Second Chances...

The ticket for Hip 180, consigned by Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales, was originally signed by bloodstock agent Guy Armengol. Immediately after the daughter of Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) left the ring, however, she was reported by Fasig-Tipton as an RNA at \$470,000. But she ended the day as the top-selling filly. Jeffrey Cooper, an Illinois attorney who was the underbidder at \$460,000, approached his agent, Mike Levy, and asked that he check to see who had bought the horse. When he learned that she had not sold, Cooper offered an additional \$10,000. Levy explained that Cooper had acted on his own initiative in the deal. The agent could not represent the Coopers in the transaction because his wife was the consignor of the filly. It was recorded as a sales transaction by Fasig-Tipton. "She wasn't sold initially, but they immediately got a deal done," said Boyd Browning, Fasig-Tipton executive vice president and chief operating officer. "It has always been our policy that when a deal gets done within a reasonable amount of time, it's a sale." The dark bay's second dam is SW Fantastic Girl (Riva Ridge), who produced GISW Fantastic Look (Green Dancer), herself the dam of MGSW Designed for Luck (Rahy).

Firmly in His Camp...

Hip 110, a colt by Forest Camp (Deputy Minister), sold to California cattle rancher John Connelly for \$450,000. Connelly was making his first visit to a yearling sale. The bay, a half-brother to GSWs Poltical Attack (Hawk Attack) and Zillah The Hun (Hawk Attack) consigned by Brereton C. Jones/Airdrie Stud, agent, will be trained by Bob Baffert. "We were getting into the business originally just to be breeders--we were the second-highest bidders on Atlantic Ocean at the Barretts March sale. That's how we got hooked up with Bob," Connelly said. "He's a good guy to be associated with and we really like his team." Connelly's daughter Sasha Borland is co-owner. Jones was not surprised by the final bid. "We did expect it to sell exceptionally well because it's an exceptionally nice horse. He's an athlete. He looks just like his sire, who was an awesome racehorse. We think he's going to make a top sire."

Profitable Trip...

Florida stallion Trippi (End Sweep), the winner of the 2000 GI Vosburgh S. whose oldest foals are yearlings, enjoyed a dynamite day in the sales ring yesterday with six youngsters selling for an average of \$131,666. Topping the contingent was Hip 115, a colt purchased by Bruce Headly for \$280,000 out of the consignment of Marshall W. Silverman, agent. "We thought he'd bring around a quarter of a million dollars," said Silverman. "He's a beautiful colt with great balance and a nice eye. He had all the right parts and we wish the buyers all the best of luck with him. I saw him when I was up here for the sale in February and he was awfully good looking at that time. Let's face it. He's going to be a better two-year-old and an even better threeyear-old. He's just a handsome colt." Trippi's success was welcome news to those at Ocala Stud Farm. "While I expected them to sell well, I was happily surprised," admitted Ocala Stud's Michael O'Farrell. "His offspring have looked awfully good and he's a goodlooking horse himself."

The Now Horse...

Hip 73, from the first crop by two-time Horse of the Year Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy), was bought for \$220,000 by Castletop Stable from Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent. Neal Winick, speaking on behalf of Castletop owners Mort and Bobbi Topfer, said, "I have a handful of people that advise me and when I took a vote [on this horse], I got no 'no' votes. He had a nice presence about him and I liked his pedigree. He vetted very well and he handled himself very well when he got into the ring." The Topfers have only been involved in racing since September. Mr. Topfer developed the business plan for Dell Computers. They recently purchased G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Clasic winner Contante (Arg) (Interprete {Arg}) in partnership with Cobra Farm. He will be released from guarantine Wednesday. The Tiznow colt will be sent to Bill Riccio at Classic Mile at Ocala to be prepped. The Topfers have horses in training with Michael Matz at Fair Hill and with Stan Hough and Todd Pletcher in New York.

Costello Hoping Lightning Can Strike Twice...

Hip 265 has been the subject of so much activity at barn 5 that the tag which bears his hip number is barely legible, worn away and peeling off his body.

"He's been out of the stall more than he's been in it," Pat Costello, who manages Paramount Sales for the team of Taylor Made and Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds, says with something of an exhausted smile.

