DOYEN READY TO EARN SOME RESPECT

He spent most of 2003 with his light hidden under a bushel, but Godolphin's **Doyen (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) is ready to step into the limelight in today's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot. Rounding off last term with a second to Dalakhani (Ire) in the G2 Prix Niel and fourth behind that champion in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, he debuted in the royal blue when finishing runner-up in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 4. He showed the expected progress from that effort to put on a scintillating display when breaking the track record over course-and-distance in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot last time June 19. "He's a wonderful horse," jockey Frankie Dettori commented. "I really loved him last year, but he

couldn't get out of the soft ground in the Arc. He was unlucky in the Coronation Cup and broke the track record in the Hardwicke. He looks magnificent, we're all happy with him and it's fingers crossed now."

It's Warr...

There will be few more popular winners this season than Saeed Manana's Warrsan (Ire) (Caerleon) if he manages to provide his veteran trainer Clive Brittain with a belated first victory in this race. Despite finishing sixth in last year's renewal, he looked an improved performer this term when beating Doyen, the Weinstock Family's Vallee Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) and Lady Tennant's High Accolade (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) to record back-to-back successes in the Coronation Cup. He confirmed that impression when getting to within a head of Refuse to Bend (Ire) when runner-up in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown last time July 3 and is chasing the BHB's £1-million Summer Triple Crown. "We've targeted him at these races this season and now we're in with a shout," Brittain said yesterday. "He did a couple of canters vesterday morning and seems very well. He had a swim, got down and had a roll in the paddock. All the signs are there that he's in good form."

WRITERS UP

THE FUTURE'S IN GOOD HANDS by Alan Carasso

This past Thursday at Keeneland Race Course, Darley hosted a series of presentations given by each of the 12 students in the inaugural year of it's Flying Start curriculum. Emceed by ESPN's Kenny Rice, the program was attended by the likes of John Ferguson, bloodstock adviser to Sheikh Mohammed, Darley Kentucky's Jimmy Bell, Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell and Tom Thornbury, Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier and prominent bloodstock professionals, among others. Each student was given 15 minutes to discuss one of a number of contemporary issues in the Thoroughbred industry. To follow are capsules from each presentation.

Amy Oberhauser (United States)

"Horse Industry Opportunities for Americans"

Amy detailed programs in equine studies located all over the world. While there are well-known, broaderbased curricula, such as the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program and at the University of Louisville, there are more specific programs available at schools such as the American School of Equine Dentistry, the American Farrier's Association and the Ohio State University's Agriculture Tech Institute. In spite of sometimes very high costs for tuition, Amy reminds everyone most of all to "have fun."

Henry Field (Australia)

"Two-Year-Old in Training Sales"

Henry suggests that two-year-olds in training sales give the owner a chance to "test drive" his potential purchase. He credits the Japanese for injecting capital into this market, which helped it to take flight and become an ever-increasing source of important horses. While Henry acknowledges that there is that segment of horsepeople who believe this kind of sale is "too much, too soon," he theorizes that this weeds out horses that are "weak" and that this benefits the breed in the long run. Henry left the audience with the question of whether two-year-old sales might eventually gain as much market share as traditional yearling sales.

Kate Grimwade (England)

"Stallion Marketing"

Farms are consistently competing for business and Kate addressed the ways that today's stallions are being marketed to the public. Advertisements have become more sophisticated and eye-catching, focusing, for example, less on racetrack performance and more on the success of a sire's progeny at auction.

Kate suggested that even more important than how a stallion is "sold" to the public are deals the farms are willing to enter into with breeders. These range from foal-share agreements to pay-when-you-sell programs to profit protection. Finally, sales teams have assumed an important role, lending a personal touch to the sale of stallion nominations.

Stuart Boman (Australia)

"Workers' Compensation in the Horse Industry" Another hot-button topic in the industry, most notably in California, where workers' comp insurance premiums reached a peak of \$43 per \$100 of payroll in 2003. Stuart explained that the rising cost of workers' comp could drive some out of business and that the situation could repeat in Kentucky, unless cost-lowering measures are taken. To that end, the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association commissioned a White Paper on the subject and established a Task Force, which has, among other things, recommended the removal of jockeys and exercise riders from workers' comp policies as well as nationwide coverage, i.e. one insurer to write the insurance, to assess risk and to monitor claims.

Lisa-Jane Moeran (Ireland)

"Racing Clubs, Syndicates and Partnerships, Worldwide Trends"

With the ever-increasing costs of owning a Thoroughbred racehorse individually, Lisa addressed the virtues of joining with a racing club, syndicates or partnerships. Drawing on the examples of Team Valor, Dogwood Stable and West Point Thoroughbreds in this country and Highclere Thoroughbred Racing in the United Kingdom, Lisa explained that the structure of racing today as compared to 20 years ago makes it possible for syndicates and partnerships to enjoy the thrill of racing, without having to win a Classic or other major race. The greatest appeal is to spread the risk of racehorse ownership.

