IN THE GROOVE

Air Groove (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}) is back in the headlines. First, her four-year-old daughter **Admire Groove (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) captured Sunday's G3-JRA Mermaid S., then her foal by **Dance in the Dark (Jpn)** set a world record when he topped Monday's opening session of the JRHA Select Sale at Northern Horse Park in Hokkaido. Consigned by Northern Farm, the bay colt

brought a final bid of ¥490,000,000 (\$4,537,037) from Fusaro Sekiguchi. The previous world mark was set by Padua's Pride (Ire) (Caerleon), who brought \$4.425 million at the 1997 Tattersalls December sale. It is not the first time Japan's 1997 Horse of the Year **Air Groove** has made history at the Select Sale. **Admire Groove** set the benchmark for a filly when she realized ¥230,000,000 as a foal in 2000. Her little brother, widely regarded as the star of the 2004 catalogue, was the subject of a 10-minute bidding war between Sekiguchi and **Admire Groove's** owner Riichi Kondo. Sekiguchi admitted he was bidding with his heart, not his head. "You cannot be realistic when you try to buy a horse with such class," he said. "I had the same feeling about this colt as when I saw Fusaichi Pegasus at Keeneland. I sat in the sales pavilion with a limitless budget." Sekiguchi went to \$4 million for Kentucky Derby hero **Fusaichi Pegasus** at the 1998 Keeneland July sale. Katsumi Yoshida of Northern Farm was thrilled by yesterday's final price. "This is just amazing," he said. "This colt has been a great individual since the day he was born and I expected a good sale, but this price is more than double what I expected." **Dance in the Dark**, an 11-year-old son of **Sunday Silence** who was champion first-crop sire in Japan in 2000, accounted for three of the top six sellers yesterday. NEWFOUNDLAND TO BROOKDALE

MGSW Newfoundland (Storm Cat--Clear Mandate, by Deputy Minister), who was beaten just a neck by **Peace Rules** in the July 3 GI Suburban H. last time out, will stand the 2005 breeding season at Brookdale Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The **Sumaya U.S. Stable** four-year-old, whose first three dams are all Grade I winners, is a son of **Clear Mandate**, who captured three Grade I's and earned more than \$1 million. The mare is also the dam of three-year-old **The Mighty Tiger** (Storm Cat), a \$2.5 million KEESEP yearling who has twice been group placed in England, and \$3.2 million KEESEP yearling and stakes winner **Full Mandate** (A.P. Indy). A \$3.3 million KEESEP yearling, **Newfoundland** has won seven of his 18 career starts, including the GIII Canadian Turf H. and GIII Skip Away H. He was also second in the GII Gulfstream Park H. and third in the GII Brooklyn H. and has earned \$459,705 to date. The chestnut will race through the end of 2004. Trained by **Todd Pletcher**, he is being pointed for GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 7. "This horse has it all--a world-class pedigree and a yearling price that speaks for his conformation and he is quickly becoming one of North America's top older runners. We're delighted to have him at Brookdale and appreciate the faith and trust of our good friend [owner] **Oussama Aboughazaleh**," said Brookdale's **Fred Seitz**.

Inevitably, the G1 Falmouth S. is destined to be remembered more as the race where Attraction lost her unbeaten record after a thrilling sequence of eight victories than for the superb effort by the winner Soviet Song, whose trainer, James Fanshawe, was compared by one wit to the man who shot Bambi's mother.

Soviet Song's triumph was only her second in her last nine starts. Even so, she now looks poised to achieve the champion status promised by her unbeaten juvenile campaign, which ended with a victory over future Oaks winner Casual Look in the Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile. Four of her last nine starts were against colts and Soviet Song had underlined her return to form by running the 2000 Guineas winner Refuse to Bend to a neck in the Queen Anne S. three weeks before the Falmouth.

Soviet Song qualifies as one of the finest achievements by her sire Marju, a 16-year-old son of Last Tycoon based at Sheikh Hamdan's Derrinstown Stud in Ireland. Thanks to this year's Group 2 victories by Brunel (German 2000 Guineas) and Marbye (Premio Emilio Turati), Marju now has 10 winners at Group 1 or Group 2 levels. Interestingly, all three of his European Group 1 winners are fillies--the others being My Emma (Yorkshire Oaks and Prix Vermeille) and Sil Sila (Prix de Diane)--and so are four of his seven Group 2 scorers.

The three male exceptions are the German Group 2 winners Stormont and Brunel and the Hong Kong star Indigenous, runner-up in the 1999 Japan Cup.

Although the males outnumber the fillies eight to seven among Marju's 15 group winners, the fillies seem to represent a better chance of a top-level winner. Perhaps this isn't so surprising, as Marju's dam, Flame of Tara, was an extremely able racemare, as was Marju's half-sister Salsabil, who took the 1000 Guineas and Oaks prior to defeating the colts in the Irish Derby. Incidentally, Flame of Tara's half-sister Welsh Love ranks as the second dam of last week's highly impressive debutant Belenus (by Dubai Millennium).

