AFLEET ALEX FLEETEST OF ALL

Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) proved the demolition of Delaware Park foes in his first two career outings was no fluke with a resounding 5 1/4-length stakes-record setting win in yesterday's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. The bay colt, sent off the slight 3-1 favorite, was allowed to rate off fractions of :22.29, :45.58, and :57.26, but stormed into contention with a five-wide move into the lane. He inhaled the leaders and drew clear with ease, stopping the timer in 1:09.32. Afleet Alex came into his stakes debut off a pair of dominating wins at Delaware Park, first taking his debut by 11 1/4 lengths June 26 and then adding a 12-length allowance tally July 12, covering both 5 1/2-furlong contests in 1:03 4/5. **Cont. p. 2**

NOTHING TO LOSE IN BERNARD BARUCH

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Nothing to Lose** (Sky Classic) headlines Saratoga's first grass stakes of the season, this afternoon's nine-furlong GII Bernard Baruch H., scheduled for the inner turf. The Spa's compulsory rains will ensure sod with plenty of give, and while **Nothing to Lose** hasn't yet run over a yielding lawn, he boasts a perfect three-for-three record over courses rated good--a stat that includes a pair of Grade III stakes and a win at Saratoga. The Bobby Frankel trainee cut out the running in the July 3 GI United Nations H. at Monmouth and gamely held on for third, but will likely be kept off what promises to be an honest pace, with the likes of **Quest Star** (Broad Brush) and **Irish Colonial** (Colonial Affair) lining up. Last year's Virginia Derby winner **Silver Tree** (Hennessy), third in the July 10 GIII Poker H., has flashed brilliance, but has failed to hit the board in two 1 1/8-mile races. An interesting longshot is the Argentine **Mr. Light (Arg)** (Numerous), who won a pair of Gulfstream allowances earlier this year and should be primed in his third start off a freshening. Making just his second career start on the grass is old pro **Evening Attire** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}). Connections hope the surface switch can revitalize the gelding, who was a flat fifth in the GII Massachusetts H. June 19.

"This horse is a beast," jockey Jeremy Rose said after winning yesterday's GII Sanford S. aboard Afleet Alex. "He's classy enough to sit off the speed and take off. It seems he has an unlimited amount of gears; that's why I think he can easily go longer." Winning trainer Tim Ritchey remains cautiously optimistic about Afleet Alex's future. "Two races at Delaware, Jeremy just sat on him. When they run those kinds of races, you've got to put him where you can find out what they have. He's a nice horse. Darasim made all under Joe Fanning to provide trainer Mark Johnston with his fifth renewal of this race since 1995. On his favored fast surface, the six-year-old is one of the finest stayers in Europe and he earned his place among the elite when beating Westerner (GB) in both the G2 Prix Kergorlay at Deauville last August and G3 Prix Gladiateur at Longchamp in September. When the ground turned against him the following month, he still mustered third behind that rival in the G1 Prix du Cadran at Longchamp, but failed to offer any threat when last in the G1 Prix Royal-Oak (French St Leger) in his season finale Oct. 26. Testing ground claimed his chance when sixth on his return in the G3 Sagaro S. at Ascot Apr. 28, but the dry spell saw him bounce back to his best when wiring the G3 Betty Barclay-Rennen at Baden-Baden May 22. He gave his all when third behind Papineau (GB) in a strong renewal of the G1 Ascot Gold Cup at the Royal meeting last time June 17, but met nothing of that calibre in this renewal. Taken straight to the front in customary fashion, he was uncontested on the lead until challenged by Misternando approaching the quarter pole. Quickening decisively there, he was pushed out to score comfortably as his stable companion Royal Rebel ground his way to the runner-up spot. "It looked like it would turn into a sprint and he almost had too easy a lead," commented his conditioner. "Thankfully, he had plenty up his sleeve and he's sharper than my previous winners Double Trigger and Royal Rebel. He is entered in the G1 Melbourne Cup [at Flemington Nov. 2], but Royal Rebel will go for the G1 Prix du Cadran [at Longchamp Oct. 3]." [Click for the Racing Post chart](#). Ringmoor Down carried on the sterling work of Frizzante (GB) and Soviet Song (Ire) in beating the colts with her own piece of boy bashing in this competitive affair. Since winning the Listed Lansdown Fillies' S. Apr. 27, Ringmoor Down was third in the G3 Greenlands S. and fourth in the G2 King's Stand S. She filled the runner-up spot in the G3 Sprint S. at Sandown July 3 and finished fourth on her last start in the G3 Summer S. six days later, but got the right splits in this race to record a career-best. Held up in the rear by Richard Quinn throughout the early stages, she quickened emphatically inside the final quarter to cut down Boogie Street in the final strides as The Tatling ran out of real estate. "She deserved that as she's been so unlucky in so many races when things went wrong every time," explained trainer David Arbuthnot. "She runs her heart out every time and she'll probably go for the G3 Flying Five at The Curragh [Sept. 5] and the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp [Oct. 3] if the ground is still right." Blue Dakota tackles six furlongs for the first time as he puts his unbeaten record on the line. Should the extra furlong not present a major problem, he will prove a tough cookie to pass here despite his three-pound penalty. His reputation preceded him before his winning debut in a Newmarket maiden during the Craven meeting Apr. 15 and he lived up to that with a five-length destruction job, before following up in two conditions events at Windsor in the space of seven days in mid-May. He just managed to last the stiff five furlongs of the G3 Norfolk S. when beating **Mystical Land** by a neck at Royal Ascot last time June 17, but trainer Jeremy Nosedata is hopeful that will not be his undoing. "He is in very good order," Nosedata commented. "I feel that the six furlongs shouldn't present a problem to him. He has been working well and I'm happy with him." **Stetchworth Prince** beat impressive subsequent winner Army of Angels (Ire) in a decent Newmarket conditions race on his July 7 debut and rates a threat, as does **Montgomery's Arch**, who opened his account over seven furlongs on his debut at Folkestone July 8.

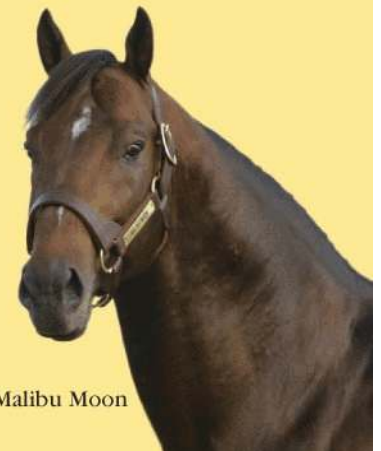
