The five-year-old bounced back to capture the Mar. 14 GII Rampart H. by 7 1/2 lengths, but was once again stymied by the footing in her next try and could do no better than fourth over a sloppy track as the 2-5 chalk in the Apr. 30 GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H. Back in New York for her latest, she returned to form with a 3 1/4-length score over Eclipse winner Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat) in the June 19 Gl Ogden Phipps H. "I still think Sightseek is the same horse that

everyone saw last year," trainer Bobby Frankel said. Azeri (Jade Hunter), who was first or second in her first 18 career starts, has been off the board in her last two, running eighth in the May 31 GI Met Mile H. and a distant

Eye of the Tiger received a much-needed confidence boost when dropped into a \$75,000 optional claimer at Belmont July 16 and made it two straight wins with a game victory here. The bay colt started the season out west under the care of Jerry Hollendorfer and finished a disappointing fourth over the Golden Gate turf Jan. 15. Stacked up against a solid field in the Feb. 7 GII Strub S., he ran a decent sixth and was sent off as the favorite in his next start, but could only manage a secondplace finish in a \$100,000 optional claimer at Santa Anita Feb. 22. He ran fifth in the GII San Carlos H. Mar. 7 while making his last start for Hollendorfer. Shipped to Kiaran McLaughlin's barn, he ran one of his best races ever, finishing third behind Pico Central (Brz) and Strong Hope in the GI Carter H. Apr. 10. But, facing top company again next time, he could do no better than seventh in the GI Met Mile May 31. 

Jockey Gary Stevens is still looking for that elusive first domestic Group 1 winner and relies on Nebraska Tornado to break his duck in this contest, upgraded to the highest level for the first time. Notoriously difficult in the preliminaries, she has talent in abundance and a generous way of running that saw her capture two of France's most important races in 2003. Despite winning the G1 Prix de Diane (French Oaks) over an extended 10 furlongs at Chantilly last June, she showed a mile was her optimum when winning the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp in September. Her lack of an outing may have contributed to her fifth placing in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp on her return May 23, but she performed with credit when fourth behind Refuse to Bend (Ire) in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last time June 15. Pascal Bary used this to relaunch the career of the Niarchos Family's Six Perfections (Fr) 12 months ago and he will be hoping that the same connections' Denebola can go one better this time. Like her illustrious stable companion, she was a smart juvenile, winning the G3 Prix de Cabourg before finishing third behind Whipper in the G1 Prix Morny at this track last August. She emulated Six Perfections in winning the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp in October, but has been slow to come to hand this term, finishing third in the G3 Prix de la Grotte back at that venue Apr. 25 and an unlucky runner-up in the Listed Prix Amandine at Deauville last time July 8. Monturani had G2 Premio Emilio Turati scorer Marbye back in fifth when finishing runner-up to Favourable Terms (GB) in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot June 16 before finishing fourth behind Soviet Song (Ire) in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket last time July 6. 


