**QUALITY COLT TOPS STRONG F-T JULY**

While Monday's opening session narrowly missed a symbolic six-figure average price, continued volleys of spirited bidding at yesterday's Fasig-Tipton Selected July Yearling Sale resulted in soaring average, gross and median. John Ferguson, bidding from the back of walking ring on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, secured the sales topper when he went to \$950,000 for an Elusive Quality colt out of the stakes-winning Copelan mare Cercida. "I saw him this spring and loved him and he's done nothing but thrive since then," said Ferguson of Hip 370, who was the sale's highest-price horse since 1982 and the fifth highest of all time. "He's by the best young stallion in America and the world, really. It's a horse

that we were very keen to have and we're delighted to have gotten him. Not only was he a strong yearling, but he was also very athletic and had a lot of presence about him." Rainbow Quest was the last horse to make \$950,000 at the sale, fetching that amount in 1982.

**Up and Away...**

Many had hoped the first major yearling sale of the year would set the tone for the upcoming season, and with the average jumping nearly 23 percent--from \$93,076 to \$114,260--and gross up by over \$10 million, few could have asked for more. "The market was really, really strong," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "Everywhere I read, they're having record sales. This country, Europe, Japan. I think we had some better horses this year. We made a harder effort to attract buyers. People told us that we missed a few end users and we worked harder to get them this year and they showed up. I don't remember ever seeing this many people here. The pinhookers showed up and they should. They've had a great year this year. The market's been good at every turn and it bodes well for everything that's going to happen this fall. There's absolutely nothing out there that says the market won't continue to be good." *Cumulative Stats p2*

**Confirmed Quality...**

If Elusive Quality isn't the favorite stallion of Dromoland Farm's Gerry Dilger, perhaps he should be. The Gainborough Farm stud, sire of Kentucky Derby winner Smarty Jones, has been good to Dromoland in recent years. The operation consigned eventual French champion Elusive City (\$250,000) to this sale in 2001, and last year's GI King's Bishop S. runner-up Great Notion (\$82,000) to the 2001 KEESEP sale. Both are sons of Elusive Quality. Dilger bought the dam of Hip 370, Cercida (Copelan), while in foal with the sales topper for

\$130,000 at the 2003 Keeneland January sale, when Elusive Quality had been represented by several stakes winners. Dilger, who foaled this colt, owns the mare in partnership. "She was a very nice mare and I've been very lucky with the sire. Being in foal to Elusive Quality helped a lot." While neither Elusive City nor Great Notion brought close to what Hip 370 would, Dilger was optimistic coming into the sale. "You never know," he said. "You go back and forth in your mind. But people on the grounds were saying he was the nicest horse in the sale. He was very well received and when he went up into the back ring, he was very professional. He's a super mind. We wish John Ferguson and Sheikh Mohammed the best of luck with the horse. I just hope he goes on to be a very, very good racehorse."

**License to Fly...**

With horses like Roman Ruler on the track and several others making a splash in the sales ring, first-year sire **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector) looks to have gotten off to a promising career at stud. The Kentucky Derby

winner's presence was once again felt yesterday, this time in the form of Hip 296, who was purchased by bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne on behalf of Michael Tabor and John Magnier for \$800,000. Hip 296 is out of the Vice Regent mare Regent's Walk, making him a half brother to MGISW Marquetry. "He's got a good pedigree anyways, doesn't he?" asked O'Byrne. "I didn't really know what he was going to make in this market, being the first sale of the year, but I thought he made about what I expected him to." The Gaines family--who co-bred the colt--bought Regent's Walk for \$550,000 carrying a foal by Seeking the Gold at the 1998 Keeneland November sale. The mare's foal of that year, also by Seeking the Gold, made \$1 million at the same auction. The chestnut likely is bound for Europe.

