Henrik in the final strides. "He hit a flat spot, but is a cheeky monkey so you have to get it out of him," said Dettori. "When he decided to go, he was in control. He's not going to be flash, winning by eight lengths, but pound for pound he'll give anybody a race. So far, what he's shown is he's determined, strong and a fighter." Conditioner Saeed bin Suroor added, "There are plenty of options open for him. He has always showed speed and class and I think we have a nice horse for the future. A mile and a guarter or a mile and a half will be no problem for him next year and he could be a Derby horse."

Unraced at two and lightly-raced at three, Frizzante quickly made up for lost time in 2003 when winning four of her six starts. After breaking her stakes duck in the Listed Boadicea S. on the Rowley Mile in October, she returned to that track to finish a half-length runner-up to Arakan in the Listed Abernant S. Apr. 15. She benefitted from a rain-softened surface when beating Avonbridge (GB) by a short head in the Palace House S. over five furlongs before finding things happening too quickly over that trip at the Royal meeting last time. "At Ascot it was lightning-fast and she got outpaced," added Fanshawe. "She ideally wants six, so the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup [Sept. 4] may be better than the five [furlongs] of the G1 Nunthorpe S. [at York Aug. 19], but she wouldn't want it very soft."

Angry Bark (Woodman), a daughter of GIII California Jockey Club H. winner Polemic (Roberto), was one of 25 lots sold by Juddmonte and finished second at Dieppe in France on her latest start for trainer Pascal Bary June 20. Breeder Michael Jacobs from Queensland in Australia, John Cameron of New Zealand Bloodstock, with agent Joseph Burke, and Gordian Troeller, who purchased Sunday's GI American Oaks winner Ticker Tape (GB) at Tattersalls, were among the early bidders. But David Minton of Highflyer Bloodstock eventually landed the three-year-old half sister to MGSP Cyrillic (Irish River {Fr}) for 75,000gns with Kevin Buckley of Coolmore, standing by the farm's Australian manager Michael Kirwan, the underbidder. "I've bought her for a small English breeder who does not want to be named," said Minton. "She'll put the filly in training and try and win a race before she goes to stud next year."

PHILLY PARK PREPARES FOR SMARTY-GANZA Anticipating an unmanageably large crowd for Smarty Jones's return to the races in the Sept. 6 GIII Pennsylvania Derby, Philadelphia Park officials plan to sell tickets to the race in advance and will limit the total number of on-track spectators, perhaps to no more than 30,000 people. "We will probably try to sell tickets in advance," Philadelphia Park CEO Hal Handel said. "If it's not a sellout prior to the event, we'll sell tickets on the day of the race, but I'd be shocked if it wasn't sold out earlier. I think if we just opened the gates we'd get 75,000 people." The track normally does not charge an admission fee and usually draws a crowd of about 18,000 to 20,000 for Pennsylvania Derby Day. "When we have that many people, the place is jammed," Handel said. Handel added that there will be an admission charge this year, but that it will be a reasonable one. The charge, he said, will be necessary not only to keep track of the number of tickets sold, but to help recoup the costs necessary to get the track ready for Smarty Jones's appearance. Bleacher seats will be installed at the track and the third floor of the grandstand, which was shut down long ago as on-track crowds dwindled, will be spruced up and opened for the day. Handel said the track will spend between \$100,000 and \$200,000 to prepare for the day. "We want to get 30,000 to 35,000 people into this facility comfortably rather than it being one of those days where you have a record attendance but nobody can go to the bathroom or make a bet," he said. "We're trying to see what our maximum capacity is, then we will track that with parking options close by to see if we can marry the two." Smarty Jones has not run since finishing second in the June 5 GI Belmont, where his bid to sweep the Triple Crown was denied by Birdstone. Trainer John Servis has all but ruled out bringing his three-year-old star back in the Aug. 8 GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park, meaning the Pennsylvania Derby will likely be his first appearance since the Triple Crown.
