MOTT AND BAILEY...AGAIN...IN THE BARUCH

If it's the GII Bernard Baruch H., it's got to be Bill Mott and Jerry Bailey. The duo teamed to win four of the last six runnings of the event and yesterday made it five victories in seven years with Peter Vegso's Silver Tree (Hennessy), who outlasted favored Nothing to Lose (Sky Classic) by a neck. Last year's Virginia Derby hero, Silver Tree took his seasonal bow at Gulfstream Feb. 21, but pulled hard and could do no better than eighth in the Mar. 21 GII Muniz H. at Fair Grounds and in the GII Dixie H. at Pimlico May 15. A one-length allowance winner over Nothing to Lose at Belmont June 16, the homebred colt was most recently a solid third in the GIII Poker H. downstate July 10. Well rated while never far from the front, Silver Tree commenced his rally approaching the far turn, went up alongside Nothing to Lose turning for home and outslugged that foe to the wire. "He settled very well today," said the victorious trainer. "We've never been on this kind of ground before, but he handled it well."

Peter Chapple-Hyam is back, and how. Just three weeks after Captain Hurricane (GB) captured the G2 July S. at Newmarket, that colt's stable companion Montgomery's Arch caused a mild upset here to take his record to a perfect two-for-two. Dropping back in distance after his seven-furlong debut score in a Folkestone maiden July 8, he showed early speed to seize the advantage under Jimmy Fortune. Allowed an uncontested lead as his rivals were restrained, he avoided any interference caused by the stumble of Obe Gold (GB) (Namaqualand), who spooked soon after the start and unseated Ted Durcan. Tackled and passed by Mystical Land and Frankie Dettori approaching the eighth pole, he belied his inexperience while hemmed against the rail and dug deep to regain the lead in the final stride.

"There was no real pace on and they were hacking," Fortune explained. "I'd planned to drop in, but I found myself in front and in a slowly run race that was probably the best place to be." Chapple-Hyam, doubling his tally in this after Polaris Flight opened the score in 1995, added, "I always thought he was a nice horse and now he's won a Group 2, so he'll have to run in a Group 1, but I don't know where. Him and Captain Hurricane won't meet though." Blue Dakota (Ire) (Namid {GB}), sent off the 9-4 pick to confirm the form of his G3 Norfolk S. success, pulled fiercely early for Eddie Ahern and found little in the closing stages.

Phantom Wind found the gaps to swoop late and provide conditioner John Gosden with a one-two in this competitive contest. Highly impressive when winning a Newmarket maiden in October, she faced a race against time to make the 1000 Guineas in the spring and showed she was not ready for that test when finishing sixth in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury Apr. 17. Shaping well on her return from a break to finish fifth behind Pastoral Pursuits (GB) in the Listed Hackwood S. back at that track July 17, she was overlooked by the punters, who allowed her to drift to 16-1. Grabbing a vital rail position early, she traveled easily in mid-division as she tracked Nyramba until switching out for her run at the eighth pole. Quickening instantly in the clear, she reeled in her stable companion inside the final 50 yards to score a shade cosily. "Her mother never truly came to her best until July and she's done exactly the same, but it's exciting that she's come now," Gosden commented. The dark bay filly was off the board in her final two outings of 2003 and in her debut this season, but just missed in the May 29 GIII Mint Julep H., finishing second by a half length and came back to be third in the June 26 GIII Locust Grove H. in Louisville. The fouryear-old was away slowly in her latest, then rushed up to press the pace before fading while caught in traffic to be seventh in the July 10 GIII All Along Breeders' Cup S. at Colonial Downs, but should improve with a cleaner trip. Ocean Drive has been first or second in her last five starts. As far as fillies go, Cheveley Park Stud have never had it so good and Chorist will be a warm order to continue the purple patch in today's G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood. Unlike the stud's 2003 heroine Russian Rhythm, who was the latest in a long line of sophomores to beat their elders in this race, Chorist has taken her time to reach this level. Brought through the handicap ranks two years back to finish runner-up in the G3 Blandford S. at The Curragh, she emerged as a topclass four-year-old when returning to that track to take the 2003 renewal of that race. After a smooth success in the Listed Pipalong S. at Pontefract June 7, she outgamed the tough three-year-old Alexander Goldrun (Ire) by a half length in the upgraded G1 Pretty Polly S. back at her happy hunting ground of The Curragh last time June 26. Godolphin took this in 1999 with Zahrat Dubai (GB) and saddle last year's G2 Sun Chariot S. winner **Echoes in Eternity** and **Zosima** today. The latter was a smart juvenile on the dirt last term when winning the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. in September and finishing fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She performed with credit when attempting to give 10 pounds to Celtic Heroine (Ire) and may have been closer than third but for a troubled trip in the Listed Sandringham S. on her European debut at Royal Ascot last time June 16. "She's a lovely filly who will stay a mile and a quarter well," commented Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "She's been working exceptionally well and it's a good opportunity for her." Sir Michael Stoute equaled Sir Noel Murless's tally of six winners in this race 12 months ago and saddles Favourable Terms. She was beaten 2 1/2 lengths by Chorist in the G3 Golden Daffodil S. at Chepstow last July before taking the G2 Matron S. at Leopardstown in September, but disappointed when fifth behind Echoes in Eternity in the Sun Chariot S. She returned to take the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot June 16, but was off form again when only sixth behind Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket last time July 6.

