VALIXIR BREAKS THROUGH

Like many of his contemporaries, **Valixir (Ire)** (Tremolino) lived in the shadow of Bago (Fr) at two, having chased that smart colt home when runner-up in the G3 Prix des Chenes last September. But it was his chance to shine yesterday as he wired the G2 Prix Eugene Adam S. at Maisons-Laffitte. Valixir returned from a winter holiday to record an impressive tally in the Listed Prix Matchem at this track Apr. 20 before finishing third in the G1 Prix Lupin at Longchamp May 16. He may have found the mile and a half of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) too far, but still managed a highly respectable third behind Blue Canari (Fr) in that Chantilly Classic June 6. Taken to the front in the early stages here, he was still traveling easily when his rivals tried to ruffle his feathers at the top of the straight. Quickening clear again, he was allowed to coast to the line under a hand ride. BOWL OF FLOWERS, WINKFIELD NAMED TO HALL *Bowl of Flowers* (Sailor--Flower Bowl, by Alibhai), a two-time filly champion in the 1960s and international rider Jimmy Winkfield have been elected to the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame. The two were approved by the Museum's Historic Review Committee and will be inducted next month along with trainer Shug McGaughey, jockey Kent Desormeaux and champions Skip Away and Flawlessly. "The Historic Review Committee was established to review horses and individuals of the distant past in racing," museum director Peter Hammell explained. "We recognize that over the years some worthy candidates might not win election and then gradually fade from memory." Winkfield won the 1901 Kentucky Derby aboard His Eminence and the 1902 Run for the Roses with Alan-a-Dale. He is one of four jockeys to win the Derby in consecutive years. Winkfield moved to Russia in 1904 and became an instant success, winning four Russian Derbys, as well as top races in Poland and Germany. During the Russian Revolution, the jockey led a number of people and some 200 horses on a 1,000-mile escape out of Odessa. He took up riding in France and, by the time of his retirement at the age of 50, he had won more than 2,500 races. He is the subject of the upcoming biography *Wink: The Incredible Life and Epic Journey of Jimmy Winkfield*. Written by Ed Hotaling, the book will be published in November by McGraw-Hill. *Bowl of Flowers* won 10 of 16 races at two and three. She was the juvenile filly champion in 1960 and was champion three-year-old filly the following season. A homebred in Isabel Dodge Sloane's Brookmeade Stable, *Bowl of Flowers* was one of six champions trained by Elliott Burch. The Hall of Fame induction will be held Aug. 9 at 10:30 a.m. at the Fasig-Tipton Sale Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, NY.

PARAMOUNT TO CONSIGN AT TATTS Paramount Sales, managed by Pat Costello, and Jamie Railton have announced a joint venture to consign horses at this year's Tattersalls October yearling sale in Newmarket. "We have a few European-type mares and we feel that we'll have more horses in the future and it's kind of a natural step forward for us to sell them over there," Costello said. "I'm very excited about the consignment. This year, we're bringing over two Red Ransoms, a Machiavellian and a Giant's Causeway. They're all nice individuals and we'll be very well represented over there." Paramount Sales, which combines the forces of Taylor Made Farm and Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds, was founded just three years ago, but has sold well at American auction houses. Part of their consignment to the 2002 Keeneland September sale was a colt by Danzig--Catchascatchcan (GB) (Pursuit of Love {GB}), who was purchased by Demi O'Byrne for \$1.5 million. That colt, now known as Antonius Pius, won the G2 Railway S. last season and was third in this year's G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. This will be their first overseas draft. Railton, also a relative newcomer to the business, has made a big splash, according to Costello. "He's made a big impact over there in the last three or four years. He's one of the top consignors there now," he commented. "Jamie knows a lot of the English breeders and trainers that don't come to America and that will be a big help to us."

Lion Heart Set to Return in Long Branch:

Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat), most recently fourth behind Smarty Jones in the May 15 GI Preakness S. at Pimlico, is scheduled to kick off his summer campaign in Saturday's GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. at Monmouth Park. Second in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and in the GI Kentucky Derby, the chestnut colt was shipped to Saratoga following the Preakness and has been back in training since mid-June. He completed his preparations for the Long Branch with a solid five-furlong move over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track in 1:01 4/5 last Sunday. "We were really pleased with the work," said Patrick Biancone, who trains the colt for Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. "Everything looks good for Saturday." Lion Heart, who will be ridden by leading jockey Joe Bravo, figures to face five other rivals in the 1 1/16-mile event, including Tracy Farmer's **Royal Assault** (Kris S.), third to stablemate Birdstone in the GI Belmont S. in his last start June 5.

Cetewayo Back at Age Ten:

Cetewayo (His Majesty), winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. in 1998, resurfaces for a ninth year at the races in Sunday's Cape Henlopen S. at Delaware Park. The 10-year-old entire, who will be making just the 37th start of his career, took the GIII Stars and Stripes Breeders' Cup H. at Arlington Park in July 2002, but is winless in 10 subsequent trips to the post, including a seventh-place effort behind Balto Star in the GII W.L. McKnight H. at Calder Dec. 27. Owned by Dr. John Chandler and trained by Michael Dickinson, Cetewayo will be ridden by jockey Ramon Dominguez in the 12-furlong event.