As Soviet Song has yet to try more than a mile after 12 starts, her connections seem to believe strongly that a mile is her optimum trip. However, the way she finished at Newmarket suggests that she could stay a bit further and Marju's record provides further encouragement. Had Generous not been in the 1991 Derby field, Marju would have been a wide-margin winner. Unfortunately, persistent stifle problems hampered him in two of three subsequent starts, and he excelled only when returned to a mile to win the St James's Palace S. His mature stock's average winning distance is nine furlongs.

Perhaps it's relevant that Soviet Song is inbred 4x4 to Northern Dancer through his sons Try My Best and Nureyev, both of whom were primarily influences for speed at up to a mile.

Her broodmare sire, Soviet Star, was a good example of this, even though he had one respectable effort over 9.2 furlongs to his name. In addition to winning the French 2000 Guineas, Sussex S. and Prix du Moulin over a mile, Soviet Star also claimed Group 1 victories over seven furlongs at three and six furlongs at four.

He was a thoroughly admirable racehorse, but success came too slowly as a stallion and he was sold to Japan in 1994, when his eldest progeny were four. The next few years saw him represented by such top-class colts as Ashkalani, Starborough, Limpid and Freedom Cry and Soviet Star's services were again secured for European breeders when he returned to stand at Ballylinch Stud in 2000. His second Irish crop contains the group-winning juvenile Democratic Deficit and he has been doing very well recently with his progeny born in New Zealand. One of his sons, Starcraft, landed the Australian Derby in April.

It could be worth remembering that Democratic Deficit and Soviet Star's New Zealand Group 3 winner Stardane are both out of daughters of Danehill, so are inbred 3x4 to Northern Dancer. As Soviet Star's good sons Freedom Cry, Volochine and Bon Point were also inbred to Northern Dancer, doubling up on the Windfields superstar can pay dividends. Now Soviet Star's daughters are producing some good winners by Northern Dancer line stallions, such as Marju, and there is even a German Oaks winner, Silvester Lady, inbred 3x3 to Nureyev.

Soviet Song's dam Kalinka was a fair winner over seven furlongs at two, without showing anything like as much ability as the next dam, Tralthee, who started second favorite for the 1986 Oaks after winning the Rockfel S. and Lupe S.

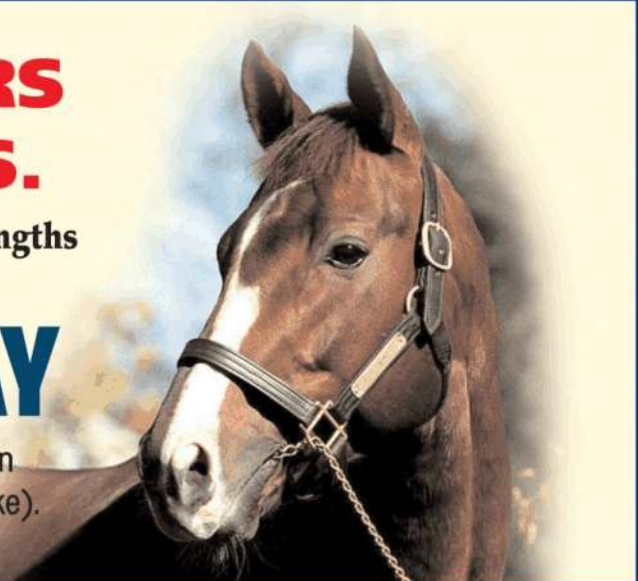

T E Lawrence caused an upset to provide conditioner Armando Renzoni with his seventh win in this prestigious sprint. Transferred to his current Rome base from Richard Hannon's yard in England late last season, the four-year-old had posted a previous career best when fourth in the G2 Premio Ribot at the Capannelle in November, but was revitalised by this drop to five furlongs. Held up in the early stages, he was delivered with a late turn of acceleration that carried him past Regina Saura and Benbaun in a thrilling finale. "He has great potential," said Renzone. "Ideally, he is suited by a straight track and six furlongs with cut in the ground, as on soft going he's a different horse. Cheers Brightly swooped from off the pace to snap a five-race losing streak in Sunday's G3 Tanabata Sho at Fukushima. Sixth in the G2 Nikkei Shinun Hai Jan. 18, Cheers Brightly finished a disappointing 11th against Listed company Feb. 7. Given a three-month respite after a ninth-place finish in the G3 Chukyo Kinen Mar. 7, the six-year-old returned to finish ninth against Listed foes last time Apr. 10. "I let him run as he liked," said winning jockey Yoshitomi Shibata. "He is such a powerful horse and he showed a gutsy performance in the closing stages of the race."