Paramount is no stranger to Fasig-Tipton success. It was 12 months ago in this very pavilion that Costello watched a filly from the first crop of Fusaichi Pegasus stride out of the ring with a sales-topping price tag of \$800,000. He hopes to work the same magic this afternoon with this son of Regent's Walk (Vice Regent), a striking half brother to MGISW Marquetry by the 2000 Kentucky Derby winner.

"He's very racey looking, he's full of quality and he reminds you a lot of Marquetry," Costello explains. "And the sire has done so well," he added, referring to Fusaichi Pegasus' five first-crop winners.

Unfortunately, this colt will be the final produce of Regent's Walk. The then 22-year-old mare died after rupturing a blood vessel while foaling this colt.

Costello is confident that <u>Hip 296</u> will create a lasting impression.

"I think this one should fetch a nice price," he admits. "It's been tremendous here in the last couple of days. We've been just slammed with lookers for the whole consignment. All the right people are on this colt and we're hoping for a good sale."

Paramount's other heavy hitters today could include a pair by Unbridled's Song--<u>Hip 275</u>, a half brother to MGSW Euchre (Personal Flag); and <u>Hip 362</u>, a half brother to champion Maria's Mon.

Another Fancy Yearling for Gunsmith?

It's a long way from Englishtown, New Jersey, to the Newtown Paddocks, but Bo Smith's Gunsmith Stables' has celebrated some of its finest hours in Lexington. Two years ago, they sold a son of Saint Ballado out of Avie's Fancy for a half-million dollars. That colt, now known as St. Averil, won this year's Gll Santa Catalina S. and was second to Lion Heart in the 2003 Gl Hollywood Futurity. Smith and his long-time friend and consignor Joe Dodgen are back looking for more with a Cozzene half brother to that accomplished colt.

"I've raised and sold and consigned a lot of the family," said Dodgen, who sells horses under the banner of Seven Fold Farm. "The important thing is to concentrate on raising runners. The rest takes care of itself."

Still, Dodgen takes nothing for granted as he reflected on the sale of St. Averil.

"It was a blessing," he commented. "God is the one who creates these things and he created a near-perfect animal in St. Averil, and in this colt, for that matter. Did we think he'd do that well? Before we came to the sale, no. We were thinking 200 or 250 [thousand] before we got here, but after we got here, we knew that when we went up there that we had a chance to top the sale with him."

But while Dodgen does the legwork getting the horses ready to sell, he freely credits Smith for being the architect of the program.

"Bo is a businessman and he's got a super mind where it comes to matings and picking stallions that have good futures," Dodgen explains. "He does his homework and he's an absolute mastermind where it comes to that kind of stuff."

Hip 339 is a full brother to Our Cozzette, who won the New Jersey Futurity at two en route to being named the state's champion juvenile. Herself now a producer, she has a weanling by Touch Gold and is back in foal to Cat Thief. Avie's Fancy has a Maria's Mon on the ground this year and is now pregnant to Elusive Quality. And all of those could end up in Dodgen's hands.

"I'm a blessed man," he says.

JLT Bloodstock Honors Memory of Taylor...

New on the roster of consignors at Fasig-Tipton this year is JLT Bloodstock, an offshoot of Taylor Made Sales, set up to honor the memory of Taylor family patriarch Joe Taylor, who passed away last winter. "We had the idea to sell some horses," said John David Christman, who is handling the four-horse draft. "We looked at boarding fees and commissions and thought, 'why don't we just do it ourselves?'" Christman spent the last several summers working with Taylor Made and reminisced about Joe Taylor. "Joe had a Boys' Club and I was good friends with the Taylors," he explained. "Joe took me under his wing and taught us all and we had the opportunity to learn from a great teacher and a great horseman." He admits to having been a bit edgy as the sale approached. "I worked other sales with Taylor Made and I never figured out what they're so nervous about, but now I really understand," Christman continued. "If I don't get an ulcer before the end of this, I'm sure I'll be pretty close."

B-Santa Rosa Partners (Ky)

By the sire of Kentucky Derby winner Smarty Jones, this dark bay colt was purchased in utero at the 2003 Keeneland January sale for \$135,000. That could prove to be a bargain by the end of the day. "He's a very nice horse," said Dromoland's Gerry Dilger. "He's a very well-balanced, good moving horse. He has a very good mind and has handled himself very professionally. People are really receiving him well and they're walking away very pleased with what they've seen."