Michael Dilger (Ireland)

"Possible Correlations Between Racetrack Surfaces and Racing Injuries"

Michael indicates that there seems to be a correlation between various racetrack surfaces and the types injuries sustained while racing over them. American racetracks are typically harder and faster than those in other parts of the world and result in concussive, bone remodeling sorts of injuries. European tracks have naturally more give, yet are not necessarily safer, as soft or heavy ground can also cause injury. Michael also discusses alternative dirt surfaces, such as the Equitrack surface at Remington Park in the late 80s, the training facility at Michael Dickinson's Tapeta Farm and the polytrack surface, used at Lingfield Park in England and currently being installed on the Keeneland training track. Track design and maintenance is key.

Andriy Ostapchuk (Ukraine)

"Breeding To Race"

Despite a decreasing number of larger-scale homebred operations, Andriy speaks highly of the positive impact they have had upon Thoroughbred racing. Developing a strong broodmare band is the cornerstone of any breed-to-race operation, while the stallion aspect, although a potential source of profit, is somewhat secondary. Because home-breeders usually do not board outside mares at their farms, they are able to closely monitor the progress of their young horses before sending them to the trainers of their choice. Culling is also a very important ingredient and must be carefully managed, so as not to leave the impression that these horse are being cast aside.

Francis-Henri Graffard (France)

"Owner Interstate Licensing Issues in American Racing" Francis moved the listeners to collective laughter when he said that "red tape" is the official sponsor where it comes to interstate owner licensing in this country. Criminal history searches and fingerprinting procedures are often different from state to state, the process can be expensive and time consuming and place a burden on the owner who wishes to race in more than one jurisdiction. Since 2000, there are three multi-jurisdictional licenses--the Compact, recognized in 23 jurisdictions; the RCI, accepted in over 30 jurisdictions; and the NAPRA, available in 20 jurisdictions. Francis is looking for a real national license to further simplify the procedure and to remove a potential hassle for owners.

Edward Sackville (England)

"Ethical Issues in Bloodstock Transactions"

Obviously an issue of great relevance, given the recent developments, both in England with the British Jockey Club's Code of Practice and Satish Sanan's Alliance for Industry Reform in this country. Despite the existence of TACA and the Federation of Bloodstock Agents, the business of facilitating a bloodstock sale remains a "grey" business and subject to scrutiny. In light of the recent court case in England involving trainer David Elsworth, the British Jockey Club developed its code, set to take hold Aug. 1, which includes the ability to ban those engaged in illegal practices from its racetracks. Edward points out, however, that Tattersalls and Doncaster Bloodstock Sales do not fall under the auspices of the British Jockey Club and calls on them to support the Jockey Club. The problem in the U.S. is that there is no single regulating body, he says, and calls on Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton to align with Sanan in his efforts.





Darley Flying Start cont. Hanako Sonobe (Japan)

"Daily Sources of Racing and Breeding News"

Hanako handed out a fairly comprehensive listing of horse-related websites from throughout the world. She reviewed the American weekly trade publications and went into some detail about what each does. She also reviewed Asian, Southern Hemisphere and European websites. Hanako also spoke briefly about and critiqued the sources of daily Thoroughbred information, including this publication, which she deemed the best in keeping its readers abreast of the Thoroughbred marketplace.

Tina Rau (Germany)

Yearling Selection at Public Auction

Tina took the audience through the steps she feels are important when shopping for and selecting yearlings at public auction. In her opinion, it is imperative that the prospective buyer be very organized in his or her approach. She suggests that the buyer have barn list in order and to do their research prior to sale. She stressed importance of working off that barn list and to comprise a final short list carefully. She explored the question of whether to make use of a bloodstock agent, but suggested that if one is organized and has a good relationship with a veterinarian, that there is a chance to do this on one's own. Tina also stressed the need to read the conditions of sale very thoroughly.

Tan Kah Soon (Malaysia)

Internet Sale and Purchases of Horses

In light of the handful of Internet-based "auction houses," Tan stated his belief that consumer fear of working with that medium has hindered the development and success of the businesses. Tan cited statistics for the dollar volume of Internet sales in 2002 versus what is predicted for 2006 and suggested that it would behoove the horse industry to embrace and become comfortable with this concept, as he believes that this is the going to gain momentum as time goes on. As he showed a video of the stallion Quiet American opening his stall door at Gainsborough Farm, Tan quipped: "Let's hope the Internet opens doors in the future."

The students each displayed a depth of knowledge which belies their relative inexperience. "What has united them as a group has been their combined passion for the industry and their ambition to succeed at the highest level," said Flying Start Director Joe Osborne. The group completed the Kentucky portion of the program on Thursday and will be on holiday through Aug. 22, when they will reconvene at Darley's Australia base in New South Wales. The program concludes at Kildangan Stud in Ireland next July 22.