**Super Sale for Silverman...**

If consignors Marshall Silverman had his way, the Fasig-Tipton sale would last two or three months. By all accounts it has been a tremendous couple of days for Silverman, who on Monday sold a colt from the first crop of **Trippi** (End Sweep) for \$280,000 to California trainer Bruce Headley. That offering had been previously purchased for \$70,000 at this year's OBS Winter Sale in Ocala, but yesterday, Silverman had a pinhooking success for his own account. Hip 358 is a filly by Artax, responsible for the recent winner of the GI Prioress S., Friendly Michelle. The dark bay, purchased by Silverman for just \$55,000 at last year's KEENOV sale, was resold yesterday to the tune of \$300,000. "No, not at all," said Silverman's wife Ginger, when asked whether they expected that sort of return. "The sire has been coming on lately. And she's just a very pretty filly. It's been a great sale for us."

**Big Splash for Ukranian Businessman...**

Kiev banker Alexander Garese made an auspicious debut in the bloodstock market yesterday, taking home the sale's second-highest priced horse, Hip 339, a Cozzene half brother to GII Santa Catlina S. hero St Averil that brought \$825,000. Purchased by Lane's End Bloodstock on behalf of the Ukranian man, who was

buying his first horse, the gray will be going to Europe at the end of next month. A trainer has not yet been selected. "I think it suits what he wants," said John Gasper, who bid on behalf of the buyer. "Being by Cozzene, he's got pedigree. If he's successful over there racing, he's going to be worth some money. It could be a very cheap investment in

the long run. He's a very athletic-looking horse. His X-rays were probably the best I've seen in several years. This horse looks like he's made out of hickory instead of bone. He's exceptional. His throat is as big a sewer pipe. He was the one I wanted and I was fortunate that Mr. Garese was willing to go that far to get him. But we didn't think we were going to have to spend this much money for one horse."

**Another Forestry for the Joneses...**

Bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, on a cell phone in the rear of the sales pavilion, saw off all bidders to take home a colt by Forestry on behalf of Aaron and Marie Jones, who raced the Taylor Made stallion. Consigned as the property of White Oaks by The Acorn LLC, agent, Chace went to \$450,000 for the Feb. 21 foal. While the progeny of Forestry have generally excelled around one turn, Chace thinks the colt can handle more ground.

"This is a horse that looks like he might be able to get that extra eighth of a mile," he commented. "This one here is out of a Cozzene mare and the family does run long and he looks remarkably like his father. Mr. Jones saw the horse the other day when he was down here and fell in love with him." The bay is out of Reach the Top, the dam of two winners from two to race, including Frances A. Genter S. winner Changing World (Spinning World). Lyn Rainbow, who consigned the colt, was pleasantly surprised by the result. "It was definitely more than we expected," she admitted. "It was what we had hoped for, however. We wish Mr. and Mrs. Jones all the best. They bought a wonderful horse."

**Brahms Off to Flying Start...**

Tom Van Meter knows a little something about **Brahms** (Danzig), whose first yearlings sold Monday at Fasig-Tipton. The co-owner of Eaton Sales purchased the colt from Europe and campaigned him in the U.S., where he registered his most important victory in the GI Hollywood Derby in 2000. The seven-year-old stallion was represented by nine yearlings in Monday's New Sire Showcase and all were sold, yielding an average of nearly \$104,000. Among them were a \$275,000 colt out of Lady Lady (Little Current), consigned by Eaton Sales. Not bad for horse than began his career for a \$12,500 stud fee. "I didn't expect him to do so well," Van Meter admitted. "He has the pedigree to be anything, but what I like about the Brahmses is that they are so uniform. I've looked at close to 100 of his offspring, both yearlings and foals, and I have yet to see a red one. They're all dark bay, they all have a little white. They're a very uniform bunch and I can't wait until next year when they're running."

**What They're Saying At The Sales...**

**Tom Van Meter, Eaton Sales**

*"We were very pleased with the results from Monday. We were glad to be the leading consignor and we sold almost every horse. We had two or three RNAs, but we also got them sold. I expected the market here to be stronger. It's a strong group of horses, everyone kept telling us. We've had close to twice as many looks than we had last year. I think that's because of the quality of the horse. There's more end-users here this year than have ever been here in the 10 years we've been doing it. Traditionally, this has been a sale for what I call 'Ocala North.' Those guys will get you to 50, 60, 75 [thousand], but we've got a lot of end users here buying--Jack Wolf and WinStar, Buzz Chace, Wally Dollase, Baffert, all of those trainer guys are here. I think that's what bumps you up to the next level"*