<u>Hip 430</u>, Guadalcanal, c, <u>Hennessy</u>--Gran Senorita (El Gran Senor)

Consigned by Betty Devenport, Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent B-Roger Devenport (Ky)

The colt's second dam is Hope For A Breeze (Briartic), the champion three-year-old of her generation in Canada. The bay is a half brother to the three-year-old filly of this season, Gilded Gold (Gilded Time), who since the catalogue has broken her maiden and won a first-level allowance at Churchill Downs, and is now poised for stakes company.

SMITH MULLS NYRA POSTS National Thoroughbred Racing Association Commissioner Tim Smith has been in discussion with the New York Racing Association about the possibility of becoming NYRA's next president and CEO. But both sides have indicated that no decision has been made and Smith, at least for the time being, remains as the head of the NTRA. "I am honored to be considered for the position of NYRA president and CEO," said the 56-year-old Smith, who has been with the NTRA for 6 1/2 years. "NYRA stands for the highest quality of racing in the world in the world's most important market. I am equally committed, however, to the NTRA and Breeders' Cup, so any decision will take more time and consultation with the relevant groups and representatives over the next several weeks." Officials at NYRA declined to comment. The news comes on the heels of last week's announcement that NYRA had lost nearly \$20 million in 2003, in large part due to government fines and legal expenses associated with an on-going investigation into operational improprieties. That investigation prompted the resignation last year of NYRA President and COO Terry Meyocks, who has since taken a position as the NTRA's special assistant to the commissioner. Barry Schwartz currently serves as chairman of the board and CEO at NYRA; he would cede the latter role to Smith. Named the first commissioner of the NTRA when it was launched Apr. 1, 1998, Smith originally intended to stay from three to five years. While at the helm, he has guided the NTRA into an operational combination with Breeders' Cup Ltd. and, along with that organization, developed a strategy to re-brand the Breeders' Cup as the World Thoroughbred Championships.

About 10 years ago, I recommended to a leading British bloodstock agent that he find time on his next Kentucky visit to inspect some of Roberto's stallion sons. Among them were Kris S., a 16.3-hand giant freshly arrived from Florida, and Dynaformer, another colossus who had just been switched to Three Chimneys.

Horses of this size can come as a bit of a shock to Europeans who have become attuned to the smaller, neater types from the Northern Dancer line. If I remember rightly, the agent's response was that I had sent him to see some of the ugliest horses in Kentucky, but even he was prepared to recognise their potential.

Kris S. was already 17 by the time he covered his first Kentucky book at Prestonwood Farm in 1994 and his death in May 2002 meant that he sired eight full crops at his new base (there are apparently also eight yearlings from the 10 mares he covered in 2002).

We didn't have to wait long for confirmation that Kris S. thoroughly merited his promotion to the major leagues. His first Kentucky crop of 67 named foals produced the Grade I winners Soaring Softly, Dr Fong and Arch, plus Grade II winners Midnight Line and Diamond On The Run.

He kept up this excellent work, especially with his 1998 crop, which produced seven graded winners (including one in Canada) among its 54 named foals. When Rock Hard Ten took the GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. earlier this month, he became no less than the 26th graded/group winner to emerge from a total of just under 400 named foals in the first seven Kentucky crops by Kris S.

There has been much talk recently that we are all going to have to lower our expectations when it comes to the percentage of stakes winners being sired by today's busier stallions. But there is no need to do so with Kris S., who can claim 6.6 percent graded winners--not just stakes winners--in those first seven Prestonwood crops. With the likes of Royal Assault, Boasting and a generous sprinkling of maiden winners among his current crop of three-year-olds, there should be more stakes winners to come from a crop that has already been responsible for graded winners Action This Day (Breeders' Cup Juvenile), Rock Hard Ten and Lucky Story, plus the stakes-winning Tiger Hunt. Lucky Story, who numbered two Group 2 contests among four consecutive wins last year, was expected to play a leading role in the 2000 Guineas until he suffered a suspected fracture. The good news is that this brother to Dr Fong is expected to return to action in the near future.

There were only 26 live foals in Kris S.' 2002 crop, but one of them, Sheikh Mohammed's English-trained Melrose Avenue, shaped like a horse with a bright future when he stormed home six lengths clear in a Sandown maiden race early in July. Six of the others sold for between \$200,000 and \$600,000 as yearlings, so there is plenty more to look forward to.