The offspring of leading sire Sunday Silence stole the show Sunday as his produce swept the top three spots in the G3 Mermaid S. at Hanshin. Leading the pack was the impeccably bred mare Admire Groove, who broke slowly, but made up the difference quickly as she swept to a three-length victory. Winner of last year's G1 Queen Elizabeth Commorative Cup, Admire Groove kicked off 2004 with a seventh-place finish in the Sankei Osaka Hai Apr. 4 before finishing fifth in her latest start, the G2 Kinko Sho May 29. A 3/4 sibling to the filly brought ¥490,000,000 at Monday's JRHA Select Foal Sale.

NORTH LIGHT OUT OF KING GEORGE The Weinstock Family's G1 Epsom Derby winner **North Light (Ire)** (Danehill) has been ruled out of Saturday's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot because of an injury. According to North Light's connections, the colt suffered a muscle pull in his right hind leg during his runner-up finish in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 27 and will not be ready in time for the mid-summer showpiece. "North Light is sound and has resumed cantering, but we have decided not to run him in the King George," said trainer Sir Michael Stoute. "We will have a discussion with his connections before deciding his future programme." Although not definitively ruled out of Ascot's showpiece, Godolphin's G1 Ascot Gold Cup hero **Papineau (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) remains questionable for the race. "Papineau is fine, but has had a bruised foot that has just held him up and he has missed a little bit of work," Racing Manager Simon Crisford told the *Racing Post*. "He is plenty fit enough and we are looking for the bruising to come out in order to continue his King George preparation, but missing more time could put his participation in doubt and he needs to be in training this week."

ROUVRES DIES IN PADDOCK ACCIDENT Group 1 winner **Rouvres (Fr)** (Anabaa-Riziere {Fr}, by Groom Dancer), bred and raced by Alec Head, died Friday after falling in his paddock. The five-year-old stallion had just been turned out when he slipped and suffered a fractured skull. Rouvres started his racing career in France, where he was first or second in seven of eight appearances and captured the G1 Prix Jean Prat and G3 Prix de Guiche. He shipped to the U.S. for his four-year-old season and was graded-stakes placed four times, retiring after a third-place finish in the GII Kelso Breeders' Cup H. at Belmont last October. A winner of \$428,075, he stood his first season at Greentree Stud in Ireland and reportedly has more than 30 mares in foal. "I'd like to thank the breeders for supporting Rouvres," Greentree's Michael Bowe told *Racing Post*. "I'd also like to thank Alec Head, who not only was very kind to sell me the horse, but also helped with promotion and sent mares to him."

Humor Me Molly debuted with a runner-up effort for a \$32,000 tag at Gulfstream in February. She returned to earn a six-length victory over that track for a \$75,000 tag Mar. 20 before adding a Florida allowance score Apr. 15 and a track-and-trip victory in her last out May 23. Allowed to settle off the swift early fractions of :21.22, :44.15 and :57.56, the dark bay filly roared out of the turn to take the lead in the final furlong and drew clear to the wire. GISP Forest Music (Unbridled's Song) was scratched.

WRITERS UP

A BREATH OF FRESH A.I.R.

Two weeks ago, Satish Sanan, patriarch of Padua Stables in Florida, launched the Alliance for Industry Reform (A.I.R.). The aim of A.I.R., according to Sanan, is to establish an open, honest, level playing field for the participants in racing's billion-dollar sales industry. In a statement released to owners and breeders, Sanan underlined three initial goals that A.I.R. hopes to achieve, including full disclosure of surgeries and veterinary procedures on horses going through the ring; full disclosure of ownership and purchasers; and full disclosure of dual agency prior to the sale of a horse. To see these goals through and to enforce them, Sanan has proposed the creation of a task force comprised of industry professionals. Sanan has also announced that, as a means of protesting the current state of the bloodstock industry, he will be boycotting all sales for the remainder of 2004.

Sanan's relatively late start in racing--he purchased his first yearling at Keeneland July in 1997--hasn't stopped him from becoming a major player in the industry who routinely spends millions for young horseflesh. Included among those purchases was Vindication, a strapping son of Seattle Slew who won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile on his way to a divisional championship. But despite the successes of Padua, Sanan felt that there was a level of deception and fraud occurring at the sales that needed to be addressed.

Q: What was the impetus behind the Alliance for Industry Reform?

Satish Sanan: During the last few years, we've [Padua] come to realize we were a bit naive when we started. We didn't realize what was going on at the sales. During the first five or six years in the business we spent an awful lot of money before recognizing there were some unethical practices going on. To be candid with you, many a time we thought about taking individual action--and one might still consider that. We tried to be smarter after every incident, but it doesn't matter how smart you try to be: the unethical behavior which is prevalent in this industry and those guys that are involved in it always find a way to work around it. We have, in the past few years, changed our plan.

