King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. cont. *Five Up*

Godolphin have won the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. with three of their giants in Lammtarra, Swain (Ire) and Daylami (Ire), and Doyen was compared favorably with that elite by Godolphin, who were notching up win number five in this contest. Conditioned by Andre Fabre at three, the handsome bay grew in substance with each run, following an easy G3 Prix du Lys success at at Longchamp in June with a game second to Dalakhani (Ire) in the G2 Prix Niel back there in September. Foiled by the testing ground when only fourth behind that rival in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe the following month, he was transferred to Godolphin and ran with credit to finish runner-up to Warrsan (Ire) in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 4. Leaving that form behind, he broke the track record over course and distance when winning the G2 Hardwicke S. at the Royal meeting June 19, but had no chance of repeating that feat off these moderate early fractions. Doyen, no morning glory, is highly regarded by his connections. "He doesn't show a lot in the mornings, but he gives everything to his racing and is a star," explained trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "The G1 Irish Champion S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 11], G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 3] and Breeders' Cup are all options, and I am confident he would love the G1 Japan Cup [at Tokyo Nov. 28]." Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum echoed those sentiments. "He is peaking now and the sky is the limit," he said. "We can take him wherever we want and he is ready to go anywhere around the world." Trainer Ken McPeek was delighted with the effort of the runner-up, who clung to that spot as Sulamani (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) closed late. "He is stellar," McPeek commented. "The winner was fantastic -- what a wonderful horse he is. I knew if he was allowed to lay close to the pace he was brave and would fight to the finish.