When Kris S. died two years ago, Doug Cauthen predicted that "his biggest influence might be as a broodmare sire. His colts are popular, but long term, his fillies will be jewels."

That seemed a fair assessment at the time, as Kris S.' stallion sons had been struggling to make a serious impact, although You And I had been represented by that very good filly You.

Perhaps the situation will change as his Kentucky-bred sons come on line. The English-based Dr Fong has the Group 1-winning filly Ask For The Moon in a first crop which also contains the ex-American Fong's Thong, a distinctly promising winner on his British debut last week. Arch has a couple of Grade III winners on turf to his credit this year, plus the Group 1-winning South African filly Overarching.

I wouldn't be surprised, though, if his main flagbearer proved to be the outstanding Japanese colt Symboli Kris S., who will be given every chance at stud at Shadai Farm. No doubt many of Sunday Silence's best daughters will be among his visitors, with this partnership producing 4x4 inbreeding to Hail To Reason--a horse whose influence showed in the physique of Kris S.

I suppose the future of the Kris S. male line depends partly on how much it is perceived by American breeders to be primarily a source of very good turf horses, like Saturday's Bowling Green H. winner Kicken Kris. The dirt horses are certainly outnumbered among the 26 graded winners in his Kentucky crops, with performers of the calibre of Soaring Softly, Dr Fong, Whitmore's Conn, Symboli Kris S., Kicken Kris and the Derby-winning Kris Kin among the 18 turf horses.

However, the eight exceptions include Action This Day, who is destined for Castleton Lyons, the GI Oaklawn H. winner Kudos and Rock Hard Ten, who could still have a major role to play in the sophomore division, judging by his Swaps S. display.

Bearing in mind that Kris S. sired his 1993 Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Hollywood Wildcat from a Mr. Prospector mare, the great Mr. P was sure to play a significant role in Kris S.' Kentucky career. Sure enough, the Grade II winner Apple of Kent, the Grade III scorer Love N' Kiss S. and Rock Hard Ten are all out of Mr. Prospector mares, while Mr. Prospector's sons Miswaki, Fappiano, Seeking The Gold and Jade Hunter all rank among the broodmare sires of Kris S.' graded winners.

Jade Hunter sired the dam of Kicken Kris, who was gaining his third graded victory on turf when he took the Bowling Green. Oddly enough, Jade Hunter made his name on dirt, having shown nothing like his full ability in three starts on turf at two in England. Kicken Kris's dam Kicken Grass failed to win in nine attempts on turf, her only success coming from her four starts on dirt, so it's hardly surprising that Kicken Kris was expected to prefer the main track. Five substantial defeats on dirt told another story, though, and he was switched to turf.

His dam is a half-sister to an excellent turf horse in Live The Dream, winner of the GI Hollywood Derby, but she was also a half-sister to Warcraft, winner of the GIII Native Diver H. on dirt. Blow Up, the third dam of Kicken Kris, was another turf specialist, showing very good form in France, and she produced Exploded, winner of the GI Hollywood Invitational H. over a mile and a half on turf.

Connections of Kalaman had to survive a scare in the stewards' room after this hard-fought success, but the judges ruled in his favor. He was sent off the 15-8 pick against older horses in the G1 International S. at York in August, then was only runner-up as the odds-on choice in the G3 Joel S. at Newmarket in October. His detractors grew more vocal when he found Gateman a length too strong on his return in the G3 Earl of Sefton S. Apr. 14, but he rewarded his followers for their continued faith when taking the May 26 Listed On the House S. at Goodwood. He was given another chance by the bettors here after running a troubled third behind Refuse to Bend (Ire) in the G1 Eclipse S. July 3. Settled in a distant second by Kieren Fallon as Gateman ploughed a lone furrow, Kalaman steadily reeled in that rival. He lugged left across the long-time leader's path, but quickly built a comfortable margin as Gateman rallied in the drive to the line. Fallon told PA Sport, "He did hang in a little, but he is a tough little horse and he was just pushing his shoulder towards the other horse as if to say, 'I'm the boss.'" 
Purses Increase Slightly in Second Quarter:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) and Equibase Company LLC announced yesterday that purses in the United States rose slightly in the second guarter of 2004, showing a 2.86 percent increase over the comparable guarter in 2003. News of the increase was released in "Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators," a report on U.S. and Canadian pari-mutuel wagering on U.S. Thoroughbred racing in 2004. In the first quarter, purses fell by one percent from 2003 numbers. The report also showed that total wagering had declined marginally and that racing days had dropped for a second consecutive quarter. There were 28 fewer racing days during the second guarter of 2004 than in the same time period the previous year. "We're encouraged by the year-to-date figures, which show continued growth in handle and a 1.23 percent increase in purses despite an overall drop in of more than two percent in the number of racing days," said NYRA commissioner Tim Smith.