Jockey John McKee has the call aboard the 121pound highweight.

PEACE RULES IN, GHOSTZAPPER OUT Trainer Bobby Frankel confirmed yesterday that his stable will be represented in next Saturday's GI Whitney H. by Edmund Gann's Peace Rules (Jules), winner in his most recent appearance of the GI Suburban H. at Belmont Park July 3. The conditioner originally planned on stretching out Stronach Stables' Ghostzapper (Awesome Again) in the nine-furlong event, but the four-year-old colt has shed his frog and was also coughing yesterday morning. "I'll point him to the [GII A.G.] Vanderbilt [H. at six furlongs Aug. 14]," Frankel commented. "Hopefully his foot will be fine." The conditioner added that Peace Rules would not run in the Whitney if the track came up wet, noting that the Aug. 22 GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar is a viable back-up.

LION HEART "UNBELIEVABLE" IN PREP Kentucky Derby runner-up **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat) sizzled five-eighths of a mile in :58 2/5 at Saratoga yesterday morning in his final serious move ahead of the GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Aug. 8, sparking rave reviews from his trainer. "It was an unbelievable work," said Patrick Biancone. "He came back good and scoped well. I'm really excited about this horse." Last year's GI Hollywood Futurity winner was a distant fourth in the GI Preakness May 15 and most recently returned to the races with a head victory over My Snookie's Boy (Crafty Friend) in the GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. July 17. Biancone expects a forward move in the \$1-million Haskell. "He has matured so much," he explained. "He's like a teenager who's developed into a man. He's put on weight and developed more muscles."

MEDALLIST WORKS A MILE FOR JIM DANDY

Robert Clay's **Medallist** (Touch Gold), who bested **The Cliff's Edge** (Gulch) in the GII Dwyer S. July 11, worked a mile yesterday morning at Saratoga in 1:41 as he prepares for his next engagement in the GII Jim Dandy S. Aug. 8. "He went a little too fast early on, more than we wanted," said Fernando Abreu, assistant to trainer Allen Jerkens. "He slowed up a little towards the end, but he did okay. We'll see how he looks tomorrow and then send him out in the morning once more before the Jim Dandy." Also the winner of the GIII Withers S. over Aqueduct's one-turn mile May 1, Medallist will be making his first start around two bends in the Dandy.

"We tried to contain that growth, but it kept getting bigger," Werner explained. "After talking to several veterinarians or trainers, hardly any of them experienced keratoma with their horses, it's that rare.