**Buzz Chace, bloodstock agent**

*"I think this is a real good sale. There are an awful lot of nice horses here and plenty of people to buy them. They're picking really nice individuals to help the young sire. I'm not surprised by the strength of the market. People want to buy horses and there's a lot of good individuals and not a heck of a lot of pedigree. It's just a good market right now."*

**Juvenal Diaz, pinhooker, Jockey Club Farm**

*"I went to \$400,000 on the Fusaichi Pegasus [Monday], but mainly we're looking to stay around \$50,000 or \$60,000. There's a lot of good horses and I knew it was going to strong for a lot of people here. You know you're going to have to pay for them. I say the market has been high all year. We, as pinhookers, are in a tough situation. We have to make sure that the horses we buy are 100 percent sound. People don't want horses that go in :11 [at two-year-old sales], they are looking for horses that can go in :10. Every little mistake costs you. The buyers won't forgive you for anything. That's why we try to stay conservative."*

**PADDOCK ACCIDENT CLAIMS FREE HOUSE**

Two-time California Horse of the Year and MGISW **Free House** (Smokester--Fountain Lake, by Vigors) died Monday afternoon as a result of a paddock accident at Vessels Stallion Farm in California.

The 10-year-old stallion, whose oldest runners are three, stood at Vessels for a fee of \$15,000. Bred and campaigned by Trudy McCaffery and John Toffan, the handsome grey took his first Grade I success as a three-year-old in the Santa Anita Derby, then ran admirably in the Triple Crown series, running third in the GI Kentucky Derby, second by a head in the GI Preakness S. and

third again in the GI Belmont S. At four, he won the GI Pacific Classic by four lengths before capturing the GI Santa Anita H. in his penultimate start as a five-year-old. He was retired in the summer of 1999 after suffering a torn ligament in the GI Pimlico Special. As a stallion, Free House was California's leading freshman sire by earnings in 2003. His best runner, House of Fortune, was named champion two-year-old filly in California and most recently won the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks. "It is an unfortunate loss," said Frank "Scoop" Vessels III, who co-owned Free House as a stallion. "It is particularly upsetting, not only for ourselves, John and Trudy, but also for the California breeding program and the Thoroughbred Industry as a whole. Free House had an unbelievable character and will surely be missed at the farm." Free House, who covered 42 mares in 2004, won nine of 22 starts on the track--including eight graded wins--and earned \$3,178,971.

plans to disperse his racing and breeding stock. Paragallo said that he would, however, keep his stallion interests. "I have some health problems I have to take care of," Paragallo explained to *Blood-Horse*. "I'll be selling all my horses privately and at the sales. Hopefully, we can get it done by the end of 2004. Until then, I'll race them, then

get rid of them. I'll just keep the stallions and get rid of the broodmares. I've got 60 broodmares, and I'll have to sell about 300 horses total." Paragallo's top horses this year include three-year-olds Redskin Warrior (Indian Charlie), winner of the Best Turn S., and Song of the Sword, who finished second in the GI Illinois Derby and third in the GI Lexington S.; as well as the four-year-old New York Hero (Partner's Hero), upset winner of the 2003 GI Lane's End S.

**Phoenix Reach (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) put himself in the picture for this Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. with a bright piece of exercise yesterday morning. The GI Canadian International winner worked a mile under Martin Dwyer, satisfying conditioner Andrew Balding with his effort. "He worked great and I was very happy with him," Balding told *PA Sport*. "As long as he is all right this evening, tomorrow and the day after, we are all systems go for the weekend. His season so far has not gone to plan; we have had a number of problems with him but, thank God, we have had a really good prep with him this time. This race has always been the objective and we'll soon find out whether we are up to it or not. He couldn't appear to be in better form and the ground will be fine whatever it is."