Sir Michael Stoute has sounded a note of caution over the participation of G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud winner Gamut (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) if the ground is fast. "It is a bit difficult to evaluate his form," Jorgensen added. "Obviously this is the top of the European tree for the three-year-olds and older, but we have to take our chances. Gary [Stevens] won't be coming over to ride him before [Saturday]. He's such a relaxed horse, though, that it shouldn't be too much of a problem. We are going to ship him down on the morning of the race. He's travelled so much before that he's used to being in new places all the time and it really doesn't bother him."

MAKING THE GRADE

A few years ago, the folks at Churchill Downs, Inc. put up half a million dollars to create a premier race for three year-old turf fillies. In 2003 they upped the ante to \$750,000. Now in 2004 those folks can (rightfully) claim "mission accomplished" in regards to their American Oaks--another stellar field and a coveted Grade I rating.

The only sad part is that the owners who supported the race in its first two years, to the point where it's now a Grade I, were not rewarded with any kind of graded black type. Luckily, the fact that the American Oaks was not graded did not hurt the residual value of the fillies who won and placed in the first two runnings. However, it could have.

Last years winner, Dimitrova, was only a Listed winner in Europe prior to the Oaks (she would later win the GI Flower Bowl Invitational H.). The third-place finisher in 2002, Alozaina, was only Listed-placed in France (she would later place in the GI Del Mar Oaks). Would it have been fair if these fillies had been forced to retire after the American Oaks without the benefit of graded black type on their broodmare resumes?

We all know life isn't fair, but couldn't the Graded Stakes Committee allow that any new race with a substantial purse, say at least \$500,000, be eligible for review at year's end? Current rules state that any new race must be run for two consecutive years before being considered for grading.

For colts, there are other factors, like sire-line and precocity, that play into stallion value. For fillies and mares, however, the difference between simple Listed black type and graded black type can be great. According to figures published in *The Blood-Horse Marketwatch*, the 2003 median sale price for a stakeswinning mare sold at public auction was \$125,000 while the median for all graded winners was \$462,500. For stakes-placed mares the median sale price was \$60,000 versus \$352,500 for graded-placed mares.

Granted these figures are for in-foal mares, but that's part of the equation: graded earners tend have access to better stallions.

Show Me the Money...

New races with big pots are likely to be more prevalent in the near future. Tracks like Delta Downs and Sunland Park have already instituted races worth \$500,000 or more in recent years, thanks to the magic of slot machines. Pennsylvania will likely be in a position to do the same soon as well.

This proposed protocol would have applied to the Delta Jackpot for two-year-old colts at Delta Downs. Fueled by revenue from slot machines, the appropriately named race was inaugurated in 2002 with a \$500,000 purse. Of the 10 contestants, none had won a graded race prior to running at Delta. Its ungraded status would likely have remained. However, in 2003, with the purse jacked up to \$1 million, two of the top three finishers in the 10-horse field were graded winners. Perhaps the Committee would have rated the race a Grade III. Now, after two runnings, it can be rated as all other races

The Graded Stakes Committee has shown some flexibility in regard to newly instituted races. In 1984 they assigned automatic Grade I status to the seven inaugural Breeders' Cup races and again in 1999 to the initial Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. They have also fired a salvo of sorts in regard to purse minimums, mandating that every 2004 Grade I carry a purse of at least \$250,000.

Of course, the most important thing is maintaining the integrity of the grading system, and races should be graded solely on their individual merits. It's also important for owners and trainers to know what they are running for when they pay to nominate and run in stakes races, which is why it's impractical to rate all races in hindsight.

But it cuts both ways. If these new races can be given their proper due sooner rather than later, why not do it? It's unlikely an owner would complain about his filly being awarded graded black type, even several months after a race. It's more likely he's upset about his filly winning over a Grade I field and seeing no black type on her page.