But it was less of a personal issue for me than it was that every time that I met with people, whether they were owners or other folks who were seriously involved in this game, they would talk about this common subject. For whatever reason, however, nobody wants to talk about this openly, number one, and nobody wanted to grab the bull by the horns and do something. So I thought about it very seriously and, four or five months ago, decided to do something. Ultimately, it is my view that the owners are the ones going to the sales and spending millions of dollars. They are the only group who are putting money into it, and those are the guys who are getting screwed. The more I talked to the owners, the more I found that they're all frustrated and that they felt something needed to be done--and here we are.

Q: Do you feel it's a problem just at the top of the game, or does it go down the ladder?

Sanan: I think it goes all the way down. I think the higher the game, the more pervasive it is, perhaps, but this is a problem at both the smaller and larger sales. And I think that, logically--and this is an issue we are not trying to tackle now--that it's a problem that extends to the racetracks. There are issues associated with claiming horses, for instance. There are an awful lot of people being misled when they buy an animal. There are drugs and this and that.

A Breath of Fresh A.I.R. cont.

Q: How have you gone about attracting owners, breeders, consignors and trainers to A.I.R.?

Sanan: We have well over a hundred names so far, largely by personal effort. I picked up the phone and just called people. I called Bob Lewis, B. Wayne Hughes, John Oxley, Eugene Melnyk--along with the TCT [Thoroughbred Champion Tour] board--and brought it up as a subject. Bob McNair threw his support behind it. It's taken me a good four or five months since we've started with it, and in the last few weeks the whole Padua team has been on the phone calling people. I think the whole initiative has taken off, and I don't think this is going to die on the vine. This thing isn't dying, that I can promise you.

Q: How has the response been from consignors and bloodstock agents, who, ostensibly, would be affected most by any changes?

Sanan: Mixed. I think there were some consignors who were delighted and they would love to see this. Others were opposed to it. There was more opposition, as one would expect, from consignors and bloodstock agents, than anybody else. The sales agencies were supportive of it--both Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland--but they don't like to rock the boat.

Q: How long do you think it will take before A.I.R. makes an impact?

Sanan: I don't really know. We'll see. The first set of advertisements are appearing in the July racing publications, and I think we are going to get tremendous support from there on. I think a lot of the rank and file haven't heard what we're doing and will be very supportive once they do. And we'll repeat the ads during the August and September sales.

Q: Other than running ads, what has A.I.R. been doing?

Sanan: There is a lot of enthusiasm over this on the part of T.O.B.A. [Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Organization] and the K.T.O.B.A. [Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association] and so on, and what I've proposed in the short term--within the next 30 days or so--is to have a meeting in Kentucky where we hope to establish the beginnings of a task force. The task force would have representatives from all the constituencies, including sales agencies and consignors and owners, maybe a couple veterinarians, even. Whether this is a self-managed sort of entity or we go the legislative route, we have not decided. But this is going to be a long-term process. It's not going to be done in 40 or 50 days.

Q: Have you been in touch with any governmental agencies?

Sanan: Well, people have contacted me, but our game plan is to avoid government agencies if we can. We'd rather have a self-governing agency.

Q: Recently, the British Jockey Club came out with a code of ethics with regard to the bloodstock business. Have you been in contact with that organization?

Sanan: No, I have not. Their Jockey Club is a little stronger organization. Even though it's a private organization, it's an industry-accepted organization. From what I understand the Jockey Club has jurisdiction over sales and the racetrack and trainers and jockeys and so on, so they've got a little more clout, more teeth, so to speak, in what they can do. But the principles are the same. What they're trying to do is what we need to do in this country. They're just a little ahead of us in terms of addressing these issues. I am glad they're doing it, I'm glad they're a few months ahead of us. We can only learn from them.

Q: What advice would you give to new owners, particularly to those coming in at the higher levels of the sport?

Sanan: Number one would be to talk to eight or 10 of the existing leading owners and learn the simple things of what to do and what not to do. Second would be to hire a reputable, high-integrity individual and pay him more than what others would. I would rather pay 10 or 15 percent to somebody up front, because that's going to happen anyway. They're charging you that, then they run you up a million bucks. Good advice is expensive. But hire somebody who is well taken care of and who is looking out for your best interests. Just take it easy. Guys like me jumped in with both feet and got burned.

Q: Are you planning on buying at the upcoming sales?

Sanan: No, I told both sales agencies that I wouldn't be attending. I made a personal commitment to my family this year that, as I protest, I would boycott the sales. I'm going to buy horses, there's no question about it. Generally, we supplement our homebreds. This year, we'll probably buy 10 or 15. But we're going to do those privately. Singlehandedly, I cannot make a difference at the sales, but symbolically I want to do that.