Dual G1 Coronation Cup hero **Warrsan (Ire)** (Caerleon) will bid to remain on course for the BHB's Summer Triple Crown £1-million bonus if he can win Saturday and again in the G1 Juddmonte International at York Aug. 17. "One million pounds is a great bonus, but the real joy is seeing him every day," conditioner Clive Brittain told *PA Sport*. "We lack some of the old faces in our game that the jumping boys have year after year, but with horses like this fellow, Luso and Needle Gun, you have them around for a while and you get used to what to do and what not to do with them. Warrsan has been steadily getting better all the time and he seems to be in top form. The only danger to him would be the race itself, but once you let go of the reins you've done your job and it's up to the horse and the jockey to do theirs."

Former French champion jockey Olivier Peslier is set to take over the reins from Dominique Boeuf on Ecurie Wildenstein's four-year-old **Vallee Enchantee (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre) in the King George. Boeuf's retainer was cancelled by Alec Wildenstein, who was publicly critical of the ride given his star filly when third to Warrsan (Ire) in the G1 Coronation Cup. Peslier, who is retained by the Wertheimer brothers, was signed on a second retainer to ride Ecurie Wildenstein's horses when available; he will be free to take up the riding option in Britain's midsummer championship.

Siberian Express's son, In Excess, has established himself at the top of the Californian stallion colony, but it's Siberian Summer, another son of Siberian Express who has been red-hot in the last couple of weeks. On July 10, his five-year-old mare Dream of Summer (out of the Skywalker mare Marya's Dream) won the GII A Gleam H. at Hollywood Park on her stakes debut. Then, just eight days later his four-year-old filly Summer Wind Dancer captured the GII Delaware H.

Siberian Express and In Excess are the only Grade I winners sired by Siberian Express. A son of Caro from the family of Mr. Prospector, the French-raced Siberian Express was an inconsistent runner, but on his day was capable of outstanding performances, such as the ones he put up to capture the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Poule de Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas), two of his three victories. Oddly enough, Siberian Summer's record was a little like that of his sire. In fact, he won only one stakes event, but that was the G1 Charles H. Strub S., which he took from that season's champion older male, Bertrando.

Dream of Summer is one of three stakes winners from his first crop, and Summer Wind Dancer is one of another three from his second crop.

We'd have to give Siberian Summer a considerable share of the credit for Summer Wind Dancer's ability, as neither her first or second dam has previously produced a stakes winner. The dam, Native Wind Dancer, is by Incinderator, an English-raced horse of modest achievement but sparkling pedigree (by Northern Dancer out of the outstanding filly Princess Karenda).

A similar description could be applied to Summer Wind Dancer's granddam, Rich Indian, an unraced daughter of Raise a Native and English group winner, Trillionaire. Winner the G3 Princess Royal S. in England, Trillionaire produced a stakes winner in the Youth filly, Lock's Dream, who also finished third in the GIII Yerba Buena H. Lock's Dream also has extended her branch of the family as she is dam of stakes winner Big Brown Bear (by Strike the Gold) and granddam of last year's multiple stakes winner Lacie Girl (by Editor's Note), and Irish two-year-old listed scorer Akanti.

Amerigo's Fancy, the dam of Trillionaire, was a star of the California scene in the mid-to-late sixties, setting or equalling track records when winning the Santa Barbara and Escondido Handicaps. Amerigo's Fancy also became a more than useful foundation mare, as through half-sisters to Trillionaire, she is also ancestress of group/graded stakes winners Discreet Hero, Triple Tiple and Bluegrass Prince.

Summer Wind Dancer has a number of fascinating patterns in her pedigree. To start with, both her grand-sire, Siberian Express and Princess Karenda (dam of her maternal grandsire) are products of the Nasrullah/Warfare cross (for good measure, Princess Karenda's sire, Gummo, is by a son of Nasrullah out of mare by Warfare's sire, Determine). We get a second set of genetic relatives via the three-quarters related Icecapade and Northern Dancer, who appear here 3x3. The combination of Icecapade and Northern Dancer is already found in at least 98 unrestricted stakes winners, 34 graded stakes winners and eight Grade I winners, so it has already established itself as quite a prepotent one.

**July 23, 1985...**A bay colt, **Seattle Dancer**, by **Nijinsky II** out of the mare **My Charmer**, sold to **Robert Sangster** for \$13.1 million at the **Keeneland July Yearling Sale**. It was the record price for a Thoroughbred at public auction.
